Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference

Institutional Long-Range Planning

uring October, about 60 Church of God people met at Atlanta Bible College to work on the Long-range Institutional Study. Eight task forces worked on the issues of Purpose Statement, Atlanta Bible College, Youth, Evangelism, Communication, Publications, Technology, and Finance. It was a great day! There was a good feeling of camaraderie and enthusiasm as we focused on the Lord's work.

Overview of the Long-Range Study

The work of the task forces will be incorporated into the actions and recommendations of the Board of Directors as we bring the long-range study to closure. The study to build a strategic plan for the College and Conference was approved by the delegates in 1994. Since that time we have studied many facets of the College and Conference, as well as garnering the opinions of many Church of God members and pastors.

Sources of information have included:

- A survey sent to Church of God members with an issue of the Progress Journal
- Meetings with people attending Church of God Conferences (Northeast, Southeast, General Conference meetings)
- · A review of the programs and policies of the Bible College
- · A review of the programs and policies of General Conference
- · Interviews with ABC/COG General Conference students, staff, faculty
- A survey sent to all Church of God pastors regarding the needs of the churches
- A review of journals and books regarding Bible colleges and ministry
- Information from the Advisory Committees
- A survey sent to all Church of God pastors regarding the needs of congregations
- A survey sent to all Church of God pastors regarding future directions for the College and Conference

All of the information has been reviewed by the Board of Directors at meetings during the last two years. Responses we've received reflect the diversity of the people, pastors, and churches of the Church of God. Any long-range study, at best, is not an exact science. It isn't as simple as calculating percentages on one or two surveys. We've purposely sought the ideas of many others as we seek to know what God would have us do.

Highlights of data collected

There are several common and consistent responses in all the data. One is that we must continue to share the distinctive Bible truths of the Church of God Abrahamic Faith. Whatever changes we make must continue to evidence our doctrine. Another consistent admonition is that we do all in concert with God's desire for us; that prayer be a constant in all aspects of the longrange study.

It is also evident in all the information we have that change is desired. Change in the College, Conference and churches is needed if we are to better fulfill the Great Commission and lead the lost to Christ.

It may not come as a surprise but one other consistent observation that can be made about all of the responses for the long-range study is that Church of God members are very diverse in the

way they think changes should take place. Although we have the same truths, we are led by prayer, and we want change, we don't really always agree on the changes which need to take place!

Schedule for completion of the study


The study will be finished by the summer of 1998; i.e. all of the decisions about the future plans related to the study should be made. However, the timing for implementing the decisions will vary; some may be implemented in a week, some may have two or three or four-year timelines to accomplish. There are several kinds of actions that are taking place. One is managerial. Some of the comments and input prompt positive changes in managerial decisions such as budgeting process and staff responsibilities and content of specific publications. There are also actions which will require board decisions such as allocation of monies. In addition, any major actions will require delegate vote; some recommendations for delegate action will be acted upon at the July 1998 General Conference meeting in Atlanta (Hope to see YOU there!). Major actions may include such things as revision of the Purpose Statement for the Church of God General Conference or changes in program offerings at the Bible College. The Board of Directors will be finalizing the summer General Conference delegate recommendations at their January and March board meetings. The recommendations will be published in the May/June Progress Journal for your review prior to the summer General Conference.

Specific issues being reviewed

Following is a discussion of several of the prominent issues that have been identified during the study as considerations for change. Some points are made in the form of questions, others in the form of possible recommendations. Keep in mind that these are all under discussion. The October task force groups provided some major directions for a number of these issues. However, *final decisions are still not made*; if you have suggestions about any of them, be certain to let us know.

1. Purpose Statement. The relationship between, as well as the purposes of the Conference and of the College are being reviewed. The task force has recommended that a stronger partnership relationship exist between the College/Conference, state conferences, and churches; that a stronger focus be placed on participation of the churches and regional conferences in General Conference initiatives.

- 2. Atlanta Bible College. The current four-year pastoral leadership program of study and the two-year certificate program are being reviewed. The churches and pastors strongly identified the need for the College to prepare leaders for the Church of God. However, how will those leaders be best prepared? Through lay ministry programs, a seminary, the current four-year program? What modalities would work best? Increase the use of technology for distance learning? Have a series of off-campus classes at churches or state conferences? Or, continue with an on-campus curriculum?
- **3. Publishing.** There are many diverse opinions on publishing for the Church of God. The task force in October identified some major considerations for this area. Some of those included ways to improve current Christian education materials, developing our own writers through workshops, encouraging young people to write, and producing editorial guidelines for our materials. In addition, they have suggested revision of the Restitution Herald, creating a magazine to the unchurched, creating small books on Biblical topics with study guides and quizzes, and providing a clearinghouse for non-Church of God publications. Input from pastors and members has indicated a strong desire for publications which include more information about other churches and people in the Church of God; information which would enable us to more strongly identify with one another.
- 4. Evangelism. What role should the General Conference and College play in evangelism? Preparation of leaders, identifying strategies for the local church? Who should stimulate and facilitate church planting? What services and resources should the College and/or Conference provide which would best serve the evangelism needs of

- the churches, members and conferences? What evangelism experiences can be provided for youth? Responses on the surveys reflect *much diversity* within the Church of God as to the role of the College, the Conference, the pastors, the regional and state conferences and the congregations. The task force recommended a strong partnership between the Conference and the local church to provide the motivation and tools to reach the lost for Christ.
- 5. Technology. There is common agreement that we need to increase the efficient and creative use of technology in the work of the Church of God. The task force strongly recommended updating the computers used on campus by staff and students. Students registered at Clayton State are required to have lap top computers. The use of technology should be incorporated in order to enhance the academic program as well as increase communication between Church of God members, pastors, and churches. The technology task force is recommending that every church/pastor be connected to the Internet within the next three years.
- **6. Communication, Marketing, Public Relations, Image.** In the interest of reaching and sharing our truths with the lost, how do we best present a positive, corporate image for the Church of God? How can the Conference and College enhance and facilitate positive communications and public relations within and outside of the Church of God? The task force has made recommendations in the areas of image; sensitivity to current trends and needs of the members as well as the lost; developing a Church of God logo; preparing students to be contributors to Conference public relations; and insuring the effective reporting and sharing of all information from the Conference.
- 7. Youth. Responding to the needs of the youth is one of the biggest areas of common agreement for change. Several recommendations that have been made include sponsorship of a National Day of Prayer for youth and youth ministry (February 15, 1998); expanding the current RYOT program; providing regional youth leader training; sponsoring youth mission trips; and developing and improving youth publications.
- **8. Leadership.** Strategies are needed to develop leadership within the Church of God. The Bible College

- currently provides a program for pastoral ministry. Programs and resources need to be provided for Christian Education, church leaders, writers, and faculty and administrators for the College and Conference. How will we facilitate the development of future leaders for the Church of God?
- **9. Finance.** Finance, of course, overlays all of the programs we decide to develop. The finance task force recommended that the Board strive to share complete financial information with the members in a user-friendly way. They also suggested that financial stewardship and education be emphasized among church members and that appeals for contributions to the Conference go through the local church.

Conclusions

The questions and discussion noted above are some examples of the input we've received from many of you and of the issues the Board is studying to make recommendations for the future of the Church of God. The process has been enlightening and exciting for many of us as we seek the Lord's will for how we should proceed as a College and a Conference. The diversity of the concerns shown by members of the Church of God contribute to the challenge of coming to decisions that will not only please God but will bring strength and cohesiveness to the body. The diversity, if we will tolerate it, can actually bring strength in that we can reach so many more and different people and bring them to know Christ. Pray for all of those involved in the decision making — the Board, the pastors, the churches, the delegates at this next summer's conference. If you have suggestions, let us know those now.

Church Builders Appeal #79

The Board of Directors has designated the Gatesville, Texas Church of God as the recipient of Church Builders Appeal #79. The church is currently constructing a new fellowship/dining area, kitchen, and five classrooms. The church presently has two buildings: a brick sanctuary building which includes three classrooms as well as a large fover; and a fellowship building which includes a study, a classroom area, and a kitchen. The second building is old and in poor condition. It will be torn down after the new building is completed. The building under construction will be phase one of a project that will eventually include a new sanctuary. This project will cost approximately \$95,000. The membership of the Church of God is invited to participate in this appeal to assist the Gatesville congregation.

A professional studies program in Christian ministry which includes sixty-one hours of Bible, forty-six hours of ministry, and ninety-one hours of general education. This program leads to a Bachelor of Theology degree.

Admission of Churches to the General Conference

ne of the duties of the Board of Directors, according to the Constitution (By-Laws, Article II, Section 6 (G)), is to take action regarding the admission of churches to the Church of God General Conference.

According to the constitution, Article II, Section 2, "a member church is a Church of God which adheres to the statement of faith contained in this document, and which has on record at headquarters a statement of affiliation with the General Conference."

The Church of God General Conference is an association of churches made up of congregations that share a common understanding of Bible truths that have formed the basis of our organization since its creation in 1921. It has been the practice of the Board to welcome into membership, congregations that wish to affiliate who are in agreement with the statement of faith as printed in the constitution. By accepting churches into the Conference, the Board is not endorsing a church's form of government, style of worship, or other practices or beliefs that are not specifically addressed in the statement of faith adopted by our delegates. The Board of Directors does not have constitutional authority to intervene in the internal affairs of individual congregations. Churches in our Conference are independently governed by members and leaders of the individual churches. The General Conference is a service organization that seeks to assist Church of God members, churches, and conferences to perform their commission.

Over the past two and a half years, several churches have applied for membership in the General Conference which were formed as a result of conflict within a "mother church" that belongs to the Conference. The Board accepted these churches into membership in the General Conference because they complied with the constitutional requirements cited above.

