Board Meets

The Board of Directors met on the new campus of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference in metropolitan Atlanta, Georgia, October 4 and 5. Among the items considered during the meeting were:

- 1. A review of financial reports of general operations and the construction projects.
- 2. Discussed the disposal of property in Oregon, Illinois (properties are being considered by potential buyers but no offers at the present time).
- 3. A review of all the work of the General Conference and our churches as a whole.
- 4. David Krogh was authorized to develop the process for granting a Bachelor's degree to graduates of Oregon Bible College for the years 1966-1991. During this time, the state of Illinois precluded the college from granting degrees.
- 5. Appointed program committee for the 1992 General Conference. The committee will consist of Pastor Sydney Kirkpatrick, Minister of Music

Connie Scott, Paula Kirkpatrick, Michele Millard, Judy Myers, Bill Gaspar, and David Krogh. The committee is meeting in November to plan the summer conference which will be held at Northwestern College, St. Paul, Minnesota, August 3-7, 1992.

- 6. Made plans for Board members to visit local congregations.
- 7. Discussed long-range plans for the development of our 12¹/2-acre campus.

The Board of Directors is very pleased with the implementation of the relocation decision and the exciting things that are happening at the college this fall. The fall quarter at Atlanta Bible College has been successfully launched and there is a good spirit among the staff and the students.

The Board is glad to hear from members regarding any and all aspects of the conference and college work. Its next meeting will be held January 23 - 25 in Atlanta.

Booster Campaign Report

"If You Love Me ..."

Recently in reading from the Gospel of John, several thoughts came to mind. In chapter 14, verse 15, we are told, "If ye love me, keep my commandments." Just what is Jesus talking about? I recall Jesus' conversation with the rich young man in which he restated some of the ten commandments (Matt. 19:17-19) and His conversation with the lawyer recorded in Matthew 22: 37-40, when he pointed to the first and second commandments as being important. And I am reminded of these words, "A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another" (John 13:34, 35).

In John 15 Jesus goes on to talk with His disciples about expressing their love for one another by bearing fruit.

If you love me... "ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth" (Acts 1:8b). "Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you; and, surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matt. 28:19, 20).

I want to show my love; I want to be obedient—but it is not always easy to "bear witness." I am not very comfortable in door-to-door calling or in telemarketing. Sharing anything with total strangers isn't in my "comfort zone," let alone sharing God's love, salvation through Christ, and the Kingdom. How then can I be obedient? By finding areas in which I am gifted and comfortable and by using them willingly and consistently, and also by praying for God to help me to move out of my "comfort zone" and serve Him through His strength and power.

Throughout our churches there are many individuals who have felt the call to serve God both in their local churches and in other lands. Mexico: July 22 - August 18, 1991

On July 20 and 21 several members of the summer ministry trip to Mexico began assembling in Oregon, Illinois, for a 5:00 a.m. departure on July 22. Team members were Andy Cisneros, Timberland Bible Church; Brad Gaspar, Pine Grove Bible Church; Dale Harshman III, Blood River; Carol Macy, Fox Valley; Steve Myers, Oregon; Todd Myers, Oregon; Emily Reye, East Oregon Chapel; Susan Savage, Pine Grove Bible Church; Kevin Schoenherr, Eden Valley; Rhonda Schoenherr, Eden Valley; and Lindsey Tyler, Jaynes Street Church of God. Dean Moore joined the team in Texas to drive us into Mexico.

The purpose of this trip was to share our experiences with churches along our route in the States and to provide a Vacation Bible School for the children of Mexico. Services in the States were provided in Little Rock and McGintytown, Arkansas; Gatesville and Harlingen, Texas; and East Oregon Chapel in Oregon, Illinois. Our sincere appreciation to our brethren in these churches for their hospitality.

Our Bible School theme was "Around the World With Jesus." The focus of the study was that God is not willing for any to perish but for all to come to salvation. U. R. There (Alice Badillo), who was accompanied on the keyboard by Dale Harshman, led the children in songs before we, through the use of a time machine (constructed by Steve Myers), traveled back in time and space to tour Canada where missionary Maskipaton (Todd Myers) and native Thomas Old Yellow Fox (Andy Cisneros) taught us that God wants the Bible to guide our lives;

China where missionary Hudson Taylor (Kevin Schoenherr) and native Lee Sun Fun (Brad Gaspar) taught us that God wants us to tell others about his love. Tour guides were Dale Harsh man, Emily Reye, Lupe Badillo, and Maythe Montalvo. Through foods, games, crafts, and conversation with the missionary and native, the participants learned about God, about missionary service, and about other lands. Steve Myers captured our efforts on film.

The Bible School average was 114, 96 of which were children. We believe that our efforts were very worthwhile and that the children learned many things that will go with them throughout their lives.

The Foreign Missions Advisory Committee would like to recommend the use of this Bible School program to our local churches. The material is published by David C. Cook. Russia: July 28 - August 13, 1991

Tracy Savage, a member of the Pine Grove Bible Church in Brooklyn Park, Minnesota, had the opportunity to travel to Russia this past summer. She went on this trip with two entirely different responsibilities. Her initial travel plans were to accompany a girls' soccer team to the Soviet Union for a cultural and soccer exchange. These plans began formulating quite some time ago. During the past year, God has convicted Tracy that He

has work for her to do in the Soviet Union. Feeling moved by God, she began to study Russian and prepare for what God had or her. Thus the second responsibility began to form. In order to return to the Soviet Union for an extended period of time to share God's Word and the Truth of the Scriptures, it would be necessary to be invited back and sponsored. This became the second responsibility of this summer trip.

The following quotes are taken from Tracy's report upon her return:

"After seventy years of spiritual oppression, the people in the Soviet Union are eager to find the one true God that many of us have known since birth. They have a hunger to know God, but will they find Him?

I returned from the Soviet Union with a deeper conviction for giving the people there the opportunity to meet Jesus, the Messiah, face to face. Not only is there a need for God's TRUTH to be boldly taught and spread throughout the Soviet Union, but there is a great urgency! This urgency became more evident when a Hare Krishna said that he thought it was good that we had brought Bibles in because it is important that the Russian people find some hope and some way to God. It is URGENT that they know that there is only one way to get to God, and that way is through Jesus. This needs to be proclaimed and taught. There are many gods being tested and explored over there, but if they are not told, how can they hear of the only true God, His Son, and the future Kingdom? If they do not hear, how will they stand when the ultimate test is given?

People like Nil, prominent people that I never would have

thought wanted a Bible, hungered for the same spiritual food as those who had nothing. The depravation of hearing the Good News has spread much deeper than just the empty churches; it has included all levels of society. The nourishment one Bible can bring is unbelievable! We could see it on the faces of the people before they even opened the cover. It was like seeing a person who had been trudging through the desert for weeks with no water and then had a cool glass of water in his hand. The pleasure and refreshment of just knowing it is in his hand makes an eternal smile come to his face. Or imagine a blind person seeing the sunrise over the ocean or a rainbow in the sky; this is the awe and the joy that flooded their faces and hearts.

This thirst and this hunger must be filled with pure water and wholesome food. Unless these people have the opportunity to see and hear the words God has spoken concerning life and death, they have more to worry about than just starvation. Please pray for them Also, please pray for those God intends to speak to and use for His Kingdom proclamation both here and there. I will be returning in August, 1992, for a long-term stay. Praise and honor be to God and to Jesus!"

Tracy's home church and state conference are both backing her in her plans to return to Russia this next summer. She was able to find a sponsor and is now in the process of working out all of the details.

New Opportunity

Upon her local church's recommendation of Tracy for this mission service, the Foreign Missions Advisory Committee has recommended to the General Conference staff that we support this effort and that we assist the Pine Grove Bible Church and the Minnesota State Conference in this sending effort. Staff members Kent Ross and Judy Myers met with Pine Grove Pastor Sydney Kirkpatrick, State Missions President Larrie Gaspar, and Tracy on October 17, 1991, to discuss details of this project. In cooperation with the church and conference, we will be helping with the cost of translating Church of God literature into Russian. Donations for this translation work will be greatly appreciated. As further details are developed, we will keep you informed. We do ask that you add Tracy to your daily prayer list as she continues her studies of the Russian language and works out all of the details of this trip.

"If you love me...go ye." In obedience, several have gone to other lands and other peoples. But there are many others who have gone to those around them and shared Christ. Their efforts are just as important. Out of our love, we must go—whether it be at home or abroad—with a message of salvation and a coming Kingdom. You are the hands and the feet that God is using to accomplish His will. "GO YE!"

Pastor's Profile

Vivian Kirkpatrick II

If you were entering the pastoral ministry today, what is one thing you would do differently?

Enter it more wisely and less naively! I feel one key element that was missing in classroom education was too much emphasis on "methods," without learning how to deal with people. I was very idealistic and all that went out the window when I started dealing with people.

Along similar lines, the most profound idea I've ever heard was something I learned at Jack Hyles' Pastor School. In the session, "Going Home and Putting This into Practice," Hyles said that we should "go home and fall in love with our people and let them fall in love with us, because then anything can and will happen." I think that is a very necessary key to ministering. If a pastor doesn't love his people, he had better go someplace where he can, or get out of the pastoral ministry.

In the last couple of churches I've pastored, I learned to love the people I've worked with and that way I wasn't looking around for something better to come along; I was already convinced that I had the best there is to have!

What has been your greatest pastoral challenge?

Again, it has probably been dealing with people. The most difficult thing in pastoral ministry is watching someone die, like with Kim. (Note: Kim Johnson, member of the Hector Church of God, died on December 31, 1990, at the age of 20 after a long battle with cancer.) It's hard to watch someone die; you feel so totally helpless and there's not a thing you can do.

