#### Are We Worshipping Worship More Than We Worship God?

The commitment in recent years to ponder the significance and place of worship among the people of God is most encouraging. For too long, many of us in the evangelical community were all too willing to settle for a hymn-sandwich approach to worship. You know—a 40 minute sermon with a couple of hymns on either side of the meat of the Word! Fortunately, this is no longer the case in most places. Serious study and reflection on the Bible coupled with an acknowledgment of the deep longings of our hearts to know and love God more experimentally, as the Puritans would say, have led many of us into a deep repentance of liturgical illiteracy—or in other words, from being woefully ignorant about the kind of worship our Father desires and de-

We now have a multitude of seminars on worship to attend; courses to choose from in seminaries; a whole spate of books on the topic; fresh, creative music; and even new periodicals such as Worship Leader to help inform and equip us in our effort to more faithfully attend to our greatest and most eternal of all callings, the worship of God. Indeed, this is most encouraging. And yet, as a pastor who has been involved in the renewal of the local church for the past 15 years and as one who has been humbled more than once because of my own superficial understanding of worship, I carry some real concerns about where much of our worship learnings are taking us. Could it be that we are unwittingly falling into the worship of worship rather than the worship of God? Dare we even think that worship itself, like anything else, can become an idol? Is it possible that what should be the most selfless act of all has actually become a showcase for the depth of our self-centeredness?

Have you really listened to much of the dialogue about worship styles and forms? Ask your average evangelical Christian about the worship in his or her local church, and you might get a response similar to this, "Oh, it's great! We don't sing many of those old boring hymns anymore. We are into some of those really neat choruses. We even got rid of the pipe organ and replaced it with a rhythm section—you know, a guitar, drums, bass, and the most incredible rack of synthesizers you have ever heard! We have a blast every time we worship now. By the way—have you ever lifted your hands when you sing to the Lord? It's great! It makes me feel so good. I could never go back to that old way of worshipping. You should visit one of our worship celebrations. You'll be glad you did."

Maybe this doesn't sound like anyone you know. Well, try the same scenario with some slight changes. You say, "Tell me about how your church worships." Your friend responds,"Well, finally we have awakened to real worship! We got over our fixation with those mindless choruses, and are once again thinking when we sing. I was so bored with those little ditties they called music. And our pastor is, at last, dignifying the pulpit by wearing a collar and robe. It makes me feel so good to see him each Sunday now. I actually look forward to worship each Lord's Day now that we have made all of these wonderful changes. And, oh, yeah, we installed kneeling benches in our pews. It makes me feel so warm and close to God when we read The Apostles' Creed while on our knees. You ought to worship with us. You'll really like it."

As different as these two responses seem to be in describing the elements of preferred forms of worship, they are actually one and the same. Both of them reflect the reason for my growing concern about how a great percentage of Christians approach the topic of worship today. Did you notice how self-centered both types of responses are? "I like." "I don't like." "I feel." "I enjoy it when. . . . " "I am bored if...." This seems so terribly esoteric and existential to me, not to mention flat-out selfish! Are we bringing up a generation of Christians who only think in terms of "What's in it for me?", even when the topic is the worship of God? Have we reduced the topic of worship to little more than what we do when we go into our 31-flavor icecream shop? One of us says,"I'll have two scoops of warm fuzzies, please, with just a sprinkle of theology." Another says, "Give me a Reformation Sunday, please, in a black cup. I'll eat it while I wear my hair shirt." Still another says, "Are these the only flavors? When are you going to get something new? I am tired of all of these."

The Board of Directors met on the campus of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference October 1 and 2. The following items were on the agenda:

- 1) Reviewed the beginning of the new ABC year including recruitment plans for 1994-1995.
- 2) It was decided to re-list the Men's Dorm and Golden Rule Building with a real estate agent in Oregon, Illinois. Chairman Stephen Bolhous has asked the entire membership to specifically pray for a buyer(s) before the end of this calendar year.

Anyone having interest in this kind of training should contact Kent Ross.


#### Financial Update

#### Jon Cheatwood

Interviewed by Pastor Jeff Bull

If you were entering the pastoral ministry today, what is one thing you would do differently?

Have a longer internship. I had a great guy to intern with and learned a great deal, but would like to have had an internship longer than five months.

