BOARD OF DIRECTORS CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Board of Directors met in Oregon, Illinois, October 28 and 29. The primary issue under consideration was the restructuring, revitalization, and relocation of the Church of God General Conference/Oregon Bible College.

It was reported in a special News Update mailed to the membership in September that Oregon Bible College had been contacted regarding the possible sale of buildings. "Responsible Peer Programs, Inc." of Rockford, Illinois, expressed an interest in the Men's Dormitory and the college Administration Building.

No offers have been received on these properties.

However, this interest in college properties, poses a dilemma for the Board of Directors. Though the Board has constitutional authority to acquire and dispose of property, they are committed to working in harmony with our entire membership. The interest in the properties was not anticipated and it was not solicited. Our Board seeks to gain the support of each of you as members of the Church, while at the same time providing responsible leadership as we chart a course for the future.

Our membership needs to be assured that our Board does not take lightly the responsibility that has been placed upon it to provide leadership for our association of churches. The Board desires to be submissive to God's leading while at the same time being sensitive to the various needs and desires of our membership.

The Board, Higher Education Advisory Committee, and staff continue the process of assembling specific proposals regarding future programs and activities of the Conference/College. Our vision is to see existing churches revitalized and many new churches started. Our Conference/College seeks to be effective in meeting these needs in the Church of God.

The Board continues to be convicted that relocation of our Conference/College is an integral part of our vision for the future. Relocation to a growing metropolitan area will:

* provide opportunities for Oregon Bible College student participation in practical on-the-job training in evangelism, disciple making, and church planting. These experiences will equip future leaders to effectively serve existing churches and new churches.

* provide additional educational oppor tunities for our students in a community college or university. Students enrolled at Oregon Bible College will be able to secure general education courses from a neighboring institution, permitting Oregon Bible College to focus on Bible and Theology and Ministry studies.

Our Board and staff solicit earnest prayer of the membership on behalf of the work of the Church of God General Conference and Oregon Bible College. These are momentous times in which we live and the Church of God faces important issues regarding its ministry in the years to come, if the Lord tarries. It is clear that our sufficiency is not in ourselves, but in Christ. "Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong" (2 Cor. 12:9b, 10, NIV).

Our Board appreciates the communication received from the membership and we welcome all input regarding the future of our movement. The future of your local church is intertwined with the future of our General Conference and Oregon Bible College. We are partners together in this ministry, and your suggestions and comments are respected by the Board of Directors. It is our hope that you will communicate by phone, letter, or in person to any member of the staff or the Board regarding the vital issues that face the Church of God today.

May God's leadership and blessings be with the Church of God as we seek to better serve him and his Son.

PRESIDENT'S PROGRESS REPORT

The 1989 General Conference will be held July 31-August 4, at Western Illinois University, Macomb, Illinois. Our 1986 General Conference was held at these same facilities.

The 1989 Conference will be extremely significant:

- We will celebrate the 50th anniversary of Oregon Bible College.
- We expect to have a victory celebration in recognition of the completion of our campaign to raise 1 million dollars for the Oregon Bible College Development Foundation.
- Important decisions will be made regarding the future of the Church of God.

For nearly six months, a special Oregon Bible College anniversary committee has been working on a program. The committee consists of Rachel Carr; former Oregon Bible College President, Dr. Alva Huffer; and Marg Overmyer. Staff members Judy Myers, Dale Ramsey, and Kent Ross vill be working with me to coordinate the program.

The entire Church of God membership, especially members of the Alumni Association of Oregon Bible College, and members who have given to the Oregon Bible College Development Foundation, are urged to attend this historic Conference.

Western Illinois University is located in the beautiful farm lands of the Midwest. The Macomb and Ripley congregations are close to our Conference location. The meals and facilities are excellent at the University. Additional information regarding costs will be available after the first of the year.

The staff and students of Oregon Bible College and advisory committee members have traveled extensively this fall visiting local churches and state conferences. They have been involved in retreats, seminars, prospect calling, sermons, and question and answer periods. Our desire is to help local churches in their education, nurturing, and outreach ministries. We wish to encourage pastors and lay members, recruit students for Oregon Bible College, and communicate our vision for the future. We deeply appreciate the invitations we have received to be involved in these many types of ministries and we appreciate the hospitality that has been extended in every area.

The Board of Directors met in Oregon, Illinois, October 28 and 29. In addition to the item reviewed on page 2 by NOVEMBER/DECEMBER/1988 chairman Joe James, the Board reviewed and approved the audit report of the 1987-88 fiscal year. A summary of this report will be included in the annual giving report which is mailed to the entire membership in January. The Board also received updates on the work of the Conference and College. The Board will meet again January 5-7 to focus on long range planning. The Board welcomes suggestions and comments from the membership and appreciates prayer support for its meetings.





We pray God's blessing upon Warren and Irene as they continue their ministry in California.

Included in this issue of the Progress Journal is a statistical report of our churches. Each congregation is important to the work of the Church of God, and we are grateful for the involvement of many individuals, local churches, church organizations, state conferences, and others.

Update on Relocation

As this is written in mid-February, we have not received a written offer on the Oregon Bible College buildings. We continue discussions with Responsible Peer Programs, Inc. Zoning regulations are being reviewed by Responsible Peer Programs.

A team of staff members are visiting the four relocation sites under consideration: DuPage County, Illinois; Kansas City, Missouri; Columbus, Ohio; and Atlanta, Georgia.

We deeply appreciate the tremendous prayer support that has been provided by our membership. We continue to see God's hand at work day by day as he opens and closes doors to us as we pursue our vision to be obedient in evangelism. We believe that God is sovereign and that he knows what is best for the work of the Church of God. The greatest desire of our leadership is to be submissive to God's leadership.

There are three specific prayers that we ask our membership to continue to pray:

1. That God will lead in the possible sale of buildings and our entire relocation effort by opening and closing doors to us.

2. That God will fill each of our members with his spirit, that the fruit of the spirit will be produced in our lives, and that there will be a spirit of unity throughout the Church of God.

3. Pray that our staff will have extra strength as they carry on regular duties and assist in securing relocation information; and that they will have peace about their future as God's will unfolds. (*Please turn to page 16.*)

Please! Consider the Important

"We have left undone those things which we ought to have done: and we have done those things which we ought not to have done."

This statement from the little booklet by Charles Hummel entitled "The Tyranny of the Urgent" is filled with despair and stands in stark contrast to the confident completion to his life that Paul shares in 2 Timothy 4:7. "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, I have kept the faith." When Jesus uttered his final words, "It is finished," it was more than just cessation of life, but the end of a work that had been completed or accomplished.

Neither Jesus or Paul was indicating that his work as carpenter or tentmaker was at an end. Those trades were simply means to maintain earthly existence. Their real work, their really "important" work of sharing "the good news," was what had come to an end.

It strikes me that, when most young people finish high school and pursue their career preparation, all their resources: time, talent, money, and energy are spent to prepare for what Hummel would classify as urgent goals: making a living, taking care of necessities, putting food on the table, all of which count for naught in light of eternal value.

The Annual Graduation Program will begin at 7:30 in the Oregon Church of God with Kent Ross, Instructor/ Academic Dean as the speaker.



OUTREACH AND CHURCH DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Foreign Missions Advisory Committee

The Foreign Missions Advisory Committee met in Oregon on January 7, 1989, to discuss the missions work of the General Conference.

Recent letters and reports from each of the fields were reviewed. This material is being sent to the membership in the "March"ing for Missions mailing. After the report went to the printer, we received word that Beder has been excommunicated from the Peru church for doctrinal differences.

Plans for the "March"ing for Missions materials were discussed. Alane Schmidlapp-Day offered to put together a devotional booklet and a calendar for distribution to the membership. We greatly appreciate her willingness to minister in this way.

A children's missions club, the COG Travel Club, was developed. Every two months members will receive a mailing providing information on various countries in the world. We hope that by developing a "world awareness" we will be able to stimulate missions interest in our children. The club mascot, designed by Todd Myers, is Charlie O. Goforth who travels with his faithful vehicle, Care-lotta. She cares, and he's been sent. A letter has gone out to all pastors and mission committee chairpersons announcing this club. Membership is \$5.00 per year. If any individual is interested and did not receive an invitation to join through his local church, please write to the Church of God General Conference Missions Department for an application, or send in the membership fee along with a name and an address. The first mailing for this club is scheduled to go out in March.

Two of the members of our committee will be presenting classes at Christian Workers' Seminar and we spent time discussing one of these classes.

We appreciate the financial and prayer support of the Church of God membership in providing for the missions work of the General Conference. Approximately \$2,500 is needed each month to carry on these outreach ministries.

Youth Advisory Committee

This year's Youth Advisory Committee is composed of elected members Lanny McAlister (South Carolina) and Alan Demmitt (Ohio); Joe James (South Carolina) represents the Board of Directors, and Kent Ross (Illinois) is the National Youth Coordinator.

They have just concluded this year's planning sessions by meeting February 11,12, 1989, at the Guthrie Grove Church of God. Their five-page agenda included an evaluation of: 1) the programs of participation, such as chartering of youth groups, Coins-For-Christ, Youth Week, caravans and mission trip; 2) Berean Youth Congress, with consideration given to increasing attendance to 250 or more, quizzing, talent competition or involvement, youth leader's training; 3) *Challenge* youth magazine, its format and content; and 4) a host of miscellaneous items, such as increasing a ministry emphasis in our programs, a Mid-Winter post-high program, and a Youth Advisory team of young people.

The Committee in brainstorming brought forth fresh and vigorous new ideas, but also felt the need to check those ideas out with the young people themselves. One of the most important changes is bringing back a program of a representative group of young people to feed their own needs into the program the General Conference offers. At this year's Berean Youth Congress a group will be selected to act in concert with the Advisory Committee in developing the youth program.

Another strongly perceived need is to involve more of our youth leaders and through them to involve more of our youth groups, and thus more of our young people in our programs, which includes taking much more responsibility for our own budget.

The program for Berean Youth Congress '89 was developed and letters will be going out with assignments for what promises to be an exciting week. The Congress will again meet at John Brown University in Siloam Springs, Arkansas, July 9-14, 1989. The earlybird cost for the first member from a family will be \$130 for the week. With Youth Week in the spring, this now becomes an excellent time for young people to raise their owns funds for this extraordinary week.

Lanny, Alan, and Joe working with Kent give us a solid team, that in conjunction with a group of our young people will generate new life and vigor among our young people nationwide.

OUTREACH AND CHURCH DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Christian Education Advisory Committee

The Committee continues to serve the Church of God General Conference by attending to matters related to the Christian Education ministries of the local church.

We were invited to participate in the Minnesota State Conference, September 8-11, 1988. Choosing the theme, "Enlarging Your Ministry," we developed and presented four workshops for those in attendance. Pastor John Railton joined us as a special guest and his presentation was videotaped for future use at similar conferences. The conference was well attended and a time of learning and fellowship was enjoyed by all.

On November 5, 1988, the Committee traveled to Louisiana to participate in their state conference. Twelve workshops on a variety of topics were offered for those who attended. Jim Ring and Susan Hall joined our team for the weekend. Medical problems prevented me from making the trip, but I was blessed by the willingness of Lynne Krogh to step in at the last minute and take my place.

Media Advisory Committee

OUTREACH AND CHURCH DEVELOPMENT REPORT, Warren Sorenson, Vice-President

A Vision for Developing the Local Church

Most congregations would like to have an increase in attendance, see more people coming forward to put on Christ in the waters of baptism, and have more people participating in and contributing to the work of the church. What can a congregation do to experience these results? That's a tough question and the answer requires developing a vision for the church which includes the following five specific items.

Program

The program of the local church is an important aspect of reaching and keeping new people. The morning worship service is perhaps the most important of all. It has replaced the Sunday School as the "feeder" to the growth of the church. New people usually feel more comfortable in attending the morning worship service as an introduction to the church. Providing a meaningful worship service therefore becomes a critical element in your church's outreach to new people. If the service is going to be meaningful, people need to feel God's presence and experience his love. A message of "Good News" which relates Bible truth to personal life and needs is a must.