I think as a pastor you sometimes have the same feelings as a father; you feel that you should be able to handle any situation that comes up in your family. You think you should be able to make it right and make it better. But you learn that only God can do that. I think the greatest experience for all pastors and Christians is learning to rely on the Lord, not on themselves.

Share an amusing personal/pastoral anecdote.

One of the most embarrassing things that ever happened to me was during a Sunday morning worship service. I had received a book as a gift and used something from it as an illustration in the sermon. I noticed that the woman who had Age: 43

given the book to me was in the congregation that morning. Since she was not a member but did attend regularly, I wanted to make her feel that she was contributing to the church and know that I appreciated the book, so I shared from the pulpit that she was the one who had given the book to me.

However, she had gotten remarried and when I made my comment, I called her by her previous husband's name and not by her present husband's name, who happened to be sitting with her that morning! Usually, when I make a mistake like that, my wife is the only one I hear gasp in shock, but that morning the entire congregation collectively gasped! I was mortified because I knew I'd done something wrong, but I couldn't figure out what it was. Through the rest of the service I kept running it over and over in my mind, but couldn't figure out what I'd done.

After I went to the back and even before the postlude was done, this woman's new husband ran back to me and asked me if I realized what I'd done. When I told him I hadn't, he explained it to me and I hurriedly tried to apologize, but he started laughing. He reassured me and told me not to feel bad because he and his wife had visited with some friends the previous night that they hadn't seen since they had gotten married, and when he introduced his new spouse to his friends, he called her by her previous husband's name also! So I was let off the hook.

Being raised in a pastor's home, I don't think it has affected me like it may have affected others. When I got into the pastoral ministry, I already knew what to expect because that was the kind of setting I grew up in.

The hardest thing about being a pastor, as far as its effect on my family, would have to be the housing. It also has to do with the way the church family may view or see you and your own family. They see the pastor's family doing without and they question why your kids don't have what their kids and the friends of your kids have. It is very difficult for me to see my family coping with that—seeing my wife wear second-hand clothes, which are usually very nice and we're thankful for them, while hearing other wives talking about going shopping and buying new dresses. While other mothers are busy shopping for and buying school clothes for their children, your wife is busy repairing and making clothes for your children.

I guess those things haven't probably been as hard on them as it has been on me watching it. The hardest thing for them has probably been moving from place to place and giving up friends.

What do you like most about the pastoral ministry?

Probably the feeling that I'm doing what God wants me to do. Until I became convinced that I was doing what God wanted me to do, I was not as happy as I am today in the pastoral ministry. I would like to see more emphasis on finding, defining, and submitting to God's call taught at Bible College. I truly believe that is part of the reason we have so many pastors leaving pastoral ministry; they never truly found their calling. Whether ou're a pastor or not, you need to feel that you are where God nas put you. Otherwise, you will never have that sense of satisfaction that comes with knowing you are where you should be.

I like the fact that I'm where God wants me and that I'm working with people. It is also very important to me to know that what I'm doing is crucial. It isn't something that won't matter a hundred years from now. It has eternal significance; I'm dealing with vital issues.

... the least?

Unrealistic expectations placed on the pastor by the congregation. Sometimes you are expected to be proficient in too many areas. I know what my strengths and spiritual gifts are and I'm uncomfortable being told to do those things I'm not gifted to do. Of course, the financial angle can be difficult, too. I guess that is something everybody struggles with, though.

What has been your most memorable personal victory?

This is hard because so much of my personal life is wrapped up in the life and lives of my congregation. Their victories are mine; we share them. It's difficult to separate my personal and pastoral lives. I guess my personal victories have come through the way the Lord has "grown me" by using those around me.

In a lot of ways, Kim's suffering gave me a personal victory n the way I view the second coming of Christ. I went from

saying, "The Lord's coming and I'm glad for that, when it happens," to saying, "I want it to happen." I'm more anxious; I'm yearning for His coming now.

I enjoy seeing the Lord work in people. It's personal, not because I've done something, but because of the way it makes me feel inside. I love to rejoice with my people when someone accepts Christ in baptism, gets married, or has a victory in life.

Was there an individual who most affected your decision to become a pastor?

My dad. There's no question that there were others who affected me throughout my life, but my dad was definitely the most influential. It was growing up in a pastor's home and watching my father. He encouraged me by the life he lived and by seeing the joy he took in the pastoral ministry and touching the lives of others.

If you could change one thing about the church/pastoral ministry with a snap of your fingers, what would it be?

Looking at the Church of God as a whole, the entire conference, not personally, I would change the relationships between churches and pastors. It hurts me deeply to see so many churches and pastors struggling with relationships with each other. I come at that from the standpoint of being extremely happy where I am and seeing other pastors hurting, talking ill of their churches, or dropping out of the ministry. It pains me inside because I know that isn't necessary; pastors and churches need to work at trying to get along. I sometimes wonder that, if our pastors and churches can't get along better, how can we expect to bring in the lost and how can we expect to get along in the Kingdom?

I wish that every time someone joined the church, he would be required to read the book, *They Cry, Too*. It shows what pastoral life is like. At the same time, I wish a book had been written by a layman for pastors to read so they could understand that viewpoint, too. They need to understand where churches are, that the church was there before the pastor came along, and it will be there long after he leaves. They also need to learn why a church does things in certain ways before they can make wholesale changes. There are two sides to the coin; I'm not trying to blame one or the other. Both pastors and churches have some changes to make. That's what I'd change if I could—church/pastor relationships.

Share some of your thoughts concerning the church's role in society.

This may sound critical, but I feel a lot of churches have lost sight of the church's role in society. To me, one of the new and dangerous fads in the church today is the effort to entertain the yuppy generation. I don't believe the church was designed to entertain. The church exists as a community where we come to worship God. The present generation is one that enjoys being entertained, but nothing important has happened until you change the individual's lifestyle, because that lifestyle is one of being uncommitted.

Report of Baptisms 2,000 by the Year 2000



With that in mind, I think the church's role is to teach the world about Jesus and God and to teach the world how to worship. There is a place for the church on the outskirts of social activism, but it should be on an individual basis. When the church gets bogged down in that, it loses sight of the real reason for its existence. It is primarily a place where God is worshiped. When true worship occurs, everything else falls into order.

Share some news/events/developments that are happening at the Hector Church of God.

I don't think there's anything revolutionary happening here and I don't say that apologetically. I'm looking at a church that is in a county and a town that is losing population, that is 90% churched according to statistics, and where the unchurched have been here for years and have no interest in attending church. We are not in a high-traffic area with people moving in all the time. We don't have an influx of people to work with and so, realistically, I don't look for growth the same way other churches should and do look for growth. Nor do I look for this situation to be a strict "maintenance" setting where a church is dying.

I have a feeling this church will be here until the Lord returns. We have people who are dedicated and committed to the Lord. And even though our young people by and large don't end up back in the Hector area, the church has maintained its size by an addition here and there over the years. While I say there aren't revolutionary things happening, there are good things happening. We continue to have home Bible studies, and our people sincerely care for other people.

There isn't a church in the Church of God conference—and I may be bragging to say this—where a visitor comes in and is better received or is more touched by the love of the people than here in Hector. We've got people who come here from Hutchinson occasionally to worship with us. They've made it clear that they're Catholics and they'll never change, but that they like to worship with us every now and then because of the love they feel from us. Besides, who knows what could happen down the line with them! I'm very touched and very proud.

In the situations we've gone through with Kim in the last couple of years, our church has grown stronger spiritually, and the bond that holds us together has grown. We are very close. When one hurts, everybody hurts. It isn't a case where only a few know about it; we rally around one another and we all care. If somebody needs help, everybody's there. I think we're a lot of what a church should be; we just don't have the opportunity for numerical growth because of where we are. We're a church family in the truest sense of family. That is something worth bragging about!


Book On Conditional Immortality Published

An Open Letter to the Membership of the Church of God

I'm thankful for an opportunity to speak with you about a venture of faith that my family and I are about to undertake. Lord willing, the middle of June we will be moving to Lafayette, Indiana, to help with the establishment of a new church work. We want you, our family in the Lord, to know the burden of our hearts as we approach this work.

We've been burdened for a work in this community ever since the previous church there closed over 10 years ago. We gave serious thought to being involved there a number of times in the past, but the timing never seemed quite right. Throughout those years a number of families and individuals have faithfully met together and held Bible studies, involving as many as 25 people at one time. Through it all these people have prayed and sought to establish a church work.

A number of pastors and Conference staff have encouraged and assisted these faithful people. Recently there has been more concerted planning and prayer for the establishment of a new work.

While planning and prayer for a new church was going on in Lafayette, we found ourselves feeling restless in our present pastorate. We had grown "comfortable" in our eight years here, but were feeling a need to become involved in something that would challenge and stretch our faith more. And so we resigned our position at Blanchard. Shortly thereafter we felt led to announce our intention provide leadership for the Lafayette group.

We're convinced that we are venturing into a work so big and risky that, if God is not completely in charge, it will dismally fail.

What an exhilarating feeling! (and downright frightening at times!) We know that not every church-planting effort results in an established church; our track record in the Church of God shows that more of these works end up closing than thriving.

So how will this work be different? There are no guarantees that it will. We know only that we approach it with firm convictions about biblical principles for church life. Both pastor and core group families are committed to certain principles that we feel God has led us to. And we believe ultimately that it is the Lord's church, not ours. If He wants a church established in this community based upon certain principles that He is showing us, then it cannot fail. The very gates of hell cannot prevail against the church that is truly the Lord's church.

So we specifically ask for your prayer support. 

Proposed Constitutional Amendments

The Board of Directors proposes the following Amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws. The amendments will be considered by the delegates at the summer General Conference August 3-7, 1992.