What has been your greatest pastoral challenge?

Developing our youth ministry. Specifically, helping the kids to distinguish the difference between church and Christ. That is, too often they see church as everything their spiritual life is to be rather than seeing that a personal relationship with Christ is the true measure of a person's spirituality. Going to church can never measure up to a vital, growing intimate relationship with Jesus. They need to learn that going to church does not equal having that relationship.

What has been your most memorable personal victory?

In many senses, I feel I've been an underachiever most of my life. I've had more talent than motivation. I think I've greatly improved in that area. I've found some direction and am more motivated than I have been; there is still room for more improvement, but I'm coming along.

How has being a pastor affected your family/personal life?

I have to think about how decisions I make as a pastor affect my wife and my homelife. Not too long ago we had a woman and her son stay with us because they were homeless. I worried about Sarah's safety, but I had to act on my convictions about reaching out to others.

What do you like most about the pastoral ministry?

I like the freedom, flexibility that I have. I can set my own hours.

... the least?

Probably the same thing! That freedom is a two-edged sword. While I enjoy that freedom, the self-discipline necessary is a struggle.

Was there an individual(s) who most affected your decision to become a pastor?

My father, David Cheatwood. I can't really ignore that; growing up in a pastor's home. I watched him and experienced that all my life. He never pushed me toward the pastoral ministry, but his presence and example were always there. In college, Kent Ross was a strong influence. I saw I didn't have to be the typical, straight-laced pastor. Kent broke the stereotype of what a pastor had to be for me. I saw that you could be a normal guy.

If you could change one thing about the church/pastoral ministry with a snap of your fingers, what would it be?

I would like to know it all. There is no way to know what to do in all situations and that gets difficult at times. Better than

that, I'd like people who call themselves Christians to automatically respond/change according to anything they read or heard from the Bible, including myself! It would make preaching a lot easier, or maybe harder because we'd run out of things to preach on! It would be great if once I preached something, I'd learn it and the congregation would learn it and we wouldn't have to look at it again—go over stuff we'd already covered.

Share some of your thoughts concerning the church's role in society.

That's something I've put a lot of thought into recently. We've seen other organizations out fighting different social wrongs while the church, in general, has kicked back and talked among themselves. I think the church needs to, not take a big social stance as its primary focus, but take part in the battle, from a Christian perspective. Again, I'm not talking about public picketing, but fighting sin in our midst, taking a stand as an example in our communities. We don't want to replace the Gospel message of Jesus Christ with a "social gospel." Our church should be leading the community by example.

Share some news/events/developments that are happening at the Church of God at which you're pastoring.

We have kids, finally! Forthe first time since I've been here, we're regularly having youth under the age of fourteen. It's nice to see those faces and even hear those screams every once in a while. I feel this is an extra plus for when we have visitors come in from our outreach program. They'll see that we have kids around and it will help in the grand scheme of things to bring people in. It is a big joy for us to see young people coming in. We're also getting excited about our outreach program bringing in some people. We hand out items to neighborhood homes about every six weeks. We've given out pencils, erasers, rulers, balloons, bookmarks, and other things like that. They have our church name and phone number on them. Hopefully, they'll remember us when they have a crisis or need and will call on us.

#### Are We Worshipping Worship More Than We Worship God?

(Continued from page 1)

While much of the language about styles and forms of worship is important, even necessary, what's the effect and end of our talk? Why don't we hear more Christians asking, "How can we honor God the most through worship? What does He desire from us as we gather to worship Him? What would bring the most glory to our Lord, the most pleasure to the heart of our Father as we seek to learn how to worship Him? What sacrifice of praise can I make on behalf of the One who has forgiven all of my sins? What Scriptures can help me better understand the kind of worship and worshipers the Father is seeking? What is appropriate and inappropriate for us, His people, who are desiring to mature in our worship? How does God Himself define and describe His worship?" Do you see the difference in these questions? Do you see the God-centered objective approach rather than the me-centered subjective approach to worship reflected in these questions?