However, the Board's action should not be construed to indicate that the Board endorses or condones division and church conflict. The Board is deeply concerned about church divisions. Several notable scripture passages suggest the importance of unity within the church (1 Corinthians 12, Psalm 133:1, etc.). The Board of Directors is very dedicated to the unity of the members in each local church. This commitment to unity is widespread throughout our conference, and therefore, many years ago, a Board of Counseling and Arbitration (now Conciliation Board) was organized to

provide assistance to churches facing conflict. The Board continues to encourage the use of this board at an early stage when conflict arises. Often, relatively minor problems can escalate into major divisions if they are not addressed early.

In examining church conflicts, it seems apparent that there are usually faults on both sides of the dispute. Rarely is one side in a dispute 100% correct in their view and their handling of the situation and the other side 100% wrong. Other than providing assistance through the Conciliation Board, the Board of Directors does not have the resources nor the ability to investigate each conflict completely and decide who is at fault and who is not. The Board feels that the resources of the General Conference should more appropriately be spent in trying to resolve disputes and bringing about unity, rather than carrying on investigations and assigning fault.

Recently, the Board of Directors adopted a resolution which it is hoped will be a positive step in the process of admitting churches as follows: "Any church application for membership must be approved by a state or district conference of the Church of God, where one exists, before being considered for membership into the General Conference." The Board recognizes the vital ministry carried on by our state/district conferences. They were the backbone of the Church of God even before the General Conference was organized. The Board continues to believe that there is value in having churches in a state or district work together to promote the well-being of the churches within the Conference and to be involved in the process of starting new churches. State conferences and officers often are in a better position to know details about a new church than is the General Conference Board. Because they are closer to the situation, they are more likely to know the personnel involved and the motives behind starting a church. Therefore, the state conference is in a better position to evaluate and make a decision on applications for membership.

Local churches and the state/district conference, represented by their delegates and pastor delegates, are the ultimate authority in the General Conference. The Board of Directors is elected by the membership and is charged with carrying out the purposes for which the College/Conference was organized. The Board always welcomes input from members and churches as it carries on its designated duties.

Institutional Long-Range Planning

uring October, about 60 Church of God people met at Atlanta Bible College to work on the Long-range Institutional Study. Eight task forces worked on the issues of Purpose Statement, Atlanta Bible College, Youth, Evangelism, Communication, Publications, Technology, and Finance. It was a great day! There was a good feeling of camaraderie and enthusiasm as we focused on the Lord's work.

Overview of the Long-Range Study

The work of the task forces will be incorporated into the actions and recommendations of the Board of Directors as we bring the long-range study to closure. The study to build a strategic plan for the College and Conference was approved by the delegates in 1994. Since that time we have studied many facets of the College and Conference, as well as garnering the opinions of many Church of God members and pastors.

Sources of information have included:

- A survey sent to Church of God members with an issue of the *Progress Journal*
- Meetings with people attending Church of God Conferences (Northeast, Southeast, General Conference meetings)
- A review of the programs and policies of the Bible College
- · A review of the programs and policies of General Conference
- Interviews with ABC/COG General Conference students, staff, faculty
- A survey sent to all Church of God pastors regarding the needs of the churches
- A review of journals and books regarding Bible colleges and ministry
- Information from the Advisory Committees
- A survey sent to all Church of God pastors regarding the needs of congregations
- A survey sent to all Church of God pastors regarding future directions for the College and Conference

All of the information has been reviewed by the Board of Directors at meetings during the last two years. Responses we've received reflect the diversity of the people, pastors, and churches of the Church of God. Any long-range study, at best, is not an exact science. It isn't as simple as calculating percentages on one or two surveys. We've purposely sought the ideas of many others as we seek to know what God would have us do.

Highlights of data collected

There are several common and consistent responses in all the data. One is that we must continue to share the distinctive Bible truths of the Church of God Abrahamic Faith. Whatever changes we make must continue to evidence our doctrine. Another consistent admonition is that we do all in concert with God's desire for us; that prayer be a constant in all aspects of the longrange study.

It is also evident in all the information we have that change is desired. Change in the College, Conference and churches is needed if we are to better fulfill the Great Commission and lead the lost to Christ.

It may not come as a surprise but one other consistent observation that can be made about all of the responses for the long-range study is that Church of God members are very diverse in the

way they think changes should take place. Although we have the same truths, we are led by prayer, and we want change, we don't really always agree on the changes which need to take place!

Schedule for completion of the study

The study will be finished by the summer of 1998; i.e. all of the decisions about the future plans related to the study should be made. However, the timing for implementing the decisions will vary; some may be implemented in a week, some may have two or three or four-year timelines to accomplish. There are several kinds of actions that are taking place. One is managerial. Some of the comments and input prompt positive changes in managerial decisions such as budgeting process and staff responsibilities and content of specific publications. There are also actions which will require board decisions such as allocation of monies. In addition, any major actions will require delegate vote; some recommendations for delegate action will be acted upon at the July 1998 General Conference meeting in Atlanta (Hope to see YOU there!). Major actions may include such things as revision of the Purpose Statement for the Church of God General Conference or changes in program offerings at the Bible College. The Board of Directors will be finalizing the summer General Conference delegate recommendations at their January and March board meetings. The recommendations will be published in the May/June Progress Journal for your review prior to the summer General Conference.

Specific issues being reviewed

Following is a discussion of several of the prominent issues that have been identified during the study as considerations for change. Some points are made in the form of questions, others in the form of possible recommendations. Keep in mind that these are all under discussion. The October task force groups provided some major directions for a number of these issues. However, *final decisions are still not made*; if you have suggestions about any of them, be certain to let us know.

1. Purpose Statement. The relationship between, as well as the purposes of the Conference and of the College are being reviewed. The task force has recommended that a stronger partnership relationship exist between the College/Conference, state conferences, and churches; that a stronger focus be placed on participation of the churches and regional conferences in General Conference initiatives.

- 2. Atlanta Bible College. The current four-year pastoral leadership program of study and the two-year certificate program are being reviewed. The churches and pastors strongly identified the need for the College to prepare leaders for the Church of God. However, how will those leaders be best prepared? Through lay ministry programs, a seminary, the current four-year program? What modalities would work best? Increase the use of technology for distance learning? Have a series of off-campus classes at churches or state conferences? Or, continue with an on-campus curriculum?
- **3. Publishing.** There are many diverse opinions on publishing for the Church of God. The task force in October identified some major considerations for this area. Some of those included ways to improve current Christian education materials, developing our own writers through workshops, encouraging young people to write, and producing editorial guidelines for our materials. In addition, they have suggested revision of the Restitution Herald, creating a magazine to the unchurched, creating small books on Biblical topics with study guides and quizzes, and providing a clearinghouse for non-Church of God publications. Input from pastors and members has indicated a strong desire for publications which include more information about other churches and people in the Church of God; information which would enable us to more strongly identify with one another.
- **4. Evangelism.** What role should the General Conference and College play in evangelism? Preparation of leaders, identifying strategies for the local church? Who should stimulate and facilitate church planting? What services and resources should the College and/or Conference provide which would best serve the evangelism needs of

- the churches, members and conferences? What evangelism experiences can be provided for youth? Responses on the surveys reflect *much diversity* within the Church of God as to the role of the College, the Conference, the pastors, the regional and state conferences and the congregations. The task force recommended a strong partnership between the Conference and the local church to provide the motivation and tools to reach the lost for Christ.
- 5. Technology. There is common agreement that we need to increase the efficient and creative use of technology in the work of the Church of God. The task force strongly recommended updating the computers used on campus by staff and students. Students registered at Clayton State are required to have lap top computers. The use of technology should be incorporated in order to enhance the academic program as well as increase communication between Church of God members, pastors, and churches. The technology task force is recommending that every church/pastor be connected to the Internet within the next three years.
- **6. Communication, Marketing, Public Relations, Image.** In the interest of reaching and sharing our truths with the lost, how do we best present a positive, corporate image for the Church of God? How can the Conference and College enhance and facilitate positive communications and public relations within and outside of the Church of God? The task force has made recommendations in the areas of image; sensitivity to current trends and needs of the members as well as the lost; developing a Church of God logo; preparing students to be contributors to Conference public relations; and insuring the effective reporting and sharing of all information from the Conference.
- 7. Youth. Responding to the needs of the youth is one of the biggest areas of common agreement for change. Several recommendations that have been made include sponsorship of a National Day of Prayer for youth and youth ministry (February 15, 1998); expanding the current RYOT program; providing regional youth leader training; sponsoring youth mission trips; and developing and improving youth publications.
- **8. Leadership.** Strategies are needed to develop leadership within the Church of God. The Bible College

- currently provides a program for pastoral ministry. Programs and resources need to be provided for Christian Education, church leaders, writers, and faculty and administrators for the College and Conference. How will we facilitate the development of future leaders for the Church of God?
- **9. Finance.** Finance, of course, overlays all of the programs we decide to develop. The finance task force recommended that the Board strive to share complete financial information with the members in a user-friendly way. They also suggested that financial stewardship and education be emphasized among church members and that appeals for contributions to the Conference go through the local church.

Conclusions

The questions and discussion noted above are some examples of the input we've received from many of you and of the issues the Board is studying to make recommendations for the future of the Church of God. The process has been enlightening and exciting for many of us as we seek the Lord's will for how we should proceed as a College and a Conference. The diversity of the concerns shown by members of the Church of God contribute to the challenge of coming to decisions that will not only please God but will bring strength and cohesiveness to the body. The diversity, if we will tolerate it, can actually bring strength in that we can reach so many more and different people and bring them to know Christ. Pray for all of those involved in the decision making — the Board, the pastors, the churches, the delegates at this next summer's conference. If you have suggestions, let us know those now.