A good-sounding choir is an excellent way to assist programming in the local church.

Timing is important, especially starting and stopping on time. Also eliminate dead time in the service. Be time efficient in receiving the offering. Plan and prepare for a smooth-flowing service.

Property

The condition of the grounds, the building, and the MARCH/APRIL/1989

location are all important. Look over your facilities as if you were visiting for the first time. Is it easy for visitors to find their way around the building? Are there directional signs? Are the rest rooms properly and clearly marked? If you have a nursery, is it well staffed and cared for?

Personality of the Congregation

One of the key elements needed in a congregation is compassion for those who are not in Christ. When the congregation is concerned about bringing people to Christ, the subject will come up in board and congregational meetings, and time will be given to plan and discuss how to accomplish this.

A second important element in the personality of the congregation is having a sense of ministry. The pastor is the equipper of many ministers with the membership following the leadership model. Everyone's ministry is important.

A third important element is the commitment of the membership. Obedience to the instruction of God and a community relationship within the body helps the church to follow the Biblical model of the church as the body of Christ.


People Flow

Increasing the numbers of people who come into your services is what is meant by people flow. The church is much more important than a business, and retailers know that it is important to increase the number of people coming into the store as a means of increasing the number of customers who buy. If you want to sell to more people, you get more people to look at your product. Consider these three ways of increasing your people flow: Advertising, Invitations, and Attraction (a quality program and a caring ministry).

Purpose

It is important to know what you want to accomplish and how you plan to do it. When this is understood, more will take place in the local church. Bringing people to salvation is our Biblical command. It is one of the most important purposes of the church.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE

THE REPORTS and information contained in this issue of the PROGRESS JOURNAL were reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting on April 7 and 8, 1989. The report was prepared by the President and members of the staff of the Conference and College.

This annual report is published to keep the membership of the Church of God informed regarding the work of our association of churches. It also serves as background information for delegates who will meet at the annual summer Conference, July 31 to August 4, 1989, at Western Illinois University, Macomb, Illinois. At the business sessions, the Conference work will be discussed and decisions will be made regarding Conference activities in the future.

Guiding Principles

The Church of God General Conference is a non profit corporation. Its members are the 79 churches in the United States and Canada, which have on file in the Conference office a statement of affiliation with the General Conference. Delegates from these churches, plus delegates from state conferences, and licensed/ordained ministers meet annually to review the work of the Conference and to elect a Board of Directors.

The Board is directly responsible to the delegates for the operation of the General Conference. The Board has divided the work into departments and employs a staff to carry on the day to day work. The staff is responsible to the Board.

The organization is guided by a Constitution adopted by the delegates, by God's word, and by God's spirit working through the chosen leadership.

Membership in the Church of God General Conference is a voluntary act by a local congregation. In affiliating with the General Conference, the local church is manifesting its agreement with the biblical truths set forth in the Bylaws, and its desire to participate in the worldwide ministry of the Church of God through the General Conference. Membership assumes a moral obligation to support the work of the General Conference and to maintain fellowship with the other members of the Conference as a brotherhood in Christ. The church does not relinquish any authority, nor compromise its local autonomy. It does, with membership, have opportunity to assist in the formation of policies and pro-MAY/JUNE/1989 grams through its delegates and its pastor. It has the opportunity to enlarge its borders through participation in missions and educational efforts.

Focus of Effort

As an association of churches, we understand it is our mission to "make disciples of all nations." (Matt. 28:19, 20). The General Conference exists to assist Church of God members, churches and conferences to bring the lost to Jesus Christ and to lead each believer to maturity by providing leadership, resources, and services.

The Church of God is in the midst of a transition as necessitated by a changing society. Since it is our desire to reach the lost through good stewardship, we recognize the need to adapt our ministries to reach the people of our generation.

Improving our ministries means strengthening existing churches and starting new churches to reach more people.

A formula which guides us is: Vision + Information x Commitment = God's blessing and growth. Our vision to strengthen existing churches and start new churches must be combined with Bible truth, effective ministry techniques, and an understanding of the society in which we live. We call upon all members to renew their commitment to use their spiritual gifts and to be active in ministry.

The reports on the following pages represent our vision, information that will help us do our job better, and evidence of the commitment of our people. These reports furthermore are testimony of God's blessing upon us as his people.

Relocation


During the past year, the Board and staff has studied extensively how relocation can help us achieve the mission to which God has called us. Consideration has been given to our present programs and activities on behalf of our churches. Our Bible College objectives and curriculum have been reviewed. Visits have been made to relocation sites to secure information about local educational institutions and opportunities for practical experience for our students. This issue of PROGRESS JOURNAL contains our findings and our proposed plans for the future.

Financial Situation

The assets of the Church of God General Conference have continued to climb during the past ten years. Contributions to the Oregon Bible College Development Foundation and the establishment of the Investment Fund have assisted in the growth of our assets. The graph below reflects the increase in our fund balance.

(Fund balance is determined by subtracting liabilities from assets. This graph does not take into account the appreciation of real estate during the 10 years. All assets are listed at cost.)



10-Year Growth in Fund Balance

The growth in our fund balance has been made possible by:

1. Faithful giving by hundreds of Church of God families.

2. Faithful giving by many local churches and state conferences.

3. Gift annuities for which the donors receive semiannual interest payments.

4. Creation of trust funds.

5. Major gifts from estates of persons who have remembered the Lord's work at the time of their death.

The chart in the next column shows contributions received during the first 10 months of this fiscal year. Our Goal



for Giving for the year was \$387,000. Contributions of \$32,250 are needed each month. As of March 31, 1989, contributions were approximately \$35,000 short of the Goal for Giving for the year.

Earlier this year, members of the Church of God were invited to become a part of the Great Commission Team to help underwrite the day-to-day ministries of the Church of God General Conference. We are seeking individuals who will provide support at the following levels.

OUTREACH AND CHURCH DEVELOPMENT REPORT

The work of the Outreach Director during this year has been focused on assistance to smaller churches, teaching OBC intensive classes in church planting and evangelism, working with core groups in church-planting opportunities, survey and planning in connection with the possibility of relocation and restructuring, and launching the new Loves Park Church, Family Bible Fellowship, plus regular administrative duties and conducting the annual How To Build Your Church Seminar.

Assistance to Smaller Churches

The strengthening of the existing local church is an important part of the work of the OCD department. Two congregations, Pomona, California, and Blessed Hope in Rockford, Illinois, requested assistance. Both of these congregations recognized a need to structure for growth.

Several meetings have been conducted with the pastor and elders of the Blessed Hope church. A lot of time and effort has gone into planting a new church in Rockford and we have recognized the need to provide as much assistance as possible to Blessed Hope, the existing church in Rockford. During these meetings various strategies have been discussed and planned for reaching out into the community and strengthening the church.

Oregon Bible College Intensives

Two intensive classes were taught: Introduction to Evangelism, and Church Planting. Both of these involved student participation in evangelism activity. Students took part in door-to-door prospect calling in Loves Park, Illinois; Bloomington, Indiana; and Fox Valley, Illinois. They also participated in the telephone evangelism contact program in launching the Loves Park Church of God. Student cooperation and participation was excellent in this program. Some of the students felt uneasy about trying something new but were willing to get out of their comfort zone and take part in the evangelism project. Several students volunteered to do follow-up calling on prospects after the initial contact project was completed.

Loves Park Church-Planting Project

Planning for the project began several months prior to its launching in connection with the intensive classes at OBC. Prospects for building a nucleus with which to start the church were gleaned through door-to-door prospecting and telemarketing. About 110 prospects were found through door-to-door calling and 1261 using telemarketing.

Attendance at the first service on October 30th was 103 and has leveled off in the mid-fifties. A weekly

telephone follow-up contact program on prospects is carried on by General Conference staff members and spouses. There are families who have become regular in attendance and new ones continue to come. Several Bible studies are being conducted and a youth program has been started with Jason Turner as leader. A children's church and nursery program runs concurrently with the morning worship service. Joyce Magaw supervises the children's church program with students helping. Glenda Turner is in charge of the nursery class. Gary Turner pastors the new church and is also conducting a Wednesday night Bible class.

Relocation Survey Trips

A preliminary trip was made to Atlanta on November 15 and 16 along with board member Joe James. More detailed investigation was conducted at the four proposed relocation sites: DuPage County, Illinois; Kansas City, Missouri/Kansas City, Kansas; Columbus, Ohio; and Atlanta, Georgia. Each of these trips involved discussions with college administration officials concerning the opportunities for OBC students to enroll in courses and benefit from the various college resources. Investigation also included a study of the availability of commercial property and costs as well as the cost of living for staff and students in the various relocation possibilities.

Restructuring

Numerous meetings were conducted for consideration of the involvement of OBC students in church planting, evangelism, and the development of an existing church. Considerable discussion and planning has taken place to strategize how to utilize the resources and potential in a relocation setting. The opportunities for students to participate in ministry is an important objective in the relocation plan. These meetings have been for the purpose of studying how to relate ministry participation to the OBC curriculum and the objectives of preparing and training pastors for existing churches and church-planting efforts.

Church-Planting Opportunities

We met with the core group in Nashville, Tennessee, and enjoyed a time of reviewing objectives and strategies. We also met with the group in Columbia, South Carolina, (Continued on the next page.)

and discussed ways of beginning a regular schedule of meetings as a preliminary step to starting a church.

Jeff and Karen Fletcher and their family have gotten settled in Milton Keynes, England, and have begun developing friendships and building a nucleus for the church. Bible studies have been conducted and a Sunday service is also conducted. We are encouraged by the new contacts that have been made and the new people who are starting to attend.

The Church of God in Lima, Peru, continues with a radio broadcast and worship services. There have been several baptisms thus far. This is an emerging church and prayer support is needed for the workers. Conditions in Peru are unsettled and this greatly affects our people there.

How to Build Your Church Seminar

The annual church-planting seminar was focused this year on the development of the local church. Several staff members took part in presenting sessions. Attendance at the seminar was good and many very favorable comments were made concerning benefits derived from the seminar.

Conclusion

I will be ending full-time employment with the General Conference as of September 1, and will be taking the pastorate at Simi Valley, California. My ministry with the General Conference has been challenging and interesting. The focus and concern in the Church of God to reach the lost is one of the most important objectives of the OCD Department. We have seen a greater emphasis in reaching out to the lost take place in the Church of God.

I will continue to work with the General Conference on a part-time basis. I continue to have a keen interest in the relocation and restructuring of Oregon Bible College and the General Conference and the focus of reaching the lost. Irene and I appreciate the support we have received from you. —*R. Warren Sorenson, Vice President.*

OREGON BIBLE COLLEGE REPORT

This school year has been somewhat like a roller coaster, with its ups and downs. The year began on a

super high. We have not experienced more excitement in the first two weeks of school than we did this year. Involvement in evangelism classes, prospecting for new people by knocking on doors, and involvement in phone calls as part of the telemarketing project at Loves Park, were new experiences for students and staff. They were rich, growing experiences that gave us all a good feel about our own contribution.

We rejoice with Kent Ross in the successful completion of his Graduate Degree. Anthony Buzzard plans to finish his graduate work in the coming year.

I am pleased and impressed by the quality of our instructors. Most have graduate degrees or extensive experience in their field of expertise. Serving in some type of teaching capacity this year were: David Krogh, Eugene Stilson, Dale Ramsey, Michael Hoffman, John Guthrie, Warren Sorenson, Russell Magaw, Gayle Guthrie, Anthony Buzzard, Eileen Moore, William Wachtel, Brian Atra, Dick Eldred, Bob Jones, Hollis Partlowe, Alane Day, and Chuck Jones. Various pastors and other guests contributed to our environment by preaching in Chapel services and visiting various functions of the college. Our men's dormitory was supervised by David and Betty Hall and the women's dormitory was supervised by Rick and Vickie Cooper. I also appreciate the contributions to our environment that Mary Hoffman gives in Food Service and David Hall gives in Maintenance.