Years ago, with the insight and foresight given by the Holy Spirit, Fuller Theological Seminary professor Dr. Ralph Martin spoke of his concern about worship in our contemporary culture in his book *The Worship of God* (William Eerdmans, 1982): "Our worship involves an activity undertaken not primarily to satisfy our needs, nor to make us feel better as a direct consequence, nor to minister to our aesthetic taste or social well-being. All these notions have crept into a modern understanding of worship and have tended in varying degrees to corrupt it. The truth is that the opposite of these apparently laudable aims may result as an immediate consequence of our engaging in worship." Martin went on to quote Richard John Neuhaus: "the celebration that we call worship has less to do with the satisfaction of the pursuit of happiness than with the abandonment of the pursuit of happiness."

Does this mean that we are wrong to enjoy worship or that we should feel guilty about having personal references with respect to form? Of course not! But that is not the point. The preponderance of "I like" and "I don't like" language in the dialogue about worship simply reflects that we are wrong about the goal of worship. Worship exists for the adoration of God for His sake, since He alone is the end of all true worship. To get back to this foundational proposition will free us from the paralyzing diatribes that are all too often the portion of those who set out to harmlessly talk about worship with their friends. How sad that the one thing that will unite us all around the throne of God now serves to be the occasion for so much pain and division among God's sons and daughters. Brethren, this ought not be! This doesn't need to be! What an utter contradiction.

Have we become those who worship worship more than we worship God? Do we enjoy our own "forms" more than we fear God? Do we show more passion in defending our "style" of worship than we do in obeying and serving Him? Are we more agitated by whatother Christians "like" about their worship than we are grieved over our own sin and foolish hearts? Are we more resolved to control the worship service in our churches than we are controlled by the Holy Spirit in our relationships? Is it God that we adore or simply ourselves that we serve? Let's ponder these things, long and hard. The glory of God is all that is at stake.



# PRESIDENT'S REVIEW OF 1993 THE STATE OF THE CHURCH OF GOD

Several Atlanta Bible College students were visiting Mary in the hospital recently. She said to them, "I am sixty years old, and all I've ever wanted in life was for someone to love me. And finally I have found that love in your church."

Several weeks ago, students collected money from students and staff. Then they went to Sam's Club to buy bread, lunch meat, and chips to prepare meals for homeless people downtown. More than one hundred lunches were prepared and shared in the name of Jesus.

While working on this message, a student came into my office to tell me of assistance that he had given to some needy people earlier in the day. Their utilities had been shut off and they were on the verge of being evicted. By helping secure assistance through social service agencies, power was restored and the rent paid.

Students continue to make regular trips to a local prison and nursing home. Students continue to work with children and young people who have grown up with little or no Christian influence.

The ministry of the Church of God today is characterized by a balance between the proclamation of truth and meeting the needs of those who are less fortunate. Perhaps you have heard the expression "empty bellies have no ears." The point is that people who are starving to death are unable to listen to or respond to the Gospel. Meeting physical needs goes hand in hand with proclamation of Bible truth. We have no less an example than Jesus of doing good along with his teaching and preaching ministry.

Jesus talked about feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, taking strangers in, clothing them, caring for the sick, and visiting those in prison. He is the one who said "whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine you did for me" (Matt. 25:36).

And so the story of Church of God ministry during 1993 can be told with countless stories of believers who reached out in love to the needy. The story can be told by reviewing the teaching and preaching ministry that took place in all of our churches.

This annual review of Church of God ministry is not undertaken to congratulate ourselves or take pride in our accomplishments. Rather we look back humbly, praising God for His faithfulness and His blessing upon the efforts of Church of God members and congregations during the year. It is truly God's grace that has seen us through another year of ministry and that has enabled good things to happen throughout the Church of God. We can truly say with the Psalmist "this was the Yord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes" (Psalm 118:23).

#### I. The Ministry of our Churches

As we think about the accomplishments of the past year we are reminded of the faithfulness of Church of God pastors who have prayed, studied the Word, led, and challenged; preached hundreds of sermons to thousands of people; made thousands of calls on the sick, hurting, and lost; spent countless hours counseling and encouraging.

#### We are mindful of:

- the thousands of Sunday school classes, midweek classes, and home Bible studies that have been taught by pastors and lay members.
- all who were involved in disciplemaking, spending time building relationships with the unconverted, knocking on doors, sharing their faith, etc., so that others might come to Christ.
- all who "shared a cup of cold water" in Jesus' name.
- the faithfulness of so many members who gave their tithes and generous offerings to see God's work go forward at home and abroad.
- the nearly two hundred baptisms that took place during 1993.
- churches that sponsored "Sacrifice Sundays" to pay off debts, to provide funds for church planting, and to fund other projects.
- all the men's groups, ladies' groups, missionary societies, youth groups, etc., that met regularly for study, fellowship, and outreach.

