**CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE**

ODAY I'd like to share with you some thoughts from Ephesians 1:3-10. As we go through this, I want you to think that this really applies to us. This is a doctrinal affirmation, this translation says. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us." I think we have all been chosen to be here at a crucial time in the General Conference history. "Chose us in him pefore the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him." His knowledge is infinite and perfect and he knew that we were going to be here on this day in August, 1978, and knew that we were going to be talking about these things. "He destined us in love to be his sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will." We have to keep that in mind.

As I studied and prayed in preparation for this meeting, I had a couple of things out in front of me: one was to pray, and the other was to remember that this is Jesus' church. "According to the purpose of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace which he has freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace which he lavished upon us. For he has made known to us in all wisdom and insight the mystery of his will, according to his purpose which he set forth in Christ as a plan for the fulness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth." These things really apply to this Conference.

Today I come to you really humble. I realize that I, as an individual, don't know the answers to the problems that

we will be confronting during this meeting.

I have spent a lot of time in prayer, specifically about this week. I have spent a lot of time in discussion and searching my own soul and on my own ideas, and I have not known the direction to go. Fortunately, the Board of Directors has been meeting for the last couple of days and I feel as though I understand the direction that God wants us to go better than I did when I arrived at O'Hare with my wife on Friday afternoon. I feel full of facts and I have heard so many things. I have heard from many of you and I appreciate that. These have been personal communications verbally or in letters. I have heard a lot of opinions. I have my own thoughts about it and I know the thoughts of others. I have talked with Stan Ross, John Lewis, Alva Huffer, and a lot of people that are deeply involved; Harold Doan and his committee; and Mardy and I have obviously spent a lot of time in discussion. I talked about it with my pastor, with the delegates from Phoenix, and maybe 30 other people there and, of course, with the Board of Directors in the last two days. I have done a lot of reading. John Lewis has sent out a lot of material, and I was so vitally interested in what the decisions were going to be that I wanted to gather all the knowledge I could, so I read everything he sent me—a couple of books and a lot of papers.

At this time I still really don't know what God wants us to do. I absolutely don't know what you want to do at this Conference nor do I know what you are going to do. One thing the Board of Directors really wants to know is what you want to do. In some ways I know exactly what God wants. He wants this church to go forward and I think this is obvious to all of us. I have been trying for openness with God first and openness with others secondly. At first I was very enthused about the Study Committee Report, and then I questioned it as people wrote me letters and I heard things from individuals. Then again, I have become very positive about it, amended in another way you haven't seen yet, but it has been amended a couple of times now. I think it is the way to go, but cautiously.

I have read a book that David Krogh sent entitled "A Manual for Church Growth Surveys," and it made me very introspective about our group-why we are doing the things we are doing and why we are going in the direction we are going. It is important for us to look, because we are going in some direction. For those of us with leadership responsibilities (and that includes all of you, because you are all here as church leaders and delegates), it is not inopportune for us to take a look at ourselves. We need to assess our strengths and weaknesses. We need to look at the past, not to become morbid, but to gain experience from what we have done, both the good and the bad so that we can project ourselves onto a path more meaningful for progress for God.

We need to look deeply at our strengths so we can capitalize on them. We need to look at our weaknesses so we can eliminate, as we are able, those things that are detrimental and an impediment to fulfilling our tasks.

About two years ago, the Home Missions Board—Warren Sorenson, Kent Ross, and Merle Patrick—went to Kansas City and heard a man speak by the name of Thomas Zimmerman, the General Superintendent of the Assembly of God. I have heard his tape and I took from it eight things that can happen as an organization grows older:

1) The visual elements replace the invisible.

2) Self-continuity becomes the reason for being (in other words you are just staying alive—this becomes your main thrust).

3) Tendency for the means to become the end, and this becomes the image that we begin to serve in this instance, the General Conference; we serve the organization.

4) Doctrines and beliefs are substituted for reality and experience. It then becomes what we say and not what we do.

5) Quantity dominates quality.

6) Conformity to a master plan tends to replace individual initiative and creativity.

7) Increased dependency upon liturgy and corporate worship, accompanied by professional, clerical development instead of having a continuing cultivation of lay participation. In other words, it is easier to pay the preacher and the staff than to roll up our sleeves and do the job ourselves.

8) Start new things but seldom eliminate things that have been done in the past.

I am sure that many of us can see that these things are happening or have happened to the General Conference of the Church of God. In my introspection, I have wondered if we are really a part of God's church; is what we believe right? I looked to the Scripture and I found that it easily supports the things we believe. I don't think the Scriptures support at all what we are doing. God wants success in the General Conference and in the member churches. God wants big numbers.

When his church started out on this earth some 2,000 years ago-around the time of the Day of Pentecost-3,000 people through Peter by the Holy Spirit, were added in one day. We are not doing anything like that. God wants big numbers! We are not utilizing the Holy Spirit the way Peter did. Why aren't we doing this? I believe that some of you are afraid of it: afraid to say (let alone shout), "Hallelujah," or "Marantha," or even to say, "He is risen" on Easter morning; afraid that if you do that you will be called Pentecostal, or you are leaning that way and that you are going to speak in tongues.

This church has traditionally been afraid of the Holy Spirit, yet it is obvious that God's presence was there through the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost. I'd like to quote my close friend and former pastor, Bro. Hollis Partlowe: "The Charismatic movement is here to stay and we need not fear it. Our theology on the Spirit is sound; however, we do need to face the issue honestly in light of God's Word. Perhaps the reason some of our people have been attracted to the movement is that we haven't given them enough of the Spirit and assurance of their salvation. That's worth thinking about. Let's keep a balanced theology." He just couldn't have said it any better. I wanted to bring that to you because it wasn't published some place where a lot of you would have a chance to see it.

I am not convinced that we have a burden for the lost. I am not convinced that I really have a burden for my acquaintances and relatives that they are going to burn in the lake of fire unless they accept Jesus as their personal savior. We all must believe that about everybody.

I'm not convinced that we in the position of leadership are willing to give enough time to get the job done. In the last couple of days the Board of Directors has made a commitment that for the coming year or two we will put in several more days in a year's time doing the work of the General Conference Board of Directors. There is much work to be done and a lot of leadership that needs to be given through the Board.

I am not sure that we share enough of our successes, or if we do that it is just quietly at home. We need to talk about our successes and uplift each other. Some may say, "Why is Bill so fired up today about these things, and why did the Board of Directors appoint that Study Committee anyway. What is wrong with the way things are going?" ### Minutes of the 1978 General Conference

### Monday, August 7

The Fifty-Eighth Annual Meeting of the Church of God General Conference convened on the campus of Rockford College, Rockford, Illinois, on Monday, August 7, 1978. Chairman William Lawrence called the first business session to order at 1:45 p.m. Pastor Richard Worley led the delegates in prayer.

Ruth Overholser, Chairperson of the

Credentials Committee, seated the delegates and explained all procedures to be followed by the delegates during business sessions. She reported that a total of 101 delegates were registered prior to lunch. These included 6 officers, 32 ministers, and 63 delegates.

The Chairman recognized the following: delegates who were attending General Conference for the first time, new churches represented, and newly licensed ministers in attendance.

Chairman Lawrence presented a devotional message in which he emphasized the importance of prayer and recognition of Jesus as head of God's Church as the delegates in Conference consider the important issues of the business sessions. He challenged all present to become involved in a unified

effort to bring about numerical and spiritual growth in the Church of God.

Special Reports as printed in the June, 1978, issue of the PROGRESS JOURNAL were considered. The Chairman read the report from the Family Life Committee which was not printed in the PROGRESS JOURNAL. Edward Goit moved and Don Swartz seconded that the delegates approve the reports of the Family Life Committee, Ministers' Fund, Counseling and Arbitration Board, and License and Ordination Board. Motion carried.

J. E. Fauntleroy, a member of the General Conference Board of Directors, reported on the activities of the Board of Directors during the past year.

S. O. Ross, Executive Director of the Church of God General Conference, presented the financial report of the General Conference for the first nine months (October 1, 1977-June 30, 1978) of the current fiscal year and answered questions relative to the report. Bro. Ross also discussed the Restricted Funds Report for the first nine months of the fiscal year. He explained that we have spent a total of \$162,344.28 plus \$12,730.00 in interest on the new women's dormitory and grounds. He stated that \$140,118.58 has been received in contributions on the dormitory, leaving a balance of approximately \$35,000.00 still owed on the women's dormitory. Robert Coverstone moved and Kenny Vancil seconded that the financial reports be approved as presented. Motion carried.

Hugh Harman, Director of the Youth Department, presented the report of the Youth Department. He expressed appreciation to all individuals who contributed to the success of the youth programs during the past year. Bro. Harman gave special recognition to the Guthrie Grove (SC) BYF group which has led in the Coins-for-Christ Crusade for the past three consecutive years. Bro. Harman informed the delegates that he is leaving the General Conference as a full-time employee but will continue to direct the Youth Department on a part-time basis from his home in Arizona.

J. R. LeCrone, Director of the Publishing Department, reported on the activities of his department. Bro. Le-Crone announced that he is retiring this year. The delegates gave Bro. LeCrone a standing ovation in appreciation of his work as Editor and Director of the Publishing Department.

Charles Jones moved and Russell Johns seconded that the delegates approve the reports of the Youth Department and Publishing Department. Motion carried.

The session was dismissed with prayer.

### Tuesday, August 8

The second business session was called to order at 1:50 p.m. by the Chairman. Bro. Elmo Gaspar opened the session with prayer. The secretary read the minutes of the Monday afternoon business session.

The Chairman called upon Harold Doan, Chairman of the General Conference Study Committee, to lead in a continuation of the discussion of the Study Committee Report which began in an earlier sharing session. This discussion was very thorough and focused on the Study Committee Report as amended by the Board of Directors, the proposed organizational chart, the related recommendations, and other issues concerning the Study Committee Report.

Betty Jannereth moved and J. Arlen Marsh seconded that the General Conference delegates adopt, as presented in its final form by the Board of Directors, the amended report of the General Conference Study Committee. (The final presentation clarified the proposed organizational chart printed in the June, 1978, PROGRESS JOURNAL by showing the Executive Director in an advisory position in relation to the Board of Directors and by indicating communications between the President of Oregon Bible College and the Executive Council with a broken line between the two. The following statement of explanation was added to the final paragraph of the Report on page nine of the June, 1978, PROGRESS JOURNAL: "When the Board of Directors is acting as the Board of the Oregon Bible College, the Executive Director will be present and serve as an advisor to the Board." Ed Bender moved and Scott Ross seconded that the motion to adopt the amended report of the Study Committee be tabled. The motion to table was defeated. The motion to adopt the amended report passed with 155 voting "Yes" and 10 voting "No."

John Huston moved and J. Don Swartz seconded the adoption of Recommendation II: "We recommend that the reorganization as outlined in the amended report of the Study Committee begin immediately upon approval and that it be completed by September 1, 1979." Motion carried.

Willis Turner moved and Z. B. Duncan seconded the adoption of Recommendation III: "We recommend that the Sunday School Board, Home Missions Board, Foreign Missions Board and the Board of Education continue to function in their present capacity until the Conference of 1979, and that at that time these Boards be terminated in lieu of the full implementation of the reorganization." Motion carried.

Edward Goit moved and Emory Macy seconded the adoption of Recommendation IV: "We recommend that Article I, Section 1 of the By-Laws of the Church of God General Conference be amended to read as follows: Section 1: "The purpose for which the

1: The purpose for which the Church of God General Conference is incorporated is to assist Church of God members, churches, and conferences to perform their commission to feed the Church of God and preach the gospel to all the world by providing trained personnel, services, resources, and materials."

Motion carried.

Robert Huddlestun moved and Jack Hearp seconded the adoption of Recommendation V: "We recommend that Article 4, Section 6 of the Constitution of the Church of God General Conference be amended to read:

Section 6: "The term of office for all Church of God General Conference Directors shall be for four years. No Director shall succeed himself for a second term. Directors shall be elected in this order: two in 1978 for three years; one in 1979 for three years; two in 1979 for four years; two in 1980 for four years; continuing therefrom with every Director being elected for a four-year term."

Motion carried.

It was announced that 175 delegates were registered with 165 voting in this business session.

The session was dismissed with prayer.

### Wednesday, August 9

The third business session was called to order by the Chairman at 1:45 p.m.

Jerry Graham opened the meeting with prayer. Joe James, secretary, read the minutes of the business session on Tuesday.

David Krogh announced that the Delegate Expense Pool had been tabulated and amounted to \$72.10.

The Chairman explained that the terms of two members of the Board of Directors, Hollis Partlowe and John Fauntleroy, expire at the end of this General Conference.

Nominations were opened for Director One. Shirley Urish was nominated by Joe James, and Dwaine Demmitt by Paul Overholser. Kenny Vancil moved and Charles Jones seconded that nominations for Director One be closed. Motion carried.

Nominations were opened for Director Two. Harold Doan was nominated by Warren Sorenson, John Huston by Richard Worley, J. Roy Humphreys by David Rainwaters, and John Hayse by Austin Railton. Warren Sorenson moved and Eddie Demmitt seconded that nominations for Director Two be closed. Motion carried.

The Chairman announced that two directors will be elected at the Thursday business session.

President John Lewis was called upon to respond to any questions or concerns relating to Oregon Bible College business and his report. No additional business concerning Oregon Bible College was brought before the delegates.

Chairman Lawrence introduced Dr. Alva Huffer, who shared with the delegates the progress on the book he is writing under the sponsorship of the Church of God General Conference. This book will be a positive presentation on conditional immortality, the triumph of the resurrection, and misused Bible texts on this subject. Dr. Huffer expects the book to be completed and published by January 1980.

David Krogh of the Sunday School Department presented the report of his department and responded to questions regarding Sunday School work and the report.

The floor was opened for nominations for Sunday School Director One. Michael Mattison was nominated by Charles Bottolfs. Paul Overholser moved and David Cheatwood seconded that the nominations be closed and that the secretary cast a unanimous vote for Michael Mattison. Motion carried.

The nominations for Sunday School Director Two were opened. Scott Ross

was nominated by Russell Johns. Kenny Vancil moved and Charles Jones seconded that the nominations be closed and that the secretary cast a unanimous vote for Scott Ross. Motion carried.

Ruth Overholser gave the Credentials Committee Report, stating that 177 delegates were registered for the business session today.

The session was dismissed with prayer.

Thursday, August 10

The Chairman called the final business session of the 1978 General Conference to order at 1:45 p.m. Kent Ross opened the session with prayer. The secretary read the minutes of the business session on Wednesday.

Executive Director S. O. Ross introduced Adrian Shephard, Executive Vice-President of the Advent Christian General Conference, as a fraternal delegate. Bro. Shephard expressed greetings from the Advent Christian General Conference and addressed the delegates.

The Chairman called for the tellers to pass out the printed ballots for the election of two directors. Dwaine Demmitt and Harold Doan were elected to fill the vacancies on the General Conference Board of Directors.

Chairman Lawrence announced that Russell Magaw has been selected by the Board of Directors to fill the position of Director of the Publishing Department beginning September, 1979. He further described that the Board of Directors will work toward filling all new positions approved in adopting the Study Committee's Report with highly qualified people.

Rachel Carr responded to questions and comments about the report of the Home Missions Department and activities of this department.

The term of Kent Ross as a member of the Home Missions Board has expired. The floor was opened for nominations for the vacancy on the Home Missions Board. Kent Ross was nominated by Warren Sorenson. Cecil Railton moved and Charles Bottolfs seconded that the nominations be closed and that the secretary cast a unanimous vote for Kent Ross. Motion carried.

Rex Shaw, pastor of the Restitution Church of God, Eldorado, Illinois, read a statement expressing appreciation to the Church of God General Conference for the financial aid given that church for the past three years. Rachel Carr and members of the Foreign Missions Board answered questions and responded to comments about the work of the Foreign Missions Department.

The floor was opened for nominations for the vacancy on the Foreign Missions Board resulting from the expiration of the term of Paul Overholser. Paul Overholser was nominated by Dwaine Demmitt. Edward Goit moved and Joe Astolfi seconded that the nominations be closed and that the secretary cast a unanimous vote for Paul Overholser. Motion carried.

S. O. Ross presented the Proposed Budget as amended and submitted to the delegates by the Board of Directors. Willis Turner moved and Oral Miller seconded that the amount for salaries in the proposed budget be increased to \$200,000.00. Motion carried.

John Huston moved and Larry Mayberry seconded that the Amended Proposed Budget requiring \$326,000.00 in "Goals for Giving" for Fiscal Year 1978-79 be adopted. Motion carried.

Ruth Overholser gave the final report of the Credentials Committee for the 1978 General Conference. There were 178 voting delegates for the Conference which included: 8 directors, 62 ministers, and 108 delegates. 13 conferences and 68 churches were represented. The membership reported by churches on delegate forms totals 3,967.

Joyce Knapp moved and Dorothy Siple seconded that the 1978-79 budget total be divided by the total membership figure to determine what the cost should be for each church member, and that a letter be sent from the General Conference to each member church informing them of this and with a word of encouragement for them to be responsible for their share as the Lord blesses their lives. Motion carried.

The Chairman gave the delegates an opportunity to have an informal discussion and present ideas that might be helpful to the committee studying the Constitution.

Edward Goit moved and Rex Shaw seconded that the minutes of the 1978 General Conference be approved, published, and filed. Motion carried.

Russell Magaw moved and Joe Duncan seconded that the business sessions of the 1978 General Conference be adjourned. Motion carried.

The session was dismissed with prayer. Joe E. James

### **General Conference Minutes**

The minutes of the 1978 annual Church of God General Conference delegate sessions appear in this issue. The annual budget can also be found in this issue. I urge you to read the minutes carefully. ### **1979 General Conference Program**

The 1979 General Conference will be held at Rockford College August 6-10. The Executive Director and Department Directors will plan the program. Any program suggestions may be sent to the Executive Director, Box 100, Oregon, IL 61061.

### **Conference Offerings**

An offering is received at each evening service during the Church of God General Conference. The offerings this year were designated for the revolving publishing fund. This fund is used for major printing projects, such as the new hymnal and other book publications of the General Conference. I am pleased to report to you that a total of \$2,466.78 was received in these Conference offerings.

### **Constitution and Bylaws Committee**

Because of the adoption of the amended Study Committee Report at the 1978 General Conference, there is a need for several changes in the Constitution and Bylaws of the Church of God General Conference. No major changes have been made in the Constitution since 1961.

The Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference has appointed a committee to thoroughly study the Constitution and Bylaws and make those recommendations that will update the Constitution according to the present needs.

The following committee was appointed to make this study: Brothers Donald Needham, Chairman; John Hearp; and Ken Vancil. S. O. Ross was appointed an exofficio member of the committee.

### License and Ordination Board Appointment

Brother James Mattison has been an active member of the License and Ordination Board for the past three years. Brother Mattison is now in a change of pastorates and because of illness in his family he found it difficult or impossible to attend the meetings of this important Board. The Board of Directors did appoint Brother Richard Worley to fill the one year unexpired term of Bro. Mattison on the License and Ordination Board. The other members of the Board are: Brothers Billie Kennedy and Kenneth Milne, Chairman. We are grateful to Bro. Mattison for his dedicated service while on this board.

### **Conference Finances**

As this report is written, the contributions to the Goals for Giving are still short of the needs. We trust that the total goal will be met by September 30, the end of the fiscal year.

May God continue to bless the work of the Church of God General Conference in this new Conference year.

Foreign Missions Begin at Home

In July I attended the Association of Church Missions Committees National Conference (ACMC) in St. Paul, Minnesota. I ached to have all of you there with me to share the information, the insights, the vision,

and the thrill of being with five hundred people who are actively interested and involved in missions. Most were on the missions committees of their local churches. Many others had spent much of their lives on the mission field. Speakers for the general sessions were all well-known missionary evangelists, authors, and/or executives of international mission organizations.