Our students, as usual, experienced the highs and lows of the roller coaster this year as well. Many attested to the joy of being involved in the OBC environment and maturing in Christ. Involvement in the ministry of local churches, witnessing in the work place, experiencing spirit-filled Prayer Days, social activities, etc., contribute to the joy of being involved in this spiritual environment. However, the struggle to meet financial responsibilities, insufficient work, or the inability to manage money tended to dampen the morale of the students who found themselves in this situation. An abnormal amount of sickness during the winter months and some untimely deaths in the family also hurt the students' ability to maintain a positive consistent attitude toward their work. However, the school year concluded on a positive note.

Our Booster program fell significantly short of the accomplishments of the previous year. The contributions were \$2,251.25 less than 1987 and there were 199 fewer contributors than in 1987. It was heartening that several

of our churches had almost 100% participation thanks to the promotion from those pastors. Steve Fewell at the North Hills Church of God and Dennis Baldwin at the Royal Village Church of God did a super job in promoting the OBC Booster Program. There were others who did a very fine job in promoting OBC through the Booster Program.

Another very fine High School Invitational Program was accomplished during the first weekend in March. Fifty-four students, some coming from as far away as Virginia, attended. Of these, 33 were juniors and seniors and many showed an interest in coming to Oregon Bible College upon completion of their high-school training. We have many fine prospects who have declared their intentions to come to Oregon Bible College in the fall of 1989. An Incentive Scholarship was offered to potential students who had at least a 3.2 GPA and a 22 on their ACT test if they came to OBC in the Fall of 1989. It looks like we may have as many as seven who will qualify for this scholarship based on high academic achievement. We also have many more students who have indicated a strong interest in being with us in the fall of '89. We are heartened by the sincerity of these students to experience Biblical education and embark upon a course to improve their ministry to life.

Two very fine men graduated from Oregon Bible College this spring, David Richert and Jeff Bull. David will be interning this fall at the Eden Valley Church in Minnesota and Jeff Bull will be interning at the Glad Tidings Church in Fonthill, Canada. David began a new course in life by getting married to Heidi Cooper on March 4. Jeff Bull is married to the former Becky Roseberry. Our prayer is that these two outstanding couples will encounter continued growth in their pastoral preparation and will be of great service to the Lord and his church in the years ahead.

Many other tasks and activities: Committee on Higher Education meeting, the Chorale Tour, the revision of the Student Handbook, Alumni Weekend, the Adulthostel, Parents' Weekend, etc., contributed to the quality of our work and experience. A survey was conducted among the present Oregon Bible College students and among the visitors for the High School Invitational Conference as to their view with regard to the possible relocation of Oregon Bible College. It was good to get a feel of both our present students and those who will be attending in

the future about this issue. Various questions were asked as to why they feel we should or should not relocate. Of our present students, 13 out of 14 taking the survey think that relocation will serve the needs of Oregon Bible College and them personally in a better way. Of our visiting students who took the survey, 22 out of 29 felt that relocation would better fit their needs than the present setting.

A strong key as to whether Oregon Bible College relocates or not has to do with the question, "Where can we best prepare our students?" We continue to evaluate our present programs and our future needs, coming to the conclusion from the research done, that we can significantly improve the quality of our program in a different setting that better meets the objectives of the Bible College. We continue to be motivated by our sincere desire to do what is best for our young people and God's kingdom. —Dale Ramsey, Vice President.

RECOMMENDATIONS AND CONSTITUTION REVISIONS

Recommendation One

The Board of Directors presents for the approval of the delegates of the Church of God General Conference, the relocation of the corporate offices of the Church of God General Conference, including Outreach And Church Development, Oregon Bible College, Printing And Publishing Services, and Business Services.

Explanation: Please see pages 9 to 16 for specific proposals regarding this recommendation.

Recommendation Two

To implement Recommendation One, the Board proposes an amendment to Article I, Section 1 of the General Conference Constitution: "The general offices of the Church of God General Conference shall be incorporated in the state in which the offices are located." (The present reading: "The general offices of the Church of God General Conference shall be located at Oregon, Illinois.")

Recommendation Three

The Board of Directors proposes an amendment to the Constitution, Article I, Section 3: delete entire section. This section currently reads "For the purpose of conducting business, the General Conference is incorporated in the state of Illinois under the name of 'Church of God General Conference,' a corporation not for profit."

Explanation: The deletion of this section helps to implement Recommendations One and Two. It is also redundant because in the preamble to the Constitution it says that the name of the organization is Church of God General Conference and that it is a notfor-profit organization. The proposed new Article I, Section 1 says that the organization shall be incorporated.

Recommendation Four

The Board of Directors recommends an amendment to Article II, Section 3, c, which has to do with delegates entitled to vote at business sessions. Delete the following: "The Executive Director of Church of God General Conference and the President of Oregon Bible College."

Explanation: Titles and positions have been changed. Currently there is a President of Church of God General Conference/Oregon Bible College. In most cases this individual is eligible to vote under Article II Section 3, b, as a licensed or ordained minister.

Recommendation Five

The Board of Directors proposes an amendment to the Constitution regarding nominations for the Board of Directors in Article IV, Section 4. Eliminate the entire section and replace with the following: "Nominations for the Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference may be submitted by: State or District Conference Boards of the Church of God; Churches that are members of the General Conference; Pastors' Association of the Church of God General Conference. Name(s) of nominees and resumes will be submitted to the President of the General Conference by May 1 and will be printed in the General Conference issue of PROGRESS JOURNAL."

Explanation: There are two major changes in this amendment. 1)The Board is proposing that our Pastors' Association be given nominating authority. 2) The current Constitution calls for nominations to be submitted by January 1. Throughout the history of the General Conference, pastors have played a significant role on the Board of Directors. The Board feels it is appropriate to encourage our Pastors' Association to have a role in placing nominations. Changing the date from January 1 to May 1 will permit more time for nominations to be prepared and will still permit them to be included in the General Conference issue of the PROGRESS JOUR-NAL.

Recommendation Six

The Board of Directors proposes an amendment to the Bylaws of the Church of God General Conference, Article I, Section 1 regarding the purpose of the Conference: "The purpose of the Church of God General Conference is to assist Church of God members, churches, and conferences to perform their commission, which is to make disciples by bringing the lost to Jesus Christ, and by leading the believer to maturity, by providing leadership, resources, and services."

The present wording is: "The purpose for which the Church of God General Conference is incorporated is to assist Church of God members, churches, and conferences to perform their commission to feed the Church of God and preach the gospel to all the world by providing trained personnel, services, resources, and materials."

Explanation: The proposed amendment clarifies our understanding of the mission to which the Church of God has been called. The words "make disciples" bring to mind the work of Jesus as he worked with the twelve disciples, beginning with his selection of them, his association with them, and the impartation of himself to them. "Make disciples" helps us to focus on the process of finding the lost and leading them to conversion.

The phrase "leading the believer to maturity" includes the idea of establishing individuals in the faith (Colossians 2:6, 7), equipping them for ministry (Ephesians 4:11, 12), and providing indepth personal training (Mark 3:14).

The Conference seeks to help local churches in their mission by offering lay and professional training of leadership. The Conference also seeks to play a servant leadership role by giving encouragement, assistance, and a role model in ministry.

EXPLANATION OF RECOMMENDATION ONE

BOARD RECOMMENDS RELOCATION

As a part of our vision to revitalize the Church of God, the Board of Directors is proposing the relocation of the corporate offices of the Church of God General Conference, including Outreach and Church Development, Oregon Bible College, Printing and Publishing Services, and Business Services to Atlanta, Georgia.

There have been many hours of prayer, deliberation, and market research put into this recommendation. The Board and staff have spent the last several years praying, planning, and considering how we can bring renewal and revitalization to the Church of God. Many members have expressed concern over the closing of churches, the loss of our young people, the plateaued and declining membership in many churches, and an insufficient number of graduates from Oregon Bible College.

In an effort to find solutions to these problems, meetings have been held with pastors, congregations, state conferences, and many individual members. Many plans and ideas have been weighed and considered. Lists of pros and cons have been compiled.

After prayerful consideration the Board has concluded that relocation is a vital key to the revitalization of the Church of God.

This eight-page section presents the plans and benefits of relocation.



DOCTRINE AND THEOLOGY EMPHASIS

The most important purpose for the existence of OBC is its emphasis on our Church of God doctrinal distinctives. Oregon Bible College is the only institution of higher education in the world which is training leadership in the great truths of the Scripture. The Board of Directors acknowledges, as you do, the importance of sound Bible teaching in order for the rest of the education at Oregon Bible College to be of any significance. We will not compromise our doctrinal heritage. Students will continue to be taught what we believe, why we believe it, why it is important, and how to communicate it to our world.

OBC TO BROADEN CURRICULUM

As our society changes, we see, as you do, a greater need to train and educate students to meet the needs of our society. Our plan is to draw upon the resources of Clayton State College, a senior college within the University System of Georgia, for general education courses for our students. After meeting with officials from many colleges, we have concluded that the Outcome-Focused Assessment-Based General Education Program in place at Clayton State College will meet our needs. Our general education curriculum will be provided by Clayton State and will be expanded from 37 semester hours to 64 and include emphasis on two basic skills: communication and critical thinking. Oregon Bible College will continue to offer 48 hours of study in Bible and Theology, and 42 hours in ministries.

The students will also have access to the Learning Resource Center which includes an 80,000-volume library and computer labs. The use of these facilities by students will enable OBC to reduce costs for staff, equipment, and space while the student receives an expanded education in preparation for ministry.

OBC TO GRANT BACHELOR DEGREE

In 1966 the State of Illinois changed the law precluding Oregon Bible College from granting a degree. However, the State of Georgia will allow us to grant our own associate and bachelor degrees in ministry and theology. Students will also receive an accredited, transferable associates of arts degree (two-year degree) in general education from Clayton State College, a senior college within the University System of Georgia.

OBC INTEGRATING EXPERIENCE INTO CURRICULUM

The best way to retain what is learned is to put it to use as soon as possible. The ministry courses are being adapted to include more hands-on experience as a part of the course requirement in order for the student to practice and build skills in the ministry before graduation. This approach to education of students and staff participating jointly in ministry experience is based on the model of Jesus as he discipled the 12 apostles.

The curriculum aims are:

- 1. To acquaint the students with a variety of ministry opportunities in which they can best use their gifts and abilities.
- 2. To enable the students to develop leadership and organizational skills for ministry.
- 3. To be challenged through personal responsibility in ministry.
- 4. To assist students in relating to and working with people from different cultural backgrounds.
- 5. To help students understand the meaning of a life of service to their family, church, and society.
- 6. To encourage students to develop priorities and practices that will contribute to their well-being and effectiveness spiritually, socially, psychologically, and physically.
- 7. To provide students with an opportunity to ask questions from experience gained from class/lab assignments before graduation.

The success of an experience-based ministry educational program requires a growing population large enough to sustain continued expansion of the program to meet the various needs of a changing society.

WHY ATLANTA?

Reams of information have been received from Chambers of Commerce, planning departments, colleges, and realtors. On-site visits were made to several cities by Board members and staff. The original list of sites included 20 cities representing each of our state/district Conferences. These locations were evaluated on 28 factors. Then, four cities, including six colleges were evaluated on 36 factors. These factors centered on educational issues, the city environment, and costs.

Some of these issues included: state laws pertaining to operating and degree granting authority; enrollment of college; quality of educational program; food service; median cost of housing for staff; cost of land; opportunities for student employment; climate; population growth; kinds of people in the area; cost of living; transportation; etc.

In the following sections you will find some of these factors explained in more detail as they relate to our program and needs.