Certainly God is pleased with those who have a concern for the church and who put forth time, effort, and money so that His work can go forward.

And so as we look back at 1993, we rejoice in the faithfulness of God's people.

#### II. The Ministry of the College/Conference

Enrollment at Atlanta Bible College in the fall of 1993 was the highest it has been in many years. We are grateful to God for the students who came to prepare themselves for more effective service. We rejoice in their academic performance as well as in their involvement in ministry.

We also are grateful for the students who graduated from Atlanta Bible College in the spring of 1993. All six are involved in ministry as church planters, as interns, or as employees of the College/Conference.

1993 was a significant year in Church of God foreign mission efforts. The decision of delegates at the summer Conference to create a mission sending agency, to more effectively channel Church of God people to foreign fields, was a giant step forward. The sending agency has been named "The Lord's Harvest International." We rejoice in opportunities to proclaim the gospel in St. Petersburg Russia; Malawi, the Philippine Islands, India, French Guinea, Liberia, Mexico, and Peru. We also rejoice that Church of God literature has been distributed in so many other countries.

A new summer ministries program was implemented last year. Under the direction of Christy Ross a number of young people, including ABC students were involved in Vacation Bible Schools and ministries at five churches. This program was of value not only to the churches that were assisted, but was also an extremely valuable ministry learning experience for those who assisted.

Another new program launched in 1993 was a lay speaker's training program. Under the direction of the License Board, Kent Ross conducted a weekend seminar to assist lay people in public speaking. Lay speakers play a valuable role in filling the pulpit for churches without pastors, or assisting when a pastor is on vacation.

We are grateful for the vision of Jason Turner and Lee McMinn to start new churches during 1993. Jason launched a new work in Beloit, Wisconsin as a daughter church of Family Bible Fellowship in Rockford, Illinois. Lee McMinn started a church in Columbia, South Carolina with several local Church of God families.

During 1993 efforts continued to dispose of college property in Oregon, Illinois. We are grateful for the sale of the women's dormitory and an acceptable offer on the men's dormitory. We know the prayers of the membership were instrumental in these sales.

Atlanta Bible College launched an experimental radio program during 1993. Sixty-five programs on the subjects of conditional immortality, the sleep of the dead, and the kingdom on the earth were produced and aired on a local radio station. Anthony Buzzard was the speaker. Several inquiries were received for additional information. We continue to give consideration to the roles of radio and television ministries in our ministry.

#### III. What's in Store for '94?

In light of our vision, the Church of God must give attention to the following items in the coming year:

- Strengthening of every church. Each member and each local church must do everything possible to strengthen its ministry. It is imperative for each church to have an outward focus of reaching out in love to those who are lost. Each church should be totally committed to making disciples, which includes discovering those who are lost, reaching out to them, ministering to them, inviting them to church activities and services, leading them to Christ, and nurturing them to become disciplemakers, and leaders in our churches. Each church is encouraged to evaluate its ministry to see how effective it is and what steps can be taken to make it more effective in fulfilling the Great Commission.
- We continue to challenge the membership to focus on starting new churches. It is surprising what happens when people begin to pray and plan for launching new works. When we take the first step God opens doors of opportunity that we never saw before. Gary Turner, President of the Illinois Conference and Pastor of Family Bible Fellowship in Rockford, IL, has a vision of starting many new churches in northern Illinois and southern Wisconsin during the rest of this decade. New Friends Bible Church in Atlanta, Georgia has a vision of having many churches in the Atlanta area by the year 2000. The Southeast Conference is exploring ways of starting more churches in North and South Carolina, and perhaps neighboring states. Other Conferences and churches are discussing church planting plans. Each local church and each state conference is encouraged to pray and plan for new works.

The staff of Atlanta Bible College continues its commitment to make Atlanta Bible College the best educational institution for the equipping of lay and professional leaders for the Church of God. God seems to be sending more community people to the college. Is it possible that God is calling us to a bigger Bible College vision? Though some of these community students may not become workers or leaders in the Church of God, perhaps Bible truth can find its way into other churches and organizations. In any case, our staff is committed to equipping students in a variety of ministries that will be of value to our existing churches and new churches.