How Each Contribution Dollar Is Used

Delegates to the annual conference will be voting on nine recommendations which have emerged from a three-year long-range institutional study. Two of the nine recommendations are constitutional amendments. According to the constitution members must be notified of proposed amendments or revisions in at least three consecutive issues of *The Restitution Herald* and/or Progress Journal, the first appearance to be at least thirty days prior to the convening of the conference at which they are to be considered.

Members are encouraged to review these two proposed amendments which consist of a change to the preamble and the purpose statement of our organization. Questions may be addressed to any member of the Board of Directors or the President. Members should express their opinions on these changes to delegates selected by their church.

Changes to the constitution require a 2/3 majority vote of delegates present at the General Conference meeting.

Other recommendations to be voted upon by the delegates will be published in the May Progress Journal (on May 7, the May Progress Journal containing all of the recommendations and reports to be considered at the General Conference will be available on our Internet website at: www.abc-coggc.org). A third notice of these constitutional amendments will be published in June.

RECOMMENDATION 1: Revise the Statement of Purpose of the Church of God General Conference.

Current By-Laws statement: The purpose of the College/Conference is to assist Church of God members, churches, and conferences to perform their commission, which is to make disciples by bringing the lost to Jesus Christ, and by leading the believer to maturity by providing leadership, resources, and services.

Proposed: The Church of God General Conference, through partnership with conferences and local Churches of God, assists them and their members in the performance of their commission to make disciples. The Conference serves as an advocate of the Church of God to the world.

(There is no recommendation for change in the <u>Purpose of the Atlanta Bible College</u> at this time — Article I, Section 2.)

RATIONALE: The switch to a stronger partnership between the Conference, College, state/district conferences and local churches is strongly supported. The organization exists to be in partnership so that it can be a vehicle of assistance as churches perform their commission of making disciples. It also clarifies and emphasizes the responsibility of the Conference to represent the organization and be an advocate to the world; the Conference responds to and reaches out to others who request information about our churches and our doctrine; it represents our association of churches to all who inquire. The Conference and College also take the initiative to make the Church of God more visible to the world, i.e. to the scholarly community through the Theological Conference and publications.

RECOMMENDATION 2: Revise the Preamble to the Constitution.

Current preamble: The Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference is a not for profit organization. Delegates and interested members of the Church of God will meet at a designated place and time to confer in all matters pertaining to the spiritual life and business of the churches.

Proposed: The Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference is an association of churches united by a common understanding of Scripture, a commitment to ministry, and a desire to work together to teach and preach the good news of the Kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, leading to the conversion of the lost and the nurture of all believers. It is a not-for-profit organization. Delegates and interested members of the Church of God will meet at a designated place and time to confer in all matters pertaining to the spiritual life and business of the churches.

RATIONALE: The proposed preamble further clarifies our organization as an association of churches and the factors that unite us. It emphasizes our historical belief that the Good News includes teachings on the Kingdom of God and Jesus Christ based on Acts 8:12.

Tara Doerr has been employed as Secretary to the President and Denise Enyart is serving as Secretary to the Vice President.








Juan Baixeras, a commerical airline pilot from Miami, Florida, who spoke on "The Indwelling of the Spirit."



ANNUAL REPORT OF ATLANTA BIBLE COLLEGE/ CHURCH OF GOD GENERAL CONFERENCE

Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference was originally organized in 1921 as an association of churches committed to the proclamation of the gospel of the Kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ.

Today the Church of God General Conference directly serves approximately 5,000 baptized members, 84 member churches, 13 non-member churches, 12 state/district conferences, and the public at large.

"Delegates and interested members of the Church of God meet annually in July or August to confer in all matters pertaining to the spiritual life and business of the churches" (Preamble). "Each member church of 15 or more members, which has held at least six preaching services during the year, shall be entitled to one delegate for each fifty of its active members or fraction thereof" (Article II, Section 1).

"A member church is a Church of God which adheres to the Statement of Faith contained in (the Constitution), and which has on record at the General Conference office, a statement of affiliation with the General Conference" (Article II, Section 2).

This report summarizes the work of our Association of Churches for the benefit of members. It also serves as background information for delegates who will meet at the annual summer Conference, July 3 to 7 at the Renaissance Atlanta Hotel - Concourse, Atlanta, Georgia.

In reviewing the work of the past twelve months, the College/Conference has served you, our constituency, in the following ways:

COLLEGIATE SERVICES

Atlanta Bible College remains dedicated to preparing lay and professional Christian workers primarily for our churches. We also welcome students from any church background who wish to take classes.

The program of Atlanta Bible College consists of Bible / Theology and Ministry courses. Students receive their general education courses at Clayton College and State University located adjacent to our campus.

During the past year, Anthony Buzzard, Joe Martin, and Kent Ross were the primary instructors and David Krogh was a part-time instructor.

Three seniors graduated at the end of the 1996-97 school year: Mark Cain, John Nelson, and Tim Spickler. Mark is pursuing additional education; John is employed as a part-time youth pastor at Blessed Hope Bible Church, Rockford, IL; and Tim is currently serving as pastor of Family Bible Fellowship, Rockford, IL.

Enrollment at the College this year was slightly higher than last year. This year, a total of 23 students have been enrolled for one or more classes. Based on full-time equivalency (FTE — the total number of credit hours divided by a normal full-time course load of 15 credit hours), the students were enrolled at ABC 10.27 FTE and 3.93 FTE at Clayton College. The number of high school graduating seniors in the Church of God continues to decline. As recently as twenty years ago, there were nearly 200 young people graduating from high school each year. We currently have 58 names in our database of high school graduating seniors, a 71% decline. Recruitment of students who are interested in preparing for lay or professional ministry is an ongoing project. Zuaquis Alford, Andy Cisneros, and Kirk Ross have directed recruitment efforts this year.

The annual College Invitational Conference to which prospective students are invited was held in March with 49 students and 8 sponsors on campus. They participated in special presentations and tours, served in evangelism outreach projects, and were involved in other programming.

Again this year, the school year began with a two-day retreat at a beautiful conference center west of Atlanta. Pastor Alan and Susan Cain from the Bethel, South Carolina Church of God were guest leaders of the retreat. Other sessions were led by staff members. A solid spiritual foundation was laid for the school year.

An integral part of life at Atlanta Bible College is the Christian Service Program. Students participate in a weekly chapel service and discipling group, attend a local Church of God for worship and Bible study, and participate in practical Christian ministry. Students are involved in teaching and leading children and youth classes, preparing and leading worship services, serving

in evangelism projects, building houses with Habitat for Humanity, feeding the homeless, visiting nursing homes and prisons, and counseling. Our students have also been involved with gospel teams which have traveled to churches for weekend services. Other students have participated in the Summer Ministries Program in churches around the country.

Joe Martin continued in his doctoral degree program from Columbia Theological Seminary. He has started work on his dissertation.

During this school year, Sarah Buzzard served as Librarian; Kirk Ross as Apartment Director; Gary Burnham as Controller; Denise Enyart as Secretary to Vice President Kent Ross; Jennifer Andrews as Secretary to the President; and Merry Peterson as Receptionist and Secretary. The maintenance staff employees were Glyn Craig, Brian Bormes, and Tracy Swartz.

The College sponsored a trip to the Holy Land on February 10 to 21. Instructor Anthony Buzzard led a group of eight travelers. Another trip is scheduled for June, 1999.

Jeff Osborn served as Student Government President. Students were involved in an activities committee which sponsored social events.

In cooperation with the Ministerial Association, pastors have been invited to serve as campus chaplains for a week at a time. The Ministerial Association helps to fund this program. Pastor David Cheatwood of the Blessed Hope Bible Church in Rockford, IL was on Campus in October.

In January, Judy Myers representing the Lord's Harvest International Board was on campus to talk to students about missionary careers.

During the past year, individuals, churches, and groups have provided financial assistance to ABC students. We appreciate the generous support which enables the tuition at ABC to be kept reasonably low.

PASTOR/CHURCH SERVICES

The Conference provides services to strengthen and assist local congregations and to facilitate the starting of new churches.

Missions

Foreign mission outreach efforts in the Church of God predate the organizing of our General Conference in 1921. Through much trial and error over the past 85 years, many important lessons have been learned in how to present the gospel in other cultures. Through the work of the Lord's Harvest International Mission Agency, policies have been developed which will assist us to channel our resources into effective mission projects.

We continue to work in two types of mission projects: Mission Fields — these are fields where a Church of God trained missionary will go to establish a work. The goal will be for the missionary to establish the work and reach lost individuals who will be nurtured and given responsibilities for carrying on the work. These missionaries will secure prayer and financial support from their home church and conference, from individuals, and from other church groups. Funds will be channeled through the Conference for recordkeeping purposes and to facilitate the disbursement of funds.

Other projects will be called teaching fields. These are countries where churches, workers, and congregations have already been established. Short-term mission teams will travel to these fields to help native workers understand the Scriptures better and be more effective in ministry.

There continues to be a need for individuals to hear God's call to a foreign field and to prepare for cross-cultural ministry. Assistance is currently being given to Tracy Savage who is working in Russia. Contact is being maintained with teaching fields in Malawi, Mexico, India, Peru, and the Philippines.

Youth

1998 is the 100th anniversary of the first organized youth ministries in the Church of God. The youth of Illinois organized in Lanark in 1898. In August 1898 the Iowa youth organized in Marshalltown. These early groups called themselves Bereans (Acts 17:11). Though we have a wonderful heritage of youth work, we realize that the past is only the foundation upon which we build for the future.