The ACMC is an international and transdenominational organization of Christian evangelical congregations working together to strengthen the role of the local church and to produce practical lay-oriented resources. Affiliate Member Churches may copy any of their material and have permission to change any statements where they differ doctrinally, provided they omit the ACMC logo from those pages which have been changed.

This year's conference addressed "The Challenge of the Great Commission" in terms of three compelling tasks:

### 1. MOBILIZING YOUR CHURCH

### 2. UTILIZING OPEN DOORS

3. PENETRATING BARRIERS

There were five practical workshops in each of these areas to teach us how to succeed in each task. The accumulation of research and experience plus the expertise in presentation were fantastic!

Thirty-two mission organizations had manned display booths. This enabled me to engage in direct and meaningful conversation with leaders of those organizations and ask my own questions as well as those which many of you have asked me. It was comforting to know that other organizations have suffered many of the same frustrations and disillusionments as have we, the Church of God of the Abrahamic Faith, and have learned a better way. It is especially comforting to know that they are willing to share and help us as we "grow up" in missions.

This was the third annual meeting of the ACMC. The next two meetings will be held in Boston and Los Angeles, respectively.

I attended and the Foreign Missions Board has purchased their condensed seminar of the last year's conference, "The Local Church Can Change the World." This seminar has been specifically designed for the local church. The entire seminar, which consists of professionally prepared slide-sound sets, overhead transparencies, and individual workbooks, can be presented in as little as six hours, plus meals and/or coffee breaks. I think this is the place to start in developing a foundation for missions involvement in our churches. The Foreign Missions Board would welcome invitations to present the seminar at your church. ### **VERY SPECIAL PEOPLE**

As brothers and sisters in Christ, we would like to share with you what we are now doing in our work in the field of alcoholism and drug abuse. At the same time we are sharing how the Lord is leading us to do his will.

After fifteen years in the active pastoral ministry, we felt the Lord was leading us into something else. In May of 1977 Jean was selected to work as secretary in the alcoholism program (New Day Treatment Center) at the Keweenaw Bay Tribal Center in Baraga, Michigan. In December of 1977 Jim was hired as assistant cook in the same program. Our director realized Jim's potential was Jim was transferred to Unit Manager. Being a unit manager consists of dealing closely with residents, some "spur-of-the-moment" counseling, handling an occasional crisis situation, and helping fill the residents' needs. Every staff member in our program is trained to deal with residents and their immediate needs. If any of us are not equipped to do this, inservice training is given. We have learned much about alcoholism and people's life problems in this area.

Two areas we feel our church has not been active in are the field of alcoholism-substance abuse and working with minorities in general (in the U.S.A.). We feel that most of us have been taught we should be very judgmental where alco-holism is concerned. Yet we need to realize the physical and emotional plight of alcoholics, and that they need Jesus for salvation the same as anyone else. People generally do not realize the dangers of drinking, and unless they are taught otherwise, they feel it is okay, nothing in it is harmful, and it is socially acceptable. Only when they are caught up in the vicious circle of alcoholism, and end up in jail, very ill, or really "hit bottom" do they possibly realize that they might need help.

Alcoholism among the American Indian people is rampant. In fact, in the overall population alcoholism is increasing by leaps and bounds in youth and women. Drinking is such a generally acceptable thing in today's society that alcoholism develops before a person realizes that he is addicted. Then it is too late; one cannot be "cured," only learn, through treatment for it, what to do for himself. Jim's father was an alcoholic, so he knows what the life is like. We feel the program we work in is of utmost importance. Once the alcoholic has been through treatment and attained sobriety, then he can be reached for the Lord.

Our program is the only Native American residential treatment program in the state of Michigan. We do accept non-Indian people, but in gen-eral priority is given to people of Indian heritage. Our program uses the Alcoholics Anonymous principles in treatment. Alcoholics Anonymous is a spiritual program which urges one to turn things over to one's Higher Power (God as you under-stand him). If only we could all do this 100% of the time, life would be much easier.

The Alcoholics Anonymous and Al-Anon (for relatives and friends of alcoholics) programs are fantastic. We attend Al-Anon and have received much spiritual strength from it which enhances our Christian growth. Also we have met many warm, wonderful people who are involved in these programs. Very Special People! We are so thank-ful that God has led us to this place, in this time, to work in this field. We hope many of you might someday have as wonderful an experience.

Many of you might have read this prayer from time to time. To us it has many special meanings.



### CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

(Continued from page 2) Let me share with you a few sample statistics that I got from headquarters a few months ago. Fifteen years ago when I started coming regularly to the General Conference, we had 93 churches. When I put this together we had 91, and with the one just started, I guess we have 92. In the fifteen years I have been associated with it, it has gone down. In those same years of training pastors at our Bible College, we only increased from 72 to 80 in the field. In the last quarter of 1977 when the weather was bad, the Sunday School attendance went down seven percent from the preceding year and in the first quarter of 1978 when the weather was bad too, it went down two and a half percent from the first quarter in 1977. During the same fifteen years I am talking about, the membership went up 429, which is seven tenths of a percent. This means that we are going down, you know, in relation to the rest of the world, because the population in the United States has gone up considerably more than that percentagewise in the last fifteen years.

We are not doing bad financially. We are not losing as we are peoplewise. The budget we adopted in 1974 was \$195,000,

and in 1977 it was \$249,000. This is nearly a nine percent financial growth each year—a tiny bit ahead of inflation. I'm really happy for this, because it takes money to run the organization and run God's work, print *Restitution Heralds*, and do everything else that needs to be done. So we need to give more if we want to do the Lord's work. And we need to get motivated in serving in time as well as in money.

In our meetings, we need to evaluate honestly, analyze correctly, and adjust courageously as prerequisites to progress. Protectiveness and a desire to cling to previous patterns, which have been at best partially successful, often create a spirit of negativism. We cannot allow ourselves to do that. Even though I am establishing some negative thoughts to give you a base to go from, I certainly don't feel negative about the General Conference or what is going to be done here. Unfortunately, the negative spirit is sometimes intensified by fear of the new and possibly unproved methods that are sometimes recommended. We have some new things that are unproved and we are recommending some things. Some don't like the pain of looking at the past. My wife will tell you that I don't like the pain of looking at the

past. We don't seek causes of our nongrowth in order to blame, but you must recount what has happened in the past in order that you may judge what should happen in the future. Dr. Zimmerman, speaking for his group, said, "If we are what we ought to be, we will better do what we ought to do." And then the Assembly of God started on a year of revival and repentance; they didn't start the way we are doing with some changes in the organization; they just started changing individuals. We'd like to dream, pray, and hope that we can start to do both at the same time. They did not want to emphasize another technique or program, but for each member to get revitalized, under-girded with praver, changed, and filled with the Holy Spirit. Let people know if you feel the Holy Spirit; let somebody know that you feel it; get alive for Jesus. To me this sounds really good. Now while we are here this week we need to take some actions to redirect our organization, which I am afraid has been directed downward. The statistics say that at least. At the end of this week, I really pray that this group individually and collectively feels the assurance to face up to the facts and make genuine efforts to find a better way.

**But What Can Just One Person Do?** 

Here is an interesting story of what one person did and how his action had far-reaching effects on millions of people.

David Farrah was working as a Wycliffe Bible Translator in South America when he became friends with a colonel in the Bolivian army. Because he was concerned about his friend and wanted him to accept Christ too, he began to pray for him. But suddenly political revolution forced his friend into prison. Although no one else dared to identify himself with the colonel, David visited him in prison and gave him a Bible. Then he continued to pray that God would use his Word in a special way.

While the colonel was in prison, he read the Bible that David had given him. And the powerful Word of God began to speak to the colonel's heart.

Before long, a victory came for the colonel's political forces. He was freed from prison and became the President of Bolivia!

The new president was very grateful for David's friendship and especially for his gift of God's Word which had influenced his life. Now as leader of his country, the president expressed to David a growing concern about the moral and spiritual decay of Bolivia. Together the two men discussed the need for a spiritual and moral revolution that would change the hearts of Bolivia's millions.

The first thing the president did was ask a noted South American evangelist, Luis Palau, to speak to the whole country on national television.

This man spoke about important moral questions which the Bible answers and offered to give free copies of the New Testament. So many people requested these that the Bolivian president proposed that the New Testament be required reading in the nation's classrooms. He asked David to help him get a million copies so they could be distributed to all the schools.

Of course, David was thrilled to think that every school child would be able to read God's Word and learn of God's great love and the gift of his Son. David contacted the World Home Bible League, which began sending the New Testaments to Bolivia.

As the students began to read the Bible, they responded with enthusiasm. Many took copies home to share them with their families. As a result of this program, many people's lives are being changed! The entire country is undergoing a spiritual revolution because God's Word spoke to them.

And miracles continue throughout South America. Because of what has happened in Bolivia, other South American countries want Bibles for their schools. Leaders of Peru, Brazil, El Salvador, and Guatemala have all come to the World Home Bible League asking for copies of the New Testament to distribute among their students.

And all of this came about because one man was willing to be used by his God.

"I am only one, but I am one. I can't do everything, but I can do something. And what I can do, that I ought to do. And what I ought to do, by the grace of God. I shall do."-Edward Hale.

### **Advise of Address Changes**

We encourage you to advise immediately of any address change. It is imperative that we keep our addresses up to date. On any Conference mailing if an address has been changed, the mailing will not be forwarded but it will be returned to us. We pay 25¢ for each return. This can become very costly.

### **Reorganization Under Way**

The delegates at the 1978 General Conference adopted the reorganization program as presented by the Study Committee and as amended by the Board of Directors. The implementation of this reorganization has begun and will be completed by September 1, 1979.

The Executive Council has begun having meetings weekly. The Council consists of the Executive Director and the Directors at the head of each department. The President of Oregon Bible College attends each meeting of the Council to assure complete communication between Oregon Bible College and the departments of the General Conference.

### **Board of Directors Meeting**

The Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference will have its first meeting of the Conference year in Oregon, Illinois, on November 30, and December 1 and 2. This will be the first meeting since the election of two new directors—Harold Doan and Dwaine Demmitt—at the annual Conference in August. During the three-day meeting, the Board will deal with all matters of business of the Church of God General Conference and Oregon Bible College. If anyone has a matter of business that should come before the Board at this meeting, please bring it to the attention of the Executive Director or one of the members of the Board of Directors before that date.

### **Conference Finances**

At the General Conference sessions in August, 1978, the delegates approved the largest budget ever of the Church of God General Conference. In that budget \$326,000 in contributions will be required to meet the needs of the Conference. This is a 30% increase over the 1977-78 budget.

This budget provides the support of the missionaries in five foreign fields, material support to Mexico, Church Aid to five local churches, and the greater part of the pastoral support in Digby, Nova Scotia. It provides the cost of preparing and publishing *The Restitution Herald*, PROGRESS JOURNAL, *Challenge*, tracts, and other free literature. It also subsidizes the cost of publishing the Sunday School quarterlies, study books, and other sale items. These contributions support the youth work of the Conference, the Sunday School, and Home Mission projects, and more than half the cost of education of each student in Oregon Bible College.

Contributions in the amount of \$27,167 are needed each month to meet the current needs. As this report is being written, it appears that we will fall considerably short of that amount in the month of October.

We ask that each church, each State Conference, and each individual member of the Church of God make this a matter of prayer and concern during this Conference year. It is evident that we will either need a 30% increase in giving, or we will need to find 30% more contributions to help meet the needs.

The work of the Church of God General Conference is God's work. We believe he wants his work to succeed. We encourage each member of the Church of God General Conference to respond to these needs.



Because of our long history of only providing classes during the morning hours, this will require an adjustment on the part of the administration, the student body, and the people of the Church of God General Conference. By scheduling afternoon classes, it will mean that students will not have the amount of time they have previously had for jobs in the community to pay for their education. To adjust to this will require not only a change in attitude on the part of the student, but also a change and understanding of the people of the Church of God who will support students at school. We ask that you pray and discuss this matter in the various churches.

### **Fall Activities**

Under the leadership of Michael Hoffman, the President of Student Government, and Donna Kennedy and Vickie Wyrick, Co-Chairmen of the Social Committee, the students have participated in many activities this fall. On September 20, all students participated in a Fall Breakfast at the Lutheran camp. During one Wednesday evening, many enjoyed an ice-cream eating contest, and most of the student body contributed to the float and information booth that were provided for the Autumn on Parade celebration in Oregon.





### Some Thoughts Concerning Youth

Everywhere I go the age-old question is always asked, "Why are our young people falling away from the church?"

I feel like this observation and question are certainly valid. The youth certainly do seem to be falling away from the church, not only the Church of God, but also the Catholic church, Baptist church, Methodist church and, in reality, almost all other denominations. Why? Well, certainly we can say it's the signs of the times. In some cases that may be just a cliche, but in many more cases it is reality—not all of it, perhaps—but definitely a major factor.

In searching for reasons within our own denomination, I have questioned youth of all ages as well as adult members. The answers are as varied as the number of people questioned. I have determined that the major factor is desire! There has always been, and will always be, people who choose to serve and people who choose not to serve. This situation is not unique to the youth of the church. When we consider our schools and our jobs, we can observe there are always some who desire to serve more than others. How often have we said, "The same few people do everything"? Somehow we tend to become more alarmed when we see this in the youth. In my opinion our concern should be for the entire church membership. How can we motivate our youth or how can we motivate our people? By prayer, by faith, by example, by commitment, by enthusiasm, by concern?

Could we then assume that, if we in fact believe the Scriptures and seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, all these things shall be added to us? Shall we try?

Let's focus a minute on the youth within the church who desire to serve. There are many. In my experience I am aware of young people who are youth leaders for their Bereans, music ministers, missionary chairmen, pastoral interns, Sunday School superintendents, Sunday School teachers, church secretaries, and faithful members of our churches. Perhaps we need to appreciate more fully those young people who are choosing to serve, and continue to pray for and encourage those who have not yet chosen to serve.



## THE FASCINATION OF ADVENT

**TF** ANYONE HAD TOLD ME a year ago that I would be participating in a monthlong observance of the Advent season I suppose I would have thought of as many ways to bolster my "conservative" image as possible. To me, when someone spoke of a church calendar and celebrations such as Udvent my immediate connection was with some of the "traditional" and "orthodox" organizations and paganized Christianity, and my reaction was generally one of disdain and disgust. So imagine my surprised reaction when one of my sisters in Christ, at the Church of the Open Bible, suggested that we begin preparing for the birthday of King Jesus by observing a schedule of Advent sermons, Sunday School lessons, and home devotions beginning the last Sunday of November and concluding on Christmas. As I look back on the experience of our first formal Advent season, I thank God for the great truths he conveyed to this servant throughout the month of December. Last year I was really prepared for Christmas-not just ready for "Santa" and gifts, or friends in for some eggnog-I Las ready for the "advent" of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Advent of Christmas and the participation of the Messiah in my life.

If you think of the coming of Christ when you hear the word "advent," you are correct in your thought. The word finds its origin in the Latin "adventus," meaning to "approach" or an "arrival." Particularly, to the Christian "advent" speaks either of the birth of Jesus Christ or his soon return. As any calendar is marked off into seasons which more or less denote the secular interests for each specific time of year, so the year also has seasons which annually inspire specific moods of worship among believers. Focusing on incidents in the life and public ministry of Christ, these worship seasons establish what has come to be known as the "church year." We are now entering the season of the year which begins all of the events on the church calendar, Advent, when we ask our Father in Heaven to "stir up our hearts" in preparation for the fulfillment of his promise—a Son who will be called the Prince of Peace, the "great light" for those who walk in darkness.

As the year progresses we are able to recognize the child of Bethlehem as the full revelation of God's love for mankind. We follow him along the roads of Palestine marking the great events with special celebrations such as Christmas, Palm Sunday, Easter, and Ascension Sunday. The church year is a kind of biography of our Lord Jesus Christ in which we can have a very real part in living, realizing each day that he yet walks among us.

Each season of the church year has an interesting and significant history. It is generally the rule that we can follow the sequence of events resulting in any given season or celebration. Advent is a good case in point.

Although Advent begins the church year, it did not become a part of the recognized church calendar until the festival of Christmas had been established, and that did not come until about the fourth century A.D. For the ancient church, Easter was the major celebration of faith.

The resurrection of Jesus from the dead was celebrated every week and so it happened that Sunday, the first day of the week, displaced the Hebrew Sabbath as the Christian day of worship. The annual celebration of Easter soon developed with a period of penitence preceding it, now recognized as Lent. The period of rejoicing after Easter ended on a high note, Pentecost, the festive recognition of the coming of the Holy Spirit.

Our Lord's death and resurrection, and the coming of the Holy Spirit in fulfillment of his promise, were primary in the theology and worship of the ancient church. It was much later that early churchmen reflected on the words of St. Augustine, "If our Savior had not been born, he could neither have suffered and died for our sins, nor sent the Holy Spirit."

The dates of Easter and Pentecost were not difficult to establish, due to the fact that they coincided with Hebrew festivals in existence. There was no way of knowing, however, what day of the year Jesus was born. Gradually, the inexact calculations of a third century bishop prevailed and, by the year 336 A.D., December 25 had become generally accepted as the date of the Savior's birth.

This celebration of Christ's first "advent" was not very old when the church felt the need of a period of preparation. Originally, the Advent season was of the same quantity of time as Lent, forty days. This is said to have represented the four thousand years of patient waiting on the part of the Hebrews for the promised Messiah. Advent dates back to at least the end of the fourth century at which time the first "advent" sermon is reported to have been preached formally by the Bishop of Turin. Advent was mentioned specifically at the council of Tours in the year 567 A.D. The date for the beginning of this special season of the year is generally figured from the Sunday nearest to November 30, whether before or after.

"Joy to the World! The Lord is Come!" Indeed, the King of kings and Lord of lords has been sent from God to the hearts of men, there to generate new life for a dying portion of God's creation. Every year he comes anew, not in flesh, but with renewed appeal to the lives of men to accept him as their king and their lord. This Advent season may our heavenly Father bless you and your family as you look forward to his Son's day of birth, and not just that, but may he greatly bless you as you more earnestly anticipate Christ's second "advent."

Everybody loves a birthday party! There is a particular brand of excitement that surrounds the celebration of a person's birth, and this fact seems especially true when the person is Jesus. Imagine how tremendously excited the angels in heaven were on the night of Jesus' birth; the entire atmosphere was charged with joy and glorious anticipation. All of creation breathlessly awaited the birth of the King God was sending. The shepherds shook and trembled, not so much from the cold, but at sounds and sights so marvelous. The angels sang to the top of their voices, and the shepherds praised the Lord their God for the fabulous event they witnessed.

A birthday party, and the excitement it generates; the miracle of new life, and the promise held in that life; the celebration of renewed hope—this is the meaning in mood of Advent! Though a preparation for Christmas, Advent has a spirit all its own. It is not a season of fasting, but rather one of expectant prayer. The whole meaning in mood of this time of year is described in the eleventh century hymn:

"O Come, O Come, Immanuel." This month, let us also eagerly anticipate his coming!

One of the most beautiful traditions of Advent is the lighting of candles on the Advent wreath during a weekly family devotion throughout the month of December. A wreath of styrofoam, decorated with evergreen, holly, and berries of glass balls, serves as the holder for three white candles and one pink candle spaced evenly around the unbroken circle.

Each Sunday evening the family gathers around the wreath to remember yet another facet of Christ's coming, or "advent." Each Sunday, in sequence, yet another candle is lit, remembering a different aspect of his coming—this Jesus,







**Equipped for Ministry**

The teaching of the New Testament is that every Christian is a minister of the gospel. Nowhere is this more clearly taught than in Ephesians 4:11, 12, where Paul says that God appointed some to be apostles, some to be prophets, others to be evangelists, and vet others to be pastor-teachers. The passage goes on to point out that the work of these individuals is to equip other Christians for the work of the ministry.