Name of Corporation

The Church of God General Conference has been incorporated in the State of Georgia under the name "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference." To make this change in the Constitution, the Board of Directors proposes that the name "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference" replace "Church of God General Conference" in the Preamble and that the abbreviated name "College/Conference" be used in all other places in the Constitution where Church of God General Conference is used (exception: the term "General Conference" is also used in our Constitution to refer to our summer annual Conference. In such cases, "General Conference" will not be changed.)

The Board of Directors proposes that the name of the Corporation be amended in the following places in the Constitution and Bylaws:

Constitution

Preamble - "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference"

In the following articles use College/Conference instead of Church of God General Conference or General Conference:

Article I, Sec. 1

Article II, Sec. 3,b

Article II, Sec. 5

Article II, Sec. 6

Article II, Sec. 0

Article II, Sec. 7

Article III, Sec. 1

Article IV, Sec. 2 Article IV, Sec.4

Article IV, Sec. 7

Bylaws

Article I, Sec. 1

Article II, Sec. 1 (mentioned 2 times)

Article II, Sec. 7(E)

Article II, Sec. 7(G)

Article IV, Sec. 1 (mentioned 2 times)

Article V, Sec. 1

Article VI, Sec. 1

Correction of Title and Corporation

Article II, Sec. 3, c "The President of Atlanta Bible College/ Church of God General Conference." The current reading of Article II, Sec. 3, c is "The Executive Director of Church of God General Conference and the President of Oregon Bible College."

Explanation: This amendment corrects the title of the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation and also changes the name of the Bible College.

Deletion of Unnecessary Wordage

Article IV, Sec. 7. Delete "Directors shall be elected in this order: two in 1978 for three years; one in 1979 for three years; two in 1979 for four years; two in 1980 for four years; continuing there-from with every director being elected for a four-year term." (explanation: Once this procedure was set up, all directors have been elected for a four-year term and the rotation is clearly established.) This amendment will delete unnecessary wordage from the Constitution.

Deletion of Unnecessary Wordage

Bylaws Article II, Sec. 6. Delete "The Board of Directors shall serve as the Board of Trustees of Oregon Bible College, which was established by the Church of God General Conference August 8, 1939, to educate men and women for the Christian ministries on the Collegiate level through programs of Biblical and Theological studies, general education in the arts and sciences, and professional studies in the pastoral ministry, and church vocational areas deemed desirable."

Explanation: This section is now superfluous if the Constitution is amended to read that the Corporation is named "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference." The Board of Directors obviously will serve as the Board for the College since it serves the Corporation entitled "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference."

Addition of Dissolution Clause

Bylaws Article VII, Sec. 1. "In the event of the dissolution of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference, the Board of Directors, after paying or making provision for payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, shall dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation by distributing those assets exclusively to organizations qualified as exempt from taxation under section 501(c)(3) and which are in agreement with the Statement of Faith contained in this document."

Explanation: This clause is based upon the Articles of Incorporation which charifies for the State of Georgia and also the Internal Revenue Service that the assets of this Corporation will perpetually be used for the same general purposes for which they were given. This clause also assures that the assets of this corporation will perpetually be used to promote the truths upon which our movement was founded.

We encourage each church to send its Pastor and spouse to the Conference and to participate in the mileage travel pool.


Special Recognitions



Nominations for the Board of Directors

- 1. A resume of the individual with special emphasis upon the individual's involvement in the Lord's work.
- 2. A statement of the candidate's philosophy of College/ Conference.
- 3. Candidate's opinion regarding the purpose of this organization.
- 4. What the nominee would like to accomplish as a member of the Board of Directors.

The Constitution requires a minimum of two nominations per position. We trust that the membership will give prayerful consideration to the selection of nominees.

Nominations for Advisory Committees

Also at the 1992 summer General Conference, two members will be elected to Advisory Committees for four-year terms. One position is on the Media Advisory Committee and the other is on the Youth Advisory Committee. Dr. John Smead is currently completing a four-year term on the Media Advisory Committee.

The Advisory Committees consist of two members elected by the delegates, a staff member appointed by the President, and a member of the Board of Directors appointed by the Board. The committees exist to advise staff on specific areas of the College and Conference work. Committee members may succeed themselves.

Nominations are received from the floor at the summer Conference. Delegates are encouraged to give consideration to candidates who could serve in these positions. Nominees should be contacted prior to nomination to secure their consent.



Annual Report of Atlanta Bible College/ Church of God General Conference

Since last year's report, Atlanta Bible College and the Church of God General Conference have accomplished the move from Oregon, Illinois, to Clayton County, Georgia. We are grateful to God for bringing us safely to our new location and for enabling our work to continue uninterrupted.

Throughout the year, staff attention has been given primarily to: providing quality instruction and ministry experiences for ABC students; the completion of buildings and the improvement of the 12 1/2 acre campus; starting the New Friends Bible Church of God; visiting churches and pastors; providing Sunday School quarterlies and other published materials; and sponsoring anumber of special events.

Special Events

During the past year several significant special events were held for members of the Church of God: The annual Youth Congress was held at John Brown University in Siloam Springs, Arkansas July 14-19. Two hundred thirty staff and campers benefitted from this time of fellowship and study.

The 71st annual summer Conference was held at the Hyatt Atlanta Airport Hotel, July 3-7. Approximately 350 attended all or part of the Conference. The theme was "Celebrate: Our Heritage; Our New Opportunities; the Promise of His Coming." The most meaningful part of the Conference was the dedication of our new Administration Building. The delegates selected "Atlanta Bible College" as the name for our relocated Bible College.

On the weekend of March 6-8, the annual Invitational Conference was held at the Bible College. Fifty-two students and 24 sponsors visited our new campus and Clayton State College.

The 19th annual Christian Workers' Seminar was held in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee, April 5-10. One hundred two individuals participated in the Seminar. This was a sizeable increase from the 57 who attended in 1991.

The 2nd annual gathering of Biblical Unitarians is being held on the campus of Atlanta Bible College May 22-24. Several key speakers are making presentations on the oneness of God, conditional immortality, baptism, and

other distinctive teachings of the Church of God. Many non-Church of God individuals who have come to understand Bible truths were invited to attend this Conference.

In addition to these special events sponsored by the College/Conference, many other conferences, youth camps, and retreats, sponsored by local churches and state conferences, helped to strengthen our members. Among those sponsored was a young adult retreat in Illinois, a men's retreat in northern Indiana; Southlawn Ministry School sponsored a Theological Conference in March, etc.

Staff

The staff of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference has served admirably during our relocation and transition. Those who moved from Oregon, Illinois, are settled in their new homes and are adjusting to the area. They have invested the extra time necessary to serve our students and membership. Staff members who are in Oregon, Illinois, are serving well.

David Riley, Controller during the past two years will be leaving our employment shortly to become the full-time pastor of the New Friends Bible Church of God. He has served as part-time Controller while completing his education at the Bible College. We have appreciated the efficient way that he has handled

The following individuals have been employed to fill staff vacancies: Glyn Craig—part-time Maintenance Supervisor; Harry McMinn—Controller.


The Publishing Staff will continue in Oregon, Illinois, through the next year.

Atlanta Bible College

The Higher Education Advisory Committee met twice this year to advise staff in all aspects of the College program. The members of the Committee are Kent Ross, Donna Deane, Joe James, and Delbert Jones.

David Krogh attended the Annual Convention of the American Association of Bible Colleges in Indianapolis, Indiana, in late October. Many sessions were presented which are proving helpful to our College program.

The staff of Clayton State College has been extremely helpful in coordinating their General Education Program to meet our needs. Our students have benefitted from the program and activities offered by Clayton State.

The College Chorale took its 23rd annual tour in March to churches in Ohio, Indiana, Michigan, Illinois, Minnesota, Nebraska, Missouri, with additional visits to Christian Workers' Seminar and the Guthrie Grove Church in South Carolina. The Chorale, under the direction of Dale Ramsey, consists of Mark Cain, Jason Cooper, Cheryl Cupp, Seth Ross, Susan Savage, Daniel Smead, Jeremy Smith, Ryan Smith, Carolyn Swartz, and Julie Vance.

Atlanta Bible College will grant Bachelor of Theology degrees to 144 individuals who graduated from Oregon Bible College between the years 1966 and 1991. In 1965, the state of Illinois passed a law which precluded Oregon Bible College from granting Bachelor degrees. Since these graduates completed the same program that graduates prior to 1966 completed, the Board of Directors took action to confer degrees upon these worthy graduates. They will be honored at our summer General Conference at the evening service on August 5.

The 1991-92 annual Booster Campaign was our most successful in the history of the College. Many new donors contributed to the Booster Campaign, increasing contributions by more than 50%. We are deeply grateful to everyone who is boosting Atlanta Bible College through his contributions and prayer support.

Outreach

The outreach efforts of the Church of God take many forms. Among some of the efforts of the last year are:

- 1. The Today's Good News television ministry directed by Steve Taylor has developed broadcast quality video tapes which can be used on local cable stations. The videos are also available for use in local churches or for home Bible studies. Television ministry provides an opportunity to introduce our churches and to offer literature to viewers.
- 2. Church of God young people traveled to Coahoma, Mississippi, to build houses for the homeless with Habitat

for Humanity. Coahoma is located in the poorest county in the United States. This trip helped to open the eyes of our youth to physical and spiritual needs in our world.