The purpose of our youth organization is to "work together to bring youth into discipleship by: advocating excellence in youth ministry, modeling discipleship and providing opportunities for expression of their faith and love."

RYOT (Radical Youth Overcoming Today) which is held each summer is a special event to inspire and encourage our young people. It also provides an opportunity for youth workers to receive additional training for their work with young people during the year.

Crossroads Youth Ministry is an organization created by Church of God youth leaders to serve youth workers. A quarterly publication called the "Atlas" is available which contains programming ideas, planning guides, product reviews, and personal devotional tools for youth workers. During the past year, the Board of Directors offered to provide the Atlas free to Church of God youth groups. For groups already subscribing to the Atlas, the General Conference will extend their subscription by one year.

The General Conference is committed to helping to strengthen youth ministry in the Church of God. Funds are provided as a subsidy for the summer RYOT. Consideration is also being given to hiring a full-time Youth Coordinator who would help to strengthen local youth programs. Resumes are being received from individuals who are interested in serving in this position.

The present Youth Coordinator position is a very limited part-time position. Pastor Jim Graham serves in this position. He is assisted by a Youth Advisory Committee consisting of Pastor Dale Bliss, Pastor Timothy Eldred and Mr. Joe James.

Christian Education

The Christian Education Advisory Committee has recommended the publication of an adult elective for use in Sunday School classes or home Bible studies. A royalty agreement has been signed with Cook Communications Ministries to revise and edit a Christian lifestyle series of lessons. Plans are being made to have this material available by the summer of 1998.

A revision is currently under way of our doctrinal distinctive series of lessons which will begin in December, 1998.

Gayle Guthrie serves as the Coordinator of the Christian Education Advisory Committee. Carol Ring, Christy Ross, and Pastor Billie Kennedy serve on the committee.

Media

The Restitution Herald is in its 87th year of publication. Pastor Jeff Fletcher is the editor. Current circulation is about 780.

During the past year, the Truth Seekers Sunday School Curriculum was revised and the age groupings were changed. The Early Elementary is for Kindergarten and Grade 1; Elementary for grades 2 and 3; Upper Elementary for grades 4 and 5; Middle School for grades 6 to 8; High School for grades 9 to 12; Adult for college age and adults. A royalty lease agreement between Cook Communications Ministries and Church of God General Conference enables us to revise the Cook publications to meet the needs of the Church of God. The Church of God editors are: Early Elementary — Irene Sorenson; Elementary and Upper Elementary — Paula Kirkpatrick; Middle School — Warren Sorenson; High School — Terri Moore; and Adult — Russell and Joyce Magaw.

Daniel Smead is the Technical Director of Publishing and Sarah Buzzard is Proofreader.

During 1997, over 250 15-minute programs were prepared by Anthony Buzzard for the "Focus on the Kingdom" radio program. (See "Special Reports" section for more information.)

The *Journal from the Radical Reformation* continues to be published four times each year. It is distributed to seminary libraries as well as to other interested subscribers.

Kent Ross and Anthony Buzzard serve as senior editors with Jeff Fletcher and Scott Deane as associate editors.

Other Services

Loan Funds — The Church of God General Conference has two loan funds available to churches that are members of the Church of God General Conference. The Hearp-DeLap loan fund was established by Jack and Louise Hearp many years ago in memory of their parents. The Church of God Investment Fund was established by action of the delegates in 1982. Churches that have received Church Builders appeals and that cease operations are required to return Church Builder funds to the Investment Fund. This fund has also grown through interest earnings. Other College/Conference restricted funds are also available to be borrowed. At the present time, nine churches have borrowed a little over \$400,000 for construction projects.

Church Development Aid — The purpose of the Church Development Assistance Program is to provide financial assistance, consultation, and training where needed to churches that are unable to support a full-time ministry, and churches which are able to financially expand their staff and ministry to utilize their growth potential. It is the intention that the recipient church grow and become self-supporting. The following churches have received aid during 1997-1998: Beloit New Life, WI; Cornerstone, GA; Blessed Hope, Rockford, IL; North Kent, MI; Family Bible, IL; and Winnebago New Life, IL. The aid begins at \$600 per month and declines over six years.

Church Planting Aid — The purpose of the Church Planting Aid Fund is to provide financial assistance to start new churches. It is the intention that the recipient church have a commitment to outreach and growth, and become self-supporting. Financial aid begins at \$400 per month and declines over a four-year time period. The following churches received assistance during 1997-98: New Friends, GA; Beloit New Life, WI; Cornerstone, GA; and Winnebago New Life, IL.

Church Builders' League — The Church Builders' League was organized in 1958 to provide assistance to new and existing churches, and to Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference, in the mission of making disciples by bringing the lost to Jesus Christ. Appeals may be issued for start-up and operating expenses for new churches, groups buying or constructing church buildings that have not owned a building previously, groups that are meeting in a building of their own that is not specifically suitable for worshipping, groups relocating to a more desirable site, groups purchasing land for a new building and groups which have outgrown their present facilities and are enlarging, buying, rebuilding,

or exchanging. In the event that no group request is approved for Church Builders' League assistance, the appeal will be used for capital expenditures for Atlanta Bible College/General Conference, or the appeal will be issued on behalf of the Church of God Investment Fund or one of the College/Conference endowment funds designated by the Board.

Appeal number 78 issued in the spring of 1997 provided support to start the Winnebago New Life, IL Church. Appeal number 79 issued in the fall of 1997 went to the Gatesville, TX Church for the construction of a fellowship/dining area, kitchen, and five classrooms. The number of individuals, churches, and groups contributing to each appeal has declined to under 400. At one time, approximately 1000 people were regularly giving to this valuable program. Interested individuals, families or groups are invited to join the League.

Summer Ministries — The Summer Ministries program provides assistance to local churches and state conferences for conducting Bible Schools, assisting with classes, and providing help with evangelistic calling and outreach. The program also provides opportunities for young people to gain experience in ministry.

During the summer of 1997, teams participated in eleven activities: Vacation Bible Schools at New Friends, GA; Family Bible Fellowship, Rockford, IL; Blanchard, MI; Farmington, MO; Brush Creek, OH; Columbia Station, OH; Cool Spring, VA; Fort Valley, VA; and Hope Second Advent Church in Monroe, NC. Teams also helped with camps in Minnesota and Washington.

Lending Library — A large collection of video and audio tapes and other resources are available without charge to churches and individuals. A catalog of all materials is available from the College library.

Miscellaneous Services — The General Conference operates the Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association and provides assistance to churches through the Christian Conciliation Board. The Ministerial Recognition Board licenses pastors. Additional information on these services is provided under "Special Reports" in this issue of the JOURNAL.

BUSINESS AND FINANCE

The business office under the direction of Gary Burnham, Controller, handles all accounting and financial records, purchases, sales, student housing, rental property, computer operations, maintenance, and the College bookstore. Carrie Krogh served as assistant to the Controller, and supervisor of the mailing department. Aaron Wells has assisted our computer operations by modem from his location in Illinois.

Contributions

Sixty-two of the 86 churches that are members of the General Conference contributed to the general operations Goal for Giving in 1997. Three churches which are not members of the Conference also contributed. Contributions from churches provide 25% of the income to support Atlanta Bible College and the Church of God General Conference. We appreciate the faithfulness of each church that contributes a portion of their income to support the work here. Individuals and families contribute 26% of the income for our organization. We are grateful for the 517 individuals and families who contributed during 1997. We are also thankful for the state conferences and groups that contributed 6% of our income.

At this point in the fiscal year, contributions to the Goal for Giving are approximately 8% less than last year at this time.

Sale of Properties

The Golden Rule Administration Building in Oregon, Illinois, the only remaining unsold property of the Illinois campus, was sold on July 15. In November, a 5.4-acre site in Colorado Springs was sold. Currently, the only properties owned by the College/Conference are the 12 1/2 acre campus and 4 duplex properties in Morrow, Georgia.

Indebtedness

Relocation Loans — approximately \$230,000 of relocation loans will be repaid as follows: \$170,000 from a contract for deed on the sale of the women's dormitory in Illinois (regular payments of interest and principal are being paid on the contract); and the balance from the Fund the Dream Campaign. Approximately \$60,000 in unpaid commitments remains to be received from this campaign. We are grateful to the 136 individuals, families, and groups that are participating in the Fund the Dream Campaign.

Operating Loans — All operating loans that had accumulated over the past 15 years have been paid in full from the sale of the Colorado Springs property, and a small portion of a trust that was received in August 1997.

Duplex Loans — The only indebtedness for property is secured by four duplexes on Trammell Road across from the campus. These properties were purchased for \$308,749. Rents are being used to cover expenses and to repay the loans that were taken out for the purchase. There is a current balance of \$234,000 owed on these properties.

Restricted Funds

Restricted funds are contributions given by donors which are earmarked for specific projects or activities. In some cases the donor specifies that the principal is to be preserved and only the interest earnings are to be used.

The larger restricted funds are as follows:

Atlanta Bible College Development Foundation — \$1,181,052 — Only the interest earnings may be used to assist Atlanta Bible College. (See "Special Reports" for information on how these funds are used.)

Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association — \$941,012 — earmarked for retirement benefits for Church of God pastors and College/Conference staff. (See "Special Reports" for additional information.)

Atlanta Bible College Scholarship Funds — \$310,328 — funds given in memory of various individuals to be used for scholarships for Atlanta Bible College students.

Elton Fund — \$113,860 — designated to help provide scholarships for Atlanta Bible College interns.