In making the application of this Scriptural principle to the church today, it should be clear that the pastor who is employed by the church should devote the majority of his time to training or equipping the members of the church to do the work of the ministry.

We find that Paul was faithful in carrying out the equipping principle in his own ministry. He constantly sought out individuals who would accompany him on his journeys, learn from his example, and be trained to do the work of the ministry on their own later. At Lystra he found Timothy and later instructed him to pay strict attention to Scripture, since it is "profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work" (2 Tim. 3:16, 17, RSV). Paul also chose Sopater of Berea, Aristarchus, Secundus, Gaius of Derbe, Tychicus, Trophimus, Crescens, Demas, and Mark, to name only a few who traveled and learned under his equipping ministry. Later in 2 Timothy 4:10-12 we read "Crescens has gone to Galatia, Titus to Dalmatia. Luke alone is with me. Get Mark and bring him with you; for he is very useful in serving me. Tychicus I have sent to Ephesus." Paul equipped these

men for the work of the ministry and they proceeded to minister after they had been trained.

Peter also speaks of the role of each Christian when he says, "Ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light" (1 Peter 2:9).

Therefore, in light of the clear teaching of Scripture, we must make certain that we avoid the "one ministerone congregation" concept that is prevalent in most churches today. Instead, we must believe and practice the "equipping pastor—everyone a minister" concept. This, of course, will require a change in the attitude and practice both of the pastor and the congregation. The pastor will need to rearrange his priorities so that rather than spending the majority of his time in doing the work of the ministry, he will spend more time in training others. And the members of the congregation will need to make themselves available to be trained, and they will need to change their attitude of expecting the pastor to make all the calls on the sick, the aged, and the new prospects. They will have to stop thinking of the pastor as the only servant in the church since he has been hired to minister to the needs of everyone.

These changes in attitude will undoubtedly not happen overnight, but if we choose to change I am convinced that this will prove to make a big difference in the growth of our churches. When we start having many ministers in our churches rather than one, I am convinced that some great things will happen. When we all start viewing ourselves as ministers of God, with responsibility to love others, to tell them of the love of God and the plan of salvation, to rejoice with those who rejoice and to mourn with those who mourn, to help those in need, and to serve others as Jesus did, then I believe that the outreach of our churches will be multiplied many times and we will see many more come to a knowledge of the truth.

### **General Conference Progress**

We are entering into the season of the year when we remember and celebrate the birth of Jesus, the Son of God, the Savior of the world. Many people of the world will use it as a time of gift exchange, commercialism in the marketplace, and worldly celebration. May we of the Church of God celebrate this season in rededication of our lives to God and to Jesus the Christ, whose birth we are commemorating. On behalf of the Board of Directors, the staff and workers of the Church of God General Conference, and myself, we extend best wishes for a glorious Christmas season and all best wishes for the new year of 1979.

### **Voluntary Retirement Association**

The Church of God Ministers Voluntary Retirement Association held their biannual meeting on August 9, during the General Conference. The rules and regulations of the association were updated to make the benefits much more appealing to the ministry of the General Conference. Under the new rules, there are now refund privileges if one leaves the ministry or withdraws from the association for any reason.

Some of the active ministers of the General Conference are not presently in the Retirement Program. It is possible for these men to now come into the association by paying a fee for the years that they have not participated. After January 1, 1979, those buy-back fees will be considerably higher. For those pastors not in the program, we urge the local churches to encourage their pastors to enter the program before the buy-back fees are increased.

### **Literature Saturation Program**

The special mailings for the Literature Saturation Program are in the mail. Thousands of pieces of material have gone to over 3,000 new homes over the past few months. People are being made aware of the Church of God. More importantly, they have had the opportunity to read about God, his Son Jesus, and the great plan of salvation provided through God's Word.

We trust that each church in this program is making a sincere effort through follow-up to reach each of these people with a personal witness. May God's blessing be with each church, each caller, and each one who has received these mailings.

### Evangelism Excitement

Your Executive Director had the privilege in October to be the guest speaker for a series of meetings with a group of people in Weiser, Idaho. This congregation has for years used the Songs of Truth Hymnal and Sunday School materials from the Church of God General Conference. During the six services, thirteen accepted Christ as their personal Savior and were immersed in the waters of baptism for the remission of sin. We pray God's blessing on this congregation and its plans and desires to have a full-time ministry.

### **Conference Finances**

The giving for the budget goals for the months of October and November have fallen far short of the needs. We began the fiscal year October 1 with a deficit, a loan of \$16,000. Since that time, additional funds have been borrowed to meet the current payroll and general expenses.

The delegates at the 1978 General Conference voted a budget that required \$326,000 in contributions. This requires monthly giving of over \$27,000 to meet the current expenses. This includes support of our foreign missionaries, church aid to five local churches, cost of printing and publishing of the free literature, and subsidizing of the Sunday School quarterlies and other sale items. The budget provides about one half of the cost of the operation of Oregon Bible College, and provides the general expenses for the total operation of the General Conference.

We trust that the churches and membership will make this a matter of prayer and respond to meet the December needs of \$50,540.00 plus the total loan of \$27,000.00.

I should warn you that it won't all be easy and it won't all be fun. You will actually be working. And you don't DECEMBER, 1978 get paid for your work—at least not with money. In fact, you will need to raise sponsorships in order to pay your way to wherever you go. But the rewards are great and you will never forget your missionary summer.

If you have ever given some thought to being a missionary, this could be a good chance for you to see if the Lord is calling you into future mission evangelism or if you aren't cut out for this kind of work.

What are you going to do with your next summer? It's not too soon to think about it.

#### A Program for Serving Christians By Sam Voorhies

As stated in the catalog, Oregon Bible College "is dedicated to the task of preparing men and women to present the whole Bible to the whole world. Its major purpose is to prepare Christian workers to preach, to teach, and to reach all persons in all places for Christ." The Christian Service Program is designed to assist the college in this stated dedication and purpose in the following ways:

First, by providing the student with present realistic opportunities to bring, "the whole Bible to the whole world," right in our local area. These opportunities allow each of us to reach people for Christ by serving and sharing the gospel with them.

Second, the Christian Service Program provides an integrating thread that pulls together the academic content and practical experience of each student. This allows us to relate divine truths to human realities and serve people in a real life setting.

Third, the Christian Service Program provides the opportunity to build significant ministering relationships —relationships with area churches and the community which can enhance and facilitate the sharing of Christ and the growth of the student.

In order for these things to happen, the program is designed in the following way: Area churches and pastors were visited to discover many possible opportunities of service for students. Also, community organizations, such as The Village of Progress (an organization working with the handicapped), Volunteers in Probation, The Senior Citizens Club, the county jail, and nursing homes were visited to discover opportunities for student involvement. All the specific opportunities were then compiled and made available to the students. After carefully considering their individual interest and goals for ministry, each student met with an adviser.

Through the adviser the student received guidance and encouragement in making a specific commitment in one or more of the opportunities for the semester.

There are six advisers, each responsible for five to seven students. The students will continue to meet with the adviser on a monthly basis to share his insights in ministry and personal growth.

Presently, students are involved in five area churches and two community organizations. Students are work-

ing as assistant pastors, song leaders, visitation assistants, Sunday School teachers, assistant teachers, music coordinators, worship leaders, and youth group leaders.

In the community, the nursing home and Volunteers in Probation have provided significant opportunities. In the nursing home, students are spending regular time each week visiting and assisting in the work of the home. This ranges from "adopting" a grandmother or grandfather to helping to feed and care for patients. Those students working with Volunteers in Probation are being assigned to someone who has been given probation in Ogle County. Their task is to meet with this person weekly, build a friendship, and provide support and encouragement as the person seeks to overcome his difficulties.

It's been exciting to see doors opening for students to put their faith into action. It's even more exciting to realize the potential we have to reach and impact this community for Christ. We're seeking to serve him by communicating his love in service to others. Please pray for us as we do.

#### Goal Planning

The faculty and staff of Oregon Bible College are currently completing a self-study required by the State of Illinois. This is beneficial to us because it helps us to understand and articulate our reason for existence.

Any organization must have a plan and goal toward which it is working. We are carefully preparing our goals and, in doing so, there is a definite need to outline a program by which these goals can be made.

By making goals and preparing plans for the carrying out of these goals, we place ourselves in a position of responsibility. Worthy goals are appropriate, but there must be a program that is equal to the challenge of these goals.

Every plan for the growth and development of the college must be accompanied with financial planning and support. Every program and goal that is considered has its economic implications as we anticipate an expanding program for Oregon Bible College which will efficiently fill the needs of the Church of God. Longrange and short-range planning are necessary important and ongoing functions of the administration of Oregon Bible College. We ask that you pray and plan for continued support of the Bible College and its activities.

These figures show an average decline of about 5.3% over the past year. This is the third consecutive quarter in which our attendance has been less than it was the previous year. This continued decline is of concern to me and I trust that it concerns you as well.

In fact, I hope that this matter concerns you enough that you will be led to do the following: 1) **pray**—pray for the growth of your church—pray for individuals who need to know the Lord—pray that the Lord will help your church to be effective in meeting the needs of people; 2) **invite**—invite friends and neighbors to attend Sunday School and church; 3) **discuss**—Sunday School teachers and officers and church boards should try to determine why attendance is down and plans should be made to try to reverse this trend.

I am convinced that the Church of God has a message that the world needs to hear, and unless we increase the number of people who come to our services, they will not be able to hear. And I am convinced that God will bless our efforts if we are serious about reaching people with the message of the truth.



### **Director of Outreach and Church Development**

Applications are being accepted for the position of Director of Outreach and Church Development for the Church of God General Conference. This department was established by action of the delegates at the 1978 General Conference as a result of the recommendations of the Study Committee.

This full-time position will become available September 1, 1979 when the reorganization adopted will be fully implemented. The functions of this department would cover the areas of evangelistic outreach, church development, Sunday School development, and Berean Youth Fellowship development. The new Director will correlate and supervise the activities of this department.

Anyone interested in this important position is asked to write an application and a resume and send them to the Executive Director, Box 100, Oregon, IL 61061 not later than Monday, February 5, 1979.

It is the desire of the Board of Directors to find the best possible candidate for this important position.

Following is the Study Committee Report as adopted.

#### **Outreach and Church Development Department**

This department is a consolidation of the functions now being performed by the Sunday School Department, the Berean Youth Department, Home Missions, and Foreign Missions. These departments are now headed by three part-time employees and four advisory boards.

We recommend that a full-time Director of Outreach and Development and a staff be employed. The functions of this department would be divided into four areas of responsibility:

#### 1) Evangelistic Outreach (which includes)

- a) Survey fields for establishment of new churches
- b) Select and develop missionary personnel
- c) Develop a planned program for establishing new churches
- d) Maintain liaison with mission churches and workers at home and abroad
- e) Develop programs for use of mass media in evangelism
- f) Plan programs of financial support
- g) Utilize the tape ministry
- 2) Church Development (which includes)
  - a) Administer the Mission Builders League program
  - b) Administer pastoral aid
  - c) Administer special church aid
  - d) Develop and administer programs for continuing church growth
  - e) Administer the Family Life program
  - f) Administer the Home Bible Study programs

- g) Arrange Christian Workers' Seminars
- h) Provide on-site counseling and consultation
- 3) Sunday School Development (which includes)
  - a) Arrange Sunday School Workers' Seminars
  - b) Develop programs for superintendents to improve their Sunday school programs
  - c) Provide promotional materials and programs
  - d) Establish growth and attendance goals and record results
  - e) Coordinate with the Publishing Department the observed needs, trends, and necessary improvements for Sunday school literature
- 4) Berean Youth Fellowship Development (which includes)
  - a) Plan and administer the International Berean Youth Conference and related programs
  - b) Plan and administer retreats
  - c) Provide promotional literature and programs to local BYF groups
  - d) Visit local and regional youth activities
  - e) Provide BYF leadership training programs
  - f) Coordinate with the Publishing Department observed needs, trends, and necessary improvements in Berean Youth Fellowship literature

We believe that the formation of this Outreach and Development Department will focus attention of the General Conference on its area of greatest opportunity and responsibility. It will be a step toward fulfilling the Purpose of the General Conference to assist the membership to feed the Church of God and preach the gospel in all the world.

# **General Conference Progress**

#### **Executive Director Resigns**

I hereby advise the membership that I have submitted my resignation as Executive Director of the Church of God General Conference effective August 31, 1979. Brother David Krogh has been appointed to that position effective on the same date.

This decision was made after much prayer and forethought, yet with mixed feelings. We will do all possible to effect a smooth transition.

#### **Board of Directors Meeting**

The Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference met on Friday and Saturday, November 30 and December 1, 1978, at Oregon, Illinois. The audit report for the past fiscal year was reviewed and approved. The report will be published in the February issue of the PROGRESS JOURNAL.

The position of Director of the newly formed Outreach and Church Development Department was discussed. It was agreed to encourage applications for this important position. See the front page of this issue for further information.

The Board approved the application of the Forest Hills Church in Royal, Arkansas, for Mission Builders Appeal #42 which will go in the mail in May, 1979. The Forest Hills Church was destroyed by fire in October.

The Board reviewed the report of Dr. and Mrs. William Lawrence on their recent trip to India. The recommendations were approved. The Board gave a vote of commendation and gratitude to Bro. and Sr. Lawrence for their dedication, interest, and concern in taking of their valuable time to visit various mission fields. The Board approved the production of a slide sound set on Church of God doctrines by Dr. Alva G. Huffer. Brother Huffer is working very closely with Dr. Joel A. Benedict, who has his own media company, and these sound sets can be widely distributed through this facility.

Approval was given for the remodeling of the Golden Rule Home for Oregon Bible College office space. We are grateful that a couple has agreed to provide the funds for the remodeling project.

The Board was advised that the Tom Savage Estate is providing a \$20,000 endowment for Oregon Bible

College. It was also noted that the closing will take place shortly on the purchase of the Myers Property immediately south of the present Men's Dormitory-Library-Kitchen Facility. This property came up for sale and was purchased for possible future expansion of the college facilities.

Many good letters and reports have been received by the Board of Directors regarding the changes that have recently been made in the format of *The Restitution Herald*.

#### **Conference Finances**

We are grateful for the many who have responded to the membership letter and to the needs as expressed in the past issues of PROGRESS JOURNAL.

It is true, however, that the contributions for the month of December are falling far short of the budget needs.

We feel that many fine things are happening in the General Conference. The literature saturation program is bringing the message of salvation to many people. The new book by Dr. Huffer, entitled "Triumph of the Resurrection," is progressing well and will be published within the next year. The production of the slide sound set on Church of God doctrine, the progressive changes in *The Restitution Herald*, the updating of our Sunday School material with the helpful teacher's guides, and the two Christian Workers' Seminars are all evidence of progressing Christian Service.

We trust that the churches of the Conference and the entire membership will make the financial needs of the Conference a matter of dedicated prayer and sacrificial response to carry on the work of the Conference without further borrowing. As this page is written, our loan stands at \$20,000, in addition to the deficit in giving for the month of December.

#### Typhoons in the Philippines

Last fall's typhoons did damage to Luzon, the island where our workers live. The rice crop was damaged, but at this time we don't know how badly. There was also some damage to the roof and walls of at least one of the church buildings. Pastor Eleodoro Javar's two youngest children were ill during the storm and nearly died because they had no transportation to the doctor.

Rebels and outlaws are active again in the mountains of Agbannawag. Because of the danger, Pastor Domingo Valdez has discontinued trips to Agbannawag and is now working to revive the church that was in Abut.

The Philippine ministers met for a seminar in the fall at the Quezon Church. Their purpose was to study together and discuss the problems of the church.

#### **India Items**

Pastor P. M. Paulson writes that his hand was injured in the cyclone that hit India sometime ago. A beam fell on it, breaking a bone. It has not healed well and Bro. Paulson is still suffering with pain and weakness and is not able to use his hand freely. He asks us to pray that the Lord will heal his hand and restore it to normal strength.

We are thankful that Bro. and Sr. Bill Lawrence have returned safely from their trip to India.

During the days Dr. Bill worked and taught at a Bangalore hospital while Mardy visited with the workers, interviewed missionaries, national pastors, and educators, and took care of administrative business. Both of them visited the churches in the evenings where Mardy led 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>- to 2-hour Bible studies on talents and fruit and gifts of the Spirit. Group participation was good and average attendance at Thomas Town was 33 and at Laljinagar, 25.

Bill preached two sermons at each church on stewardship, tithing, and commitment. The last night was a special treat, with films on the life of Christ being shown.

The Lawrences had the opportunity to visit with S. S. Manoah on several occasions. He looks good, is more relaxed, and seems happy. Bro. Manoah has always loved music and is talented in it. He is now teaching piano, organ, and accordion each day at a school and also does private tutoring. In addition he preaches to ten families on Sunday evenings at the YMCA. Pastor M. R. Noel is doing a fine job of preaching, teaching lay pastors, and giving his committees a chance to serve and make decisions regarding money matters. His sermon outlines are well organized and of good content. He continues to study and attend seminars for his own growth.

Dr. and Mrs. Wendell Rossman (supporters of the clinic work) and the Lawrences were extremely pleased with the clinic. In addition to Dr. Michael, who is hired for three mornings a week, three female doctors each give one-half a day voluntarily. A female psychiatrist also came and volunteered her services for the clinic. Emily Manoah is to be commended for her capable service as administrator of the clinic. It is now a good witness for Christ and our churches in Bangalore.

Continue to pray for the growth—both physical and spiritual—of our churches in India.

#### Nigerian News

Pastor John Obott has been having difficulties with his church and also personally. John and his people were in the process of having a more permanent church building constructed on some property of Tony Idiong's for which the people had paid a fee. It was nearly complete when the owner of the land and some of his friends argued and fought with the contractor and his laborers. When it was over, the church had been severely damaged with iron bars. Tony wanted additional money for the use of his land, and when John wrote he said they were planning to supply the money by the end of November.

Another problem of John's is a place to live. It has been several months since his landlord asked John and his family to leave his house. John has been staying with a friend while his wife and children have been living with her father. There is a possibility that John can rent some land and put up a small home for his family. Pray concerning both of these matters.

#### **Boards to Meet**

At this writing the Foreign Missions Board is planning to meet a few days before the beginning of the Arizona Christian Workers' Seminar. The Home Missions Board will meet following the Seminar. Members of both boards will be participating in the Seminar—several of them as staff members.

#### Staying in the Ministry

Pulpit Helps Magazine of November, 1978, and Christianity Today of January, 1977, both carried articles dealing with the continuing problem of pastors leaving the ministry.

Both articles draw conclusions similar to those reached by a study committee appointed in the Church of God a few years ago. Currently, one out of every four Catholic priests is leaving the priesthood, and one out of eight of every Protestant clergymen is leaving the ministry. The two major reasons ministers gave for leaving was the need for more money and the seemingly ineffectiveness of the work of the church. Bob Dale, a Pastoral Ministries Consultant for the Southern Baptist Sunday School Board, concluded that dropout in the ministry is related to three crises that come in the pastor's life. The first of these crises comes from three to five years after entering the ministry when reality shatters the ideals the young pastor started with. The second occurs at about age forty when he realizes he has not reached the goals he had originally established for himself. The third crisis comes when the pastor understands that he is looking forward to insecure retirement years.

Being a pastor is one of the most exciting and rewarding of jobs, but at the same time it is one that has nerve-destroying and frustrating responsibilities. Working in a local church demands powerful personal attributes and a strong faith in God.

Clearly it is the responsibility of laymen to cooperate with their pastor and provide a supportive environment so that he feels needed, fulfilled, and rewarded. Two important areas laymen can support the pastor in practical ways are: 1) to see that he has salary commensurate with his needs and the style of living of the people in his church and, 2) to support the pastor by clearly abiding by his teaching and patterning their style of life after the Christian teachings he is presenting.

This same support and encouragement that are given for the pastor must also be provided for the pastor's wife and family.