ATLANTA CITY WITHOUT LIMITS

The Chamber of Commerce calls Atlanta "a city without limits." The Atlanta Metropolitan statistical area includes 18 counties. Three of these counties are among the 15 fastestgrowing counties in the nation. Atlanta and the State of Georgia are projected to be among the top five fastest-growing areas in the nation and one of four states representing 50% of the population growth in the nation through 2010. The other states are California, Texas, and Florida.

Georgia is the largest state east of the Mississippi and the 11th most populous in the nation. It is second only to Florida in population increase for the decade.

Atlanta has been growing by 60,000 people per year for the last decade and the trend is projected to continue with 942,000 new jobs in the Atlanta area between 1988 and 2010—keeping Atlanta as one of the top five fastest-growing job markets in the nation.


The continued opportunity for church-planting experience for students looks favorable in Atlanta and Georgia.


Atlanta is not an antebellum, "Gone With the Wind" type city. It is an international city where the native Georgian is in the minority.

Atlanta is presently headquarters

for many of the largest companies in the United States.

Atlanta is preparing for the 21st Century. As you know, 83% of the population in the United States will soon be living in the 200 largest cities of the nation. Atlanta provides the varying kind of environment to which we seek to expose our students in order to make them more effective leaders in the future.





GOOD CLIMATE FOR EVANGELISM EXPERIENCE

Since our Bible College operates on a fall-to-spring calender, the weather can play a very important role in the amount of opportunity our students may have to participate in an experience-based ministry education program.

Atlanta has an average daily high in January of 51.4 degrees with an average low of 33.4. There are 59 freezing days compared to 119 in Chicago which has an average January high of 31.5. The humidity is not significantly different—Atlanta 70%, Chicago 67%. Chicago has more days of precipitation with 123, while Atlanta has 116. Atlanta has an average daily high in July of 86.5 and only 19 ninety-degree days a year, while Chicago has 21 ninety-degree days with an average daily high of 84.4 degrees during July.

Atlanta's enjoyable climate is due to its location in the foothills of the southern Appalachians in north-central Georgia. With the mountains to the north tending to retard the southward movement of Polar air masses, Atlanta's winters are rather mild. Cold spells are not unusual but they are short lived and seldom disrupt outdoor activities for an extended period of time. Atlanta has a mean elevation about 1.000 feet above sea level.



CLAYTON STATE COLLEGE

Clayton State College is a senior college within the University System of Georgia. Founded in 1969 on 295 acres in Morrow, Georgia (Southeast metro Atlanta) as Clayton Junior College, it remained a junior college until 1985, when it became a senior college and was renamed. Presently it offers the Bachelor of Business Administration and Bachelor of Science in Nursing. It also provides the first two years of work in more than 45 transfer programs and one- and two-year career and technical programs. Enrollment in Spring, 1989, was almost 3,600.

Clayton State is very proud and protective of the fact that it has no record of any criminal action on campus. This is contrary to what is found on most college campuses.

There are also 31 colleges within a 40-minute commute of Clayton.


COMPARATIVE **COST OF LIVING**

Average new home costs in Atlanta are \$121,989, with the lowest in Clayton County at \$75,609. Clayton County enjoyed a slow

and steady growth for many years. But in the second half of 1985, major national and international developers realized the county's potential and began investing heavily in shopping centers, apartment complexes, new business parks, a foreign trade zone, and speculated in over a million feet of space for new and existing industry.

Today, barely three years later, the county has nearly two billion feet of shopping space with 555 shopping centers and mall stores.

While most of the county's development has been concentrated in the airport area, a secondary center of commerce has sprung up about a mile and a



half from Clayton State College around Southlake Mall, a regional mall with 121 stores.

However, because Clayton only recently became one of metro Atlanta's fastest-growing counties, its land and construction costs are still comparatively low.


The cost of living in Clayton County is very similar to Oregon, Illinois, with housing being about the same and utilities and taxes are less.




EMPLOYMENT

The opportunity for student employment is very favorable with restaurant/ retail positions paying \$3.35 to \$5.50 per hour. The average weekly wage for manufacturing is about \$450, with the high end of potential employment in the transportation field, where the average weekly salary is about \$745 for full-time employees.

Continued employment opportunities look favorable as the job market in Clayton County is projected to increase from 97,190 in 1987 to 136,729 by the year 2000.






ATLANTA'S EXCELLENT TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES

Hartsfield International Airport is one of the major airports in the world. Located in Clayton County, the airport is within two hours' flying time of 80% of the nation's population with flights to nearly anywhere in the U.S. as well as Europe and Asia.

Clayton County also has the best interstate access in Georgia. Highways I-75, I-85, I-285, newly opened I-675, and four major U.S. highways move traffic between Clayton County and the airport, and throughout Atlanta.

Atlanta is located about halfway between Chicago and Miami, directly south of Columbus, Ohio, centrally located in the fastest-growing region in the United States. From 1977 to 1986, the southeast attracted an average 1,837 new residents every day, accounting for 27% of the nation's total growth. By the year 2000, one-third of the nation's growth will occur in the southeast, making it the number-one spot in the U.S.






RELIGION

MAJORITY OF POPULATION UNCHURCHED

There are only 115 churches and houses of worship representing 16 denominations in Clayton County. That is only one church for every 1450 people.

The unchurched population in Clayton County ranges from 50% to 69.9%.

ANTICIPATED STEPS

1989-90

YEAR OF TRANSITION

1. Maintain quality educational program for students at Oregon Bible College, with special arrangements for married students who are nearing the end of their program who would find it difficult to move to a relocated setting.

2. Assist local churches in revival, renewal, and revitalization. (See the July/August PROGRESS JOURNAL for more information on our plans to assist churches.)

CONSTRUCTION OF NEW CAMPUS BEGINS

3. Finalize details of relocation: a. Revision of curriculum for Oregon Bible College b. Purchase land

- c. Begin construction of apartment building and office/ classroom/chapel/library building—use volunteer labor from throughout the Church of God.
- d. Make plans for physical move of staff and equipment—plan to use volunteers to accomplish the move.

REQUIRED FACILITIES

A new 8,000-square-foot building for offices, classrooms, chapel, and library for an estimated cost of \$200,000.

Apartment Building: eight units with four to six people per apartment will provide space for a total of 32 to 48 single students, or a lesser number if units are used for married students and their families.

COUNTING THE COST

We believe that relocation will help us to be most effective in ministry as an act of obedience to God's Word. As good stewards, the cost of this project has been counted. Appraisals, offers, and estimates indicate our present property has a value of about \$770,000. The Board has viewed property in the area of Clayton State College and has determined that five- to 10-acre parcels of appropriate land are available for up to \$350,000 (depending on location). Contractors have projected the cost of an office/classroom building and an eight-plex apart-

ment house at \$200,000 each. If volunteer labor from Church of God members is utilized, costs could be lower.

Cost of Moving:

Provisions will be made to move staff families to the Atlanta area, along with the library, office equipment/furniture, and dormitory furniture.

The initial phase of moving will involve no more than five families. Estimates received of moving costs indicate the cost will be less than \$10,000. Individuals have volunteered trucks and labor to assist, which would reduce this estimate.

Cost to Students:

We do not anticipate increased costs for tuition, lodging, or meals for our students. Food service is available at Clayton State College at a reasonable cost. Fourteen meals are served weekly. Three entrees and a grill are available daily, Monday through Friday. Lodging will be provided in college owned and supervized apartments.

PHASED MOVE

1. Initially, publishing, mailing, and business services will remain in Oregon, Illinois. A gradual move will provide more stability and adequate time to secure a new printer and other vendors.

2. Establish Oregon Bible College in Atlanta—develop a working relationship with Clayton State College.

3. Emphasize assistance to local churches in revival, renewal, and revitalization.



4. Emphasize evangelism and practical training experiences for our students. Students and staff will participate in starting a new church in Atlanta.



Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association

The Retirement Association of the Church of God General Conference has been in existence over 20 years. Retirement benefits of over \$200,000 have been distributed to 14 members and five member spouses. The fund contains assets of over \$320,000.

Major changes were made in the association at the regular biannual meeting held August 3, 1988. The revisions to the rules and regulations provide additional options regarding investments and benefits. One provision also opened a window of opportunity for those who failed to enter the program when they first became eligible. Six pastors took advantage of this opportunity to join the association. Four churches also joined. The present membership of the association is 46 pastors, 46 churches, and six conferences.

At the biannual meeting last year, Dean Urish, who had served as Vice President of the association for 10 years, submitted his resignation. William J. Gaspar was elected to serve during the next two years of the unexpired term. The other officers are S. O. Ross, Chairman; and David Krogh, Secretary-Treasurer.

Church of God Investment Fund

The Church of God Investment Fund provides assistance to churches that wish to borrow funds to purchase property, remodel or construct buildings, purchase parsonages, etc.

As of March 1, 1989, the fund has a balance of approximately \$46,000. Nearly 80% of the fund is being loaned at a reasonable rate of interest to three churches.

The Directors of the fund are: Bill Burnham, Chairman; Robert Smith, Vice Chairman; David Krogh, Secretary-Treasurer; and Directors Dr. William D. Lawrence and Joe E. James.

Ministers' Fund

The Ministers' Fund exists to assist pastors or their families in times of emergency. The current rules limit the amount of help to \$300 per family in any one year. The Board has met three times during the year. A January meeting was held in addition to the customary meetings at Ministerial Conference and General Conference.

During the 1988 Ministerial Conference, Dennis Cheatwood, Tom Schmitt, and James Raymond were interviewed and approved for license. A licensing/commissioning service was held at the 1988 General Conference for these men. Tom was unable to attend because of an injury to his wife.

A pilot program of linking new pastors with a "mentor" was also experimented with this year. It is an attempt to provide the new pastor with an encourager and a resource person to turn to for help and advice in the early stages of ministry. We appreciate the willingness of Pastor John Railton to serve as mentor to Dennis Cheatwood this past year. We will continue to examine the merits of such a program and will consider expanding it to include all new pastors.

We have continued to work on licensing guidelines that would govern the work of the board. They will be presented and discussed at the Ministerial Association meeting at the 1989 Ministerial Conference.

The board is continuing to consider the issue of licensure of women, and has undertaken a study of the divorce/remarriage issue at the request of the Board of Directors.

I would like to express my appreciation to Bro. Johns, Bro. Ross, and Bro. Hearp for their investment of time and wholehearted energy to this service.

POSITION DESCRIPTION Board of Directors

ROLE OF CONFERENCE DELEGATES

At the 1989 General Conference, two members will be elected to the Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference for four-year terms. The terms of Joe James and Don Overmyer will expire at this Conference. They may not be reelected according to the constitution. Nominations appear on page 19.

Below is the position description for directors who serve on the Board. As nominations are considered, the following information should be taken into consideration.

Title:

Director, Church of God General Conference

Summary:

The position exists to transact and administer the business of Church of God General Conference in accordance with its Constitution and By-Laws.

Duties:

- Serve as a Director of Church of God General Conference.

 Employ a President who is responsible for the administration of the work of the Church of God General Conference and Oregon Bible College.
- 2. Serve as Trustee of Oregon Bible College.
- 3. Serve as a Trustee of Oregon Bible College Development Foundation (13 members).
- 4. Give general (external) supervision to all Conference/College affairs.
- 5. Engage in long-range planning and evaluation.
- 6. Make recommendations to Conference delegates regarding: a. Amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws
 - b. Major policy or major policy changes
 - c. Creation of major programs
 - d Budgeting
- d. Budgeting
- 7. Acquire and dispose of real and personal property.
- Approve borrowings and other plans to finance operations.
 Give of his private means to support the Conference/Col-
- lege and be actively engaged in fundraising activities.
- Establish controls to protect the rights and interests of contributors, member churches and conferences, and staff.
- Communicate the purposes and programs of the Conference/College to the Church of God through public-relations efforts.
- 12. Employ competent auditor.
- 13. Attend all meetings of the Board and the Annual Conference.

Organizational Relationships:

Each Board member is accountable to the Conference delegate body for the carrying out of the duties of the office.