Mission Endowment Fund — \$211,233 — designated by the donor to be used to fund special mission trips and projects.

Investment Fund — \$78,076 — for loans to churches. (See "Special Reports" for additional information.)

Canadian Development Fund — \$79,000 — from the sale of property in Digby, Nova Scotia to be used for church work in Canada.

Hearp/DeLap Loan Fund — \$62,700 — for loans to churches.

Church Planting Fund — \$16,594 — for assistance in church planting projects.

Annuity Fund — \$201,370 — income is used to pay interest to annuitants until their death at which time the funds are released to be used at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Savage Endowment Fund — \$20,000 — interest earnings to be used to assist Atlanta Bible College.

Hanson Trust Fund — \$40,000 — income to be used for scholarships, missions, Conference ministries, Atlanta Bible College, etc.

In addition, there are a multitude of small funds for the Russia mission work, other mission fields, ministers' loan fund, publishing reserve fund, vehicle replacement fund, radio ministry fund, furniture and equipment fund, Christian Workers' Seminar Scholarship Fund, RYOT Scholarship Fund, etc.

The assets of restricted accounts continue to grow through the generosity of donors and investment income. These monies fund important programs and activities of the College/Conference.

CONCLUSION

During the past three years, an institutional longrange planning study has been under way under the direction of Kent Ross and Dr. Donna Deane. Last October task forces met in Atlanta to discuss possible recommendations for the future. Many excellent ideas were proposed. Some have already been implemented by staff at the direction of the Board of Directors. Others are requiring additional study and research. Some will be acted upon by delegates at the summer Conference.

As we look to the future, we do so with an attitude of optimism and faith based upon our confidence in our God who is able to do more than we ask for (Eph. 3:20). We continue to believe that the best days of the Church of God are in the future. Though we face many challenges, our confidence is not in our abilities or work, but in the God whom we serve. Wise Solomon said "whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Ecc. 9:10). Working in partnership with each of you, as a board and staff, we intend to use every available resource and all of our energy to do whatever will advance the cause of the Kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ.

SPECIAL REPORTS

Atlanta Bible College Development Foundation

The Development Foundation was organized in 1982 by action of the delegates at the summer Conference. The original goal was to raise one million dollars for the Endowment Fund. Currently the Foundation has a fund balance of \$1,181,053.00. During the 1997-98 school year the Foundation has funded the following programs:

\$35,000.00 - basic grants to students \$4,000.00 - purchase of equipment and library books \$3,000.00 - library periodicals

\$5,000.00 - Holy Land grants

\$5,000.00 - Presidential Scholarships awarded as incentives for new students

\$3,000.00 - staff training

\$4,000.00 - recruitment

\$2,000.00 - grants for students to General Conference and/or Christian Workers' Seminar

\$61,000.00 - Total disbursed to the College

In addition, \$7,000.00 in interest earnings is being added to the Foundation principal and \$2,000.00 covers the cost of the annual audit.

For the 1998-99 school year the Trustees have approved the use of \$5,000.00 as grants toward laptop computers which are required by Clayton College. For \$200.00 per quarter, ABC students enrolled at Clayton College will receive a laptop computer, Internet access, training in the use of the computer, and a 24-hour help line. Grants will be available to ABC students at the beginning of each quarter. Students not receiving a GPA of "C" or better in Clayton courses during any quarter will not be eligible for a computer grant in the following quarter. These computers will be a help to students doing their work not only at Clayton College but also at Atlanta Bible College.

The Trustees of the Foundation are: Pastor Billie Kennedy, President; Mr. Charles Bottolfs, Vice President; Dr. William Lawrence, Secretary; Mr. Robert Huddlestun, Treasurer; and Directors Mr. Lynn Berry, Pastor David Cheatwood, Pastor Scott Deane, Mr. Jim Hamilton, Mr. Rob Helenburg, Mr. Joe James, Mr. Robert Petry, Pastor Dale Swartz, and Mrs. Terri Tschaenn.

Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association

This Association exists for the benefit of Church of God pastors and employees of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference and their families. During the past year, total assets in the Association increased by over 17%. Retirement benefits are being distributed to five pastors and eight spouses. Lump sum settlements have been disbursed to 28 pastors.

The Association currently consists of 36 active members and 2 pastors who are currently non-participating members. There are 40 churches and 6 conferences that are active members.

The Association is administered by Trustees Gary Burnham, Bill Gaspar, and David Krogh.

Today's Good News

This past year has been a year of significant improvements for the Today's Good News television ministry, improvements which have allowed us to grow in our potential effectiveness and outreach.

During the year we were able to purchase a used studio camera, which has allowed us to improve our overall image. We were also able to purchase a signal converter, which allows us to convert computer graphics for use directly in our productions. This device, along with a

donated computer, allows us to import an unlimited variety of fonts, backgrounds, pictures, etc.

Another milestone for our work was the development of a website. Justin Taylor devoted many hours to this work and was able to develop a very impressive site at no cost to us. If you haven't visited our website, please do so. Our address is http://www.angelfire.com/biz/tgnews.

Programming content for our programs during this past year consisted of Sunday messages by Pastor Taylor and numerous guest speakers including Anthony Buzzard. Programs were shot in our facilities in Lafayette, Indiana which are equipped with studio lighting. They were done utilizing a three-camera shoot and post-production editing.

One major frustration that I experience in this work is the lack of the use of these resources by the Church of God. Opportunities exist in nearly every community for free or low-cost cablecasting and no churches are availing themselves of these opportunities. With our large stock of U-Matic tapes, programs can be loaned for use at no cost. The opportunity also exists for churches and/or pastors to produce programs from our Lafayette facility. I invite pastors to visit us for the purpose of videotaping messages for cablecast. I also invite those interested to contact us so that we can develop short church commercials or promotionals.

If you haven't seen work that we have recently produced I urge you to contact us for a demo tape. I also invite suggestions as to how we can better promote and utilize this vital tool that the Lord has entrusted us with.

Our special thanks to all who have worked with and supported Today's Good News during the past year: volunteer staff workers — Andy VanBuren, Bill Wyatt, Bob Morrison, Joshua Morrison, and Justin Taylor; financial supporters — Hedrick Church of God, Glad Tidings Church of God, Church of God General Conference, Oregon Missionary, Indiana State Conference, and those who participate in the Lifeline telephone long-distance program (my apologies to anyone I have inadvertently omitted!)

Surely we can all agree that an important part of the Lord's plan for the Church of God Abrahamic Faith is that we participate together with the Lord in the fulfillment of His prophecy in Matthew 24:14: "This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all the nations, and then the end will come." Today's Good News television, with your involvement and support, can be a vital tool in this work of our Lord.

Focus on the Kingdom

A conversation (unplanned) between Jim Ring and myself at Christian Workers' Seminar in 1996 initiated a plan to see what might be done by way of radio to spread the unique message of the Abrahamic Faith — the Gospel of the Kingdom of God.

Inquiries into Christian radio in Atlanta revealed that some stations require programmers to sign a statement of faith. One large station (50,000 watts) which had no such restriction was WGUN 1010 AM, known locally as the "big gun." In January of 1997 we started a series of a year's

programs entitled "Focus on the Kingdom." These are 14 minutes and 30 seconds long, including the intro and the outro. The introprovides 10 seconds of music and the outro offers free literature to be requested at ABC's toll-free number. The Gospel of the Kingdom is discussed from every angle and in connection with the promises made to Abraham. I attempt to relay the great scheme of God for the salvation of individuals and the world.

Broadcasts continued in Atlanta for a year and a month. After beginning on WGUN we bought time on KPBC, Christian University of the Air, 770 AM in Dallas. This station has produced the greatest response so far. From January to December 1997 we received some 250 calls from the two stations. We then sent out a personal letter to each Texas resident who had received my Kingdom book, inviting them to meet at a hotel in Dallas. A generous listener and convert to the Kingdom message arranged for the meeting place and some 30 persons turned out for a two-hour session during which I presented something of the theology behind our ministry. From this group several are now beginning to be in contact with each other and one lady has requested baptism.

WGUN provided a forum for me to be in the studio live on Wednesdays for a call-in session. Fifteen minutes is really not an optimum time for live conversation, but we were able to interact with a number of regular callers.

Peg Eckel of Pennsylvania has taken on a ministry of copying and distributing tapes of the programs. Several complete sets of the 260 programs were sent to Margaret Sakala in Malawi and also to the Philippines. Many more copies were sent out to inquirers within and outside the COG in the USA. Restoration Fellowship now has several sample programs which can be listened to on our website (http://anthonybuzzard.home.mindspring.com).

Due to the generous contributions, we have embarked on a second year at KPBC in Dallas. The programs will be played twice daily, 11:15 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., and new ones will be interspersed as time allows for their production. We also ran the programs on KSKY (660 AM) in Dallas which provided Internet service in addition to local coverage.

As of February 16, 1998 the broadcasts are being aired on WLUV, 1520 AM (11:00 a.m. weekdays), Rockford, IL. In addition there is a Sunday airing in Wenatchee, WA; over the Welland, Ontario area; and in Charlotte, NC. These programs are supported by the local church. Others of our local churches have expressed an interest in running the programs locally.

Beginning March 1, we are beginning to broadcast over shortwave WHRI out of South Bend, IN. This provides coverage over North America, Europe, Africa, the Middle East and Asia and can also be received anywhere in the world on Internet and Satellite. "Focus on the Kingdom" airs at 6.04 Mhz on the shortwave dial weekdays at 8:15 a.m. (Eastern Standard Time) and again weekdays at 3:00 p.m. at 13.76 Mhz.