- 3. A mission trip was made to Labor Vieja last summer by Judy Myers and a team of Church of God young people. A Bible School was sponsored along with special evening services.
- 4. Contact and assistance have been provided to a group at Lafayette, Indiana, in preparation for the launching of a new congregation this summer under the leadership of Pastor Steve Taylor.
- 5. Two churches received Church Builder's League appeals during the past year: The Simi Valley, California, Church received the 1991 fall appeal; Family Bible Fellowship, Rockford, Illinois, is the recipient of the spring 1992 appeal.
- 6. Church aid funds are being provided to help the St. Charles, Missouri, congregation. Both St. Charles and Loves Park, Illinois, are receiving a limited amount of assistance from our church-planting endowment fund.
- 7. ABC students and staff have been involved in starting a new church in Morrow, Georgia. New Friends Bible Church of God is meeting in the College chapel. Students, staff, and others from the local church have been involved in a midweek youth rogram and an after-school Bible club. Calls have been made in the homes of those who have attended our services.
- 8. Communications have been received from many states and foreign countries requesting information about the teachings of the Church of God. Anthony Buzzard maintains an extensive


correspondence with many people who are truth seekers. (See report in this JOURNAL regarding these contacts.)

God honors efforts to reach out to those who are lost. All churches can be strengthened as local members develop a compassion for the lost and take steps to reach out to friends and neighbors who are without Christ.

Properties

As this is written in early April, no offers have been received on our property in Oregon, Illinois. The women's dormitory and the General Conference building are leased and producing approximately \$40,000 per year in rental income. Two hundred fifty thousand dollars has been borrowed against the women's dorm and \$100,000 has been borrowed against the General Conference building. Of this \$350,000 that has been borrowed, several generous investors are loaning \$110,000 at 0% interest. The other \$240,000 is being borrowed at 7% interest at an annual cost of \$16,800. An additional \$325,000 has been borrowed: \$225,000 from the Atlanta Bible College Development Foundation, (\$100,000 at 9% and \$125,000 at 7% interest) and \$100,000 from the Rhoda M. Hanson Trust at a 9% interest rate. We have borrowed an additional \$525,000 from internal sources without interest. Total annual interest expense is \$43,550.

The rental income from our Oregon properties is helping to offset the interest expense on funds borrowed for our properties and buildings in Georgia. We continue to pray for the sale of all Oregon property so that loans can be repaid.



Finances

We are grateful for the faithful giving of the membership to Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference. Contributions during this year have consistently been larger than last year. Total contributions during the first 10 months of this fiscal year are more than \$40,000 higher than last year at this time.

Though total giving is up, contributions have continued to fall short of our goal for giving. Contributions of approximately \$32,000 per month are needed to maintain our work. (See graph.)

The continued financial health of the College/Conference is dependent upon several factors: continued financial support from local churches, state conferences, and individual families; improved enrollment at Atlanta Bible College; a good return from invested funds; increasing sales of *The Restitution Herald*, quarterlies, books, etc.

We are thankful for each local church which has designated a portion of its income to be directed to the College/Conference. We encourage churches that do not have a regular practice of giving to our College/Conference, to consider taking such action. We are deeply grateful to the more than 600 individuals and families who give to the College and Conference beyond their giving to their local church. We encourage others to support our work.

Sunday School Curriculum

Following action by the delegates at the 1991 summer General Conference, work began on a special 13-week series of lessons on Church of God distinctives for all age levels. Gayle Guthrie and the Christian Education Advisory Committee have worked diligently to secure writers and artists to produce new material which will be available for the December, 1992, January, and February, 1993, quarter. Sample lessons will be available for review by the delegates at the summer General Conference. We trust that each local church will use this material in Sunday School or midweek classes.

Volunteers

The work of the College and Conference depends not only upon the financial support of churches, conferences, and individuals; it depends not only upon the service of the staff; but it also depends upon hundreds of volunteers who serve in various capacities without remuneration so that the Lord's work can go forward. The volunteers include members of the Board of Directors, members of our five Advisory Committees, the Trustees of the ABC Development Foundation, members of the License Board, the Christian Conciliation Board, Trustees of the Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association, Directors of the Church of God Investment Fund, Officers of the Minister'


Association and Priscilla Association, Alumni Association officers, writers for *The Restitution Herald*, quarterlies; those who speak, lead workshops, and are responsible for programming at Youth Congress, Christian Worker's Seminar, General Conference, and other special events. Without the dedicated service of all of these individuals (numbering literally in the hundreds) the work of Atlanta Bible College/General Conference could not succeed. We are thankful for the servant heart of each one and for the time and effort that are put forth with a willing spirit. God is glorified and His work goes forward because of these individuals who work together in unity for common purposes.

Conclusion

Each year that passes brings us closer to the return of our Savior Jesus Christ. We look forward to the establishment of God's Kingdom here upon the earth. In the meantime we welcome the challenges of ministry. Our success as an Association of Churches is measured in the number of growing disciples who are producing additional disciples. We rejoice in the baptisms in local churches and the spiritual growth that is taking place.


Our prayer is that God will honor our faith and bring fruit from our efforts. In all things may His name be glorified.

Proposed Constitutional Amendments

The Board of Directors proposes the following Amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws. The ammendments will be considered by the delegates at the summer General Conference August 3-7, 1992.

Name of Corporation

The Church of God General Conference has been incorporated in the State of Georgia under the name "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference." To make this change in the Constitution, the Board of Directors proposes that the name "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference" replace "Church of God General Conference" in the Preamble and that the abbreviated name "College/Conference" be used in all other places in the Constitution where Church of God General Conference is used (exception: the term "General Conference" is also used in our Constitution to refer to our summer annual Conference. In such cases, "General Conference" will not be changed.)

The Board of Directors proposes that the name of the Corporation be amended in the following places in the Constitution and Bylaws:

Constitution

Preamble - "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference"

In the following articles use College/Conference instead of Church of God General Conference or General Conference:

Article I, Sec. 1

Article II, Sec. 3,b

Article II, Sec. 5

Article II, Sec. 6

Article II, Sec. 7

Aiticle II, Sec. 1

Article III, Sec. 1 Article IV, Sec. 2

Article IV, Sec.4

Article IV, Sec. 7

Bylaws

Article I, Sec. 1

Article II, Sec. 1 (mentioned 2 times)

Article II, Sec. 7(E)

Article II, Sec. 7(G)

Article IV, Sec. 1 (mentioned 2 times)

Article V, Sec. 1

Article VI, Sec. 1

Correction of Title and Corporation

Article II, Sec. 3,c "The President of Atlanta Bible College/ Church of God General Conference." The current reading of Article II, Sec.3,c is "The Executive Director of the Church of God General Conference and the President of Oregon Bible College."

Explanation: This amendment corrects the title of the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation and also changes the name of the Bible College.

Deletion of Unnecessary Wordage

Article 4, Sec. 7 delete "Directors shall be elected in this order: 2 in 1978 for 3 years; 1 in 1979 for 3 years; 2 in 1979 for 4 years; 2 in 1980 for 4 years; continuing there from with every Director being elected for a 4-year term." (Explanation: Once this procedure was set up, all Directors are elected for a 4-year term and the rotation is clearly established.) This amendment will delete unnecessary wordage from the Constitution.

Deletion of Unnecessary Wordage

Bylaws Article II, Sec. 6 delete "The Board of Directors shall serve as the Board of Trustees of Oregon Bible College, which was established by the Church of God General Conference August 8, 1939, to educate men and women for the Christian ministries on the Collegiate level through programs of Biblica, and Theological studies, General Education in the Arts and Sciences, and Professional Studies in the Pastoral Ministry, and Church vocational areas deemed desirable."

Explanation: This section is now superfluous if the Constitution is amended to read that the Corporation is named "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference." The Board of Directors obviously will serve as the Board for the College since it serves the Corporation entitled "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference."

Addition of Dissolution Clause

Bylaws Article VII, Sec. 1. "In the event of the dissolution of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference, the Board of Directors, after paying or making provision for payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, shall dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation by distributing those assets exclusively to organizations qualified as exempt from taxation under section 501(c)(3) and which are in agreement with the Statement of Faith contained in this document."

Explanation: This clause is based upon the Articles of Incorporation which clarifies for the State of Georgia and also the Internal Revenue Service that the assets of this Corporation will perpetually be used for the same general purposes for which they were given. This clause also assures that the assets of this corporation will perpetually be used to promote the truths upowhich our movement was founded.

Special Reports

Ministers' Fund

The Ministers' Fund provides emergency assistance to pastors or their families. Up to \$1,000 is available to any one family in any one year. This fund is supported entirely by special contributions. During the past year one pastor received a gift from the fund and two pastors secured short-term loans.

The current fund balance as of April 1, 1992 is \$1,286.97. This compares with a balance of \$2,236.97 a year ago.

Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association

The Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association is a very successful effort of the Church of God General Conference. This Association was organized in 1968 through the efforts of Harold Doan, S.O. Ross, and Clyde Randall. Since its inception, over \$335,000 has been distributed in monthly benefits or lump-sum settlements.

The Association currently has assets of approximately \$475,000 invested in stocks, bonds, money market accounts, real estate, and annuities. The fund continues to grow substantially from premiums paid by pastors, churches, and Conferences, and from investment earnings.

The membership currently consists of 40 active and two inactive pastors/staff; 46 churches; and six conferences. Eleven pastors and spouses are currently drawing benefits. Eighteen members withdrew from the Association and received lump sum settlements.

We are very grateful for churches and Conferences who belong to the Association to help provide for pastors and spouses who have served the Lord and the Church of God during their lifetime. Churches not currently enrolled are invited and encouraged to participate.

Chairman of the Association, S.O. Ross, is a minister appointed by the Board of Directors of the Church of God General Conference. William J. Gaspar, the Vice-Chairman is elected by the membership of the Association. The President of the Church of God General Conference, David Krogh, serves as Secretary/Treasurer of the Association.

Recently a \$10,000 contribution was given to the Retirement Association by a member family. Such contributions are appreciated and encouraged to help build the assets of the Association.