Several other efforts are being undertaken to undergird our vision, as follows:

#### **NEW ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CURRICULUM**

The Truth Seeker's Sunday school quarterly for adults has been published for sixty-seven years. It continues to meet many needs in the Church of God, with a circulation of nearly twenty-three hundred copies per quarter. However, we recognize it is not possible for one curriculum to meet the needs of all adults in the Church of God. Therefore, the Christian Education Advisory Committee is pursuing the publication of a new curriculum to meet more needs. An editor will be appointed and a writing staff will be secured.

#### MISSION WORK

We will continue a vigorous foreign mission effort in accord with our vision of starting new churches not only in North America, but around the world. We recognize the need to raise up missionary personnel at local churches and train them for specific work overseas. In conjunction with Atlanta Bible College, the Mission Sending Agency is designing a curriculum that will effectively prepare people for cross-cultural mission work. Training will include Bible, Theology, and Ministry from Atlanta Bible College and language and cross-cultural studies at other recommended educational institutions. The fields are white unto harvest and we pray that God will send forth the laborers that are necessary to bring in the harvest.

#### **CAPITAL CAMPAIGN**

Now that the old Oregon Bible College campus has been sold (an offer has been accepted on the final building) the Board of Directors is considering a Capital Campaign to meet the challenges of this decade. This campaign would meet three critical needs:

- Raise funds for additional campus building(s) as we anticipate the continued growth of the College.
- 2. Pay off final loans on the Atlanta campus.
- 3. Pay off funds borrowed to meet general operations during the past few years.

The Board will discuss this matter further at their next meeting. A recommendation will be presented for consideration by delegates at the summer Conference.

#### **MORE BAPTISMS**

During 1994 we will continue to keep our eyes focused upon the goal adopted by the delegates of having two thousand baptisms by the year 2000. This is a tremendously exciting goal in keeping with the Great Commission. Thus far in the decade we have had 646 baptisms. We rejoice in all those who have come to Christ.

#### SPECIAL CHALLENGES AS WE LOOK TO THE 21ST CENTURY

We continue to face the challenge of living in changing times. There seem to be four kinds of people in regard to change:

- 1) Radicals—These people want change for change's sake.
- 2) *Progressives*—These people say "if we don't change, we will lose what we have." They face the fact that change is a reality of life.
- 3) *Conservatives*—These people say, "If we change, we will lose what we have." They feel secure in the status quo.
- 4) *Traditionalists*—These people do not want change of any kind. They cling tightly to the past.


I propose that we as members of the Church of God must be progressives. We must be flexible and willing to adapt so we can minister to our changing world. We may not like the changes taking place in the world, but the changes are reality. We do not have the power to force the world to cooperate with our agenda. But we do have the power to modify ourselves in an effort to minister more effectively. Our message will not change, but we must adjust our methods of ministry, otherwise many of our churches will die and we will have little effectiveness in reaching those who are lost. Our members must be united as they discuss and implement modifications that will help our ministries to be more effective.

Some of our churches continue to struggle with internal difficulties. We must redirect our energies away from fault finding to finding the lost. The best cure for internal difficulties is to bevelop an outward focus—being more concerned about others than we are about ourselves. In many of our churches we need to turn our focus from problems to opportunities. Sometimes we become so preoccupied with our internal problems that we fail to see the doors of opportunity that God is opening to us.

As we face the future, we must also be certain to avoid the sins of Israel. I recently heard a pastor speak on the sins of Israel, which he said were: they forgot the past; they became satisfied with the present; and they were fearful of the future. We dare not forget our heritage and the way God has blessed us in our past ministry. We must never become satisfied with the status quo and be content with things as they are. And we have no reason to be fearful of the future. God continues to be in control of the universe and He wants his church to succeed even more that we do. We can view the future with optimism knowing that God will bless each of our efforts to serve Him.

Bright days are ahead for the Church of God as we yield ourselves in complete obedience to God and His Word.



Bible study material and tapes are being provided to assist Pastor Ferdinand Sakala in his teaching and preaching ministry.




#### 1994 Christian Worker's Seminar