One of the side benefits of the programs has been their circulation outside the arena of radio itself. We calculate that some 7,500 programs are now in circulation. A group of Delta pilots (whom we met in the home school community) became interested in the Kingdom message and

invited me to address them at a weekend seminar in north Georgia. Many of these pilots have been involved in the Navigator organization. Their reaction was one of amazement that the Kingdom of God had not formed part of their movement's Gospel. The radio tapes are used as backup and for further clarification of the Gospel of the Kingdom of God.

In the near future we intend to put out one-minute advertisements on numerous major stations over the USA and invite people to receive our free book on the Kingdom of God. We also have a project to send the Kingdom book to all the pastors of Peachtree City, GA.

We are delighted with the opportunity which radio has afforded formaking contact with many sincere Bible searchers across the States and abroad. If the Word of the Kingdom (Matt. 13:19) is to make progress it must be announced to many potential believers. Fish are caught only when the net is widely spread. Everyone must hear the Gospel of the Kingdom before the end of the age (Matt. 24:14).

Funding for this project was initially provided by several Church of God families and several non-Church of God families. Funding is also now being provided by state/district conferences and local churches.

I am grateful for the opportunity which this ongoing project has provided for learning the ins and outs of radio. It is hard to measure results. At an individual level many have been impacted as they come to learn of the Abrahamic faith. A great deal of literature has been circulated, and I have been touched by the generosity of our sponsors and donors.

Ministerial Recognition Board

The Ministerial Recognition Board, both appointed and elected, is responsible for granting ministerial recognition in the form of license to those seeking accreditation by the Church of God General Conference. In addition, this Board is responsible for maintaining the integrity and good standing of those licensed.

Typically we meet three times each year: 1) before or during Ministerial Conference, 2) before and during General Conference, and 3) one other time, generally in early December. There are other occasions when it is necessary to have phone conferences.

This is the typical order, or sequence, by which we license:

- a. The student that anticipates graduation in June will receive Part I of his application for ministerial recognition in early November of the preceding year.
- b. The student is to complete Part I of the application process early enough for it to be copied and distributed to members of the M.R.B. to read and consider before the first interview.
- c. An interview is arranged, generally around the time of Ministerial Conference.
- d. If the interview is deemed satisfactory, the student is notified that he/she will receive his/her three-year Provisional License at a ceremony, generally during General

Conference. If there is something that arises during the first interview, the M.R.B. may ask for further study by the applicant on some particular item in the application, or something that has arisen during the interview. This three-year Provisional License is for the one year of internship and two years of the mentoring program.

e. A second interview is arranged near the end of the intern year. The interning pastor is sent Part II of the application during this year, approximately three months prior to the second interview. By the time of the second interview Part II of the application has been received,

copied and distributed to the M.R.B.

f. After the two-year mentoring program relationship has been arranged, a third interview is scheduled near its end.

g. If the interview indicates satisfaction with the developing ministry of the applicant, arrangements are made for permanent licensure.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR DELEGATE ACTION

Long-Range Planning Recommendations

The following recommendations from the Long-Range Institutional Study are submitted by the Board of Directors to the delegates for consideration and vote:

RECOMMENDATION 1: Revise the Statement of Purpose of the Church of God General Conference.

Current By-Laws statement: The purpose of the College/Conference is to assist Church of God members, churches, and conferences to perform their commission, which is to make disciples by bringing the lost to Jesus Christ, and by leading the believer to maturity by providing leadership, resources, and services.

Proposed: The Church of God General Conference, through partnership with conferences and local Churches of God, assists them and their members in the performance of their commission to make disciples. The Conference serves as an advocate of the Church of God to the world.

RECOMMENDATION 2: Revise the Preamble to the Constitution.

Current Preamble: The Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference is a not-for-profit organization. Delegates and interested members of the Church of God will meet at a designated place and time to confer in all matters pertaining to the spiritual life and business of the churches.

Proposed: The Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference is an association of churches

united by a common understanding of Scripture, a commitment to ministry, and a desire to work together to teach and preach the good news of the Kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, leading to the conversion of the lost and the nurture of all believers. It is a not-for-profit organization. Delegates and interested members of the Church of God will meet at a designated place and time to confer in all matters pertaining to the spiritual life and business of the churches.

RECOMMENDATION 3: Study and identify ways in which the Church of God can improve public relations with members and with those outside the church to better foster a distinct identity and increase the visibility of Church of God distinctives to those outside its membership.

RECOMMENDATION 4: Expand the current ABC program of study to include a distance learning program that will provide education for lay ministers and local church leadership.

RECOMMENDATION 5: Study and identify ways to improve the Atlanta Bible College program with the intention of achieving excellence and meeting accreditation standards within the next five years.

RECOMMENDATION 6: Strengthen the programs and increase the resources allocated for youth work in the Church of God.

RECOMMENDATION 7: Further integrate the use of technology in the work of the College and Conference.

RECOMMENDATION 8: Strengthen the programs and increase the resources allocated for evangelism.

RECOMMENDATION 9: Provide publications that can best enable the Church of God to fulfill the Great Commission.

Additional Recommendation

RECOMMENDATION 10: By the year 2000, secure 1,000 active members of the Church Builders' League.

Rationale for Recommendations and Actions to Be Taken

RECOMMENDATION 1: Revise the Statement of Purpose of the Church of God General Conference.

RATIONALE: The switch to a stronger partnership between the Conference, College, state/district conferences and local churches is strongly supported. The organization exists to be in partnership so that it can be a vehicle of assistance as churches perform their commission of making disciples. It also clarifies and emphasizes the responsibility of the Conference to represent the organization and be an advocate to the world; the Conference responds to and reaches out to others who request information about our churches and our doctrine; it represents our association of churches to all who inquire. The Conference and College also take the initiative to make the Church of God more visible to the world, i.e. to the scholarly community through the Theological Conference and publications.

RECOMMENDATION 2: Revise the Preamble to the Constitution.

RATIONALE: The proposed preamble further clarifies our organization as an association of churches and

the factors that unite us. It emphasizes our historical belief that the Good News includes teachings on the Kingdom of God and Jesus Christ based on Acts 8:12.

RECOMMENDATION 3: Study and identify ways in which the Church of God can improve public relations with members and with those outside the church to better foster a distinct identity and increase the visibility of Church of God distinctives to those outside its membership.

RATIONALE: Various concerns and recommendations stated during the study indicate the importance of our image internally to our members and externally to the lost that we want to reach. This has been identified as a critical issue for the Conference and the College as well as for the local churches. How do we mold together into one voice while recognizing and appreciating the richness of the diversity in the Church of God? The diversity will, if we are serving the Great Commission, not diminish but only continue to change and grow. Examples of the recommendations which have been noted include: develop an identifiable image; publish a more user-friendly book on our

distinctives; determine the influence of current financial strategies on the image; identify improved recruiting strategies; provide a consistent "look" for all of our publications; identify ways to present a positive and visible presence; and identify ways to enhance our "public relations" whether at the Conference level or at the local church level.

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN: The Board of Directors will appoint a one-year task force (made up of individuals outside the current Conference, College staff) to study this issue and provide recommendations to be taken. Also, any recommendations which are acted upon as a part of the long-range study will take the concerns of image, identity, public relations and communication into account. Current staff and students at the Atlanta campus will identify ways in which the Conference and College could enhance the image and identity of the Church of God through their ongoing activities (worship teams, recruiting, discussions with local churches, communications, college activities, etc.). More publications will be encouraged among COG pastors and scholars (in both COG and non-COG publications). In order to reach the lost visibility is critical for establishing an image and identity related to our distinctives, both internally and externally.

RECOMMENDATION 4: Expand the current ABC program of study to include a distance learning program that will provide education for lay ministers and local church leadership.

RATIONALE: This recommendation is a revised version of the recommendation made by the workshop group in October. The intent is to continue the current program while making a shift toward the inclusion of lay ministry and distance education offerings. The workshop group in October had also recommended the establishment of a seminary. After prolonged discussion by the Board, they decided not to recommend a switch to a seminary at this time. A number of reasons were noted. The Board has not sensed a strong call for more highly degreed pastors; in fact, some of our churches have chosen to employ pastors without baccalaureate degrees. Most churches are not in a position to pay a salary commensurate with someone holding a Master's degree. Few potential students can be identified. The Church of God seminary leadership resources, i.e. qualified individuals with doctorates, is limited.

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN: After action of the delegates, the Higher Education Advisory Committee

will assist the College staff in the development of the new programs which will then be presented to the Board for action.

RECOMMENDATION 5: Study and identify ways to improve the Atlanta Bible College program with the intention of achieving excellence and meeting accreditation standards within the next five years.

RATIONALE: Aspirations of accreditation for the Bible College have continued over the years; accreditation affirms standards of excellence in educational programs. We wish to meet accreditation standards within the next five years.

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN: The Higher Education Advisory Committee and the College staff will identify strategies to be taken to achieve accreditation. Those strategies will be reviewed by the Board; systematic actions will be taken to assure the meeting of accreditation standards.

RECOMMENDATION 6: Strengthen the programs and increase the resources allocated for youth work in the Church of God.

RATIONALE: Many responses on the surveys reflect a concern on the part of our membership for reaching, discipling and leading our youth during the coming years. The "youth" includes toddlers through young adults. Development of resources, publishing, training of teachers and youth workers, youth programs, development of missions activities, and increasing the visibility of youth in the COG should all be included in order to respond to the concerns of our members.

ACTION TO BE TAKEN: Employ a full-time staff member to serve as youth coordinator and recruitment coordinator. The goal will be to fill this position by the fall of 1999. The coordinator would be responsible for activities such as networking with youth and youth leaders nationwide; shepherding youth leaders; visiting local youth groups and assisting with programming; developing courses in youth ministry to teach at ABC, RYOT, Christian Workers' Seminar and summer General Conference; and coordinating the ABC recruitment program. Additional monies will need to be allocated in order to accomplish this recommendation.