The Board is accountable for the work of the President.

Qualifications:

The qualifications of each director shall be those given in 1 Timothy 3, Titus 1, and such other scriptures as teach the qualifications of church leaders. A Director may be either male or female. The Preamble to the Constitution of the Church of God General Conference states that "Delegates and interested members of the Church of God will meet at a designated place and time to confer in all matters pertaining to the spiritual life and business of the churches."

The Constitution then proceeds to state in Article II that "each member church of 15 or more members, which has held at least six preaching services during the year, shall be entitled to one delegate for each 50 of its active members or fraction thereof. Delegates named shall be active members of the Church of God."

In addition to church delegates, the Constitution provides for delegates at large as follows:

"a) the Board of Directors and one delegate from each state or district Conference;

b) the following licensed or ordained minsters: one who is actively pastoring a church; a full-time employee of the General Conference; those who have met either of the above qualifications and have reached retirement age."

Conference delegates play a very strategic role in the work of the Church of God. Delegates from local churches should be selected with great care. Delegates shall be active members of the Church of God, and it is important that they be able to successfully represent their local church and have interest in the work of the General Conference and Oregon Bible College.

Before attending Conference, delegates should:

- Carefully read the reports, recommendations, proposed budgets, and other information regarding the summer Conference.
- 2) Meet with the Church Board, or the congregation, to determine the wishes of the local church regarding the business which will be transacted at the Conference.
- Be certain that the local church secretary has submitted a delegate form listing active members, along with the names of the delegates.
- 4) Send a registration form to the General Conference to make reservations for attendance prior to July 15.

The delegate will have important duties to perform while in attendance at Conference:

- 1) Register with the Credentials Committee upon arrival at Conference.
- 2) Attend all business sessions of the Conference.
- 3) If unable to attend a business session, contact an alternate delegate from your local church to serve.
- 4) Take careful notes of decisions that are made and information which is shared.
- 5) Be prepared to make a personal commitment during Conference to the financial support of Conference/College ministries.
- After returning home, the delegate's work must continue by:
- Presenting a report to the congregation and/or Church Board, sharing information from Conference, and decisions which were made.
- 2) Encouraging participation of local members in General Conference programs and activities.
- 3) Contacting local church families to encourage them to make a commitment to send at least \$10 per month to the work of the Conference/College.

The work of the General Conference and Oregon Bible College will be greatly strengthened by delegates who take their responsibility seriously and who will follow the guidelines mentioned above.

EXPLANATION OF BUDGET

The proposed budget for June 1, 1990 - May 31, 1991, represents an investment in people, programs, and facilities. This proposed budget reflects spending for the following:

1. Salaries and Wages—compensation is provided for 11 full-time employees; three half-time employees; two quarter-time employees; three guest instructors; and part-time student help.

2. Social Security—the social security tax rate is 7.65%.

3. Employee Benefits—this includes the life and health insurance, workmen's compensation, participation in the Ministers Voluntary Retirement Association, and miscellaneous fringe benefits.

4. Advertising, recruitment—this includes travel, telephone calls, printing of brochures, and mailings to promote Oregon Bible College.

5. Films, Speakers—honorariums are paid to non-staff speakers at chapel and graduation.

6. Foreign Exchange—when foreign currency is converted into U.S. dollars, there is an expense to cover the difference in value.

7. Auto Expense—license plates, insurance, and upkeep are provided for Conference vehicles.

8. Office and Computer Supplies—paper, ribbons, stationery, and envelopes.

9. Royalties—a small fee is paid to use copyrighted material for our Sunday school curriculum.

10. Editorial—a small honorarium is paid to editors of our Sunday school curriculum.

11. Magazines, Library—a collection of religious and theological magazines are a part of our library collection.

12. Periodicals, Books, Dues—covers expenses incurred by staff as support for classes and their participation in professional organizations.

13. Postage—includes the mailing of the PROGRESS JOURNAL, *The Restitution Herald*, quarterlies, and all correspondence.

14. Professional Services—an annual audit is required by our Constitution.

15. Repairs, Nonplant—this item covers maintenance contracts on computers and other office equipment.

16. Staff Education—staff members are encouraged to attend at least one seminar each year to remain current in their field.

17. Mailing Supplies—includes envelopes, boxes, and miscellaneous items.

18. Supplies and Expense—includes printing supplies, piano tunings, towels and paper products, and a multitude of other small-expense items.

19. Telephone—includes basic service and long-distance calls. 20. Travel—includes staff travel on behalf of the Conference and College, along with travel forAdvisory Committees and Board of Directors.

21. Assistance, Mission Points—funds provided in support of overseas mission projects.

22. Assistance, Churches—Church Development aid is budgeted for two churches.

23. Plant Operations—includes an estimated operating cost for offices, classrooms, and student housing.

24. Library Books—a small number of books are added to our collection each year.

25. Furniture and Equipment—a reserve fund to replace equipment as necessary.

26. Resale—includes all items purchased which are resold including textbooks for College classes.

27. Vehicle Replacement—over 50,000 miles are driven each year by staff visiting churches, gospel teams, and other business travel. Gifts of vehicles have helped to minimize this cost in the past.

28. Contingency—since this budget is being adopted 10 months before the fiscal year begins, this item provides a cushion for adjustment when the new budget begins June 1, 1990.

Projected Income

1. Sales—this includes income from sale of quarterlies, tracts, books, etc.

2. Herald Subscriptions—subscriptions are \$12 per year.

3. Trust and Endowment—these are designated funds given to the Conference and College that are invested and earning interest which can be used for general operations. The Oregon Bible College Foundation is providing a significant portion of this amount.

4. Tuition and Housing—this income is based on a projected enrollment of 30 students (25 in student housing) for the 1990-91 school year.

5. Miscellaneous—this includes income from the sale or lease of Oregon Bible College and General Conference buildings. This amount helps to offset plant operations expense.

Contributions Needed

To accomplish the program goals for the General Conference and Oregon Bible College for 1990-91, churches, conferences, and individual families will need to contribute \$402,500. This is approximately \$32,500 per month.

This projection compares with \$402,000 required for the 1989-90 fiscal year.

You are cordially invited to a church-raising party the week of August 7-12, 1989. That is the tentative date for the construction of the new facility of the Oregon Church of God, Oregon, Illinois. Plans are to construct that week the shell of the entire 22,000 square foot facility using "pre-fab" walls delivered to the job site from the factory. Your help can make

it possible to erect the walls and completely roof the entire facility. It will be an exciting week of teamwork.

The Oregon church has purchased 7.75 acres of land exactly one mile west of its present location. Building plans have been finalized. David Kizer from Timberland Bible Church, South Bend, IN, served as the architect and did a tremendous job for the church. 



Celebrating Our Heritage— Shaping Our Future



We celebrate the 50th anniversary of Oregon Bible College with great joy and thanksgiving. Oregon Bible College can look back humbly on a glorious past. The accomplishments are an indication of God's favor and we have hope as we look to the future. Oregon Bible College has had a tremendous impact upon the Church of God. Over 85% of our licensed and ordained pastors graduated from Oregon Bible College. Hundreds of other alumni are serving in leadership positions as elders, Sunday school superintendents, music directors, deacons, Sunday school teachers, etc. Multiple thousands of lives have been touched by the ministry of our students.

How grateful we are to the vision of our early leaders who recognized the need to train workers for Christian service. Among the working rules of our General Conference, organized in 1921, was the provision "that facilities be provided to aid in the education of those desiring to prepare themselves for the ministry, Bible teaching, or other religious work." This purpose was implemented two years later by the Bible Training Class which was the forerunner to Oregon Bible College. Though discontinued during the depression years of the 30's, our pastors, delegates, and young people voted in 1939 to reopen the Bible Training School. Only two months later, the school opened with six students. In 1942, the name was changed from "Bible Training Class" to "Oregon Bible College."

The progress of Oregon Bible College over 50 years is indeed a remarkable accomplishment. Many Bible colleges have closed in recent years because of declining enrollments and financial difficulties. We are grateful to God for continuing to provide students who wish to prepare for service and we are thankful that God continues to provide financial support through the contributions of his people.

It is appropriate at this anniversary occasion to celebrate the achievement of our Foundation goal of raising an endowment fund of one million dollars. These invested funds will provide funding for present programs and for new programs and activities. The membership of the Church of God is to be commended for extra giving to the Foundation in addition to consistent giving to the Goal for Giving for general operations.

Today, Oregon Bible College stands alone out of all the thousands of colleges and universities of the world. It is unique in its mission and in its message. It exists for the purpose of providing leadership for the Church of God of the Abrahamic Faith. Its unique message emphasizes the oneness of God, the Sonship of Jesus Christ, conditional immortality, the kingdom on the earth, and the other distinctive teachings of the Church of God. For 50 years, Oregon Bible College has been true to its mission and its message.

What About the Next 50 Years?

Students of prophecy are convinced that we are living in the end times before the return of Christ. We may not have 50 more years to serve as the institution of higher education for the Church of God. However, Oregon Bible College cannot rest upon its reputation. Our past is only a foundation upon which to build for the future.

1. Our Mission. Our mission in the next 50 years, if the Lord tarries, will be the same as in the past: to train leadership for the Church of God. It is imperative for us to pray the Lord of the harvest that he will send forth laborers into fields that are ripe and ready for harvest. Today, a lack of trained leadership is holding up progress in the Church of God. There are urgent leadership needs in existing churches and our vision to plant new churches will be a reality only with more trained workers. Every member of the Church of God is encouraged to be a recruiter for Oregon Bible College. Every member is challenged to drop idea "seeds" in the minds of children, young people, and mid-career individuals. Words of encouragement and support can be spoken and the challenge of ministry can be laid out before prospective students. Prayers for the convicting of God's Spirit must be offered by everyone.

2. Our Message. The doctrinal distinctives that have provided a foundation for the College during the past will continue to be the foundation during the next 50 years. The doctrinal heritage of the Church of God will not be compromised. Students will continue to be taught what we believe, why we believe it, why it is important, and how to communicate it to our world.

3. The Pursuit of Excellence. God calls us to give our best in service to him. We seek excellence in our instructors, in our curriculum, in our standards, in our performance, and in the product we produce.

The Resources We Will Need

If Oregon Bible College is to accomplish its mission during the next 50 years, we must not minimize the cost. We desperately need the prayer support of our entire (Please turn to page 11)

RECOMMENDATIONS AND CONSTITUTION REVISIONS

The following recommendations and constitution revisions will be acted upon by delegates to the summer Conference, July 31 to August 4, at Western Illinois University, Macomb, Illinois.

Recommendation One

The Board of Directors presents for the approval of the delegates of the Church of God General Conference, the relocation of the corporate offices of the Church of God General Conference, including Outreach and Church Development, Oregon Bible College, Printing and Publishing Services, and Business Services.

Explanation: Please see pages 9 to 16 in the May/June/1989 *Progress Journal* for specific proposals regarding this recommendation.

Recommendation Two

To implement Recommendation One, the Board proposes an amendment to Article I, Section 1 of the General Conference Constitution: "The general offices of the Church of God General Conference shall be incorporated in the state in which the offices are located." (The present reading: "The general offices of the Church of God General Conference shall be located at Oregon, Illinois.")

Recommendation Three

The Board of Directors proposes an amendment to the Constitution, Article I, Section 3: delete entire section. This section currently reads "For the purpose of conducting business, the General Conference is incorporated in the state of Illinois under the name of 'Church of God General Conference,' a corporation not for profit."

Explanation: The deletion of this section helps to implement Recommendations One and Two. It is also redundant because the preamble to the Constitution says that the name of the organization is Church of God General Conference and that it is a notfor-profit organization. The proposed new Article I, Section 1 says that the organization shall be incorporated.

Recommendation Four

The Board of Directors recommends an amendment to Article II, Section 3, c, which has to do with delegates entitled to vote at business sessions. Delete the following: "The Executive Director of Church of God General Conference and the President of Oregon Bible College."