The encouragement Paul gave to the Corinthians is the same kind of encouragement we will give to pastors. "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord" (1 Cor. 15:58).

#### **Chapel and Student Activities**

Recent speakers at chapel activities have included Fred Lessten, Special Secretary of Church Relations, American Bible Society; Edward Germane, Probation Officer for DuPage County; and Lars Dunberg, Executive Director of Living Bibles International. In a sharing chapel service students reported and shared their growing experiences in the Christian Service Program of the Bible College.

On Wednesday, November 8, James Hill and Gary Burnham led the students in Prayer Day activities. Students voiced their praise, needs, and thanksgiving to God in individual devotions and group prayer activities throughout the morning.

#### **Gospel Team Activities**

Under the direction of Dale Ramsey, students have participated in several gospel team activities during the semester.

In September they participated in the anniversary celebration of the Hope Chapel Church, and in October the anniversary celebration of the Omaha Church. Many other trips are planned for this semester.

#### **Faculty Staff Activities**

October 26-28, Eugene Stilson, Bob Jones, Russell Magaw, and John Lewis attended the American Association of Bible Colleges Convention at Arlington Park, Illinois.

October 4-8, John Lewis conducted meetings at the McGintytown Church of God in Greenbrier, Arkansas. On November 12, he spoke at the Macomb Church of God on the occasion of its annual anniversary celebration.

#### **OBC Student Government Project**

Each year the OBC student body establishes a project goal for the year. Chapel service offerings are used to finance these projects. Past projects have included financing Bro. Manoah's trip to the United States and purchasing videotape equipment, an electronic stencil maker, and a television for the women's dormitory.

This year the students are letting their lights shine forth in the community by advertising the General Conference and Oregon Bible College. Preparations are currently under way for a colorful mural depicting a Christian message to be painted on the south side of the Conference building, to be completed in the spring.

In addition it is helpful to have two or three people serve each Sunday as official greeters. One of our churches has recently secured some name pins for the members to wear. The name of the church is at the top with the individual's name below. Newcomers can see each person's name, as well as hear it, when introduced.

Be sure to get the new person's name and address recorded in your guest book to aid in future follow-up.

Another helpful idea is to print a layout of your church plant showing where the various classrooms and the sanctuary are located. Also list the grades and topics (for adults) and teachers of the classes. The greeters can give these sheets to newcomers and direct them to the proper areas.

We are glad for each church that participated in the Literature Saturation Program and we pray for good results in people being brought to know our Lord. Churches involved in the program are encouraged to write and tell us how the program went in your area, about experiences you had, and any suggestions that would be helpful to us for a future program.

#### **Personal Literature Distribution**

We do not need to depend on a special literature campaign to get the printed word out to people. Each of us in our personal lives comes into contact with many people in the course of a week. And these people present to us an opportunity to share the good news.

Carry a supply of gospel tracts with you and look for ways in which you can distribute them. "Have a Good Day" is appropriate to give to someone who has provided a service for you. Someone who has lost a loved one will need the comfort offered by a message of resurrection and hope for tomorrow. "Here's My Tip" is a good tract to leave along with your monetary tip at a restaurant.

Exercise care in your use of tracts. In a newspaper column prepared by a well-known evangelist, there appeared a letter from a widow with two children who worked as a waitress. She was angry with "religious people" who came in and left a gospel tract *instead of* a tip. She felt that she tried to give good service and needed the income for her family. We want to be careful that we do not cause an adverse reaction to the gospel by the way in which we present it.

#### SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

October 1, 1977, to September 30, 1978

#### ORGANIZATION

This organization is incorporated under the not-for-profit Illinois Corporation Act. It is exempt from Federal Income Tax under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

#### ACCOUNTING RECORDS

The books and records are maintained on the accrual basis of accounting. The bookkeeping system is divided into General Fund and Restricted Fund, with each fund being a complete and separate record. The receipts and expenditures of each fund are classified to the department to which it is applicable. The Restricted Fund includes Annuities and Trust and Endowment Funds.

#### STUDENT FUNDS

There are four (4) student loan and assistance funds which are accounted for outside of the books and records of the General Fund and the Restricted Fund. These funds are reported under the title, "Other Student Funds."

#### INVENTORIES

All inventories are reported on a cost basis.

#### INVESTMENTS

Investments are carried on the books at cost, except the stock held by the Hall-Alexander Trust. It is reported each year at the going market value.

#### LAND, BUILDINGS, & EQUIPMENT

Land, Buildings, and Equipment are reported at cost, except assets received as a gift in kind. Those assets are recorded at the established value when received, and continued to be carried at this substituted cost. All assets are titled in the name of the General Conference, and not in any department.

#### DEPRECIATION

The Administration Building has not been depreciated since September 30, 1967. The Men's Residence Hall has not been depreciated since September 30, 1966. The Women's Residence Hall, built more recently, has not been depreciated. The two old buildings, Golden Rule Home and the Old Print Shop Building, continue to be depreciated. All equipment is depreciated on a normal basis, but not at taxaccounting rates.

#### **INCOME & RECEIPTS**

All monies received and designated by the donor for restricted uses are reported as income in the year received. The income and expenditures are identified by the applicable fund. Individual fund balances are maintained at all times on a continuing basis.





However, we do not have much choice. Once the delegates have adopted a budget at the August General Conference, we proceed to make commitments for the expenditure of funds. Once we have made these commitments we do not feel we can break them.

#### For example:

• \$1,075.00 is sent each month as pastoral aid to five churches. These churches are depending on this aid and we do not feel that we can withhold bayment when the Goals for Giving are not met.

• \$696.00 is sent each month to nineteen missionaries who serve in five foreign countries. These men and women are counting on receiving their checks each month. We do not feel that we can stop these checks even though the Goals for Giving are not met.

By the Editor

• We have agreed to subsidize the education of all students at Oregon Bible College this year. About 40 students this semester are counting on us to pay the instructors, the grocery bills, and the utility bills, and we do not feel that we can eliminate any of these services, even though the Goals for Giving are not met.

• We have agreed to send *The Restitution Herald* to all who wish to receive it and even though this will cost about \$30,000 this year, we do not feel that we can stop publishing the *Herald*, even though the Goals for Giving are not met.

This list, of course, could go on and on. But the point is, our delegates adopted Goals for Giving totaling \$326,000 and the General Conference Board of Directors and staff have made commitments to spend this amount, this year, in the work of the Lord. We are convinced that this is what you want us to do and we believe that when you become fully aware of the need you will respond generously as you have in the past.

It has been estimated that if every member family in the Church of God were to give \$95 to the General Conference during this year, the Goals for Giving would be easily met. Naturally many of us will want to give more than \$95 during the year and this will help to make up for those families who may be unable to give that much. But together and with the Lord's help, we can meet the budget requirement.

We are certain that you do not want us to be deficit spenders, and with your help, we can pay our current bills and repay the money we have already borrowed. Thanks for caring and helping.

#### **Know Your Director**

Brother Harold Doan was elected to the Board of Directors at the August, 1978, General Conference. He was chosen Vice-Chairman by his fellow directors on the Board. Brother Doan has served two previous terms on the Board of Directors, the last term being 1971-74 in which he was chairman each of the three years.

#### **Board of Directors Meet**

The Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference met in Oregon, Illinois, February 8 and 9. The Board approved an annuity contract with an individual in the amount of \$10,000. We are grateful for members who provide funds for the future work of the General Conference by the avenue of deferred giving. Brother Paul Newell was appointed to serve as Director of Business Administration effective September 1, 1979. This is one of the departments under the reorganization and administration as approved at the 1978 General Conference. Brother Newell is presently Office Manager and in charge of the Mailing Department.

Reports were received and approved from the various departments of the Conference. The Constitution Committee Report as revised was approved for presentation to the delegates at the 1979 General Conference. These proposed changes will be published in the June, July, and August publications.

Pastor Kent Ross of the Home Missions Board and Brother Howard Shute of the Fonthill, Canada, Church of God presented a report of their survey trip to Digby, Nova Scotia. This survey was made at the request of the Board of Directors. The report was accepted with thanks and appreciation.

The recommendations will be carried out by the Home Missions Board.

#### **Teaching the Bible**

A new course this spring taught by Bro. Sam Voorhies is called "Teaching the Bible." The course is designed to help the students to experience and develop Bible-teaching skills, to put into practice their particular philosophy of Bible teaching, and experience a significant influence on the lives of others through teaching.

During the semester each student will experience real life teaching situations several times under the guidance of the instructor. He will prepare lesson plans, work with small groups, and make practical application of Biblical teachings into everyday life. Students spend seventy minutes in class. Fifty minutes of the class are spent in teaching, and twenty minutes are allowed for evaluation. This semester the book that is used as a model in the class is the book of Ephesians. Students are also allowed to prepare a lesson out of any other book of the Bible of their choosing. As an aid to improving teaching techniques, students were videotaped in the class, and at a later time viewed the tapes for personal evaluation.

Through evaluation and instructor guidance, students discover areas of weakness and are encouraged to maximize their areas of strength in teaching. They practice teaching various age levels under different specific settings.

Teaching the Bible is an important part of our curriculum that will help a student improve in his service to the Lord.

#### **Church Growth**

Bro. David Krogh is teaching a class this semester on Church Growth. The purpose of the class is to help students become convicted of the need for our churches to grow, to become aware of the factors that affect church growth, to develop a strategy for church growth, and to become involved in a growing church.

The students become involved in observation and study by observing local churches, and examining the programs conducted by these churches, evaluating the programs, and then preparing practical strategies to bring about change in a church that will produce growth.

In addition to reading four required textbooks in the class, students are exposed to an intensive bibliography of more than fifty books on church growth.

We trust that our students are exposed through this class to the practical aspects of church development and growth.

Joe Myers, Director of Student Recruitment and Public Relations, is planning an excellent program for those dates. 

#### A Day Like We Have Never Seen

In the Spring Prayer Day experience at Oregon Bible College, faculty member Bob Jones gave the account of the sun standing still for Israel when Joshua led his army against the Amorite kings at Gibeon. The tenth chapter of Joshua makes the statement: "There has never been a day like it before or since, a day when the Lord listened to a man." It is this kind of day and this kind of experience that we envision for Oregon Bible College and the Church of God. We want a time in which the church will realize the potential personal, spiritual, and numerical growth we feel God has intended.

As we focus our attention, energy, and resources on personal, spiritual, and body growth, the Lord will bless us with a day unlike any other that this modern world has ever seen. Faith has always been the energy of the church that has caused it to be triumphant in the past. We must be united in faith.

Oregon Bible College has a significant role in the growth and progress of the church. Oregon Bible College is the place for people to prepare for many areas of Christian service representing Christ to the world. As we see last-day events happening in the nations of the earth, in culture, and in society around us, we realize that we will need strong spiritual resources to be a growing people in this time. Each member of the faculty and administration has a special gift that he offers and provides for the student. The Bible College team is extended through the gifts and example of laymen and pastors who provide their special gifts as further encouragement and growth for the student so that spiritual, capable Christian leaders are the result.

Our love for one another and concern for the lost of the world must unite us in a supportive relationship in the Bible College and all other programs of the church. By being able to concentrate our spiritual energies upon the goals we have before us, we will successfully overcome the problems that would delay the church in its intended purpose. # **General Conference Progress**

**Director of Outreach and Church Development** I am pleased to announce the appointment of Brother Warren Sorenson (see photo above) to the position of Director of Outreach and Church Development for the Church of God General Conference effective September 1, 1979. We are grateful that Brother & Sister Sorenson have agreed to accept this important position. This position was established by the delegates at the 1978 General Conference in adopting the report of the Study Committee.

Brother Sorenson graduated from Oregon Bible College in 1950 and has served successfully in pastorates at Ripley, IL; Burr Oak, IN; Macomb, IL; and Tempe, AZ. Brother Sorenson was elected to the Missions Board of the General Conference in 1961 and has served continually in various capacities, and is presently a member of the Home Missions Board. He is also currently president of the Ministerial Association of the Church of God General Conference. Brother Sorenson will spend most of the first year at Fuller Theological Seminary in California, developing additional techniques and insights that will be most helpful in his new position. He will be serving as director during this period of study.

#### **Youth Director**

We take this opportunity also to announce the appointment of Brother Joe Myers to the position of Youth Director of the Church of God General Conference and Director of Recruitment for Oregon Bible College effective September 1, 1979. Brother Myers is currently serving as Recruitment Director and receiving only travel expenses. As Youth Director for the General Conference, Brother Myers will serve under Brother Sorenson, who will direct the total Outreach and Church Development area.

#### **Annual Ministerial Conference**

The annual meeting of the Church of God Ministerial Association will convene in Oregon, IL April 30 to May 3. We trust that each church will encourage its pastor to attend and will assist in the expenses and Conference pool. The local church membership will benefit from the pastor's attendance and participation in these services and activities. The pastors of the Northeast Conference are planning the program for this Conference.

#### **Constitution Committee**

Brothers Donald Needham, Chairman; John Hearp; and Kenneth Vancil, with the Executive Director, exofficio member, were appointed as a committee to study the Constitution and By-Laws of the Church of God General Conference. The committee has made its report and several proposals for change have been submitted. The Board of Directors has approved the proposals that will be presented to the delegates for action at the 1979 General Conference. These proposals will be printed in the May, June, and July issues of PROGRESS JOURNAL, as required in the Constitution.

How would you like to be involved in a real home missions service project this summer? The opportunity is available to you if you are willing to exchange a few weeks of your life for it.

The purpose of the Short-Term Missionary Program is to help some of our churches by sending in a team of people for a few weeks of assistance. Teams or individuals can help with Sunday School, youth work, and special programs that help to build enthusiasm and give encouragement.

This program is open to persons in the eleventh grade of high school on through those who are retired. Team members will be chosen from among those who make application. On page 6h of the April *Restitution Herald* Member Supplement you will find an application blank.

Here is an opportunity for real service to God. This is not just talking missions, but it is making a sacrifice. This commitment is doing something really significant, doing something that really counts for God.

Talk to God about it and then make your decision about accepting this challenge!

#### **Mission Builders**

If you missed signing up as a member on April 1, Mission Builders Day, it's still not too late. We would be glad to receive your name and address and enroll you as a member of this "helping hand" organization. Just write and tell us you would like to join, and twice each year you will be notified of the opportunity to assist a church with its building.

#### **Items for India**

In India a young Christian woman named Lalitha Prathap had a desire to help the handicapped children in her city. So she started a school for them which was the first school for the handicapped in Bangalore. She was able to help them learn how to help themselves.

Several years ago Mrs. Prathap was chosen to receive a scholarship offered by the Rotary Club. She came to the United States and in one year received her Master's degree in special education. While in this country Mrs. Prathap did some public speaking for the Rotary and at the same time received straight A's in her studies.

After she returned to India some of the Rotary Clubs APRIL, 1979 sent her materials for use in her school. Mrs. Prathap firmly believes that you don't help people by giving them things or by doing things for them. The best way to help them is to teach them to help themselves. Using the materials that were sent to her, she taught the children to make things and sell them.

This talented Christian has offered to go into our India churches and hold workshops to teach the people how to make and sell items, if we can send the materials for them to use.

If your church is interested in helping our Indian brethren in this way, here are items you may send:

1. Plastic egg cartons (colored ones only)—these can be sold in India for 25¢ each if in good condition; broken ones are used to make Christmas balls.

2. Whipped topping cartons with lids—sell for 37¢ each.

3. Styrofoam meat trays—especially the ones with the groove in the middle so they can be cut into two "frames" for pictures, small objects, etc.

4. Berry baskets—they make a mud pot to put inside, grow a plant, and sell it.

5. Greeting cards for all occasions—they cut out the pictures and glue them on the meat tray frames, put a string through the top and sell for 12¢ each. (To save postage, cut away the blank pages; but send the scripture or the verses inside.)

6. Multi-color glitter—to be used to surround each picture in its frame. Send just enough to use on your parcel, so it doesn't get charged duty as a new item.

7. Glue—one large bottle of Elmer's with each parcel.

8. Scraps of felt and cloth.

These items are light weight so the postage is inexpensive. This gives the church people a way to "earn" money for their church, and provides a fellowship time getting together to make and sell the items. The people buy these things like hotcakes because they are colorful and they are from America.

Both inside and outside there should be a label stating: "Discarded, throw-away article; used items." Also itemize and tell the count. This is important so overseas postal officials won't steal the items.







### **1979 General Conference Reservations**

Reservations for the 1979 Church of God General Conference are now being received. Each person planning to attend must file a reservation form, with a \$10 non-refundable deposit fee, prior to July 25. Your pastor has the forms and detailed information regarding reservations.

Isolated members who do not have access to the reservation forms at a local church may write to: Reservations, Box 100, Oregon, IL 61061, and the reservation forms will be mailed to you.

The Conference will be held at Rockford College, Rockford, Illinois, on August 6-10. A firm commitment of attendance will need to be made to the college several days before the Conference begins.

The total cost for the four-day Conference for an adult this year is \$55. For those ages 3-12 the cost is \$40. There is no charge for children under 3 years of age. For those staying off campus and commuting to the meetings there is a charge of \$8 per person for the use of facilities, insurance, and miscellaneous costs. Should the commuter wish to take the meals, the total cost would be \$35 for the above benefits and the meals.

There is no charge for one attending the evening services only.

Children and young people under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. There is a full schedule of classes and activities planned for all ages and the youth are expected to attend all of the planned services. These activities will include a Junior Church each evening for those 3 to 12 years of age.

More details on the Conference, including the daily program, reports, and recommendations will appear in the June issue of PROGRESS JOURNAL. The theme of the Conference is: "Awake! Arise! O Church of God." We trust that you will make plans to attend every session of the Conference. Registration begins at 9:30 a.m. on Monday, August 6. Lunch will be served at noon. The first business session of the General Conference will convene at 1:15 p.m. The Conference will end after the 7:30 breakfast on Friday, August 10. There will be ajoint prayer service at 7:00 a.m. Make plans now to attend.

### **Camping Information**

Many delegates and friends who attend the annual Church of God General Conference enjoy traveling and staying in recreational vehicles and camper-trailers. Campers are not allowed on the campus. There are three camping parks relatively close to Rockford. Oak Valley Campground is 2 miles, Rock Cut State Park is 9 miles, and Lowden Memorial State Park at Oregon, Illinois, is 22 miles.

### **Boards Meet**

The Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference will meet at Oregon, Illinois, on May 3 to 5. At this meeting the annual Conference Program is finalized, the departmental reports and recommendations are approved, and the tentative 1979-80 budget will be discussed and proposed.

The annual Ministerial Conference will be held in Oregon the week of April 30 to May 3. The Board of License & Ordination will meet in Oregon that same week. Oregon Bible College graduating seniors who are going into the pastoral ministry will be interviewed for possible ministerial license at that time.

### **Conference Finances**

We are grateful for the more positive response of the membership to the financial needs of the Conference during this current month. Since the membership letter of March 12th, the giving has increased considerably.

I would like to share the testimony of one couple. Their letter says, "My husband read your letter and told me to draw \$500 from our bank savings to send. It appears that the General Conference staff is very conscientious in trying to keep costs down. It is a good work you are doing." Many others have written similar letters. Praise God! We trust the needs will soon be met.

### CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

The Constitutional Committee and the Board of Directors propose the following amendments to the present Constitution and By-laws. Where changes are proposed, the present section will be quoted and then the proposed change will be quoted with new material in italics and underlined.

#### FRONT COVER

CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE Proposed: Church of God General Conference, headquarters Oregon, Illinois.

### **ARTICLE II**

### Delegates

Section 1. Each member church of fifteen or more members, which has held at least six preaching services during the year, shall be entitled to one delegate for each 50 of its active members or fraction thereof.

Proposed: Add the following.

Delegates named shall be active members of the Church of God.

Section 2. A member church is a Church of God which has on record at headquarters a statement of affiliation with the General Conference.