The Youth Advisory Committee will also be asked to do some further work on the prioritizing of actions to be taken. Their report should be available for the Board's January 1999 meeting.

RECOMMENDATION 7: Further integrate the use of technology in the work of the College and Conference.

RATIONALE: The need for a better use of technology has been reflected in the input we have received in many areas: communication, education, publication, evangelism, visibility outside of the Church of God. In particular it will be needed in order to manage a distance learning program for ABC.

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN: Incorporate the use of computer software and the Internet in ABC course requirements. Position the Atlanta campus so that it can efficiently facilitate communication between all constituents of the Church of God - Web pages, Internet, e-mail. Provide a variety of technology classes, workshops at Christian Workers' Seminar, General Conference, RYOT, for the next 3 - 5 years. There are many talented people in the Church of God who could offer classes on a variety of topics. In particular, prepare every pastor/church to be on the Internet within 3 years. Initiate immediately the development of distance learning technology and programs - video development, on-line courses. Enter more of the General Conference, Atlanta Bible College information on the computer — student records, personnel records, library system, archives. This ACTION requires investment in equipment, supplies, and qualified personnel. A coordinator could be identified; the talents of many Church of God members could be tapped to assist with the development.

Also a part-time technology coordinator will be hired to facilitate the increased and effective use of technology.

At their last meeting, the Board allocated up to \$50,000 from the Morgan estate to be used to update the present computer system which was initially designed ten years ago. Upgraded hardware and software is greatly needed to improve present functions performed by faculty, staff and students, and will be vital if this recommendation is adopted by the delegates. As new computers are purchased we are keeping in mind the Clayton College requirement for students to rent a laptop computer. This decreases the need for a large number of student computers, but printers, software, and appropriate interfaces with the Clayton computers are being assured. The ABC Foundation is providing grants to cover the rental of laptop computers from Clayton College.

RECOMMENDATION 8: Strengthen the programs and increase the resources allocated for evangelism.

RATIONALE: This area is critical to the ability of the Church of God to fulfill the Great Commission. There has been consistent input that the churches and pastors want the Conference to provide information and resources regarding evangelism. They want evangelism to go beyond church planting and include a variety of strong resources for making evangelism work in current churches. There has also been a clear message that we look more specifically at the ministry needs and how we reach special groups - seniors, single parent families, victims of violence and abuse, divorce, etc. Somehow we must look more broadly at the needs and decide what role the General Conference should assume to empower local churches, members, and pastors to reach the lost in future years. How do we identify the most appropriate mission fields for the Church of God and prepare programs and people for working in that ministry?

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN: A full- or part-time spiritual life and evangelism coordinator will be hired. The goal will be to fill this position by the fall of 1999. The conference will develop and provide resources on evangelism; they will serve as a clearinghouse for evangelism resources. Classes and workshops will be offered at Conference-sponsored meetings. The College will continue to include ministry and evangelism content and experiences in the academic program — content and experiences which serve in both the planting of churches and the work of existing churches.

The Board is proposing that \$200,000 be raised for the planting of 6 new churches in the next 5 years (approximately \$36,000 per church with payments spread over 5 years).

RECOMMENDATION 9: Provide publications that can best enable the Church of God to fulfill the Great Commission.

RATIONALE: This area needs a great deal of attention. The task force in October made great strides in clarifying needs and issues.

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN: The publishing task force information will be forwarded to the Christian Education Committee. They will be asked to make more definitive and prioritized recommendations regarding publications to the Board of Directors by January,

1999. Contacts will be made now to ask individuals to initiate publishing projects such as creating a user-friendly booklet on our distinctive teachings, developing a series of short study booklets on doctrine, and developing home Bible study courses.

Additional Recommendation

RECOMMENDATION 10: By the year 2000, secure 1,000 active members of the Church Builders' League.

RATIONALE: Financial support is needed to enlarge buildings, acquire land, and construct buildings for present and new congregations. At one time, there were 1,000 members of the Church Builders' League. Currently there are less than 400 active participants.

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN: Churches receiving appeals during the next two years will be strongly encouraged to enroll at least 50% of their membership in the Church Builders' League. All churches will be encouraged to appoint a Church Builders' League Coordinator who will receive a printout from the General Conference showing who are the active participants of the league in their local church. They will be encouraged to institute a campaign to enroll at least 50% of the member families of their church in the league.

Explanation of Budget

The proposed budget for July 1, 1999 to June 30, 2000 will fund the following programs and activities of the College/Conference in accordance with our mission.

Anticipated Expenses

Salaries and Wages - compensation is provided for 24 employees (6 part-time quarterly editors, 5 part-time coordinators, 6 part-time student workers, 1 ten-month instructor, 1 five-month instructor, and 7 full-time workers. This budget also includes support for Summer Ministry team members.) This budget includes the addition of a new employee in the area of Spiritual Life and Outreach, and a Technology Coordinator.

2. Social Security - amount matched by the employer

- Employee Benefits health insurance, workmen's compensation, conference premium for Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association, and registration fee for summer General Conference.
- 4. Assistance to Churches funds provided for eight churches on a declining scale of payments each year.
- 5. Ministerial Association support for programs and other expenses of the Church of God Ministerial Association.
- Youth Ministry funding to help subsidize the cost of the annual RYOT.
- Printing and Binding includes all materials printed by the College/Conference and the binding of permanent materials for the library.
- 8. Postage shipping charges for the PROGRESS JOURNAL, The Restitution Herald, A Journal from the Radical Reformation, tracts, books, and all correspondence.

9. Purchases - Bookstore - textbooks and other materials which

are purchased for resale.

- Purchases Cook material Creative Teaching Aid packets and other Cook material that is resold as a part of our Sunday School curriculum.
- 11. Royalties fees paid for the use of the David C. Cook curriculum and copyrighted material used in our publications.
- 12. Basic Grants assistance to ABC students in the amount of up to \$120 per semester hour to subsidize their tuition at ABC.
- 13. Clayton Rebates during the first three semesters of education, ABC students who attend Clayton College and State University are eligible for a rebate to offset the out-of-state tuition until they can establish residency.
- 14. Advertising Recruitment includes travel, telephone calls, printing, and postage primarily to promote ABC.
- 15. Special Speakers honorarium paid to graduation speaker and other guests on campus.
- 16. Library Periodicals religious and theological journals and other magazines for the library collection.
- 17. Library Books newly published books are acquired to keep the library collection up to date.
- 18. Periodicals, Books, Dues a small allowance is provided to professional staff to purchase resource material for classes and to participate in professional organizations.
- Staff Education professional staff members are encouraged to attend at least one seminar each year to remain current in their field of study.
- 20. Program Development the purchase of resources to enhance teaching programs at ABC and for the Lending Library.
- 21. Travel includes travel for Board members, advisory committees, special boards and committees, Gospel Teams, Summer Ministries, and staff.
- Motor Vehicle Expense license plates, insurance, and maintenance for three vehicles.

- 23. Office Supplies paper, printer cartridges, stationery, envelopes, etc.
- 24. Professional Services the constitution requires an annual audit.
- 25. Telephone basic and long distance service, including the cost of all "800" number calls which are provided toll-free to the caller.
- Insurance non-plant liability insurance for employees and directors.
- 27. Supplies and Expenses printing supplies, piano tuning, towel and paper products, and other operational expenses.
- 28. Repairs/Maintenance non-plant maintenance agreements and repairs for office and library equipment.
- Plant Expenses includes all expenses for buildings and property.
- 30. Contingency this budget is being prepared 15 months before the fiscal year begins. This item provides a cushion for adjustments when the fiscal year begins on July 1, 1999.
- 31. Vehicle Replacement money is set aside in a restricted account to be available when a vehicle needs to be replaced.

Anticipated Income

- Sunday School Materials includes all sales of Sunday School curriculum.
- 2. Books, Tracts sale of textbooks as well as other materials to the membership and the public.
- 3. Subscriptions subscriptions for *The Restitution Herald* are \$13 per year, \$24 for two years, \$33 for three years; *A Journal from the Radical Reformation* is \$24 per year.
- 4. Tuition income is based upon projected enrollment of the equivalent of fifteen students at ABC taking an average of 12 credit hours (students are also enrolled for additional hours at Clayton College) and 20 extension students taking an average of 5 semester hours during the year.
- Housing rent received from ten apartments on the College campus.
- Laundry income from laundry facilities in apartment building.
- 7. Late Fees/Rent and Fees interest income and registration fees from students.
- 8. ABCDF transfer of interest income from the Atlanta Bible College Development Foundation.
- 9. Interest money earned on checking account through the year.
- 10. Transfers In funding for church planting is supplemented by restricted trust funds.
- 12. Bequest Distribution the College/Conference is the recipient of annuity payments on a contract of a deceased member.
- 13. Transfer from Morgan Fund to subsidize budget.
- 14. Contributions Needed to accomplish the goals of Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference for the 1999-2000 fiscal year, contributions of \$392,600 will be needed from churches, conferences, and individual families. This is approximately \$32,000 per month.

In 1997, churches, conferences, and groups gave over \$177,000 to the Goal for Giving. We are thankful for this faithful giving and encourage each member church to designate a portion of its income to assist with the work of the College/Conference.

To close the gap between contributions needed and the amount provided by churches, conferences, and groups, we rely upon faithful giving of individuals and families. Approximately \$215,000 is needed in contributions from individuals and families. In 1997, giving families contributed an average of \$294 during the year. There is a need for additional support from other member families to help underwrite the work of the College and Conference.