Explanation: Titles and positions have been changed. Currently there is a President of Church of God General Conference/Oregon BibleCollege. In most cases this individual is eligible to vote under Article II Section 3, b, as a licensed or ordained minister.

Recommendation Five

The Board of Directors proposes an amendment to the Constitution regarding nominations for the Board of Directors in Article IV, Section 4. Eliminate the entire section and replace with the following: "Nominations for the Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference may be submitted by: State or District Conference Boards of the Church of God; Churches that are members of the General Conference; Pastors' Association of the Church of God General Conference. Name(s) of nominees and resumes will be submitted to the President of the General Conference by May 1 and will be printed in the General Conference issue of *Progress Journal.*"

Explanation: There are two major changes in this amendment. 1)The Board is proposing that our Pastors' Association be given nominating authority. 2) The current Constitution calls for nominations to be submitted by January 1. Throughout the history of the General Conference, pastors have played a significant role on the Board of Directors. The Board feels it is appropriate to encourage our Pastors' Association to have a role in placing nominations. Changing the date from January 1 to May 1 will permit more time for nominations to be prepared and will still permit them to be included in the General Conference issue of the *Progress Journal*.

Recommendation Six

The Board of Directors proposes an amendment to the Bylaws of the Church of God General Conference, Article I, Section 1 regarding the purpose of the Conference: "The purpose of the Church of God General Conference is to assist Church of God members, churches, and conferences to perform their commission, which is to make disciples by bringing the lost to Jesus Christ, and by leading the believer to maturity, by providing leadership, resources, and services."

The present wording is: "The purpose for which the Church of God General Conference is incorporated is to assist Church of God members, churches, and conferences to perform their commission to feed the Church of God and preach the gospel to all the world by providing trained personnel, services, resources, and materials."

Explanation: The proposed amendment clarifies our understanding of the mission to which the Church of God has been called. The words "make disciples" bring to mind the work of Jesus as he worked with the twelve disciples, beginning with his selection of them, his association with them, and the impartation of himself to them. "Make disciples" helps us to focus on the process of finding the lost and leading them to conversion.

The phrase "leading the believer to maturity" includes the idea of establishing individuals in the faith (Colossians 2:6, 7), equipping them for ministry (Ephesians 4:11, 12), and providing indepth personal training (Mark 3:14).

The Conference seeks to help local churches in their mission by offering lay and professional training of leadership. The Conference also seeks to play a servant leadership role by giving encouragement, assistance, and a role model in ministry.

REVITALIZATION OF THE CHURCH OF GOD

As the issue of relocation of the General Conference and Oregon Bible College has been discussed over the past several years, the revitalization of the Church of God has been presented as an integral part of our plans for the future. Attenders at the 1988 summer General Conference overwhelmingly acknowledged the importance of bringing renewal to the church. Though much has already been written on this subject, we present the following information for your review.

What is revitalization? To vitalize means "to give life to; make vital." Revitalization means "to give life again" or "to make vital again." Synonyms are "renewal" and "revival."

It has been observed by Thomas Zimmerman that, as denominations age, there are certain tendencies that must be considered.

1. Denominations tend to become ends in themselves.

2. Continuation of programs that have lost their validity.

3. Self-continuity becomes the reason for being, taking precedence over the desire to proclaim the message of the gospel.

4. Conformity to a master program replaces individual initiative and creativity.

5. As professional clergy become better trained, lay participation is diminished.

Some of these same tendencies can be seen in congregations as they age. Such signs indicate a need for revival, renewal, or revitalization. We do not exist as an end in ourselves! Our programs and activities must have life and meaning! We must make certain that the proclamation of the message of the gospel is our reason for being, not the preservation of our institutions. Individual initiative and creativity must be encouraged in each local church and throughout our Conference. And we must continue to preach and teach the priesthood of all believers as they use their gifts in ministry.

Revitalization/renewal/revival does not take place only once in the history of the church. It seems to be a characteristic of churches that they have their ups and downs; interest and enthusiasm seem to ebb and flow. Though we may wish that our work would remain on an even keel, with steady progress and ever-increasing enthusiasm, most churches from time to time need revival. It may need to take place in each generation, or even more often as we see the need to pump new life and enthusiasm into our churches and institutions.

What is the evidence that revitalization is needed? Reports from our churches indicate that there is a declining number of baptisms, which has barely kept pace with deaths, falling away, and transferring away.

Seven hundred thirty-nine members became inactive over the past five years. We find young people who are abandoning the church. It is growing more difficult to attract young people to full-time Christian service. The attendance at many of our churches is on a plateau or is declining. Seventy-four percent of our Sunday schools have 50 or less in attendance. These statistics are not the problem. Rather, they are evidence of the need for new life, revival, or revitalization.

What are the aspects of revitalization?

The summer 1984 issue of *Leadership* magazine contains an article by Howard Snyder entitled, "Renewal That Lasts." The author suggests five dimensions of revitalization, renewal, or revival which we believe are applicable to the Church of God:

1. Personal: The renewal of churches and conferences begins on a very personal level, with each person seeking a closer and more personal relationship with the Father.

2. Corporate renewal: As individuals within a local church are renewed, the whole community of believers will take on a renewed life. Congregations may experience a dramatic spirit of revival, or simply a gentle quickening in the life of believers. The renewal of congregations will bring new life to our association of churches.

3. Conceptual renewal: This renewal takes place as God gives new vision of what the church can and should be. Conceptual renewal is a new vision for the church's life and mission. It comes primarily in the area of our thoughts, ideas, and images of the church. Snyder says we need an understanding of the church that is "based on scripture first, on practical reason and experience second, and only thirdly on tradition. What promotes revival, renewal, and faithful kingdom witness in the church should be kept; what does not should be scrapped. We can be imprisoned by our concepts as surely as we are imprisoned by our habits."

4. Structural renewal: This dimension of renewal is concerned with the way we, as believers, live out our lives together. "History is full of examples of structural renewal becoming a key to extending renewal beyond the passing moment. Early Christians discovered the usefulness of homes for church gatherings, and through history the rediscovery of the house church has often been a part of renewal movements. Truly enough: we cannot bring renewal by changing forms, but we can stifle it by putting forms above life. Renewal is less likely to come and more likely to die in a tradition-bound group where everything happens in the church building and there is little freedom to innovate."

5. Missiological renewal: A church needing renewal is focused inward. A renewed church focuses outward to needy persons. Sometimes renewal actually begins here, with a new sense of mission. Some people catch a vision for a new ministry in the church, the neighborhood, or the world.

Summary:

In considering these thoughts, it is apparent that revitalization must begin with individuals and from there it will spread through the local church. Since our General Conference is a service organization, we are committed to assisting in any way possible to bring about renewal in the lives of our members and revitalization of our churches. Here are some initial things that we are willing and able to do:

1. Over the past few years, our staff has set aside specific times during retreats and meetings to pray specifically for pastors and for local churches. We will commit to you that we will continue to set aside time for prayer and fasting for our pastors and churches. In the past few weeks, we have had two such events involving our staff.

2. We also commit to you that we will pray for revival in our own lives. We will spend more time in Bible reading, scripture memorization, meditation, and prayer so that we can be used of God for his service. We will continue to be personally involved in an outward focus of concern for those who are lost by loving, praying, developing friendships, witnessing, and discipling those who are lost.

3. At the recent Pastors' Conference in St. Charles, Missouri, the pastors unanimously initiated a year of prayer and fasting for Oregon Bible College, the General Conference, churches at large, spiritual leadership, and the Board of Directors. We are deeply grateful to our pastors for taking the lead in this effort. We will join with our pastors to participate and support this emphasis throughout the year.

4. We recommend that a task force of pastors/staff/Board convene in Oregon, Illinois, in September, 1989, to discuss further steps of revitalization that can be pursued with our local churches and the General Conference.

5. We offer an outline which some have found helpful in starting the process of personal renewal. (See "A Tool to Use for Personal Renewal" below.)

6. The above-mentioned items are only preliminary offers of help. We want to hear from you with your suggestions of additional ways that our Board and staff can help you and your church to be revitalized.

A Tool to Use for Personal Renewal

Some of our pastors and staff have found the following outline helpful in starting the process of personal renewal. We offer these thoughts for your consideration and use.

Our Quest:

Psalm 85:6, "Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?"

An Outline of Prayer for Renewal—Psalm 51 (use these scriptural phrases as you pray):

Make me hear joy and gladness (v. 8a) Blot out all my iniquity (v. 9b) Create in me a pure heart (v. 10a) Renew a steadfast spirit within me (v. 10b) Do not cast me from your presence (v. 11a)

a

Do not take your holy spirit from me (v. 11b)

Restore to me the joy of your salvation (v. 12a)

Grant me a willing spirit to sustain me (v. 12b)

Pray that these scriptures will be a reality in your heart. Pray that God will give you joy in your faith and that service to God will be a time of personal rejoicing. Pray that God will create within your heart a hunger and thirst for righteousness. Pray for a closer relationship with the Lord.

What has God been doing in your personal life? List one thing which gives evidence that God is working in your personal life:

Give God thanks for what he has been doing. Claim God's help for your future service. "Being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus" (Phil. 1:6).

Renewal comes from God as we respond to his will.

Renewal comes through God's power at work in our lives. This power is activated when we yield to God in obedience to his will. There are some basic conditions in which renewal is most likely possible:

1. When we are obedient to Scripture. Three questions regarding Scripture are: What does it say? How does it apply to me? What should I do about it?

2. A cleansing from sin. Read Psalm 66:18; 2 Peter 1:4-9 and follow the instruction of 1 John 1:7-9 and claim the promise of forgiveness.

3. Earnest prayer. Read James 4:2 and Matthew 7:7.

4. Submission to God. Read James 4:7, 8. Pray a prayer of commitment to God: "I give my life to you—use it as you will."

5. Be filled with the Spirit. Read Romans 8:14 and 16.

6. Be involved in a redemptive ministry. God will bless our efforts if they are in agreement with his purpose of salvation for the lost. (John 3:16 and Matthew 28:19, 20.) Ask God to give you someone with whom you can share your faith: "Lord lay some soul upon my heart." Write the names of persons you want to see come to the Lord.

membership: for our students, our staff, and for our recruitment effort. Daily prayer for Oregon Bible College may be a high price to pay for some, but it is essential if we are to accomplish our mission.

As Oregon Bible College grows and as staff members retire or seek other employment, there is an ongoing need for capable people to serve on our staff. We need a much larger pool of individuals in the Church of God who will pursue Masters' Degrees in the area of Bible, Theology, and Ministry. Such education will not only prepare people to serve on our staff, but it will enhance the effectiveness of the work of our churches. We must not minimize the value of professional education.

We have a desperate need for more students at the College. We seek students who love the Lord, love the truth, love the lost, and are willing to pay the price for ministry. There are many talented people in the Church of God who are being called to full-time Christian service. We trust that these individuals will hear God's call and will respond by preparing for service.

We earnestly need the financial support of all of our members. The entire work of the Church of God General Conference and Oregon Bible College can be supported with \$.30 a day from every member family! Yes, it is possible for our work to be advanced with less than the cost of a can of pop per day from every member family. It seems hard to believe that so much can be accomplished with so little from our membership. Perhaps \$10 per month is more than some families are willing or able to give. However, others are giving so much more.

In Psalm 73, we have a picture of the process of passing the knowledge of God's works from one generation to another. The psalmist indicates that we must speak of God's works to our children, "so the next generation would know them, even the children yet to be born, and they in turn would tell their children" (v. 6). It is my prayer that the heritage of the Church of God will be perpetuated as Church of God members tell their children of the truths that have been passed to us, and the way God has worked through the Church of God to be a standard-bearer of truth and righteousness. It is my prayer that parents will challenge their children to consider full-time Christian service as they model a love for truth and a love for the lost.

Oregon Bible College has a bright future. Our leadership seeks to be submissive to God's leadership, responsive to the needs of our members and churches, and committed to providing quality education for our students. With your help, the next 50 years can be even better than the first.



day was spent focusing on how we communicate with God. Each of us was given quiet times alone to communicate with God.