**Proposed:** A member church is a church of

God which adheres to the Statement of Faith contained in this document, and which has on record at headquarters a statement of affiliation with the General Conference.

Section 3. The officers of the Church of God General Conference, together with the licensed ministers of the Conference and one delegate from each state or district conference, shall be considered as delegates-at-large and shall have the same powers as the delegates from the churches.

Proposed: These shall be considered as delegates at large:

a) The Board of Directors and one delegate from each state or district Conference;

b) The following licensed or ordained ministers: one who is actively pastoring a church; a full-time employee of the General Conference; those who have met the above qualifications, and have reached retirement age.

**ARTICLE III** 

#### **Business Sessions**

Section 1. All matters of General Conference business shall be open to the discussion of all members present, but only delegates may vote or introduce motions. All delegates shall be seated in a section of the auditorium reserved for them, and no delegate shall be allowed to vote unless seated in the reserved section.

Proposed: Drop the following Phrase: "And no. delegate shall be allowed to vote unless seated in the reserved section.

Section 2. A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of twenty-five duly qualified delegates. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern all questions of parliamentary procedure not covered by this Constitution and By-laws.

Proposed: A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of fifty percent of the recognized delegates at that Conference. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern all questions of parliamentary procedure not covered by this Constitution and By-laws.

#### **ARTICLE IV** Officers of the Conference

Section 3. The qualifications of each director shall be those given in 1 Timothy 3, Titus 1, and such other scriptures as teach the qualifications of church leaders.




This year the Dorm Council was instrumental in acquiring the new washing machines for the men's dorm and updating the Student Handbook for the 1979-80 school year.




### SPORTS



### **PROPOSED AMENDMENTS**

(Continued from page 2)

Section 5. Nominations shall be made from the floor; but voting shall be done by ballot, and no nominee shall be elected unless he receives a majority of the votes cast. In case a majority is not received by any nominee in the first balloting, balloting shall continue after eliminating the name receiving the lowest number of votes, until an election is reached. Each director shall be elected separately.

Proposed: Nominations shall be made from the floor; but voting shall be done by ballot, and no nominee shall be elected unless he receives a majority of the votes cast. The total list of all nominees shall be submitted to the delegates for election. If no majority is reached in the first balloting, the list of nominees shall be reduced to the three receiving the highest number of votes. When no majority is reached with the list of three nominees, the nominee receiving the fewest votes shall be removed from the list. Of the two remaining nominees, the one receiving the majority of votes cast is elected. If other directors are to be elected, all names, except the one(s) previously elected, shall be resubmitted, and the same election process repeated until all positions are filled.

#### BY-LAWS OF THE CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE ARTICLE I

Section 2. The Board of Directors and employees shall walk in a manner worthy of the calling wherewith they are called, "with all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another [throughout the church] in love; endeavoring to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace." In such oneness of spirit they shall unite in an effort to edify the body of Christ in utilizing the contributed strength of the church to affirm by print and voice the following Biblical truths and kindred truths, viz.;

**Proposed:** The Board of Directors and employees shall walk in a manner worthy of the calling wherewith they are called, "with all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another [DROP: "*throughout the church*"] in love; endeavoring to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace." *They shall unite to edify the body of Christ by proclaiming the following Biblical truths:* 

#### Statement of Faith

A. GOD. We believe that only one person is God, and that He is a literal (corporeal) being almighty, eternal, immortal, and the Creator of all things.

**Proposed:** Drop the parentheses around the word "corporeal."

B. JESUS CHRIST. We believe that Jesus Christ, born of the virgin Mary, is the sinless and only begotten Son of God. He did not personally pre-exist.

**Proposed:** We believe that Jesus Christ, born of the virgin Mary, is the sinless and only begotten Son of God. <u>He existed only from his birth.</u> C. THE HOLY SPIRIT. We believe that the

C. THE HOLY SPIRIT. We believe that the Holy Spirit is not a person, but is God's divine power and influence manifest in God's mighty works and in the lives of his people.

**Proposed:** We believe that the Holy Spirit is God's divine power and influence manifest in God's mighty works and in the lives of his people. <u>It is not a person.</u>

D. THE BIBLE. We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, given by divine inspiration, and that

it is the only authoritative source of doctrine and practice for Christians.

**Proposed:** We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, given by divine inspiration. *It is* the only authoritative source of doctrine and practice for Christians.

E. MAN. We believe that man was created innocent, but through disobedience to God fell under condemnation of death—the cessation of all life and consciousness. All men, being both sinful and mortal, are in need of salvation.

**Proposed:** We believe that man was created innocent, but through disobediene to God fell under condemnation of death—the cessation of all life and consciousness. All <u>persons</u>, being both sinful and mortal, are in need of salvation.

F. SALVATION. We believe that salvation is by the grace of God, through the atoning blood of Christ, and that it consists of God's forgiveness of sin, the imparting of His spirit to the believer, and finally the gift of immortality at the resurrection when Christ returns. The steps in the gospel plan of salvation are:

1) Belief of the gospel of the Kingdom and the things concerning Jesus Christ;

2) Sincere repentance for sin, which may be evidenced by confession and restitution;

 Baptism—which is immersion—in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins;

4) Growth in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

**Proposed:** We believe that salvation is by the grace of God, through the atoning blood of Christ. *It* consists of God's forgiveness of sin, the imparting of his spirit to the believer, and finally the gift of immortality at the resurrection when Christ returns. The steps in the gospel plan of salvation are:

1) Belief of the things concerning Jesus Christ, and the gospel of the Kingdom;

2) Sincere repentance and confession of sins;

3) (no change)

4) Receipt of the Holy Spirit;

5) Former number 4. Growth in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. G. THE CHURCH OF GOD, (no change)

H. THE CHRISTIAN LIFE. We believe that the Christian life is primarily a life of consecrated discipleship to Jesus Christ as Lord, Saviour, and Teacher. It will be based on the standards which He taught and exemplified. Thus, it will be characterized by prayerful dependence on God, study of His Word, and faithful stewardship of time and possessions—with tithing as a practical expression of such stewardship. The Church of God will recognize those members who, because of their religious convictions, claim exemption from military service.

**Proposed:** We believe that the Christian life is primarily a life of consecrated discipleship to Jesus Christ as Lord, Savior, and Teacher. <u>It will</u> be exemplified by love, prayer, study of God's Word, development of the fruit of the Spirit, <u>stewardship, and tithing</u>. The Church of God will recognize those members who, because of their religious convictions, claim exemption from military service.

We believe that the Kingdom of God will be established on earth when Christ returns personally and visibly to reign as King in Jerusalem over the whole earth, with the Church as joint-heirs with Him. His millennial reign will be followed by the final judgment and destruction of the wicked, after which will be established "new heavens and a new earth" wherein there will be no more death and God will be all in all.

**Proposed:** <u>THE RETURN OF CHRIST.</u> We believe that the <u>Millennial Kingdom</u> will be established on earth when Christ returns personally and visibly to reign as King in Jerusalem over the whole earth, with the church as joint-heirs with Him. His millennial reign will be followed by the final judgment and destruction of the wicked. (Remainder of the section <u>deleted</u>)—"after which will be established 'new heavens and a new earth' wherein there will be no more death and God will be all in all."

New Section:

K. THE KINGDOM OF GOD. We believe that the Kingdom of God will be established on a renewed and perfect earth, with God being all in all.

ARTICLE II Duties of the Officers Sections 1-5. (no change)

Section 6. (all new material) <u>The Board of</u> Directors shall serve as the Board of Trustees of Oregon Bible College, which was established by the Church of God General Conference August 8, 1939, to educate men and women for the Christian ministries on the collegiate level through programs of Biblical and Theological studies, general education in the arts and sciences, and professional studies in the pastoral ministry, Christian education ministry, music ministry, and church vocational areas deemed desirable.

Section 7. (formerly Section 6 with no changes A through E)

(F) To employ a competent Executive Director who shall be responsible to the Board of Directors for administering the business of the General Conference, for personnel, for planning, for production, and for such specific matters of business as shall be assigned him.

**Proposed:** Eliminate (F) in its entirety.

Former Section G becomes Section F

Former Section H becomes Section G.

Section 7. The work undertaken by the General Conference shall be divided into such departments as may be necessary, each department to be provided with its own head, all under the supervision of the Board of Directors.

**Proposed:** That former Section 7 be eliminated completely.

**ARTICLE V** 

Amendment of the Constitution and By-Laws

Section 1. (no change)

Section 2. (new material) Proposed amendments to the Constitution shall be submitted in writing to the secretary of the Board of Directors by a member church, a member Conference, or the Board of Directors in sufficient time to be properly published.

When the delegates at the 1978 General Conference adopted the amended Study Committee Report, it appeared that some changes in the Constitution and By-laws may be advisable or even necessary. A committee was appointed consisting of Brothers Donald Needham, chairman, John Hearp, Kenneth Vancil, and S. O. Ross as an ex-officio member, to study the present Constitution and By-laws. The above proposals are the results of the committee report and final approval by the Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference. These proposed changes will come up for action to adopt during the business sessions of the 1979 General Conference.

### Annual Report of the Church of God General Conference Board of Directors

Theme: "Awake! Arise! O Church of God"

This report of the Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference was approved at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors on May 3, 1979. The report was prepared and assembled by the Executive Director and the Directors of the various departments and presented to the Board of Directors for approval. The report is presented here so delegates to the 1979 General Conference business sessions (August 6-10, 1979, Rockford College, Rockford, Illinois) can become familiar with it and can be instructed by their churches or state Conferences regarding same.

This report is for the first eight months of the fiscal year. Any special items of interest in the interim will be reported orally at General Conference. The Department Heads and the Executive Director meet as an Executive Council each week. The President of Oregon Bible College meets with the council.

The Director of each department presents a written report to the Executive Director monthly. The business office presents to the Director of each department a financial statement of their department to keep them abreast of their expenditures in relationship to the budget. We are grateful for each departmental Director and all the members of the General Conference staff for their united and dedicated service to the work of the Church of God General Conference. Following is the report of each of the several departments:

### **Publishing Department**

During the past year, this Department has continued to have oversight in two main areas of responsibility:

1) All published material of the Church of God General Conference. Such materials include *The Restitution Herald*, *PROGRESS JOURNAL*, *Challenge*, Sunday School quarterlies, tracts, booklets, study courses, and Oregon Bible College catalog.

2) All printing needs of all of the Conference departments. These items include letterheads, envelopes, order blanks, advertising materials, Mission Builders appeals, and forms.

The format of *The Restitution Herald* was changed slightly during the year to include two sections: 1) an evangelistic section directed toward reaching people who are not Christians; 2) an edification section especially directed toward building up the members of the body.

Though several thousand copies of *The Herald* are distributed each month in racks or through special distribution

programs conducted by the churches, it is becoming apparent that very few people come to our churches as a result of this evangelistic approach. A continuing study is being made of *The Herald* to determine its effectiveness as a means of bringing people to our churches and winning them to Christ.

All of our publications depend upon many dozens of people who receive no remuneration for their writing. I would like to thank all who have written articles, lessons, or other items for us. Without this volunteer help, it would be impossible to carry out our publishing goals.

I am very glad for the opportunity I have had during this year to serve as interim editor of our Conference publications. I have developed a much greater appreciation for all of the efforts that are being put forth in this vital ministry area. —David Krogh.

### Sunday School Department

The Sunday School Department is being operated this year under the direction of a Board consisting of James Graham, Joyce Knapp, Michael Mattison, Scott Ross, and David Krogh, Director.

Two Christian Workers' Seminars were held during 1979 with a total attendance of 84. The first Seminar was held January 8-12 at Francisco Grande near Casa Grande, AZ, and the second was held at Camp Mack near Milford, IN, March 25-31. People from 21 different churches benefited from the practical sessions which were held. We thank God for his blessing upon these learning experiences for Church of God people.

The theme of the 1979 Vacation Bible School material is "Speak Out for God." Charleen Graham, Enid Maddock, Mary Mickey, Paula Kirkpatrick, Carol Daniels, John and Rachel Carr, and David Krogh served as editors for the seven manuals. We very much appreciate the fine work which these individuals have done on this Bible School material.

The theme of the 1980 Bible School material is "God's Great Warriors." The emphasis will be on faith in God. If our churches are to grow, our faith must increase so that we will have the courage to go forward to accomplish the things he would have us do for him.

Sunday School attendance figures for the entire Church of God indicated an upward trend in the last month of 1978. Though there was a slight decline for the final quarter of the (Please turn to page 3)

### **Berean Youth Department**

The Berean Youth Department continues to be thankful for the support shown financially, in service, and prayer by both young people and adults. It has been a good year and we feel blessed as always that the programs sponsored by this department continue to be supported by the participation of individuals and local church youth groups and for this we are grateful. The programs sponsored by the Berean Youth Department include International Berean Youth Conference, Post-high Midwinter Retreat, Mission Dollar Club, Berean Youth Week, and the publication of *Challenge*. A few facts concerning these programs are as follows:

The International Berean Youth Conference was held at Camp Alexander Mack in July, 1978. This was the first time in four years that both the post-high and high school camps had been held together at the same facility. A staff of forty-five adults, seven at the post-high and thirty-eight at the high school level, conducted these two separate programs. Seventytwo post-high and two hundred nine high school campers attended. It proved to be a very successful program and the decision was made to continue the same format for the conference of 1979 to again be held at Camp Alexander Mack.

The annual Post-high Midwinter Retreat was held December 29, 1978, through January 1, 1979, at Camp Mack. This retreat is open only to twelfth graders and post-high students through age twenty-five. This program was also well attended with forty-four young people from eleven different states attending. Despite some adverse weather conditions, all who attended grew spiritually, enjoyed themselves, and termed the retreat a success.

The annual Youth Week competition was held again this year. Fifteen church youth groups sent in reports on their activities of the week. Excellent reports were received from several of the groups and it was difficult for the Youth Advisory Council to choose a winner. However, after much deliberation the Guthrie Grove Bereans of Pelzer, SC, were judged first place. They were followed by the Blood River Bereans of Springfield, LA, and the Phoenix Bereans of Phoenix, AZ. These participating groups and their leaders are to be commended for their hard work and dedication in the service of our Lord.

The publication of the Challenge, a sixteen-page magazine

especially for our young people, continues to be published on a bi-monthly basis. This publication has a circulation of about twelve hundred.

It has been my privilege to serve as the Berean Youth Department Director for the past five years and I would like to thank you for providing me with the opportunity. I would also like to thank the young people for their support of me as well as the department programs over this time period and I pray for God's richest blessings to be yours as you continue to serve him. God bless and thanks again for the opportunity of service.—Hugh W. Harman.

### **Home Missions**

The Home Missions Board consists of: Chairman: Rachel Carr; Secretary: Lois Pryor; Board Members: Kent Ross and Warren Sorenson.

One of the major projects this past year was the Literature Saturation Program. Twenty-one churches participated and at this writing we are receiving their evaluations of the program in their areas.

The Home Missions Board continues to oversee the Mission Builders League and the Church Development Aid (Pastoral Aid) Program. On April 1 special emphasis was given throughout our churches to enrolling new members in the Mission Builders League. Presently there are 1,107 people, churches, and organizations who are helping to provide buildings for sister churches. The Greenville, SC, Church and the Forest Hills, AR, Church were recipients of aid this year.

Churches receiving regular Church Development Aid are North Hills, OH, and North Salem, IN. Special Church Aid is going to our churches in Fremont, NE; Glendale, CA; and Front Royal, VA.

Last summer 4 young people and 2 churches participated in the Short-Term Missionary Program, and this year we are again offering this opportunity for service. In this program the Home Missions Board acts as coordinator, matching willing workers with churches in need of help for a few weeks in the summer.

Members of the Home Missions Board participated in the Christian Workers' Seminars held this year. The classes and sharing sessions included subjects dealing with church growth, witnessing, and the Christian's gifts. A regional Home Missions seminar is planned for the Illinois Conference in June.—*Rachel Carr*.

#### **Foreign Missions**

The Foreign Missions Board consists of: Chairman: Mardy Lawrence; Secretary: Paul Overholser; Board Member: Don Swartz.

The Foreign Missions Board appreciates your patience during this time as we have stopped to take stock of our situation and have made changes in our approach to foreign missions.

We believe we are headed in the right direction and continue to work toward the goal of training workers here to go overseas to teach and train others.

Since our last annual report Steve Grant has completed his studies at Oregon Bible College and is presently enrolled in

We encourage your generous contributions to the Missions Training Fund to assist Steve in his preparation for missionary service.

Members of the Foreign Missions Board have traveled to different parts of the country to present seminars and to participate in missionary conferences. Trips have also been made to India and to Washington where the Philippine work was discussed.

Financial assistance from the General Conference continues to go each month to workers in Ghana, Nigeria, India, and the Philippines. Soon we hope to be able to offer them aid in the form of spiritual guidance and training for service by prepared missionaries.

We thank each of you for your generous prayer and financial support of all our mission work, at home and abroad.—*Mardy Lawrence*.

### **General Conference Finances**

The delegates at the 1978 General Conference voted the largest budget ever adopted by the General Conference in the amount of \$326,000. The Board of Directors, Department Heads, and staff members appreciate the dedicated financial giving of the membership, churches, and state conferences. In mid-year, the giving has fallen somewhat short of the Goals for Giving for the budget items. We believe, however, that with prayer and dedicated concerns the needs will be met. The budget provides the funds for many things. It subsidizes the publications of the General Conference, carries on the mission work both at home and abroad, supports the work of the youth and the Sunday School departments, provides at least half the cost of education of each student at Oregon Bible College, and funds the many general services provided by the General Conference staff.

In addition to meeting the budget needs, the membership provides funds for repayment of the Oregon Bible College Women's Dormitory Building Fund. Other restricted funds provided by the membership are the Oregon Bible College Booster Fund, Oregon Bible College Library Fund, several special mission projects, and so forth. We pray for your continued prayers, concern, and support for all the work of the Church of God General Conference.

#### **General Services**

The Executive Director is automatically the secretarytreasurer of the Church of God Ministers Voluntary Retirement Association. He works closely with local churches in finding replacements for vacant pulpits. He has information on file on pastors and their families and usually knows when a pastor may be available for a "call." Churches seeking pastors are encouraged to contact the Executive Director for assistance in this area. He is responsible for all General Conference personnel, for promotions and public relations, for the upkeep and maintenance of all properties, for the management of the day-to-day business, and generally supervises all the work of the Church of God General Conference. The Executive Director is required to complete many forms and questionnaires from various governmental, civic, and religious agencies.

The Executive Director gives assistance and counsel in Estate Planning, Deferred Investments through annuities, trusts, and life insurance and is available for counsel in any financial matters pertaining to the Church of God General Conference. He and the staff members of the Conference perform many services in addition to departmental activities related in the preceding reports. Staff members are available for special meetings, dedications, state conferences, seminars, workshops, and other activities. They often fill the pulpit when a local pastor is ill or on vacation.

Your Board of Directors, Executive Director, Department Heads, and staff workers of the Church of God General Conference covet your prayers, encouragement, criticism, and concern as they attempt to carry out the programs and policies that have been established and set forth by the delegates of the General Conference.

God has richly blessed the Church of God in many ways. Our prayer is that he will continue to bless each avenue of service of the Church of God General Conference in these latter days. May God soon send his son Jesus Christ back to this earth to establish his wonderful kingdom.

#### **Oregon Bible College Annual Report**

Oregon Bible College makes a significant and specific contribution to the life preparation of young people for Christian Service. A College career is not an end in itself, but is designed and planned with the purpose of preparing people for the basic issues and work of life.