Nominations for Board of Directors

The Church of God Ministerial Association meeting in Dayton, Ohio, May 1-4, voted to nominate Pastor Stephen Bolhous for the Board of Directors. Stephen submits the following information and philosophy:

I believe the philosophy of the central organization of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference must be to encourage and motivate each local church—both congregation and pastor—to faithfully and thoroughly accomplish their unique individual ministry in their community. General Conference personnel are to serve in a coaching capacity; local churches are the key front-line players. Without them we have no organization.

I believe the purpose of this central organization (College/Conference) is to train ("equip," Eph. 4:12) and prepare pastors and lay workers who will exercise their gifts and training to build spiritually mature congregations. This purpose needs to be accomplished through on-site training at Atlanta Bible College, and through training at seminars and conferences held around the continent, utilizing College/Conference personnel.

As a member of the Board of Directors I would like to help intensify the focus of the Church of God to local church responsibility in ministry, missions, and finances. We must regain the concept that the local scene is where most meaningful action occurs. We must not look unduly to our central organization for solutions to local concerns.

Another item I would like to bring to the Board of Directors is an increased openness to the workings of the Holy Spirit immediately prior to Jesus' return. I believe the Church of God needs a greater awareness and openness to the workings of the Spirit in our lives and in our churches. Narrow-mindedness on this issue only excludes us from the receipt of God's blessings.

After graduating from high school in Oregon, Illinois, I entered Oregon Bible College for preparation for the pastoral ministry. I have been serving God in a pastoral

Don's civic accomplishments include: Member, White House Conference for the Handicapped; Board of Directors, Central Ohio Chapter of Cystic Fibrosis Foundation; President, Central Texas Chapter for Cystic Fibrosis. He was a member of the Aerospace Systems Division Briefing Team. And he was Air Force Systems Command Selection for the award of "America's Ten Outstanding Young Men of the Year" (1985).

While on active duty he acted as an

auxiliary chaplain. While at state-side assignments he was active in the work of the Kokomo, Indiana, and Omaha, Nebraska, Churches. In May, 1982, Don was medically retired from the Air Force, and entered OBC. He was graduated in 1983.

While at OBC Don worked as a Youth Director for the Oregon Church and he interned under both Hollis Partlowe and Dick Eldred. Upon return to active duty Don pastored (part-time) the North Hills Church of God. Later he was transferred to Ogden, Utah, where he ministered to 3 isolated Church of God families. He also started a Bible study with an unchurched family. The result was three members of that family were baptized.

Upon transfer to Indiana Don pastored (part-time) the Burr Oak Church of God. And on August 1, 1990, he began full-time work. After just 18 months of full-time work Burr Oak is achieving significant results. The church is now ministering to over 130 people. They have baptized nine individuals in the past three months. God's mighty hand has worked through Don to teach his congregation how to minister to each other and to the unchurched and it appears that this effort is working.

Don has written several articles for *The Restitution Herald* and the *Wisdom and Power*. His book on "*Team Ministry*" is being published by Ministry School Publications. He is treasurer on the Indiana State Board.

We fully believe that Don would make an ideal member for the General Conference Board of Directors. The above evidence undergirds our belief that Don would give tremendous support to our Conference and to our churches, and would bring about glory for the coming Kingdom of God.

Statement of Philosophy

Editor's Note: Atlanta Bible College is grateful for the initiation of this van replacement fund. At the 1986 General conference, a similar fund was started. Following the Conference, the Valley View Bible Church in Arizona donated a used van to the college. Some of the funds collected for a replacement van were used to make repairs and improvements to the donated van. About \$2,000 of contributions remain from the gifts given in 1986.

In addition, our plan is to sell several other Conference vehicles and put the money in the van-replacement fund. Our present 15-passenger van currently has 199,000 miles on it.

In addition to using the van for the chorale trip and College outings, the van is also needed each summer to transport young people to Mexico and other outreach events.



Explanation of Budget

The proposed budget for June 1, 1993, to May 31, 1994, states in dollars and cents the programs and activities of the College and Conference which will enable us to carry out our mission.

- Salaries and wages—Compensation is provided for eight full-time employees and 18 part-time employees (includes a 10-month Instructor and four students employed while College is in session).
- 2. Social Security—7.65% of salary which matches employee withholding.
- Employee benefits—Life and Health Insurance, Workman's compensation, Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association premium, and registration fee for summer General Conference.
- Advertising, recruitment—Includes travel, telephone calls, printing, and postage to promote Atlanta Bible College.
- Films, speakers—Honorarium paid to graduation speaker and films used in classes and chapel.
- 6. Foreign exchange—Expense to convert other currencies into US dollars.
- 7. Insurance-nonplant—Liability insurance for employees and directors.
- 8. Youth expense—Provides a subsidy for youth events. (Other support for youth ministry falls under other items such as salary, printing, postage, travel, telephone.)
- Auto expense—License plates, insurance, and maintenance for College/Conference vehicles.
- Office supplies—Paper, ribbons for typewriters and printers, stationery, envelopes, etc.
- 11. Royalties—Fees paid for copyrighted material used in our publications.
- 12. Editorial—A small honorarium paid to Editors of our Christian education curriculum.
- Magazines-Library—Religious and Theological Journals for our Library collection.
- 14. Periodicals, books, dues—A small allowance is provided to professional staff to purchase resource material for classes and to participate in professional organizations.
- 15. Postage—Shipping charges for PROGRESS JOURNAL, *The Restitution Herald*, quarterlies, tracts, books, and for all correspondence.
- 16. Printing, binding—Includes all materi-

- als printed by the General Conference and Atlanta Bible College, including the binding of permanent copies of *The Restitution Herald*, PROGRESS JOURNAL, quarterlies, and Theological Journals for the Library.
- 17. Professional services—Fees for the annual audit and legal expense as needed.
- 18. Repairs, nonplant—Maintenance contracts on office and library equipment.
- 19. Staff education—Professional staff members are encouraged to attend at least one seminar each year to remain current in their field of study.
- 20. Mailing supplies—Envelopes, boxes, padded bags, sealing tape, etc.
- 21. Supplies and expense—Printing supplies, piano tunings, towel and paper products, and other small expense items.
- 22. Telephone—Basic and long-distance service including the cost of all 800 number calls which are provided toll-free for the caller.
- Travel—Includes travel for Board of Directors, Advisory Committees, special Boards and Committees, Chorale, and staff
- 24. Assistance, Missions points—Emergency back-up funds to help with Missions projects. Most Missions funds are raised through appeals for specific projects
- 25. Assistance, Churches—Church Development Aid for three churches.
- Literature campaign—These funds are available to make *The Restitution Her*ald and other literature available to inquirers without charge.
- Ministerial Association—Support for programs and other expenses of the Church of God Ministerial Association.
- 28. Program development—The purchase of resources to enhance teaching programs of Atlanta Bible College.
- Basic grants—Students from churches that are members of the General Conference receive \$115 per quarter hour to subsidize their tuition at Atlanta Bible College.
- 30. Plant operations—Includes all expenses for buildings and property.
- Addition to plant—Provides for the replacement of old equipment and furniture and the acquisition of books for the Library.
- 32. Bookstore—Textbooks and other materials which are purchased and resold.
- 33. Vehicle replacement—A reserve fund is maintained for the replacement of vehicles as necessary. Gifts of vehicles have helped to minimize this cost in the past.

34. Contingency—This budget is being prepared 14 months before the fiscal year begins. This item provides a cushion for adjustments when the fiscal year begins on June 1, 1993.

Anticipated income

- 1. Sales—Includes income from the sale of quarterlies, tracts, books, etc.
- 2. *Herald* subscriptions—Subscriptions are \$12 per year; \$21 for 2 years; and \$30 for 3 years.
- 3. Trust and Endowment—Transfers of interest from the Atlanta Bible College Development Foundation and other trust funds of the College and Conference.
- 4. Tuition—Income is based upon projected enrollment of 30 students in the 1993-94 fiscal year.
- Housing—Rent received from 10 apartments from Atlanta Bible College students.
- 6. Miscellaneous—Primarily interest income.

Contributions Needed

To accomplish the program goals of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference for the 1993-94 fiscal year, contributions of \$432,800 will be needed from churches, conferences, and individual families. This is approximately \$36,000 per month.

In 1991, churches, conferences, and groups gave nearly \$160,000 to the Goal for Giving. We are thankful for this faithful giving and we encourage each member church to designate a portion of its income to assist with the work of the College/Conference.

To close the gap between contribution needs and the amount provided by Churches, Conferences, and groups, we rely upon faithful giving of individuals and families. During 1991, 660 individuals and families gave an average gift of \$275. We invite additional individuals and families to help underwrite the work of the College and Conference.

Opportunities to Proclaim God's Word

This year has been a most exciting one for our family. A chance (?) meeting with a former minister and his wife, who had moved close to our house in Oregon, led to prolonged Bible discussions about the Kingdom of God. Our neighbors were delightfully open-minded and tremendous enthusiasts for the message of Jesus, remarking that they could not understand why churches had never told them about the Gospel of the Kingdom! The pastor is a published author and they have seen religion in many forms over a long period of time. They were very receptive to the basic truths of the Abrahamic Faith and have begun to speak of the Kingdom of God to their many contacts. They are now in Phoenix.

Another neighbor family was introduced to the Bible at Willow Creek Church. A conversation at a garage sale enabled us to invite them to regular Bible study. They are thrilled to see how the Scriptures open up when the basic keys of the Kingdom of God are used. For Barbara and me, it has been a strong confirmation of the exciting business of evangelism especially where we encounter truth seekers with a Berean attitude. It also gave me a chance to correspond with Pastor Bill Hybels of Willow Creek and with the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association.

Opposition has come from some of the ex-Worldwide Church of God groups who "flattered" us with the title of "Satan's end-time deceivers" and warned their readership not to fall for "Buzzard bait." Charles Hunting has also been raked over the coals for proclaiming that God is a single person.