1989 CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

THE 69TH ANNUAL Church of God General Conference was held at Western Illinois University, Macomb, Illinois, July 31 to August 4. The theme of the conference was "Partnership in Advancing the Gospel." The purpose of the conference was to: renew our commitment to the gospel message of the Kingdom of God; celebrate the 50th anniversary of Oregon Bible College; rejoice in the victory of accomplishing the Oregon Bible College Foundation goal of raising one million dollars; adopt a personal goal of strengthening our daily devotional life; and commit ourselves to each one reach one during this year.

Evening Activities

The conference was launched with an inspiring musical extravaganza Monday evening, under the direction of Dale Ramsey. Following the service, a special reception in honor of Oregon Bible College alumni was held.

Tuesday evening, special music was provided by groups that had sung together as students at Oregon Bible College. Louise Lapp directed a special choir composed of individu-

als who had performed under her instruction while at the college. All who had served on the staff of OBC in the past were recognized. Former President William Wachtel presented a message expressing appreciation for our past.

In recognition of the achievement of our goal of raising one million dollars for the OBC Development Foundation, a special reception was held Tuesday evening to thank all those who made commitments toward the goal. A number of individuals testified of how God had blessed them as a result of their giving to the Foundation.

The service on Wednesday evening consisted of the dramatization of events from past and current college activities. Former Presidents Dr. Alva Huffer and Dr. Charles Pryor presented messages regarding the importance of Oregon Bible College for today.

The Ripley and Macomb congregations sponsored an ice cream social for those in attendance at the conference following the Wednesday evening service.

Thursday evening, the theme of the service was Looking to the Future with Vision. Children from the junior church program were in attendance during the early part of the service to enjoy a puppet skit about Oregon Bible College and to receive special gifts. President David Krogh challenged the membership of the Church of God to commit themselves to spiritual growth, to the reaching of those who are lost, and to support the work of the Church of God with



prayer and financial support. The service concluded with a moving enactment of the Last Supper, based upon DaVinci's painting. The communion service was a fitting act of unity as the conference closed.

Classes and Workshops

Adult Bible classes were taught by Scott Ross, William Wachtel, and President David Stephen Bolhous. Youth classes were Krogh speaking directed by Thomas Schmitt. Ralph Childs was the director of the Bible

school. Sharon Cain directed the nursery staff. Thirty-four workshops were offered on a variety of topics including: evangelism, family life, prophecy, disciple-making, stewardship, and Christian education.

Elections

Pastor Scott Ross of the Jaynes Street Community Church in Omaha, Nebraska, and Dr. William D. Lawrence of the Valley View Bible Church in Scottsdale, Arizona, were elected to four-year terms on the Board of Directors. They replaced retiring board members Joe James and Don Overmyer, who were presented plaques of appreciation by President David Krogh. The officers elected for the coming year are: Scott Ross, Chairman; William Lawrence, Vice Chairman; Brenda Wessel, Secretary; Elmo Gaspar, Treasurer; and Donna Deane, Vivian Kirkpatrick II, and Chris Ramsey, Directors.

The following individuals were elected to four-year terms on the Advisory Committees: Higher Education-Joe James, Guthrie Grove Church, Pelzer, SC; Missions-Mardy Lawrence, Valley View Bible Church, Scottsdale, AZ; and Christian Education-Carol Ring, East Peoria Community Church of God, IL.

Appointments

The Board appointed the following six individuals to serve on the Oregon Bible College Development Foundation Board of Trustees for a one-year term: Pastor Rex Cain, Joe E. James, Pastor Delbert Jones, Joyce Knapp, Paul Overholser, and Don Overmyer.

Special Service

On Thursday morning a special service was scheduled to install the Board of Directors and to license three pastors. Pastor Larry Mayberry, President of the Ministerial Association, conducted the installation service. Members of the License Board, Pastor Sydney Kirkpatrick, Pastor John Hearp, Russell Johns, and Kent Ross conducted the license service. Dale Bliss, Mark Cheatwood, and Charles Jones successfully completed the license process and were presented certificates of licensure and recognition cards.

Recommendations

Recommendation One regarding the relocation of the Conference and College was approved by the delegates, 94 yes; 73 no. Prior to the vote, the Board announced that Paul and Ruth Overholser had offered a 35-acre tract of land in central Ohio, five miles northwest of the center of Spring-field as a possible site for the Conference and College. Since an investigation had not been made of this location, the Board reported that a survey team would visit the Spring-field area following conference and that the Board of Directors would make a final decision to relocate to either Clayton County, Georgia, or Springfield, Ohio.

Recommendation Two was approved by the delegates 118 yes; 36 no. This recommendation was a constitutional amendment which makes it possible to accomplish relocation. A motion was made and adopted to bring a constitutional amendment to the delegates at the 1990 Conference which would insert the location of our Conference and College. This amendment would be drafted after the Board decides which city will be the relocation site.

Recommendation Three, which was also a constitutional amendment to permit relocation, was approved by the delegates.

Recommendation Four, which pertained to a vote by the President of the Conference and College, was tabled.

A constitutional amendment, Recommendation Five, regarding nominations for the Board of Directors, was approved by the delegates.

Recommendation Six, regarding the purpose statement of SEPTEMBER/OCTOBER/1989 the Conference and College in the Bylaws of the Church of God General Conference, was approved.

Other Business

During the business session, Jeff and Karen Fletcher showed slides and reported on their work in Milton Keynes, England.

Leona Strickland, representing the San Jose, California, Church, presented a check for \$100,000 to the Oregon Bible

College Development Foundation. The San Jose congregation closed its work earlier this summer and chose to distribute some of its assets to the Foundation. This gift enabled the Foundation to reach its goal of one million dollars. It was reported that the San Jose Church had also given a check for \$50,000 to the pastoral aid program of the General Conference. A rising vote of thanks was extended to the San Jose group for its generous gifts.

Pastor Stephen Bolhous, representing the Fonthill, Ontario, congregation, extended an invitation to the delegates to attend the 1990 General Conference at Brock University, St. Catherines, Ontario, Canada. Conference will be held July 30 to August 2.

Retiring Board member Don Overmyer reported on the activities of the Board during the past year.

Pastor Billie Kennedy, representing the Ministerial Association, discussed the need for prayer and fasting during the coming year as important decisions are implemented by our conference and as revitalization takes place in our churches.

Budget

A budget for the fiscal year June 1, 1990 - May 31, 1991 was approved by the delegates. It calls for contributions of \$402,500. This compares with \$402,000 for the 1989-90 fiscal year (see page 13 for a copy of the budget).

Conference Attendance

Approximately 360 people were registered for the regular sessions of the conference. Many others attended the evening services or other portions of the conference.

CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

Brothers, sisters, and friends, welcome to this 69th Annual General Conference of the Church of God headquartered in Oregon, Illinois. We are pleased to have this wonderful body of delegates assembled on the beautiful and comfortable campus of Western Illinois University in Macomb, Illinois. On behalf of the staff and Board of Directors, I extend a special welcome to those attending General Conference for the first time, to those serving as church or conference delegates for the first time, to those delegates from churches represented for the first time, and to new pastors.

It takes the concerted efforts of many individuals to plan and make the annual General Conference a reality. We are grateful to the staffs of the General Conference and Oregon Bible College which work throughout the year in all phases of planning, organizing, and carrying out the program of the annual conference. These people have pulled it all together to make the conference program happen. We appreciate very much the contributions of area churches and pastors who have contributed so much to this conference. A special thank you is extended to the program committee for planning and arranging the workshops, seminars, classes, musical services, and worship services. The special activities in celebration of the Fiftieth Anniversary of Oregon Bible College and the achievement of the Oregon Bible College Development Foundation goal were planned by a committee composed of Marj Overmyer, Alva Huffer, and Rachel Carr. Thanks so much to this committee for all the planning efforts to make this conference a joyous and memorable occasion. The Church of God should recognize and celebrate victory. We also owe our thanks to all those contributing to the annual conference as speakers, teachers, workshop leaders, musical participants, and in so many other ways. Your attendance and participation will make this conference a resounding success. Thanks to each of you for being here and thanks to your local churches for having you represent them in this conference. Most of all, we are thankful to Almighty God for his leadership, the blessings we receive, entrusting this great work to us, and for allowing us to be stewards of the wonderful gospel of salvation found in his holy Word.

We will celebrate accomplishments and milestones in this conference. We will fellowship and enjoy the times spent together. We will study the Word of God and sing praises to God and to his Son, Jesus Christ. We will pray together and call upon the leadership of God and for the presence of his Spirit. There is also work to be done. Two directors will be elected; advisory committee members will also be elected. A budget will be approved. Some tough decisions are to be made in the business sessions. You, as delegates, have tremendous responsibilities. With the help of God, all of these business matters will be decided.

God has been good to us. Oregon Bible College was established in 1939 for training pastors and other church workers. We can look back at those 50 years in a spirit of thanksgiving for God's blessings and for the ministry of Oregon Bible College in training pastors and other church workers. Many faithful present and past presidents and instructors have dedicated their lives to teaching Bible and Theology at Oregon Bible College and to helping students develop their abilities and gifts in preparation for ministries and Christian service. Our educational institution is one of the most important assets we have in carrying out the work God has entrusted to us. Because of its purpose Oregon Bible College is the greatest institution of higher education in the world. We praise God and give him the honor and credit for these 50 years of operation of Oregon Bible College. We are also thankful for all the students who have studied at Oregon Bible College. Many of you in attendance today were trained at Oregon Bible College and all of us have benefitted from the 50 years of this great educational institution.

The delegates assembled at the 1982 Church of God Annual General Conference approved the establishment of the Oregon Bible College Development Foundation as an endowment program for our Bible College. At that time a goal was set of building the principal in the Foundation to one million dollars in gifts and commitments. The income from the principal is to be used to support the programs and projects of Oregon Bible College. This goal appeared extremely ambitious in 1982. God has been good to us. He has blessed us abundantly.

I am pleased to share with you that you have been successful. The Oregon Bible College Development Foundation goal of one million dollars in gifts and commitments has been reached. We thank God for the Foundation vision, challenge, and achievement. Enjoy the celebration of this accomplishment and please express gratitude to members of your local congregations who have contributed to the success of the Foundation.

We will soon enter the final decade of the Twentieth Century. Fulfillment of Bible prophecy and signs of the times indicate that Jesus will soon leave heaven to return to the earth to establish the kingdom of God. Jesus preached a message of a coming kingdom and salvation. Before he ascended to heaven, Jesus gave his disciples, and others who would follow, the responsibility of preaching and teaching the gospel of the kingdom throughout the world. The Great Commission, Mark 16:15, 16, and Matthew 28:18-20, is a major part of our mission today. It is the work Jesus gave to the church-even to us. Jesus expressed the urgency of preaching this kingdom message in Matthew 24:14, "This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come." There are millions in our world who do not know this gospel. Let us resolve to dedicate the decade of the 1990s to catching a vision of going into our world to carry out the Great Commission. It is time for revival and revitalization among our membership so that we become awakened to the need of taking the gospel of salvation to a lost world. We must strengthen and build up our existing churches and establish new ones, thereby bringing more workers into the vineyard. The challenges of preparing for the 1990s and the years that follow are great. We who are of the Faith of Abraham can perform the work of Jesus Christ with God's help. The planning we will do and the decisions we will make this week will lay the groundwork for our efforts as we enter the twenty-first century.

The population of our great nation is growing, especially in the large metropolitan areas. We are experiencing declining or plateaued memberships in many of our churches. Our enrollment at Oregon Bible College continues to be less than desired. In an effort to find solutions to these problems, meetings have

been held with pastors, congregations, state conferences, and many individual members. Many plans and ideas have been weighed and considered. After prayerful and careful consideration, the Board of Directors concluded that relocation of our College and Conference is a vital key to the revitalization of the Church of God.