Forty-seven students attended Oregon Bible College during the 1978-79 academic year. The student body came from fourteen different states and represented many different local churches in the Church of God. Nine seniors graduated in May: Stephen Grant, Phoenix, AZ; James Hill, Royal, AR; Michael Hoffman, Tempe, AZ; Kenneth Howe, Frankfort, IN; Donna Kennedy, Eden Valley, MN; Howard Robinson, Front Royal, VA; Alan Shaw, Montrose, MI; Wade Tierney, DeSoto, MO; and Kenneth Walters, Eden Valley, MN. There were fifteen male students in the Men's Dormitory, eighteen female students in the Women's Dormitory, and nine married students during the year.

John Lewis served as President and Instructor during the year; S. O. Ross served as Director of Business Services; Eugene Stilson was Director of Academic Services, Director of the Library, and Instructor; Dale Ramsey was Director of Music and Instructor; Bob Jones was Instructor; Russell Reye was Director of Student Services, Director of Admissions, and Registrar; Sam Voorhies was Director of Christian Service and Instructor; Joe Myers was Director of Student Recruitment and Alumni Relations; Gayle Reye and David Hall served as Dormitory Directors; Diane Rademachir was Director of the Kitchen Staff; and David Krogh was part-time Instructor.

John Lewis, Eugene Stilson, Bob Jones, and Board Member Russell Magaw attended the American Association of Bible Colleges meeting in Chicago during October. Dale Ramsey attended a Music Workshop during the year. Sam Voorhies took several students to a Child Development Seminar in Kentucky in February. John Lewis, Russell Reye, Joe Myers, and Sam Voorhies attended a Success Rally in Chicago in March. Pastor Michael Mattison conducted a Christian Emphasis Week Program in October.

Michael Hoffman served as president of the Student Government; Denise Donaldson and Karen Mitchell were cochairwomen of the student body social committee. James Hill, Gary Burnham, Darlene Burkhart, and Dick Eldred led in Prayer Day activities during the year. Dan Shaw and Vickie Wyrick were co-editors of *Maranatha*. Sam Voorhies was named Director of the Christian Service Program this year; Russell Reye was appointed Director of Student Services, Director of Admissions, and Registrar; Joe Myers donated his time to the College as Director of Student Recruitment and Alumni Relations.

We continued the cooperative educational program with Rock Valley Junior College. During the year it provided our students with classes in General Earth Science, Introduction to Sociology, and Psychology.

The students were very active in many Christian Service Programs involving participation in the activities of local churches and community activities including Nursing Homes, Volunteers In Probation, and Youth Service Bureau. There were many gospel team activities and the Chorale toured the southeastern United States during the spring break.

We appreciate the support of the membership of the Church of God and the dedication of the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees consists of Chairman William Lawrence, Vice-Chairman Harold Doan, Secretary Joe James, Treasurer Russell Magaw, and Directors Dwaine Demmitt, Carroll Bennett, and Don Needham.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

I. We recommend the adoption of the proposed changes to the Constitution and By-laws of the Church of God General Conference as duly published. (Pages 14 and 15, this issue.)

II. We recommend that the Mission Builders League standards for applying for Mission Builders League assistance be amended by adding the following statement to section 8 of the standards:

"In the event that no church request is approved for Mission Builders League assistance, the appeal will be used for capital expenditures for the Church of God General Conference and/or Oregon Bible College. At the time the appeal is mailed, a full explanation of how the funds will be used will be included."

*Explanation:* For the first time in over 20 years, no request from any church is on file for Mission Builders League assistance for the fall appeal. There is, however, a special need for capital funds at the General Conference at this time. During the winter, a major heating system return pipe in the basement floor of the Men's Dormitory sprang a leak and it was necessary to replace the pipe at a cost of \$2,624. Also, during the winter several serious leaks developed in the flat roof on the General Conference building on North 3rd Street, necessitating a new roof.

Additional insulation will be added when the roofing is done, to conserve heating costs. As this is written a firm bid has not been received.

Since no church has made a request for Mission Builders assistance for the fall appeal, and since the aforementioned building needs were not covered by our current operating budget, the adoption of this motion will meet a need at this time, and will be available if no appeals are received at some time in the future.

### MINISTERS' FUND

The Ministers' Fund of the Church of God General Conference is used for loans or gifts to ministers or their families in times of emergency. Since the last report, gifts in the amount of \$900 have been given to three ministers in emergency situations. Two are receiving monthly assistance from this fund in the total amount of \$600 for the year. The Ministers' Fund is supported by contributions from the membership and from churches. As of March 31, 1979 the fund balance is: \$2,803.49. The Fund is administered by the pastors of the Oregon, Rockford, and Dixon, Illinois Churches, the Director of Student Services of Oregon Bible College, and the Executive Director of the Church of God General Conference. S. O. Ross, Secretary.

### MINISTERS VOLUNTARY RETIREMENT ASSOCIATION

The Church of God Ministers Voluntary Retirement Association is growing in strength and stability each year. The funds of the Association are invested by Aetna Life Ins. Co.

At the 1978 biannual meeting several areas of the Rules & Regulations were updated, including refund benefits if one withdraws from the ministry. These refund benefits, however, will not take effect until January 1, 1980.

Presently there are 52 ministers, 58 churches, and seven Conferences in the Association. Eight retired ministers and one retired minister's widow are receiving retirement benefits.

The Board of Trustees is established by the Rules & Regulations of the Association. The Chairman is a minister appointed by the Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference. The Executive Director of the Church of God General Conference is automatically the secretary-treasurer of the Association. The Vice-Chairman is elected by the Association and Brother Dean Urish of Freeport, Illinois, was elected to a four-year term in August of 1978.

Brother Willard Naylor had been Vice-Chairman since the Association was organized in 1968, but chose not to accept the nomination last year. Brother Naylor brought much expertise to the Board of Trustees on investments and related matters and we are grateful for the many years of dedicated service he has given to the Association.

Under our rules, we are not allowed to inject ourselves into a church problem. Most local church problems would be amicably solved if all concerned would exhibit a willing and loving spirit. This Board stands ready to assist a local congregation at any time and in any way possible to strengthen the work of the Church of God. Clyde E. Randall, Chairman.

### **Additional Conference Information**

**Site**: The 1979 Church of God General Conference will be held at Rockford College, Rockford, Illinois, August 6-10. Rockford College is located on East State Street (U.S. Highway Business 20).

If one is traveling on Interstate 90, he would get off the Interstate at the Rockford exit, which is marked Business 20 and State Street (the Henrici Clock Tower Inn is on the east side of the Interstate at the interchange). One would travel from the Interstate west on State Street about 3 miles. One would pass a large Wards store, St. Anthony Hospital, and next is Rockford College on the right. There is a large sign at the entrance.

If one is coming in from the south or west, he would come on Bypass Highway 20, which goes around the City of Rockford on the south side. At the Alpine Interchange (near the east end of Rockford) one would go north on Alpine for about 3 miles to the intersection of State Street. Turn right (east) on State Street about one half mile, and Rockford College will be on the left.

If one is flying to the General Conference, he can come into O'Hare Field in Chicago. There is a shuttle bus leaving every hour (on the half hour) and comes directly to Rockford. The bus can be boarded on the lower level in front of Carson's Circle Restaurant. This is located between TWA and United Airlines. One would get off the bus at the Sweden House (the second stop) in Rockford. A Conference vehicle will meet each bus from O'Hare at Sweden House on Monday, August 6 (Registration Day) from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Other arrivals will be met if we are notified. There are a few flights that come directly to Rockford Airport, mainly on Ozark Airlines. We will make arrangements to pick you up there if we are notified of arrival data.

**Registration:** Registration begins on August 6 at 9:30 a.m. in Burpee Center. At the end of the main entrance to Rockford College is a parking lot marked "A." Please leave your car in parking lot "A" and walk across the street to Burpee Center for registration. At registration your housing assignment will be made. You will then move your automobile to the parking lot assigned for the dormitory in which you will be located.

**Reservations and Camp Costs:** Reservations for General Conference must be made prior to July 25, since we need to notify Rockford College several days before arrival. The pastors of the Churches of God have the necessary registration forms. Isolated members may write to: Reservations, Box 100, Oregon, IL 61061 for the reservation forms.

The cost of the Conference this year is \$55 per adult, \$40 for those 3-12 years of age, and no charge for those under 3 years. This includes room, board, use of the grounds and buildings, insurance, recreational facilities, bed linens, blanket, pillow, and towel.

For those staying off campus and commuting to the meetings, there is a charge of \$8 per person for the use of the facilities, insurance, and miscellaneous costs. Should the commuter wish to take the meals, the total cost of the Conference would be \$35. There is no charge for those 3 years old and under.

There is no charge for one attending the evening services only.

**Youth:** The youth are encouraged to come to General Conference *only* if accompanied by a parent or a responsible guardian. A full schedule of activities is planned for the youth. (See program in this issue.) All youth attending the Conference will be expected to attend all of the planned services and activities.

This action is necessary due to the problems created at the 1979 General Conference. The Conference had to remit to Rockford College considerable funds for breakage and destruction of furniture and equipment which occurred during the Conference. Full cooperation of the youth and parents at this Conference will be appreciated.

**Children's Classes:** A full schedule of activities is planned for all children 8 years of age and under (see program in this issue). Hired sitters are being provided to attend the children 2 years and under and one class each morning from 9:15 to 10:00 will be conducted by Sandi Withers and Ellen Laurent.

Junior Church will be conducted by Pastor C. Joseph Astolfi at 7:00 p.m. each night for those 3 to 12 years of age. **Gymnasium & Pool:** The gymnasium and pool will be open each afternoon from 2:00 to 5:00 for the youth, grades 4 through 12.

The gymnasium and pool will again be open to all each evening from 8:30 to 10:30. Anyone who plans to use the gym must bring gym shoes and proper gym clothing.

Anyone planning to use the pool must bring bathing suit (bikinis not allowed) and girls, or fellows with longer hair, must have bathing cap.

**Delegates Expense Pool:** Each year delegates from the various churches and conferences have opportunity to pool their expenses and thus equalize the cost of travel of those from far away and those who live nearby. Delegate pool expense forms have been mailed to each church and conference secretary and each is urged to enter the pool. This is a fair means of assuring general delegate representation.

### ELECTIONS DURING GENERAL CONFERENCE

**Board of Directors:** Three members will be elected to the Church of God General Conference Board of Directors. The terms of William D. Lawrence, Joe James, and Russell Magaw will expire at General Conference (these cannot be reelected).

At this 1979 General Conference one director will be elected for a three-year term and two directors will be elected for four-year terms. In the future all directors will be elected to four-year terms.

This information is given so churches and State Conferences can instruct their delegates to make particular nominations. Proposed nominees for any of these offices should be contacted beforehand to be sure they will serve if elected and to be sure they are free and able to attend the meetings of this important board.

### BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION

Churches and state conferences are urged to give consideration to whom they would like to nominate to the Board of Directors and should see that the people of their choice are nominated. The candidates should be contacted ahead of time to be sure they will accept and serve if elected.

At the 1979 General Conference one director will be elected for a three-year term and two directors will be elected for four-year terms. The terms of **William D**. **Lawrence, Joe James, and Russell Magaw** expire at this Conference. They cannot be reelected. Following are four sections of the Constitution of the Church of God General Conference dealing with election of Board of Directors:

Section 2. No elected director shall be a paid employee of the Church of God General Conference for a period of longer than two months in any one year.

Section 3. The qualifications of each director shall be those given in 1 Timothy 3, Titus 1, and such other scriptures as teach the qualifications of church leaders.

Section 4. Nominations for each director shall be by General Conference delegates in session at least one day before the day set for the election, and shall not be closed with fewer than two nominees for each directorship.

Section 5. Nominations shall be made from the floor but voting shall be done by ballot, and no nominee shall be elected unless he receives a majority of the votes cast. In case a majority is not received by any nominee in the first balloting, balloting shall continue after eliminating the name receiving the lowest number of votes, until an election is reached. Each director shall be elected separately.

If the proposed amendments to the Constitution are passed before the election, there would be a change in Sections 3 and 5 above. (See the proposed Constitutional amendments in this issue.)

On the evening of April 20, the enemy death claimed the lives of John and Ruth Lewis and Russell Reye. The words of Paul which he spoke to Timothy are brought to mind at this time. These three individuals had indeed fought a good fight. They had indeed kept the faith. And we have absolute confidence that a crown of righteousness is laid up for them, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall grant to them and to all those who love his appearing when he comes again. (2 Tim. 4:7, 8.)

Though we all understand the inevitability of death, and though our great hope is in the resurrection when Jesus comes, a void has been created in our hearts and in the Lord's work because of their loss.

And yet the memory of their exemplary conduct and their faithful and dedicated service will continue to be a pattern which many will follow.

Since the time of his graduation from Oregon Bible College over 20 years ago, Bro. Lewis had committed himself to the cause of the gospel. He had served as pastor of our churches in Eldorado, IL, and Troy View, OH. He had served first as Vice-President and then President of Oregon Bible College. But not only did he serve the Lord during his working hours, he also actively served the Lord in the local congregation. He was one of the most regular and faithful attenders at every service of the church, setting an example not only for the local members, but for the students of the college whom he sought to influence. Sr. Lewis was a faithful wife who encouraged her husband in his ministry and who stood firmly by his side. She had served as a part-time instructor of Oregon Bible College for several years, and she had edited the Truth Seekers Junior Sunday School Quarterly for 10 years. She too was a responsible and involved member of the local church.

Bro. Reye was always active in the Lord's work. He and his wife Gayle were active especially in youth activities at their home church in Columbia Station, OH, before moving to Oregon nine months ago. As Director of Student Services, Russell was in a position to give encouragement and help to the students of Oregon Bible College—help which he freely gave. He too was actively involved in the local church and he and his family were among the most faithful attenders at every service.

It was clear to all observers that these three persons had made the Lord's work their first priority in life.

Our friends were very much aware of the promises of Scripture and their hope can be summarized in the words of King David, when he so eloquently stated his hope, "As for me, I will behold thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with thy likeness" (Psa. 17:15).

Today we take comfort in the knowledge that the next voice these friends and loved ones will hear will be the voice of the one whom they so faithfully served. Come, Lord Jesus. Come quickly.

We the students of Oregon Bible College believe that "all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are called according to his purpose." Our prayer is that this loss will be a gain for the body of Christ as we strive to share with the world the message of hope in which we find comfort during this time of sorrow.

### **Tragedy Strikes**

The staff and entire membership of the Church of God General Conference were saddened by the tragic automobile accident that took the lives of Brother John Lewis, President of Oregon Bible College, his wife Ruth, and Russell Reye, Director of Student Services and Registrar at Oregon Bible College. Their lives and influence upon students and friends is a continuing testimony to the entire membership of the Church of God General Conference.

### **Board of Directors Meets**

The Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference, which also serves as the Board of Trustees of Oregon Bible College, met in Oregon, Illinois, on May 3, 4, and 5. There was much discussion regarding the appointment of President of Oregon Bible College. It appeared that a permanent replacement could not be found by September 1, 1979.

Your Executive Director had resigned his position effective August 31, 1979. The Board of Directors has asked me and I have agreed to continue in the position of Executive Director for one additional year.

David Krogh, who had been appointed to be Executive Director effective September 1, 1979, has agreed to serve as Acting President of Oregon Bible College through the 1979-80 school year.

We covet the concerns and prayers of the membership for the Board of Directors as it selects the new President for the college. We would appreciate receiving information on individuals who may qualify for this important position. We ask for your prayers for the work of the Church of God General Conference and Oregon Bible College in this interim period of transition.

The Board of Directors approved the program and the various reports that will be presented to the delegates at the 1979 General Conference.

Dr. Alva G. Huffer presented to the Board a sample of the slide-sound set on Church of God Doctrines. The Board approved Dr. Huffer to proceed with preparing six master sets of slides. Brother Joe Myers, who had previously accepted the appointment of Youth Director and Director of Student Recruitment for Oregon Bible College, asked the Board to be relieved of this appointment. The Board of Directors accepted Brother Myers' request. Brother Myers has accepted the pastorate of the Pennellwood Church of God in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

The Board reviewed the salary schedule and approved a tentative proposed budget for the next fiscal year.

## Cross-Cultural Training . . . Essential to Effective Service Abroad

The missionary has a life-fulfilling message to proclaim: Through Jesus Christ man can be restored to a right relationship with God and can, under his control, serve his generation well and work through the issues of life in a just and righteous way that brings glory to God.

The gospel applies to all areas of life, and its message is applicable to all cultures. But the avenue or doorway into each culture must be carefully explored so that the message will be clearly understood within the context of that culture.

With cultural distinctives becoming more rigidly held and barriers more difficult to penetrate, it becomes increasingly important that a missionary discover the most effective ways of building positive relationships with people of different cultural background in order to be an effective ambassador for Christ among them.

A missionary's first few weeks abroad are crucial. He will be making decisions consciously and unconsciously during that time which will govern how deeply he will become involved with the people. Those decisions will also greatly affect how well the people will accept him. Cross-cultural training and orientation play a vital part in getting him off on the right foot. The testimony of missionaries who have taken the time for proper prefield training verifies this fact.

A missionary who put this training into practice reports:

"Within a month of Missionary Internship we were on the field and so had practical and immediate opportunity to apply what we learned. We truly praise the Lord for bringing us in contact with M.I. and for using the principles we learned there to give us a smooth adjustment as we entered a very complex cultural and linguistic situation here. Adjustments have not been difficult, and I believe it is because we learned at M.I. how to enter a new culture, what to expect, and perhaps most important of all—proper attitudes toward the cultural and linguistic problems that have arisen."

The foregoing was quoted from a brochure printed by Missionary internship of Farmington, MI. This evangelical agency offers a variety of programs aimed at providing orientation for the overseas missionary.

In the March issue of Advent Christian Missions, there appears a letter from Alice Brown, who has recently entered the Philippines as a missionary. Before going overseas, Miss Brown took the three-week prefield orientation program at M.I. She says, "We grappled with the differences and conflicts that we were all soon to face as we entered into our new countries of service, working through concepts that would help our adjustment. I gained many valuable insights from this program."

We believe that anyone going overseas will want to be as well prepared as possible in order to be of utmost effectiveness for God. We recommend cross-cultural training, such as that offered by M.I., as part of that preparation.

#### **News From India**

Pastor Paulson in Ravulapalem, India, writes that they have had good response from meetings held in the villages. Over 100 indicated their desire to accept Christ as Savior.

The India brethren are grateful for the aid we sent after the cyclone struck their area, and they have repaired their damaged church building.

On the evening of April 20, 1979, four of our number were killed in car accidents.

John Lewis, President of Oregon Bible College, his wife Ruth, and Russell Reye, Director of Student Services, were involved in an accident. Russell and Ruth were killed instantly, and John was dead on arrival at Swedish American Hospital, Rockford, IL.

David Seger, a deacon and Sunday School teacher, was killed earlier the same evening when his new car (one day old), which was parked on an incline in the driveway of his home, ran over him. The deaths of these four fine Christian persons

The deaths of these four fine Christian persons have left our church family stunned and will be felt for many days, but God has been good in giving grace and comfort.

A memorial service was held for Bro. Reye Sunday evening, April 22, at Farrell Funeral Home in Oregon. He was then flown to Columbia Station, Ohio, for another service and burial.

Funeral services for Bro. David Seger were held at the Oregon church, April 23, conducted by Bro. Clyde Randall and assisted by the writer. Afterward he was buried in Washington Grove Cemetery. A memorial has been established in his honor.

Funeral services for John and Ruth Lewis were held at the Oregon Church, April 24, conducted by the writer and assisted by S. O. Ross, Executive Director of the General Conference. They were buried at Daysville Cemetery.

Brother John Humphreys has continued as pastor of the church since it was built and Brothers J. Roy Humphreys and Dean Moore have filled in from time to time.



#### CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

The Constitutional Committee and the Board of Directors propose the following amendments to the present Constitution and By-laws. Where changes are proposed, the present section will be quoted and then the proposed change will be quoted with new material in italics and underlined.

#### FRONT COVER

CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE **Proposed:** Church of God General Conference, headquarters Oregon, Illinois.