From India came a letter saying that a father and son (in different parts of Madras) had been praying for a long time for an "American Bible teacher" to help them. They appear to be thrilled with the literature that has been sent.

I have been able to make further contact with members of the ex-Way International community. They are proving to be devoted students of the Scripture and are giving up the mistakes of Wierwille's form of "dispensationalism." They, too, are amazed to see what beautiful sense the Abrahamic Faith makes of the Bible. The Abrahamic Faith is flourishing in the household of an individual in Universal City, CA, who has been a wonderful encouragement to us.

From Norway a young man has been finding out what we believe and there has been a very interesting correspondence with a doctor of Budapest, Hungary. He had been involved with Armstrongism and now sees the Abrahamic Faith very clearly. A former Christadelphian is receiving all of our material and this looks like a very useful contact.

The publication of Sid Hatch's book, *Daring to Differ*, represents a break-through for conditional immortality. Charles Hunting's and my book on the Doctrine of the Trinity: *Christianity's Self-Inflicted Wound* will be going to press shortly. This has taken some five years to prepare. We hope it will open some eyes.

The Sabbath and law issue is a problem for many of the ex-Worldwide people. It has been a great encouragement to delve into the books of Romans and Galatians and to discover again the freedom we have in Christ. I was able to produce a new booklet on that subject.

A contact has been made in Raleigh, NC. This American recently spent a month in Hungary, Poland, and Czechoslovakia distributing Church of God literature. He formerly lived in Cracow, Poland, where he had started a Bible fellowship. His burden is to help these believers understand the Bible truths held by the Church of God. In fact, he wishes to translate some of our literature into Polish.

There is a massive interest in the Bible in America, but too few laborers to fill the needs of spiritually starving people. I am convinced that the Abrahamic Faith has a major role to play in maintaining Biblical sanity in an evermore confusing theological world. Above all we must resist the evermore popular notion that religion is a matter of experience. Faith in fact is believing what Jesus taught and His whole message is based on the covenant made with Abraham, a subject obviously missing from other systems of belief.






special program for kids in the community (1-4 grades). This program includes games, singing, a lesson, snacks, and plenty of fun.

College/Conference Update

Annual Maranatha Issue

The July-August PROGRESS JOURNAL is annually designated as the Maranatha issue in honor of our Bible College. We rejoice in God's blessing upon Atlanta Bible College in its first year of operation in its new location. It has been enjoyable to work with a group of dedicated students and staff during this year. The attached pages give a brief glimpse of the exciting things that have happened at Atlanta Bible College during this school year.

Theological Conference

An inspiring and challenging theological conference was sponsored by Atlanta Bible College and the Journal for the Radical Reformation. Fifty-two individuals from 12 states attended the conference. Guest speakers included Kent Ross, Joe Martin, Anthony Buzzard, Sidney Hatch, Waldon Winner, Charles Hunting, Mark Mattison, David Graham, and David Krogh. Other individuals presented short stories of how they had come to understand Bible truth. Messages were presented on the oneness of God, conditional immortality, baptism, Kingdom of God, the rise of adventism, Church of God history, etc.

Those who attended were strengthened in their understanding of Bible truth and came away appreciative of those who have upheld Bible truth through the centuries. All were encouraged to be truth seekers.

New Employee

Terri Tschaennhas joined our staff in the position of bookkeeper and assistant to the controller. She began work June 1. She is the wife of Mark Tschaenn who has enrolled at the Bible College to prepare for ministry. We are happy to welcome the Tschaenns and their two children to our college/conference family.

Duplex Purchase

The Board of Directors has authorized the purchase of an additional duplex directly across Trammell Road from the administration building. It was reported earlier that three duplexes had been purchased across from our property. The acquisition of this additional piece of property for a small outlay of cash plus the assumption of a mortgage will provide additional housing for students as needed. Rental income will cover the mortgage payments, taxes, insurance, and upkeep.

Financial Aid to Two New Churches

The Board of Directors has approved church development aid to two new churches that are being started: the Lafayette Church, Lafayette, Indiana; and New Friends Bible Church, Morrow, Georgia. Each church will be granted \$500 per month beginning this summer.

When the current budget was adopted by the delegates in the summer of 1991, funds were not budgeted for these two congregations; therefore, the Board of Directors has designated the offerings received at the 1992 summer General Conference to be used toward this unbudgeted expense. The Board feels that support of these two churches is in keeping with the purpose and mission of our conference and the membership is encouraged to remember these needs in their prayers and giving.

Further Explanation of Proposed Constitutional Amendments

Page eight of this PROGRESS JOURNAL contains proposed constitutional amendments which will be considered by the delegates at the summer General Conference.

The General Conference and Atlanta Bible College have been incorporated as one entity in accordance with the conclusions of a 1985 study committee and action by the delegates of the General Conference. The college and conference are inseparably linked by a common purpose, mission, and constituency. All of the activities of the conference and college can be summarized in the two principles: education and evangelism. Together, the conference and college provide educational experiences for both lay and professional leaders. These educational experiences happen on campus as well as through seminars and workshops held in other locations. The same principles of worship and music, Christian education, counseling, youth ministry, missions, evangelism and discipleship, and church planting are taught both in the Bible College and through other educational experiences. The single incorporation reflects our commitment to do everything possible to "assist church of God members, churches, and conferences to perform their commission, which is to make disciples by bringing the lost to Jesus Christ, and by leading the believer to maturity by providing leadership, resources, and service."

Our unified organization permits our staff to effectively work as a team in carrying out our mission by helping to strengthen local churches, start new churches, and provide leadership training. Because our organization is small, employees often fill several roles in different branches of the organization. A unified organization eliminates a spirit of competition between staff, and competition for contributions. The unified organization also is more efficient and conserves resources to be channeled into productive areas.

Atlanta Bible College is named first in the corporation, not to designate preeminence over the Church of God General Conference, but rather to more clearly give the college legal status. Legal identity is a help in dealing with the Veterans' Administration, and state and federal Departments of Education. Though we do not receive any public funds for the operation of our Bible College, we

Proposed Constitutional Amendments

The Board of Directors proposes the following Amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws. The amendments will be considered by the delegates at the summer General Conference August 3-7, 1992.

Name of Corporation

The Church of God General Conference has been incorporated in the State of Georgia under the name "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference." To make this change in the Constitution, the Board of Directors proposes that the name "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference" replace "Church of God General Conference" in the Preamble and that the abbreviated name "College/Conference" be used in all other places in the Constitution where Church of God General Conference is used (exception: the term "General Conference" is also used in our Constitution to refer to our summer annual Conference. In such cases, "General Conference" will not be changed.)

The Board of Directors proposes that the name of the Corporation be amended in the following places in the Constitution and Bylaws:

Constitution

Preamble - "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference"

In the following articles use College/Conference instead of Church of God General Conference or General Conference:

Article I, Sec. 1

Article II, Sec. 3,b

Article II, Sec. 5

Article II, Sec. 6

Article II, Sec. 0

Article II, Sec. 7

Article III, Sec. 1

Article IV, Sec. 2

Article IV, Sec. 4

Bylaws

Article I, Sec. 1

Correction of Title and Corporation

Article II, Sec. 3,c "The President of Atlanta Bible College/ Church of God General Conference." The current reading of Article II, Sec. 3,c is "The Executive Director of the Church of God General Conference and the President of Oregon Bible College."

Explanation: This amendment corrects the title of the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation and also changes the name of the Bible College.

Deletion of Unnecessary Wordage

Article 4, Sec. 7, delete "Directors shall be elected in this order: 2 in 1978 for 3 years; 1 in 1979 for 3 years; 2 in 1979 for 4 years; 2 in 1980 for 4 years; continuing therefrom with every Director being elected for a 4-year term." (Explanation: Once this procedure was set up, all Directors are elected for a 4-year term and the rotation is clearly established.) This amendment will delete unnecessary wordage from the Constitution.

Deletion of Unnecessary Wordage

Bylaws Article II, Sec. 6, delete "The Board of Directors shall serve as the Board of Trustees of Oregon Bible College, which was established by the Church of God General Conference August 8, 1939, to educate men and women for the Christian ministries on the Collegiate level through programs of Biblical and Theological studies, General Education in the Arts and Sciences, and Professional Studies in the Pastoral Ministry, and Church vocational areas deemed desirable."

Explanation: This section is now superfluous if the Constitution is amended to read that the Corporation is named "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference." The Board of Directors obviously will serve as the Board for the College since it serves the Corporation entitled "Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference."

Addition of Dissolution Clause

Bylaws Article VII, Sec. 1. "In the event of the dissolution of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference, the Board of Directors, after paying or making provision for payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, shall dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation by distributing those assets exclusively to organizations qualified as exempt from taxation under section 501(c)(3) and which are in agreement with the Statement of Faith contained in this document."

Explanation: This clause is based upon the Articles of Incorporation which clarifies for the State of Georgia and also the Internal Revenue Service that the assets of this Corporation will perpetually be used for the same general purposes for which they were given. This clause also assures that the assets of this corporation will perpetually be used to promote the truths upon which our movement was founded.

College/Conference Update (Cont.)

were required to seek exemption from the State of Georgia from the rovisions of the post secondary educational authorization act which permits us to operate and confer a Bachelor of Theology degree in this state.

Though the corporation name has changed, the way the conference and college operate has not changed. We continue to be one organization working together for the benefit of the Church of God.

Guest Speaker at Summer Conference

Pastor Sidney Hatch, author of the book "Daring to Differ: Adventures in Conditional Immortality," will be on the program of the summer General Conference. He will lead a morning worship service on "Why I Believe in Conditional Immortality"; he will also lead an adult Bible study class, "My Greatest Discoveries in the Word of God"; and lead a workshop on "The Practical Value of Truth." Pastor Hatch participated in our Unitarian



Conference last year and our Theological Conference this year on the college campus. His confirmation of our understanding of Bible truth, presented in an insightful and humble manner, makes him a real blessing to the membership of the Church of God.