The recommendation presented to the 1988 General Conference regarding relocation was withdrawn by the Board of Directors. A year of prayer, study, and presentation of information regarding relocation followed the 1988 Conference. I believe that our staff and the Board have met your request of one year ago to study, present packets of material, and submit recommendations on relocation this year. Our staff has worked tirelessly to study specific areas and develop results of their studies. We have reported to you in the PROGRESS JOURNAL and special mailings. I commend the staff on this work and the communication of information concerning relocation. It is my opinion that each of you has sufficient information to make a decision on relocation. I believe that another year without a the relocation site which the Board of Directors had concluded to be the best for our College and Conference operations. I refer you to the May/June, 1989, issue of the PROGRESS JOURNAL for details on this subject.

We must realize and be sensitive to the fact that there are diversities of opinions on relocation and a new location site for the Conference and Bible College. As we come to the point of voting—making a decision on relocation—let us resolve that we will continue in a strong bond of unity to serve God regardless of the outcome of the decision.

Relocation is the major business issue before us in this conference. It is a vital issue. Reaching a decision on a matter of so great a magnitude certainly is not easy. Implementation of the decision to relocate will involve some of the greatest changes ever undertaken by this conference. While acknowledging that such changes are difficult and sometimes scary, I urge you as delegates to approve the recommendations concerning relocation. We cannot afford to continue in our comfort zone with erosion taking place. The Conference is financially



decision on this issue would be detrimental to our organization, especially to the staff members and their families who have been living with major uncertainties. It is important that we reach a decision on relocation at this conference.

It is no secret that I personally support relocation. I sincerely believe that relocating to a site meeting the criteria established by the Board and staff will provide wonderful opportunities for the Church of God to move ahead to more fully carry out the Great Commission. The Board of Directors has not acted impulsively in recommending relocation—it has been thoroughly studied and prayed about. We believe that relocation to a larger metropolitan area will present us with greater opportunities for training students in evangelism, church planting, and revitalization of existing churches.

It is also very clear as we prepared the PROGRESS JOURNAL for this General Conference, that Clayton County, Georgia, was capable of carrying out relocation. The Board supports relocation, and leaders on our staff and their families are committed to implementing relocation.

Relocation will not answer all the needs and problems of the Church of God. Revitalization and revival must first take place in the hearts and lives of individual members and in our local churches. If great progress is to be made, it will occur at the local church level.

Our theme, "Partnership in Advancing the Gospel," is a timely topic. It is what we are about. As all of us commit to this partnership, the gospel can truly be advanced and many people brought to Jesus Christ and the way of salvation. We can expect great days ahead for the Church of God and we can anticipate outstanding results as God blesses our efforts to do his will in carrying out the Great Commission.

DELEGATE BUSINESS SESSION— Tuesday, August 1, 1989

Chairman Joe James called to order the first delegate business session of the 69th Annual General Conference of the Church of God at 2:10 p.m.

Pastor Richard Eldred opened the meeting with prayer.

Pastor Delbert Jones will serve as parliamentarian for the delegate sessions.

Chairman James welcomed those attending the delegate business session. Several groups were recognized: delegates attending the Conference for the first time; first-time delegates; churches being represented for the first time (Bethel Church of God, Pelzer, SC; Milton Keynes Church of God, Milton Keynes, England; Hilliard Church of God, Columbus, OH; and Family Bible Fellowship, Loves Park, IL); Anthony Buzzard called attention to the new congregation in Lima, Peru, though it is not represented at this conference; new ministers—Dale Bliss, Timberland, South Bend, IN; Mark Cheatwood, Little Rock, AR; Chuck Jones, Wyoming, MI; the staff from Oregon Bible College; and the planning committee for the OBC 50th year celebration consisting of Dr. Alva Huffer, Marj Overmyer, and Rachel Carr.

The chairman's message to the delegates was given by Joe James.

Judy Myers, credentials chairperson, reported the following delegate count: 99 conference or church delegates, six directors, and 59 ministers, for a total of 164 as compared to the 1988 total count of 159.

Three communications were read to the delegates by Donna Deane, acting secretary—a letter from the Southeast Conference supporting the proposed relocation, a letter from Guthrie Grove Church supporting the proposed relocation, and a memo from the Board of Directors regarding the offer of property from Paul and Ruth Overholser.

The chairman directed delegates' attention to the special reports as printed on page 17 of the May/June, 1989, PROGRESS JOURNAL: (The Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association, Church of God Investment Fund, Minister's Fund, License Board, and the Christian Conciliation Committee). Pastor David Cheatwood moved to accept the reports. Pastor Ed Goit seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the delegates.

Bill Burnham, controller, presented the Financial Reports as noted on pages 12-14 of the *Partnership* Conference publication regarding both operating and restricted funds. He noted significant changes from last year's figures.

It was clarified that the OBC Development Foundation is a separate corporation and the monies are not reflected in the operating and restricted funds.

Joe James reported to the delegates that projections for the Development Foundation interest income for 1989-90 are \$25,000, 1990-91 are \$60,000, and 1991-92 are \$90,000. The income will be available for use by Oregon Bible College.

David Swartz moved to approve the financial statements and Pastor Dennis Baldwin seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the delegates.

Nominations for the Board of Directors were presented: Pastor Dennis Baldwin nominated Pastor Gary Burnham on behalf of the Virginia Conference; David Swartz nominated Dwaine Demmin on behalf of the Northeast Conference; Pastor Delbert Jones nominated Dr. William D. Lawrence on behalf of the Valley View Bible Church; Pastor Rex Cain nominated Pastor Scott Ross.

Pastor Richard Young moved that nominations be closed. Jerold Brewer seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the delegates.

The nominees for the Board of Directors were introduced.

Nominations for one position on the Christian Education Advisory Committee were opened. The term of Carol Ring expires. Millie Laning nominated Carol Ring. Pastor Jack Hearp made a motion to close nominations. Pastor Alan Cain seconded the motion. The delegates approved the motion.

Nominations for one position on the Higher Education Advisory Committee were opened. The term of Donna Deane expires. Pastor E. Richard Smith nominated Joe James. Pastor Delbert Jones moved to close nominations. Pastor Richard K. Smith seconded the motion. The delegates approved the motion.

Nominations for one position on the Missions Advisory Committee were opened. The term of Mardy Lawrence expires. Ken Vancil nominated Mardy Lawrence. Pastor Kenneth Milne moved that nominations be closed. Ralph Brown seconded the motion. The

delegates approved the motion.

It was announced that elections for the Board of Directors and the three Advisory Committee members will be held Wednesday afternoon at the delegate session. The installation of the Board of Directors will be Thursday at 8:00 a.m.

President David Krogh announced the resignation of R. Warren Sorenson, Vice-President of Outreach and Church Development. He commended both Warren and Irene for their 10 years of service to the Church of God General Conference. A plaque of commendation was presented to Warren.

The chairman announced that an open session with the Board of Directors will be held in the Heritage Room immediately following the delegate session today.

Pastor Sydney Kirkpatrick reported on the building project for the Pine Grove Bible Church in Minnesota.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:30 p.m. until Wednesday at 2:00 p.m. Pastor John Guthrie dismissed the session with prayer.

DELEGATE BUSINESS SESSION— Wednesday, August 2, 1989

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Joe James at 2:15 p.m.

The secretary read the minutes for the Tuesday delegate session. No changes or corrections were noted.

Leona Strickland of the San Jose Church of God presented a check for \$100,000 to the OBC Development Foundation to the Development Foundation President, Joe James. Joe James reported that this brings the total of all cash received thus far to \$775,000. The church also donated \$50,000 to the General Conference Pastoral Aid Fund.



Pastor Stephen Bolhous of the Glad Tidings Church of God, Fonthill, Canada, welcomed the delegates to Brock University for the 70th Annual General Conference meeting July 30 - August 2, 1990.

Pastor Fred Pensyl of Urbana, Ohio, provided the delegates with an update on the work in Urbana. They were given two or three acres frontage by a donor in Urbana for the church building. Approximately 20-25 attend services and Bible Study.

Pastor Stan Ross reported on the new church work at Hewitt, Minnesota. They have purchased the church building but do not yet have a pastor. Furniture from the San Jose Church was contributed to the Hewitt church as well as \$2,000.

The travel pool has been calculated; the amount is \$152.50. Delegates can settle at the Conference office.



Don Overmyer reported on the activities of the Board of Directors during the past year.

The election of the Board of Directors was completed after the 5th ballot. Pastor Scott Ross and Dr. William Lawrence were elected by the delegates to serve four-year terms.

Parliamentarian Pastor Delbert Jones clarified the appropriateness of Chairman Joe James voting on the ballot votes for the Board of Directors' positions.

The Chairman noted that only one individual was nominated to serve on each Advisory Committee. He indicated that he would entertain a motion that the secretary cast a unanimous ballot for all three of these Committee positions. Marion Burnham moved and Willis Turner seconded the motion. Sorenson reported on the staff and board activities in selection of a site for relocation. Twenty-eight criteria were used to review each site. Atlanta was identified as the site which best met the criteria.

Pastor Dick Eldred discussed concerns about the consideration of relocation. He urged support of the Board and also urged that we not delay our decision making.

Pastor Jack Hearp spoke to Recommendation One. He urged that delegates not judge ways of voting as a person's support or lack of support of the Church of God.

Paul Overholser discussed the offer he and Ruth had made regarding land in the Springfield area for the college site. He asked the delegates if it would be preferable to them that he and Ruth withdraw the offer in order to decrease the confusion. The delegates indicated that the Overholsers leave the offer as it was.

President David Krogh introduced Recommendation One. Extensive information has been provided already. However, he did note that the Board of Directors had unanimously voted to restrict funds for any sale of the Conference buildings to be used only for new buildings at the new site. Also, two weeks ago some people approached President Krogh regarding the potential purchase of the OBC buildings. These negotiations will be pursued after the Conference.

The Chairman indicated that he would entertain a motion for Recommendation One. Tom Schmitt moved that Recommendation One be accepted. Pastor Dennis Baldwin seconded the motion. There was much discussion on the recommendation. Marion Burnham called for the question. Delegates voted to approve the

However, he moved that if the recommendation is approved, the city will be added at the Conference next year. The Board will be asked to bring the recommendation forward in 1990. Seconded by Pastor Delbert Jones. The motion was approved by the delegates.

Pastor Alan Cain moved that Recommendation Two be accepted. Pastor Jeff Fletcher seconded the motion. Pastor Delbert Jones called for the question. The delegates voted to approve the call for the question. Delegates voted on Recommendation Two. There were 154 ballots cast—118 yes and 36 no. The Recommendation passed.

Tom Schmitt moved that Recommendation Three be accepted. Willis Turner seconded the motion. The recommendation was adopted by hand vote by the delegates.

Pastor Scott Ross spoke to the delegates' decision regarding relocation on Wednesday. He prayerfully asked for unity and support and for excitement about the revitalization.

Vice President of Outreach and Church Development Warren Sorenson reported on the site visits and the review of the 28 criteria at each site. He discussed several of the strong positives for Clayton County, Georgia.







OBC Fall Semester

We are pleased to welcome many new students and returning students to the campus of Oregon Bible College. The fall program began with orientation on August 21 and 22. A new program of evaluative testing was started this semester. There has been a need to evaluate where students are in their educational development and attempt to assess how they might best be helped at the college.

Michele Millard, on the staff of Creighton University, in Omaha, Nebraska, is coordinating this new program in conjunction with OBC's Academic Dean, Kent Ross.

The initial battery of tests include: 1) the Myers/Briggs Type Indicator; 2) the LASSI Test to evaluate study skills; 3) the Nelson Denny Test of Reading Skills; and 4) the Shipley Test of IQ Indication. Testing done during fall orientation will be followed up during the semester to help the students succeed in their academic performance.

1989 Booster Campaign

Once each year Oregon Bible College reaches out and asks for that extra boost or support. 
Meeting of Board of Directors