ARTICLE II

#### Delegates

**Section 1.** Each member church of fifteen or more members, which has held at least six preaching services during the year, shall be entitled to one delegate for each 50 of its active members or fraction thereof.

#### **Proposed:** Add the following.

<u>Delegates named shall be active members of</u> the Church of God.

**Section 2.** A member church is a Church of God which has on record at headquarters a statement of affiliation with the General Conference.

**Proposed:** A member church is a church of God <u>which adheres to the Statement of Faith</u> <u>contained in this document, and</u> which has on record at headquarters a statement of affiliation with the General Conference.

Section 3. The officers of the Church of God General Conference, together with the licensed ministers of the Conference and one delegate from each state or district conference, shall be considered as delegates-at-large and shall have the same powers as the delegates from the churches.

**Proposed:** <u>These shall be considered as dele-</u> <u>gates at large:</u>

a) The Board of Directors and one delegate from each state or district Conference;

b) The following licensed or ordained ministers: one who is actively pastoring a church; a full-time employee of the General Conference; those who have met the above qualifications, and have reached retirement age.

#### **ARTICLE III**

**Business Sessions** 

Section 1. All matters of General Conference business shall be open to the discussion of all members present, but only delegates may vote or introduce motions. All delegates shall be seated in a section of the auditorium reserved for them, and no delegate shall be allowed to vote unless seated in the reserved section.

**Proposed:** Drop the following Phrase: <u>"And no</u> <u>delegate shall be allowed to vote unless seated in</u> <u>the reserved section."</u>

**Section 2.** A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of twenty-five duly qualified delegates. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern all questions of parliamentary procedure not covered by this Constitution and By-laws.

**Proposed:** <u>A quorum for the transaction of</u> <u>business shall consist of fifty percent of the</u> <u>recognized delegates at that Conference.</u> Robert's Rules of Order shall govern all questions of parliamentary procedure not covered by this Constitution and By-laws.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

Officers of the Conference Section 3. The qualifications of each director shall be those given in 1 Timothy 3, Titus 1, and such other scriptures as teach the qualifications of church leaders.

PROGRESS JOURNAL

Proposed: Add the following phrase: A director may be either male or female.

Section 5. Nominations shall be made from the floor; but voting shall be done by ballot, and no nominee shall be elected unless he receives a majority of the votes cast. In case a majority is not received by any nominee in the first balloting, balloting shall continue after eliminating the name receiving the lowest number of votes, until an election is reached. Each director shall be elected separately.

Proposed: Nominations shall be made from the floor; but voting shall be done by ballot, and no nominee shall be elected unless he receives a majority of the votes cast. The total list of all nominees shall be submitted to the delegates for election. If no majority is reached in the first balloting, the list of nominees shall be reduced to the three receiving the highest number of votes. When no majority is reached with the list of three nominees, the nominee receiving the fewest votes shall be removed from the list. Of the two remaining nominees, the one receiving the majority of votes cast is elected. If other directors are to be elected, all names, except the one(s) previously elected, shall be resubmitted, and the same election process repeated until all positions are filled.

#### **BY-LAWS OF THE CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE ARTICLE I**

Section 2. The Board of Directors and employees shall walk in a manner worthy of the calling wherewith they are called, "with all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another [throughout the church] in love; endeavoring to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace." In such oneness of spirit they shall unite in an effort to edify the body of Christ in y utilizing the contributed strength of the church to affirm by print and voice the following Biblical truths and kindred truths, viz.;

Proposed: The Board of Directors and employees shall walk in a manner worthy of the calling wherewith they are called, "with all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another [DROP: "throughout the church"] in love; endeavoring to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace." They shall unite to edify the body of Christ by proclaiming the following Biblical truths:

#### Statement of Faith

A. GOD. We believe that only one person is God, and that He is a literal (corporeal) beingalmighty, eternal, immortal, and the Creator of all things.

Proposed: Drop the parentheses around the word "corporeal."

B. JESUS CHRIST. We believe that Jesus Christ, born of the virgin Mary, is the sinless and only begotten Son of God. He did not personally pre-exist.

Proposed: We believe that Jesus Christ, born of the virgin Mary, is the sinless and only begotten Son of God. He existed only from his birth.

C. THE HOLY SPIRIT. We believe that the Holy Spirit is not a person, but is God's divine power and influence manifest in God's mighty works and in the lives of his people.

Proposed: We believe that the Holy Spirit is God's divine power and influence manifest in God's mighty works and in the lives of his people. It is not a person.

D. THE BIBLE. We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, given by divine inspiration, and that it is the only authoritative source of doctrine and practice for Christians.

Proposed: We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, given by divine inspiration. It is the only authoritative source of doctrine and practice for Christians.

E. MAN. We believe that man was created innocent, but through disobedience to God fell under condemnation of death-the cessation of all life and consciousness. All men, being both sinful and mortal, are in need of salvation.

Proposed: We believe that man was created innocent, but through disobediene to God fell under condemnation of death-the cessation of all life and consciousness. All persons, being both sinful and mortal, are in need of salvation.

F. SALVATION. We believe that salvation is by the grace of God, through the atoning blood of Christ, and that it consists of God's forgiveness of sin, the imparting of His spirit to the believer, and finally the gift of immortality at the resurrection when Christ returns. The steps in the gospel plan of salvation are:

1) Belief of the gospel of the Kingdom and the things concerning Jesus Christ;

2) Sincere repentance for sin, which may be evidenced by confession and restitution;

3) Baptism-which is immersion-in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins;

4) Growth in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Proposed: We believe that salvation is by the grace of God, through the atoning blood of Christ. It consists of God's forgiveness of sin, the imparting of his spirit to the believer, and finally the gift of immortality at the resurrection when Christ returns. The steps in the gospel plan of salvation are:

1) Belief of the things concerning Jesus Christ, and the gospel of the Kingdom;

2) Sincere repentance and confession of

sins; 3) (no change)

4) Receipt of the Holy Spirit;

5) Former number 4. Growth in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

G. THE CHURCH OF GOD. (no change)

H. THE CHRISTIAN LIFE. We believe that the Christian life is primarily a life of consecrated discipleship to Jesus Christ as Lord, Saviour, and Teacher. It will be based on the standards which He taught and exemplified. Thus, it will be characterized by prayerful dependence on God, study of His Word, and faithful stewardship of time and possessions-with tithing as a practical expression of such stewardship. The Church of God will recognize those members who, because of their religious convictions, claim exemption from military service.

Proposed: We believe that the Christian life is primarily a life of consecrated discipleship to Jesus Christ as Lord, Savior, and Teacher. It will be exemplified by love, prayer, study of God's Word, development of the fruit of the Spirit, stewardship, and tithing. The Church of God will recognize those members who, because of their religious convictions, claim exemption from military service.

I. ISRAEL. (no change)

J. THE KINGDOM OF GOD. We believe that the Kingdom of God will be established on earth when Christ returns personally and visibly to reign as King in Jerusalem over the whole earth, with the Church as joint-heirs with Him. His millennial reign will be followed by the final judgment and destruction of the wicked, after which will be established "new heavens and a new earth" wherein there will be no more death and God will be all in all.

Proposed: THE RETURN OF CHRIST. We believe that the Millennial Kingdom will be established on earth when Christ returns personally and visibly to reign as King in Jerusalem over the whole earth, with the church as joint-heirs with Him. His millennial reign will be followed by the final judgment and destruction of the wicked. (Remainder of the section deleted)—"after which will be established 'new heavens and a new earth' wherein there will be no more death and God will be all in all.

New Section:

K. THE KINGDOM OF GOD. We believe that the Kingdom of God will be established on a renewed and perfect earth, with God being all in all.

#### **ARTICLE II**

**Duties of the Officers** Sections 1-5. (no change)

Section 6. (all new material) The Board of Directors shall serve as the Board of Trustees of Oregon Bible College, which was established by the Church of God General Conference August 8, 1939, to educate men and women for the Christian ministries on the collegiate level through programs of Biblical and Theological studies, general education in the arts and sciences, and professional studies in the pastoral ministry, Christian education ministry, music ministry, and church vocational areas deemed desirable.

Section 7. (formerly Section 6 with no changes A through E)

(F) To employ a competent Executive Director who shall be responsible to the Board of Directors for administering the business of the General Conference, for personnel, for planning, for production, and for such specific matters of business as shall be assigned him.

Proposed: Eliminate (F) in its entirety.

Former Section G becomes Section F.

Former Section H becomes Section G.

Section 7. The work undertaken by the General Conference shall be divided into such departments as may be necessary, each department to be provided with its own head, all under the supervision of the Board of Directors.

Proposed: That former Section 7 be eliminated completely

ARTICLE V

Amendment of the Constitution and By-Laws

Section 1. (no change)

Section 2. (new material) Proposed amendments to the Constitution shall be submitted in writing to the secretary of the Board of Directors by a member church, a member Conference, or the Board of Directors in sufficient time to be properly published. INCLUDE ORGANIZATIONAL CHART.

#### **EXPLANATION:**

When the delegates at the 1978 General Conference adopted the amended Study Committee Report, it appeared that some changes in the Constitution and By-laws may be advisable or even necessary. A committee was appointed consisting of Brothers Donald Needham, chairman, John Hearp, Kenneth Vancil, and S.O. Ross as an ex-officio member, to study the present Constitution and By-laws. The above proposals are the results of the committee report and final approval by the Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference. These proposed changes will come up for action to adopt during the business sessions of the 1979 General Conference.

#### **Conference Finances**

The delegates to the 1978 General Conference approved a budget for the current fiscal year which requires monthly contributions in the amount of \$27,167. Except for the months of April and May, the giving has fallen far short of this amount each month. We therefore dropped behind each month and are now needing \$31,019 to make up the to-date deficit in giving. This, of course, makes the current needs a very large sum. We have borrowed \$21,000 to try to meet the current needs.

There will be no PROGRESS JOURNAL in August, so we show the July-August needs in the Goals for Giving. We covet your prayers and concerns that these needs will be met.

#### Update on Ghana

In a report from Pastor Oliver Amani he tells about the "house churches" and the school he operates.

Missions News

The "house churches" are groups that meet in the various homes of members for the purpose of Bible study and worship. Meetings are held on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings, and in addition there are daily morning devotions from 5:00 to 5:30.

Each group chooses its own leader, considering such characteristics as zeal, faithfulness, good morals, and especially his knowledge of Scripture. Once each guarter Bro. Amani organizes a "doctrinal orientation course" for leaders, using the General Conference publication "Words of Truth" (a subject concordance).

Members of these groups give tithes and offerings, half of which go for pastoral support and half for miscellaneous expenses.

Presently there are 7 house churches with an average of 18 members in each group.

A total of 104 students (67 boys and 37 girls) are attending the school. Of this number, 49 are baptized members of the Church of God and 11 more are being prepared for baptism. There are 4 men teachers and 2 women teachers, each giving instruction in two subjects. The instructors receive small salaries from students' tuition fees.

Bro. Amani personally teaches the two required Bible courses: the General Certificate of Education Bible Course, based on a government-approved syllabus, and the Systematic Bible Study Course on Church of God doctrine. Students attend these classes a total of 6 hours each week.

#### India Scooter

Funds are still needed for purchasing a motor scooter for Pastor Noel in Bangalore, India. In order for him to effectively minister to the members of the three churches, he needs a dependable means of transportation. Any contributions will be appreciated by him and us. #### **Philippine Conference**

April 10-13 the members of the Philippine Churches of God gathered at the Quezon Church for their 18th annual conference. This year's theme was "Self-Sacrifice" and lectures and classes emphasized the sacrificial giving of tithes. Two evangelistic night meetings offered the opportunity for persons of different faiths to come and join in an open forum. Two people of the Quezon Church submitted themselves for baptism during the conference.

#### Transition

Because of the tragic deaths of John and Ruth Lewis and Russell Reye, the past few weeks have been difficult for our College family. However, the Lord has sustained us. He has given us strength and help. And though it will take a long time for the void in our lives to be filled, we have the assurance that the God who has asked us to cast all of our cares on him will continue to sustain us in the coming weeks and months.

During this time of tragedy, our student body has maintained a mature and stable posture. They performed superbly in pulling themselves together and they applied themselves with special diligence to complete the school year.

As was previously announced, the Board of Trustees has asked me to serve as Acting President through the coming school year. I did not seek this position, but neither did I shrink from accepting this great responsibility when the Board asked me to serve. I have continually asked the Lord to use me to do whatever he wanted me to do. And though I have not always understood why God was asking me to do certain things, I have always had an overriding confidence that he knows what is best for me and what is best for his work. And so with your support, with the help of the faculty and staff of the College, and with the cooperation of the students, I will fill this position in the best way that I can.

Oregon Bible College is very fortunate to have an excellent faculty. Our faculty consists of men of Christian character. They are men who have a strong commitment to the truth of the Scriptures. They have a Biblical philosophy of education. And they have adequate preparation in undergraduate and graduate studies.

I believe that God wants Oregon Bible College to continue without hesitation in the work of training leaders for the Church of God. I believe that God continues to call us to excellence, and I don't believe he is satisfied with second best. Therefore, we will rise above the recent tragedy and zealously carry on with the work God has called us to do.

We very earnestly solicit your prayers for the work of our College. We urge you to pray that the Lord of the harvest will send young men and women to us who will prepare for work in bringing in the harvest. We welcome your comments and suggestions regarding our programs and activities.

#### Commencement

At commencement exercises in the Oregon Church of God on Friday night, May 11, 1979, nine seniors were graduated. Pastor David Wilsterman of the Church of the Open Bible in Pomona, California, was the commencement speaker. Michael Hoffman, President of the Student Government, spoke words of welcome to those who attended, and Ken Howe, President of the Senior Class, made brief remarks on behalf of the class. Members of the faculty took part in various ways in the program.

#### **Golden Rule Building Progress**

Work is progressing on the remodeling of the Golden Rule Building on the College campus. The interior walls have been removed and construction of new room partitions will begin soon.

Present plans call for offices and a Conference room to be constructed on the main floor, and four classrooms and a lounge on the upper floor.

We hope to have the project completed by early summer of 1980. Completion will centralize most of the College activities in one general area in Oregon.

Consideration is being given to an overall campus development plan which will enable us to most effectively use the land available to us.

#### **Booster Campaign**

In April, former President John Lewis asked the membership of the Church of God to become Boosters of Oregon Bible College by sending contributions and by agreeing to pray regularly for the work of the College. He stated that previous Booster campaigns had generated in excess of \$3,000 in contributions, and he stated that we were praying and trusting that we would receive in excess of \$5,000 this year. As of this writing, approximately \$4,000 has been received. Contributions are still being received, and we trust that, if you have not yet responded to this appeal, you will do so immediately.

Funds collected in this appeal will be used to print the Oregon Bible College Catalog, to send several of our staff members to a Bible College Seminar, and to support the operation of our library.

Our thanks is extended to all of you who have sent contributions and agreed to pray for the College.

#### **Board of Trustees Meet**

The Board of Trustees for Oregon Bible College, which is also the Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference, met May 3-5 in Oregon. Two important documents were approved by the Board which will lend stability to the College, especially during this critical time of transition. The first document approved was the Constitution and By-Laws of Oregon Bible College. This document is a complement to the Constitution and By-Laws of the General Conference. Its purpose is to tightly link the College to the General Conference, and it clarifies that the people of the Church of God have full and final authority over College affairs through the Board of Trustees which they elect. The By-Laws spell out the duties of the Trustees, the Administrative Officers of the College, and the faculty.

The second document adopted was the Oregon Bible College Organization and Administration Handbook for Administrators and Faculty Members. This policy manual provides rather detailed job descriptions for the faculty and staff of the College, as well as pointing out the relationships between these individuals.

The approval by the Trustees of these two policy documents will provide continuity to the College program and will clarify our working relationships.

The Trustees also spent many hours discussing the selection of a new permanent President for the College. A Search Committee—consisting of Don Needham, Eugene Stilson, Charles Pryor, and David Krogh—was appointed to seek possible candidates for this position. Suggestions of individuals who might qualify for this position would be appreciated from the membership of the Church of God.

#### Marriage

Sam Voorhies, our Christian Education instructor, will be married July 28 to Emily DeFee. In connection with her work, Emily has been offered a position in Nairobi, Kenya, so Sam and Emily will be going to Africa in January, 1980. Sam will continue to serve on the staff during our Fall Semester, teaching courses in Christian Education.

We pray God's blessing on this couple as they begin their life together.

#### Dean of Women

Gayle Reye has been appointed to serve as Dean of Women during the coming school year. She will serve as Director of the Women's Dormitory and also be involved in several Student Services activities. In the Student Services area, she will be assuming several of the responsibilities handled by her husband Russell before his death in April. We are happy that Gayle has agreed to be a part of our staff during the coming year.

At the close of the Spring Semester, the student body elected Bobby Lee Partain as the Student Government President for the coming school year. When College begins the end of August, each class will elect one of its members to serve in the Student Government along with the President. The President of the College will serve as the faculty adviser for this organization during the next school year.

Many others have served on this Board over the years and we appreciate the work that all of these individuals have done in the development of Oregon Bible College.

With the termination of the Board of Education, the Board of Trustees of the College will assume full responsibility for governing College affairs. Three Directors-Trustees will be elected by the delegates at General Conference next month. I trust that each church and conference will give careful consideration to people who could serve effectively in these positions.

#### **Berean Youth Conference Classes**

There have been several requests for information concerning the classes which are taught each year at Berean Youth Conference. The following are the class descriptions of those being taught this year:

#### Not Individuals, but a Body

This is an exciting class of discovery—the discovery of the fact that we are parts of the body of Christ. As parts, we have something to give to the overall cause of Christ. Based on 1 Corinthians 12:27, "Now ye are the body of Christ, and members in particular," this class will attempt to reveal the marvelous place a Christian youth has in the church. It will deal with the God-given abilities that each possesses and give guidelines for his ministry to the body. "To equip God's people for work in his service, to the building up of the body of Christ. ... Bonded and knit together by every constituent joint, the whole frame grows through the due activity of each part, and builds itself up in love" (Eph. 4:12-16, NEB).

#### **Personal Vultures**

Pride, jealousy, anger, hate, lust, fear, vengeance, guilt—these are personal vultures. "Birds" that prey on the very life of our Christianity, they can and will destroy the blessings God has in store for us.

This class is designed to help the Christian youth overcome these vultures. It deals with the interpersonal relations of Christians: how to deal with guilt; freedom through forgiveness; overcoming pride; what to do when you are confused; how God deals with fear, and much more.

#### **Becoming a Prayer Warrior**

"Pray without ceasing" (1 Thes. 5:17). This is another "discovery class" and it deals with an exciting Bible subject—prayer. Some say it is a key to a Christian's life. This class will deal with becoming a warrior in prayer. We know that when we pray things happen. This class is designed to help the Christian teen in the quest for a dynamic and victorious prayer life. Answers, helps, examples, when to pray, how to pray, why pray, and much more will be examined.

#### **Temple Maintenance**

"Surely you know that you are God's temple, where the Spirit of God dwells" (1 Cor. 3:16, NEB). This is a very precious Bible truth; yet we sometimes forget, and the temple may need repair, cleaning, or even remodeling. (Please turn to page 10) SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS

These figures show an average decline of about 8% from 1978 to 1979. According to my records, there were more churches and Sunday Schools closed for one or more Sundays in 1979 than in 1978 because of severe snowstorms.

#### A Tribute to Sunday School Board Members

As a result of the Study Committee report adopted by the delegates at the 1978 General Conference, the Sunday School Board will be terminated at General Conference time next month. The work of the Board will be carried on by the Outreach and Church Development and Publishing Departments, the Executive Council of the Conference, and committees or consultants who will be appointed from time to time for special assignments.

The present members of the Sunday School Board have served faithfully for a number of years as follows: Joyce Knapp—10 years; Scott Ross—8 years (nearly a year of which he served as part-time Director of the Department); Jim Graham—6 years; Michael Mattison —3 years.