Financial Update for Fiscal Year

The college/conference fiscal year ended on May 31. Contributions for the year totaled \$326,565. This year's giving was more than \$27,000 above last year's general contributions. We are deeply grateful to all who have contributed to the work of the conference and college during the past 12 months.

Contributions for the year were \$56,000 less than our goal for giving. Expenditures were approximately \$35,000 less than budgeted. The additional shortfall was made up from a special bequest received during the year and an allocation of Board-

restricted funds. We are grateful that it was unnecessary to borrow funds for operations during the year.

Contributions needed for the new fiscal year that began June 1, 1992, are \$422,550. In order to meet the goal for giving for this current year, contributions will need to increase by nearly \$96,000.

Modest gifts from the more than 3,000 Church of God families who do not normally contribute to the college/conference would make







Catch the Dream

The theme for the 72nd Annual Church of God General Conference was "Catch the Dream." Conference attenders were encouraged to catch the dream of how the Church of God can be more effective in ministry. Our vision for the future of the Church of God must arise out of our desire to know and to fulfill the will of God. Together we must consider how each local church can be strengthened; how new churches can be started; and how Atlanta Bible College can become stronger and more effective in preparing leaders for the Church of God.

It was observed at the Conference that many significant things are happening throughout the Church of God and the Lord is presenting many opportunities for our churches, our General Conference, and Atlanta Bible College. The membership is encouraged to dream, pray, and plan for an expanded ministry based upon the promise of Ephesians 3:20 that tells us that God can do more than we ask or imagine by giving us the power to accomplish the tasks.

Elections and Appointments

Pastor Stephen Bolhous, nominated by the Ministerial Association and Frank Johnson, nominated by the Minnesota Conference, were elected to four-year terms on the Board of Directors. Retiring Board members Donna Deane and Vivian Kirkpatrick were presented plagues of appreciation by President David Krogh. The Board of Directors organized as follows for the coming year: Pastor Scott Ross, Chairman; Dr. William D. Lawrence, vice-chairman; Pastor Gary Burnham, Secretary; Pastor Stephen Bolhous, Treasurer; and Pastor Rex Cain, Frank Johnson, Joe E. James, Directors.

The following individuals were elected to fouryear terms on Advisory Committees: Media Advisory Committee—Dr. John Smead, Missouri; Youth Advisory Committee—Pastor Dale Bliss, Michigan.

The Board of Directors reappointed Ed Schroth and Ruby McCaslin to three-year terms on the Atlanta Bible College Development Foundation Board of Trustees. John Huston was appointed to fill the two-year unexpired term of Frank Johnson who was elected to the Board of Directors and who by virtue of his office is automatically a member of the Foundation Board.

Pastor Stan Ross was reappointed as Chairman of the Minister's Voluntary Retirement Association Board of Trustees. Joe E. James was reappointed as a member of the Christian Conciliation Board.

Dr. Donna Deane was appointed to the one-year unexpired term of Joe James on the Higher Education Advisory Committee.

Business Sessions

The complete minutes of the business sessions appear in this JOURNAL. All of the proposed Constitutional Amendments were approved. A motion was adopted regarding mission outreach to those coming to the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta. Jim Graham, Youth Coordinator, reported on the 1992 Youth Congress. Kent Ross, Vice-President, reported on the develop-

ment of correspondence courses and our new publication, Journal from the Radical Reformation. David Krogh presented the new Sunday School curriculum to be used for the December 1992 - February 1993 quarter. The budget for the fiscal year June 1, 1993 -May 31, 1994 was adopted calling for contributions of \$432,800.

Chairman's Message to Delegates

Delegates and friends. On behalf of the Board of Directors, I am pleased to be able to report to you that this last year has been a very, very good year! Truly God has blessed us. We have successfully completed our first school year at our new location in Georgia and some wonderful things have happened. Our students and staff have become involved in the community in which they live. They have faithfully testified of their faith before the students at Clayton State College where they have taken some of their classes. They have reached out to the children of their community with an "after-school" program that has ministered to more than 50 children and young people. They have, as instructed by Jesus, visited those in prison, fed the hungry, clothed the naked, and welcomed the strangers. As they surveyed their community, they found that one of the real needs of people in their community was disposable diapers. In response to their prayers, God has provided literally truckloads of diapers that they have been able to distribute to people in need in the name of Jesus. New students have literally walked in off the streets looking for an opportunity to study and be trained at our college. Our ABC Chorale has visited many of our churches and ministered to many of us. Our students have been academically challenged to grow and prepare for service to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Truly God has blessed us!

This past year has seen the establishment of two new churches: the New Friends Bible Church of God in Morrow, Georgia, and the reestablishment of a congregation in Lafayette, Indiana. I am excited to see new churches planted, new "outposts" from which God's message of love and hope and truth can be sent forth. The Board of Directors wants to help and encourage these new works. In our current budget, adopted a year ago, there were no funds for assistance to these new works. On faith and in confidence of you people, we have promised support to these works. This year's offerings at this conference will go to raise support for the new work in Lafayette, Indiana and Atlanta, Georgia. Truly God has blessed us!

I am happy to report to you that we have sold one of the buildings in Oregon, Illinois. The office building on Third Street was sold this past month for \$123,000. This will significantly help eliminate some of the indebtedness of our new campus. Significant interest is being shown in other buildings. Continue to pray for the sale of the rest of the buildings. But truly, God has blessed us!

This past year has seen Atlanta Bible College host the second conference on Biblical Unitarianism and the continued publication of the theological journal: *The Radical Reformation*. We continually get responses of those who are thrilled to find that there are people and a college that are teaching these truths. It is exciting to

see Atlanta Bible College and our staff become leaders in raising a strong voice for truth and clarity in the theological world. Truly God has blessed us!

This past year the giving of you and of the people and churches you represent has been tremendous. Giving this past fiscal year was more than \$27,000 above last year's general contributions. It was not necessary to borrow any funds for operations last year. Truly God has blessed us!

This past month a successful Youth Congress was held with a wonderful spirit of unity strong among the staff and students. Seven young people made commitments to accept Christ and be baptized. Truly God has blessed us!

This past year the staff and student body has put forth tremendous effort with the help and cooperation of the pastors and churches of our conference to recruit new students. The results are exciting. At this time we are anticipating an enrollment of 20 or more new students to begin this fall quarter. This is more than a 50% increase in total enrollment. Truly God has blessed us!

On behalf of the Board I want to express, and give you an opportunity to express, our heartfelt thankfulness for the sound Christian leadership of our president, Brother David Krogh, and of our vice-president, Brother Kent Ross, and of all our faithful staff that have been so important in making this past year such a blessing Truly God has blessed us!

We want you the delegates to know and understand and share in the vision for our conference. We want you to "Catch the Dream." Our resources and efforts for the coming years are going to be directed in the following three areas. First, we want to encourage, strengthen, and help our local churches. We have been and will continue to be a "service" organization—serving the needs of our churches. Our staff is available to you to help in any way that they can in your local congregations. We will continue to provide valuable resources for you to use in training and teaching people, including such things as videos and tapes, staff visits to present seminars, Christian Worker's Seminar, Focus magazine, The Restitution Herald, and our Sunday School quarterlies. We are excited about the new curriculum that will be provided for the winter quarter of this year that will emphasize the important doctrinal distinctives we hold so dear. This is in response to the action taken by you delegates at last summer's conference. A special thanks needs to be expressed to Sister Gayle Guthrie who has served as general editor of this massive project, and to all of the editors and writers who have given so many hours and given of their many gifts and talents to make this possible.

The first focus of our vision is indeed to encourage and strengthen our local churches. But a second vital part of our vision is to help and encourage the planting of new congregations. We need more churches. We need more "beacons" of truth and light in the world of confusion and darkness. We want to make our staff and resources available to help state conferences, local churches, and individuals who have caught a vision of planting a new church. We want our staff and students to experience and model church planting in the Atlanta area, as indeed they have and are doing. There are not enough churches teaching the word of truth that reveals the Savior that brings salvation. As a consequence, many are dying without coming to know Jesus as Savior and Lord. We cannot be indifferent to that. God has called us to bear witness so that people might be saved. That has always been and will continue to be a vital part of our vision.

The third focus of our vision is to provide the best environment possible with the help of God to train men and women for Christian service at Atlanta Bible College. We want to make it spiritually rich, academically sound, and service oriented. We commit our resources and efforts and prayers to making that happen. For out of Atlanta Bible College will come the men and women who will lead the Church of God in the coming century in such a way as to continue to be a strong and even brighter beacon of truth in a lost world of darkness.

This is our vision: To strengthen, encourage, and help our existing local churches; to establish new churches; and to build Atlanta Bible College into the strongest college possible for the purpose of training men and women for Christian service.

What challenges must we overcome to make the vision, the dream, reality? I suggest there are at least four with which we must come to grips. First, we have some serious problems faced by local churches that will split and destroy or at least seriously damage those churches unless something miraculous happens. Every local church at times faces challenges and conflicts. I want to urge churches to avail themselves of an important resource: The Christian Conciliation Board. This board is composed of skilled, trained, and spiritual people who can help a church. But you must avail yourself of this

resource early in the tension and conflict. Do not wait until "battlelines" have been drawn. This is not a "court of last resort" that is to be called in to oversee the battle and destruction. Seek its counsel early so conciliation can happen and God's work can go forth.

A second challenge we must overcome is an attitude that exists in some individuals toward the conference—an attitude that says it's "them" and "us." It is not "those people" at the conference and "us people" in the local church. We are all on the same team, all working together in service to the same Lord. We need an attitude of cooperation and mutual support. I frankly do not understand certain individuals. I wish they would spend as much effort at making the work of the conference succeed as they do in criticizing and fault finding. None of us are perfect, and we all make mistakes. But we all want the same thing. Let's all work together in cooperation and love to be all that God has called us to be and do all God has called us to do.