These individuals have spent hundreds of hours serving as seminar and workshop leaders, planning and carrying out Sunday School projects, writing for quarterlies and teachers' guides, and directing the work of this department. In the past 10 years, many improvements have been made in our Sunday School quarterlies and Vacation Bible School material. Christian Workers' Seminars were started under the direction of this Board and they have become a valuable tool in teaching hundreds of Church of God people to be more effective Christian workers.

I have appreciated the opportunity to work with these people during the past several years. Their insights and knowledge have helped to stimulate great progress in the Church of God.

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION**

Churches and state conferences are urged to give consideration to whom they would like to nominate to the Board of Directors and should see that the people of their choice are nominated. The candidates should be contacted ahead of time to be sure they will accept and serve if elected.

At the 1979 General Conference one director will be elected for a three-year term and two directors will be elected for four-year terms. The terms of William D. Lawrence, Joe James, and Russell Magaw expire at this Conference. They cannot be reelected. Following are four sections of the Constitution of the Church of God General Conference dealing with election of Board of Directors:

Section 2. No elected director shall be a paid employee of the Church of God General Conference for a period of longer than two months in any one year.

Section 3. The qualifications of each director shall be those given in 1 Timothy 3, Titus 1, and such other scriptures as teach the gualifications of church leaders.

Section 4. Nominations for each director shall be by General Conference delegates in session at least one day before the day set for the election, and shall not be closed with fewer than two nominees for each directorship.

Section 5. Nominations shall be made from the floor but voting shall be done by ballot, and no nominee shall be elected unless he receives a majority of the votes cast. In case a majority is not received by any nominee in the first balloting, balloting shall continue after eliminating the name receiving the lowest number of votes, until an election is reached. Each director shall be elected separately.

If the proposed amendments to the Constitution are passed before the election, there would be a change in Sections 3 and 5 above. (See the proposed Constitutional amendments in this issue.)

When death comes so swiftly to a loved one in the Lord, the living cannot adjust in like manner. Our search for life in great quantities of days and years seems unbounded. But Russell Reye's short 36 years reminds us that quality of life counts most.

The lifestyle that Bro. Reye enjoyed certainly deserves emulation by those who loved him. As a family man he was a compassionate, constant, and true husband and father. Few men alive stand as strongly for moral principle as did Russ Reye. Yet his staunch sense of right and wrong did not limit his reach into the lives of others. Because of his moral fibre he touched hearts with compassion, concern, and care. He could be called day or night; we could show up on his doorstep "any time," and he would take us in. It's been a long time since a man cared as much as did this man.

In addition, Russ was a man of humor. His stories and practical jokes provided gaiety for the whole neighborhood. In all this, Russ was motivated to morality, love, and laughter by his complete trust in the known will of God, revealed in the Bible and the life of Christ. In following God's way he led us toward a closer walk with the Lord. Whether he was encouraging prayer in the school classroom, leading teen-agers to Christ through

the church youth group, sharing his walk with Christ in community functions, or lending his leadership in Columbia Church of God, Russ always gave the last full measure of himself. By the way he lived, Russ fulfilled one of his

By the way he lived, Russ fulfilled one of his personal goals as expressed in a favorite scripture: "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (Micah 6:8.)

May our hope in the resurrection of all the faithful at Christ's return as expressed in 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 comfort us until that day dawns.

#### CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

The Constitutional Committee and the Board of Directors propose the following amendments to the present Constitution and By-laws. Where changes are proposed, the present section will be quoted and then the proposed change will be quoted with new material in italics and underlined.

#### FRONT COVER

CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE **Proposed:** Church of God General Conference, *headquarters Oregon, Illinois.* 

#### ARTICLE II Delegates

Section 1. Each member church of fifteen or more members, which has held at least six preaching services during the year, shall be entitled to one delegate for each 50 of its active members or fraction thereof.

#### **Proposed:** Add the following.

<u>Delegates named shall be active members of</u> the Church of God.

**Section 2.** A member church is a Church of God which has on record at headquarters a statement of affiliation with the General Conference.

**Proposed:** A member church is a church of God *which adheres to the Statement of Faith contained in this document, and* which has on record at headquarters a statement of affiliation with the General Conference.

Section 3. The officers of the Church of God General Conference, together with the licensed ministers of the Conference and one delegate from each state or district conference, shall be considered as delegates-at-large and shall have the same powers as the delegates from the churches.

**Proposed:** These shall be considered as delegates at large:

a) The Board of Directors and one delegate from each state or district Conference;

b) The following licensed or ordained ministers: one who is actively pastoring a church; a full-time employee of the General Conference; those who have met the above qualifications, and have reached retirement age.

#### ARTICLE III Business Sessions

Section 1. All matters of General Conference business shall be open to the discussion of all members present, but only delegates may vote or introduce motions. All delegates shall be seated in a section of the auditorium reserved for them, and no delegate shall be allowed to vote unless seated in the reserved section.

**Proposed:** Drop the following Phrase: <u>"And no</u> <u>delegate shall be allowed to vote unless seated in</u> <u>the reserved section.</u>"

Section 2. A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of twenty-five duly qualified delegates. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern all questions of parliamentary procedure not covered by this Constitution and By-laws.

**Proposed:** A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of fifty percent of the recognized delegates at that Conference. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern all questions of parliamentary procedure not covered by this Constitution and By-laws.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

#### Officers of the Conference

**Section 3.** The qualifications of each director shall be those given in 1 Timothy 3, Titus 1, and such other scriptures as teach the qualifications of church leaders.

**Proposed:** Add the following phrase: <u>A di</u>rector may be either male or female.

Section 5. Nominations shall be made from the floor; but voting shall be done by ballot, and no nominee shall be elected unless he receives a majority of the votes cast. In case a majority is not received by any nominee in the first balloting, balloting shall continue after eliminating the name receiving the lowest number of votes, until an election is reached. Each director shall be elected separately.

Proposed: Nominations shall be made from the floor; but voting shall be done by ballot, and no nominee shall be elected unless he receives a majority of the votes cast. The total list of all nominees shall be submitted to the delegates for election. If no majority is reached in the first balloting, the list of nominees shall be reduced to the three receiving the highest number of votes. When no majority is reached with the list of three nominees, the nominee receiving the fewest votes shall be removed from the list. Of the two remaining nominees, the one receiving the majority of votes cast is elected. If other directors are to be elected, all names, except the one(s) previously elected, shall be resubmitted, and the same election process repeated until all positions are filled.

#### BY-LAWS OF THE CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE ARTICLE I

Section 2. The Board of Directors and employees shall walk in a manner worthy of the calling wherewith they are called, "with all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another [throughout the church] in love; endeavoring to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace." In such oneness of spirit they shall unite in an effort to edify the body of Christ in utilizing the contributed strength of the church to affirm by print and voice the following Biblical truths and kindred truths, viz.;

**Proposed:** The Board of Directors and employees shall walk in a manner worthy of the calling wherewith they are called, "with all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another [DROP: "throughout the church"] in love; endeavoring to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace." They shall unite to edify the body of Christ by proclaiming the following Biblical truths:

Statement of Faith

A. GOD. We believe that only one person is God, and that He is a literal (corporeal) being almighty, eternal, immortal, and the Creator of all things.

**Proposed:** Drop the parentheses around the word "corporeal."

B. JESUS CHIRIST. We believe that Jesus Christ, born of the virgin Mary, is the sinless and only begotten Son of God. He did not personally pre-exist.

**Proposed:** We believe that Jesus Christ, born of the virgin Mary, is the sinless and only begotten Son of God. He existed only from his birth.

C. THE HOLY SPIRIT. We believe that the Holy Spirit is not a person, but is God's divine power and influence manifest in God's mighty works and in the lives of his people.

**Proposed:** We believe that the Holy Spirit is God's divine power and influence manifest in God's mighty works and in the lives of his people. *It is not a person.* 

D. THE BIBLE. We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, given by divine inspiration, and that it is the only authoritative source of doctrine and practice for Christians.

**Proposed:** We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, given by divine inspiration. *It* is the only authoritative source of doctrine and practice for Christians.

E. MAN. We believe that man was created innocent, but through disobedience to God fell under condemnation of death—the cessation of all life and consciousness. All men, being both sinful and mortal, are in need of salvation.

**Proposed:** We believe that man was created innocent, but through disobediene to God fell under condemnation of death—the cessation of all life and consciousness. All <u>persons</u>, being both sinful and mortal, are in need of salvation.

F. SALVATION. We believe that salvation is by the grace of God, through the atoning blood of Christ, and that it consists of God's forgiveness of sin, the imparting of His spirit to the believer, and finally the gift of immortality at the resurrection when Christ returns. The steps in the gospel plan of salvation are:

1) Belief of the gospel of the Kingdom and the things concerning Jesus Christ;

2) Sincere repentance for sin, which may be evidenced by confession and restitution;

3) Baptism—which is immersion—in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins;

4) Growth in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

**Proposed:** We believe that salvation is by the grace of God, through the atoning blood of Christ. *It* consists of God's forgiveness of sin, the imparting of his spirit to the believer, and finally the gift of immortality at the resurrection when Christ returns. The steps in the gospel plan of salvation are:

1) Belief of the things concerning Jesus Christ, and the gospel of the Kingdom;

2) Sincere repentance and confession of sins;

#### 3) (no change)

4) Receipt of the Holy Spirit;

5) Former number 4. Growth in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

G. THE CHURCH OF GOD. (no change)

H. THE CHRISTIAN LIFE. We believe that the Christian life is primarily a life of consecrated discipleship to Jesus Christ as Lord, Saviour, and Teacher. It will be based on the standards which He taught and exemplified. Thus, it will be characterized by prayerful dependence on God, study of His Word, and faithful stewardship of time and possessions—with tithing as a practical expression of such stewardship. The Church of God will recognize those members who, because of their religious convictions, claim exemption from military service.

**Proposed:** We believe that the Christian life is primarily a life of consecrated discipleship to Jesus Christ as Lord, Savior, and Teacher. <u>It will</u> be exemplified by love, prayer, study of God's Word, development of the fruit of the Spirit, stewardship, and tithing. The Church of God will recognize those members who, because of their religious convictions, claim exemption from military service.

I. ISRAEL. (no change)

J. THE KINGDOM OF GOD. We believe that the Kingdom of God will be established on earth when Christ returns personally and visibly to reign as King in Jerusalem over the whole earth, with the Church as joint-heirs with Him. His millennial reign will be followed by the final judgment and destruction of the wicked, after which will be established "new heavens and a new earth" wherein there will be no more death and God will be all in all.

**Proposed:** <u>THE RETURN OF CHRIST.</u> We believe that the <u>Millennial Kingdom</u> will be established on earth when Christ returns personally and visibly to reign as King in Jerusalem over the whole earth, with the church as joint-heirs with Him. His millennial reign will be followed by the final judgment and destruction of the wicked. (Remainder of the section <u>deleted</u>)—"after which will be established 'new heavens and a new earth' wherein there will be no more death and God will be all in all."

New Section:

K. THE KINGDOM OF GOD. We believe that the Kingdom of God will be established on a renewed and perfect earth, with God being all in all.

#### ARTICLE II

Duties of the Officers Sections 1-5. (no change)

Section 6. (all new material) <u>The Board of</u> Directors shall serve as the Board of Trustees of Oregon Bible College, which was established by the Church of God General Conference August 8, 1939, to educate men and women for the Christian ministries on the collegiate level through programs of Biblical and Theological studies, general education in the arts and sciences, and professional studies in the pastoral ministry, Christian education ministry, music ministry, and church vocational areas deemed desirable.

Section 7. (formerly Section 6 with no changes A through E)

(F) To employ a competent Executive Director who shall be responsible to the Board of Directors for administering the business of the General Conference, for personnel, for planning, for production, and for such specific matters of business as shall be assigned him.

**Proposed:** Eliminate (F) in its entirety.

Former Section G becomes Section F.

Former Section H becomes Section G.

Section 7. The work undertaken by the General Conference shall be divided into such departments as may be necessary, each department to be provided with its own head, all under the supervision of the Board of Directors.

**Proposed:** That former Section 7 be eliminated completely.

ARTICLE V

Amendment of the Constitution and By-Laws

Section 1. (no change) <u>Section 2.</u> (new material) <u>Proposed amend-</u> ments to the Constitution shall be submitted in writing to the secretary of the Board of Directors by a member church, a member Conference, or the Board of Directors in sufficient time to be properly published.

#### **EXPLANATION:**

When the delegates at the 1978 General Conference adopted the amended Study Committee Report, it appeared that some changes in the Constitution and By-laws may be advisable or even necessary. A committee was appointed consisting of Brothers Donald Needham, chairman, John Hearp, Kenneth Vancil, and S. O. Ross as an ex-officio member, to study the present Constitution and By-laws. The above proposals are the results of the committee report and final approval by the Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference. These proposed changes will come up for action to adopt during the business sessions of the 1979 General Conference.

The Sorensons have two children, Ron and Leanne, who will continue to live in Arizona.




#### **Office Manager**

# **General Conference Progress**



#### **1979** General Conference

The 59th Annual Church of God General Conference convened at Rockford College, Rockford, Illinois, August 6 through 10. From various parts of the United States and Canada, 563 persons enjoyed a very inspirational Conference. There were 162 voting delegates compared to 178 delegates in 1978.

James Graham and Shirley Urish were each elected to a four-year term on the Board of Directors, and Charles Pryor was elected to a three-year term. Henceforth, all terms of the Board of Directors will be for four vears.

The seven directors elect their own officers. For the next Conference year the officers are: Harold Doan, Chairman; Dwaine Demmitt, Vice-Chairman; Shirley Urish, Secretary; Carroll Bennett, Treasurer; and Donald Needham, James Graham, and Charles Pryor, Directors.

William Lawrence, Joe James, and Russell Magaw completed their terms of office on the Board of Directors and could not be reelected in accordance with the Constitution. We appreciate the dedicated service of these outgoing officers during the past three years.

The proposed amendments to the Constitution were adopted with some changes. Recommendation #2 regarding changes in the Mission Builders League Standards was adopted.

Resolutions of commendation were adopted on behalf of the Sunday School Board, the Home Missions Board, the Foreign Missions Board, the Board of Education of Oregon Bible College, and the Family Life Committee. These Boards and Committee ceased to exist after Conference, due to the amended Study Committee report that was adopted at the 1978 General Conference.

The budget that was approved by the delegates will require contributions for the year in the total amount of \$348,000. This budget need reflects an increase of about 6% over the 1978-79 budget, which is considerably less than the percentage of inflation.

The entire Conference was a tremendous inspirational experience. We express our thanks and commendation to each one who took part in any program to make the Conference a real success. We were especially appreciative of the fine music provided during this Conference.

#### **Board of Directors Meeting**

The Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference met in Oregon, Illinois, on August 4 and 5, and also met several times during the General Conference. The Song Book Committee reported to the Board of Directors. The Committee was authorized to proceed with the printing, and hopefully the book will be ready before General Conference, 1980.

Sections of a policy manual for the administration of the Church of God General Conference and Oregon Bible College was approved by the Board of Directors.

Brother Francis Burnett of Oregon, Illinois, was appointed to the License & Ordination Board for a sixyear term. The term of Richard Worley expired at this Conference. Brother Worley chose not to be reappointed. The other members of the License and Ordination Board are Brothers Billie Kennedy and Kenneth Milne.

The next business meeting of the Board of Directors will be held in Oregon, Illinois, on November 15, 16, and 17. The full minutes of the 1979 General Conference sessions and the 1979-80 budget will be published in the October issue of PROGRESS JOURNAL.

#### **Conference** Finances

As this report is written in mid-August contributions are short of the two-month needs: however, we have reduced the loan to \$7,000. We are grateful for the concerns of the membership and trust that the total needs will be met by September 30th, the end of the current fiscal year. May God richly bless the membership and the work of the Church of God General Conference.

In addition to these courses, all students are required to attend two 50-minute chapel services during the week.

#### **Junior-Senior Weekends**

Again this year, we are sponsoring two Junior-Senior Weekends. The Fall Junior-Senior Weekend will be October 18-20 and the Spring Weekend will be April 10-12. All high school juniors and seniors are invited to visit Oregon Bible College at one of these times. By attending classes and staying in the dormitories, visitors have a first-hand view of life at our College. For more information, please contact your pastor or youth leader.

#### Women's Dormitory

In 1974, the delegates at the summer Conference voted to construct a new Women's Dormitory for Oregon Bible College, with construction to be completed so it could be occupied in August, 1975. Though no funds were available for this project, the delegates approved a fund-raising program and instructed the Board of Directors to borrow the necessary funds to complete the project.

Many individuals and churches responded to this need and made promises to contribute to this project over the next five years. The five-year period is drawing to a close and we are very thankful for the many people who have faithfully contributed during this period to our dormitory project.

At the present time there is a balance of about \$18,000 which must still be paid on our loans. It is our desire to repay these loans as quickly as possible, and any contribution which you could make would be greatly appreciated.

I am very thankful for the vision of our delegates when they chose to proceed with this project even though it was necessary to borrow a substantial amount of money. Recently, out of curiosity, I checked to see how much our identical building would cost today. Of course, I don't need to tell any of you what inflation has done to prices, but I found that our building would have cost a little over \$100,000 more today than it did in the summer of 1975. Instead of costing \$162,000, it would have cost \$262,900. So even though we have had to pay about \$15,000 in interest on the money we borrowed, we have saved a substantial amount of money on the building and, of course, we have been able to benefit from the use of the building during these years as well.


I am very confident that you will respond to the need and that this building will be paid in full soon.

#### **Golden Rule Building Progress**

During the past two months work has been progressing on the remodeling of the Golden Rule Building. Carroll Bennett, a member of the Board of Trustees, spent two weeks in Oregon early in July, directing the leveling of the floors and the interior framing for the building. Late in July, Ed Schroth and his son Eddie from the Columbia, Ohio, Church spent about two weeks installing the electrical wiring in the building. Plumbing and heating are presently being installed by Spangler Brothers of Oregon. New window units will be installed before winter weather arrives, and the interior finishing work will be completed during the winter months.

We are very grateful to Paul and Ruth Overholser for providing the funds for this special project.





#### **RENCONTRE REPORT**

We would like to share with you, our brothers and sisters in Christ, what is happening in our lives, how God is guiding us, and what is happen-ing in the field of alcohol and substance abuse in the State of Michigan.

Last winter Jim felt very strongly that he should attend the Western Region Alcoholism Courselor Training Program at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City. About \$1,200 was needed for this. We prayed, we wrote letters, and we asked. The money came, little by little. Books and tuition were paid by the Bureau of Indian Affairs in South Dakota, plane fare came from the Methodist Missions Department in Detroit, and our own program (where we work) made up the rest. The Lord must have really wanted him to go!

Upon returning and getting back to a normal routine, Jim was assigned a case load and became much more involved in counseling individuals and actively working in the area of Indian culture as it relates to the Indian alcoholic's low self-esteem.

In May Jim was elected to the Board of Directors of Great Lakes Alcoholism Counselors and Trainers Association (GLACTA), which is an organization of Native American alcoholism programs of Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, and Illinois. Their main project at the present time is to work out a training program, through a university, for the alcoholism counselors of the above-mentioned states that are members of GLACTA.

In June, Jim was accepted as a registered member of the Michigan Association of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors (MAADAC). He is working now to attain the goal of becoming a Certified Alcoholism Counselor, which requires the passing of an eight-hour exam. Hopefully this will be in the fall.

We have felt the guiding of the Lord in this work. Alcoholism touches many, many people. It ranks near the top as a killer of people in our country, and is the most prevalent disease among our Native American people.

As an ordained Church of God minister, Jim feels his calling is to serve the Lord in this way. To love the unlovable, as Jesus did, seems hard to some. We ask your prayers as we, from time to time, share a little of our work with you. James and Jean Rencontre.