The third challenge we face is in placing our students. We have the unfortunate situation of pastors wanting to serve but no churches being available. Instead of training people and then having no place for them to serve, we need to plant more churches.

A fourth challenge we face is in broadening our base for financial support. Less than 20% of member families give anything directly to our General Conference and Atlanta Bible College. Many of our donors are older members. We need to share the good news of what has been happening, share the vision so people "catch the dream" and that base will broaden.

I am excited. I am excited about all that has happened this past year. Truly God has blessed us! I am excited about all that will be happening this coming year. Truly God will bless us. I am excited about the vision for the Church of God, and I know you are excited too. Together we can "Catch the Dream." Together we can serve the Lord. Together we can go forth so that the lost will be saved, the churches will be encouraged, and God will be glorified. Truly God has blessed us!

- VIII. Sites for future General Conference meetings were announced. The 1993 General Conference will be held July 26-30 at Purdue University in Lafayette, Indiana. The 1994 General Conference will be held in the Atlanta area. Simi Valley, California, has offered to host the 1995 conference. The delegates were asked to discuss this as a potential site with their membership. A straw vote indicating the level of interest will take place at the 1993 General Conference.
 - IX. Scott Ross explained that the Church Builder's Appeals are coordinated by the General Conference. The Conference costs for printing, etc., are taken from the funds generated, usually around \$1,000 or 7%.
 - X. In absence of Gayle Guthrie who was hospitalized yesterday, President David Krogh reported on the new Sunday School curriculum to be used December, 1992, to February,

- 1993. Information materials were included in the delegate packet.
- XI. The 1991 delegates voted that the General Conference sponsor two churches in a free-literature campaign. Thus far, no one has decided to do the pilot study; if anyone is interested, be certain to contact the ABC staff.
- XII. Jim Graham, Youth Director, reported on the 1993 Youth Congress. The 1993 conference will be held at John Brown University in Arkansas, July 11-16; he encouraged attendance. Fonthill won the quizzing contest at the 1992 Congress.
- XIII. Kent Ross, Vice President, ABC, reported on the status of the development of correspondence courses. He also reported on the new periodical, *The Radical Reformation*, and the scholarly recognition of the journal. He recognized Mark Mattison and Anthony Buzzard (coeditors with Kent Ross) for their excellent work on the journal.
- XIV. Pastor Gary Turner, Family Bible Fellowship, expressed thanks for the funds from the Church Builder's Appeal. He also encouraged delegates to urge their churches to contribute to the appeal and identified specific financial needs of Family Bible Fellowship.
- XV. Chairman Scott Ross adjourned the meeting with prayer.

Thursday, August 6, 1992 2:30 P.M.

The business session was called to order by Chairman Scott Ross at 2:40 p.m.

A moment of silent prayer was held in recognition of the deaths during the past year of Pastor J.R. LeCrone, Pastor Leonard Brown, and two pastors' wives, Ruth Sheets and Mildred Macy. Pastor Francis Burnett opened the meeting with prayer.

- I. The minutes of Wednesday, August 5, were read by the secretary. No corrections were noted.
- II. The proposed constitutional amendments printed on page 6, in the May, June, 1992, Progress Journal were discussed.
- a) Change name of corporation to Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference. (Preamble; Article I, Sec. 1; Article II, Sec. 3,b; Article II, Sec. 5; Article II, Sec. 6; Article II, Sec. 7; Article III, Sec. 1; Article IV, Sec. 2; Article IV, Sec. 4; Article IV, Sec. 7; Bylaws: Article I, Sec. 1; Article II, Sec. 1 (mentioned two times); Article II, Sec. 7(E); Article II, Sec. 7(G); Article IV, Sec. 1 (mentioned two times); Article V, Sec. 1; Article VI, Sec. 1. John Huston moved and Howard Shute seconded the motion. Gaye Dilley moved on behalf of Minnesota State Conference to amend that the Corporation be called Church of God General Conference/Atlanta Bible College. Norwald Sogge seconded. Discussion followed, the amendment failed 52 to 83. The original motion carried.

- b) Correction of the title and corporation name (Article II, Section 3,c.). Don Overmyer moved, Jon Lippert seconded. Motion passed.
- c) Deletion of unnecessary wordage (Article IV, Section 7.).
 Earl Poland moved, Ruby McCaslin seconded. Motion passed.
- d) Deletion of unnecessary wordage (Article II, Section 6.). Francis Burnett moved, Darrell Cardwell seconded. Francis Burnett moved to amend the amendment with the following wordage in Article II Section 6 retained: "Atlanta Bible College, which was established by the Church of God General Conference August 8, 1939 (as Oregon Bible College), to educate men and women for the Christian ministries on the Collegiate level through programs of Biblical and Theological studies, General Education in the Arts and Sciences, and Professional Studies in the Pastoral Ministry, and Church vocational areas deemed desirable." Willis Turner seconded, Discussion followed, Don Overmyer moved to table the amendment to the amendment until the 1993 conference. Don Black seconded the motion. 56 to 26—the motion was tabled. Original motion passed.
- e) Addition of dissolution clause (Article VII, Section 1.). "In the event of the dissolution of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference, the Board of Directors, after paying or making provision for payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, shall dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation by distributing those assets exclusively to organizations qualified as exempt from taxation under section 501(c)(3) and which are in agreement with the Statement of Faith contained in this document." Alan Cain moved, David Cheatwood seconded. Motion passed.
- III. The 1996 Summer Olympic games will be held in the USA. Most importantly, they will take place in Atlanta. Marge Bolhous, Missions Chairperson of the Oregon Church of

God, moved "that the General Conference Missions Committee study and correlate a plan to encourage mission outreach to those coming to the 1996 Olympics, present this plan to the Conference Board for their consideration and implementation as soon as possible." Darrell Cardwell seconded that the above recommendations be accepted. Motion passed.

- IV. Michael Mattison, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, expressed special thanks to Dick Eldred for coming to their church.
- V. Clarence Jones asked the delegates to think about the inclusion of "Abrahamic Faith" in referring to the Church of God.
- VI. David Krogh presented and explained the 1993-94 budget printed on pages 16-17 of the May, June, Progress Journal. John Huston moved and Clarence Jones seconded adoption. Motion passed.
- VII. The Credentials Committee reported a total of 153 delegates: seven Board of Directors, 95 delegates, and 51 pastors.
- VIII. Darrell Cardwell shared information about a radio program they are sponsoring in Peoria. Jon Cheatwood is asking that members pray for the Pomona Church in its outreach program on the following days in 1992-93: September 5, October 17, November 28, January 9, February 20, April 3, May 15, and June 26.
- IX. Attendance at the Conference has exceeded 400.
- X. The minutes for the August 6 meeting were read. Delbert Jones moved and Charles Webster seconded that all 1992 delegate session minutes be accepted. Motion passed.

College/Conference News

School Year Begins

The second school year for Atlanta Bible College started with registration on September 8 and 9. We rejoice in a sizable increase in our enrollment over last year. A total of 21 new students joined our student body for a total enrollment of 38 for this fall quarter.

The school year began with two intensive classes taught September 10-18. Regular classes at ABC and Clayton State College began on September 21.



New Van

A 1990 15-passenger van has been purchased for the use of the College and Conference. The Northeast Conference contributed \$4,000 to start a van replacement fund and issued a challenge to other conferences, churches, and individuals to add to the fund as soon as possible. We are grateful for all of the special gifts that have been received toward the \$15,000 purchase price. Approximately \$4,000 is yet needed toward the purchase.

Building Sold in Oregon

Just prior to the Summer Conference the Board of Directors accepted an offer of \$123,000 on the former General Conference building on Third Street in Oregon, Illinois. During the coming year we will lease space in the building for our publishing offices. We have received offers on the Women's Dormitory. Counter-offers have been made and we continue in negotiations. Efforts to sell the other remaining buildings in Oregon are continuing. We are thankful for the sale of the General Conference building and ask our membership to continue to pray for the sale of other buildings.

Come Visit Our Campus

Church of God members are encouraged to visit our campus in Morrow, Georgia. Recreational vehicle pads with utility hook-ups are available. During the fall quarter space is not available in our apartment building because of our greatly increased enrollment.

Pastors who will be in the area are encouraged to let us know as far in advance as possible so arrangements can be made to speak in our Chapel service.

Telemarketing Campaign

Representatives of Atlanta Bible College have been calling Church of God members to encourage contributions to provide basic grants for Atlanta Bible College students. In order to keep our tuition charges as reasonable as possible, tuition and fees pay only about 60% of the costs of educating each student. The balance must be made up by general contributions from our membership. We welcome more than 100 new giving individuals and families who have responded to our telemarketing effort. Contributions from individuals and families provide a sizable part of our operating income. Thanks for receiving our call and joining with us in the support of students preparing for ministry.

We would like to give special recognition to Esther Sprinkle who is the oldestregular contributor to the Conference and College. She will celebrate her 98th birthday on October 16.


Diapers to Florida

Graduates Honored

The Board of Directors authorized the granting of Bachelor's Degrees to students who graduated from Oregon Bible College between the years 1966-1991, Prior to 1966, the State of Illinois permitted the Bible College to grant a Bachelor's Degree. However, degree-granting authority was withdrawn from unaccredited institutions in 1966. The State of Georgia Department of Education granted Atlanta Bible College exemption upon religious grounds from the provisions of the Post Secondary Educational Act. This exemption gave ABC operating authority in the State of Georgia and provided authority for the Bible College to grant a Bachelor's Degree for our four-year program. 


Mexico Trip