Report of Summer Conference

The Secretary and Treasurer of the Board of Directors automatically serve in the same capacities for the Founda-

Delegates voted on nine recommendations pertaining to the Long-Range Planning Study as follows:

Recommendation 1 — revision of purpose statement — adopted with the addition of the words "of Jesus Christ" following the word "disciples."

Recommendation 2 — revision of preamble to the Constitution — adopted.

Recommendation 3 — improve public relations — adopted.

Recommendation 4 — distance learning program for Atlanta Bible College — adopted.

Recommendation 5 — improve ABC programs with the intention of seeking accreditation — adopted.

Recommendation 6 — strengthen programs and increase resources for youth ministry adopted.

Recommendation 7 — integrate the use of technology in the work of the College/Conference — adopted.

Recommendation 8 — strengthen programs and increase resources for evangelism adopted.

Recommendation 9 — provide publications to enable the Church of God to help fulfill the Great Commission — adopted.

An additional recommendation regarding securing new members for the Church Builder's League was also adopted.

A motion was also adopted to appoint a task force to study the organizational structure of the College and Conference.

A budget for the 1999 – 2000 fiscal year was adopted by the delegates. It calls for contributions of \$392,600.

The Christian Education Advisory Committee announced that a new quarterly for pre-kindergarten age children will be added to our Sunday school curriculum for the special doctrinal distinctive series, which will be for the December, 1998 through February, 1999 quarter. If there is sufficient interest in a curriculum for this age group, the curriculum will continue to be offered in the future.

This issue of the Progress Journal contains additional information about the Conference.

Chairman's Message to Delegates

The Board of Directors and staff welcome you to this 78th annual General Conference of the Church of God. We are pleased to have all of you — delegates, pastors, staff, families and other attendees — assembled in Atlanta, Georgia for this important General Conference. An exciting and stimulating Youth Congress — RYOT — is planned for July 26-31. We are very grateful to Jim Graham, his advisory committee, and the RYOT staff who commit their time and energies to contribute to the spiritual development of our young people.

We are very fortunate to have President David Krogh and a staff of dedicated and committed spiritual people to carry on the day-to-day programs and functions of the General Conference and Atlanta Bible College. These individuals serve sacrificially to provide an academic program and all the services and endeavors of the General Conference. We are very appreciative of their work.

The advisory committees, the Ministerial Recognition Board, the Atlanta Bible College Development Foundation Board, the Board of Directors, the editors and writers of our publications, and numerous volunteers all make important and significant contributions to the operation of our Conference and College.

This will be a very busy and intensive General Conference. It is one of the most important Conferences we have ever had. The decisions made here will define the pur-

poses of our College and Conference and establish the direction of our programs and resources. All of us should prayerfully seek God's leading and will as we consider the issues and decisions of this Conference. The work groups ultimately concluded with the content of the nine recommendations which you will consider in this Conference. We are very thankful for the time and hard work of all who participated in these work groups.

It is one thing to gather in Conference and make decisions regarding the purpose and directions of our organization. The real challenge is to commit ourselves, including our resources, to become personally involved and also involve others in implementing and supporting the decisions that are made.

Yes, there are challenges before us. Some of these challenges will be with us for a while. We tend to be a very independent people — independent thinkers. Our independent ways tend to give rise to diversity. The General Conference is not a governing body over our local churches and conferences. Maintaining an association of churches with this diversity is a challenge. We are blessed with a core of Bible understandings — doctrines — and a hope that bind us together. Methods and style are not rigidly prescribed by the Word of God and these are areas where flexibility is appropriate. The message entrusted to us is biblically based and prescribed. Where the Word speaks directly we must be in compliance with it.

Another challenge involves what I would call "identity issues": Who are we? What are we? In times when we

struggle with these issues, it is wise to go back and renew and reclaim our discipleship. It is a time to discover anew the message of the Word of God and the gospel message God would have us share with the world about us.

We are the Church of God — we are His. We are not our own. We have been bought with a price — the precious blood of Jesus Christ. Let us perform in this Conference with this in mind.

What we are about this week is God's business. This is God's church and we are His workmen. With the help of Almighty God, let us rise to meet all challenges in doing His will, in loving one another as commanded, in carrying out the Great Commission as Jesus intended and in being "steadfast and unmovable in the work of the Lord." Our labors will not be in vain.

May God bless and direct us in this General Conference and as we return to our homes and local churches to serve Him.

Minutes of the General Conference Business Sessions Renaissance Hotel, Atlanta, Georgia

Saturday, July 4, 1998

- 1. Chairman Joe James called to order the Saturday, July 4th delegate business session of the 1998 General Conference at 1:45 p.m.
- 2. Pastor Michael Hoffman offered prayer.
- 3. Chairman James welcomed all delegates and other Conference attendees. Those specially recognized included: first-time delegates; newly licensed pastor, John Raymond; Open Bible Church of Farmington, Missouri, oeing represented for the first time; and first-time attendee Bill Bryant from Alabama.
- 4. Chairman James delivered the Chairman's address, noting that the decisions made during this year's business sessions are critical because they will shape the purpose and direction of our College and Conference for years to come. He urged all delegates to become personally involved in carrying out the decisions made and to enlist the support and personal involvement of others in their home churches.
- 5. Michelle Turner, Chairperson of the Credentials Committee, reported that the final delegate count at the close of the 1997 General Conference business sessions was 6 members of the Board of Directors, 62 church and conference delegates, and 36 pastors. Several delegates attending this year's business sessions still need to see Michelle to receive their delegate card.
- 6. Chairman James read to the delegates a letter from Cornerstone Bible Church, relating Tracy Swartz's financial need due to recent gallbladder surgery without the

benefit of medical insurance or other assistance to help pay her bills.

- 7. The Annual Report printed in the May Progress Jour-NAL was considered. An opportunity was given for questions to be asked.
- 8. The Special Reports printed in the May Progress Journal were considered. An opportunity was given for questions to be asked.
- 9. Gary Burnham made comments about, and fielded questions regarding, the financial reports printed in the delegate packet.
- 10. The floor was opened for nominations for a four-year term on the Board of Directors. David Riley nominated both Pastor Greg Demmitt and Paul Duncan. Francis Burnett moved and Charles Webster seconded that nominations be closed. The motion passed. The nominees were introduced and delegates were encouraged to ask them questions later in the day at the picnic on the ABC campus. The election will be held during the Sunday afternoon business session.
- 11. The floor was opened for nominations for a four-year term on the Youth Advisory Committee. Fred Gerullis nominated Pastor Jon Welch. Wally Winner nominated Pastor Tom New. Jerold Brewer moved and David Riley seconded that nominations be closed. The motion passed. The election will be held during the Sunday afternoon business session.
- 12. Dr. Donna Deane was called upon to introduce the recommendations for delegate action coming out of the

Institutional Long-Range Planning Study. She reviewed the process used over the past four years to gather input and to produce those recommendations.

- 13. Robert Coverstone moved and J. E. Fauntleroy seconded adoption of Recommendation 1, to revise the Statement of Purpose of the Church of God General Conference. Passage requires a 2/3 majority vote.
- 14. Michael Hoffman moved and Dale Brown seconded to amend the motion, inserting the words "of Jesus Christ" after the word "disciples." The motion to amend passed.
- 15. Frank Toth moved and Michael Brown seconded to amend the motion to replace the word "partnership" with the word "cooperation." The motion to amend failed.
- 16. The recommendation, as amended, reads, "The Church of God General Conference, through partner-ship with conferences and local Churches of God, assists them and their members in the performance of their commission to make disciples of Jesus Christ. The Conferenceserves as an advocate of the Church of God to the world." The motion to adopt Recommendation 1, as amended, passed 79 to 5.
- 17. Francis Burnett moved and Ed Goit seconded adoption of Recommendation 2, to revise the Preamble to the Constitution. Passage requires a 2/3 majority vote.
- 18. Phyllis Raymond moved and Don Ward seconded to amend the motion, replacing the words "and the nurture of all believers" with the words "and the nurturing and equipping of all believers." The motion to amend failed 37 to 41.
- 19. Bill Gaspar moved and Sarah Ross seconded to amend the motion, inserting the words "as being inspired by God" after the word "Scripture." The motion to amend failed.
- 20. The recommendation reads, "The Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference is an association of churches united by a common understanding of Scripture, a commitment to ministry, and a desire to work together to teach and preach the good news of the Kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, leading to the conversion of the lost and the nurture of all believers. It is a not-for-profit organization. Delegates and interested members of the Church of God will meet at a designated place and time to confer in all matters pertaining to the spiritual life and business of the churches." The motion to adopt Recommendation 2 passed by an overwhelming margin.

- 21. Charles Bottolfs moved and Mark Tschaenn seconded adoption of Recommendation 3, to study and identify ways in which the Church of God can improve public relations with members and with those outside the church to better foster a distinct identity and increase the visibility of Church of God distinctives to those outside its membership. This recommendation, and all additional recommendations to be considered, require a simple majority for passage.
- 22. J. E. Fauntleroy moved and John Raymond seconded to amend the motion by adding the sentence "The Board of Directors will appoint a one-year task force to study this issue and provide recommendations to be taken." The motion to amend failed.
- 23. Recommendation 3 passed.
- 24. Charles Webster moved and J. E. Fauntleroy seconded to adjourn today's business session. The motion passed.
- 25. Following adjournment, Pastor Seth Ross led a brief prayer session.

Sunday, July 5, 1998

- 1. Chairman Joe James called to order the Sunday, July 5th delegate business session of the 1998 General Conference at 1:45 p.m.
- 2. Pastor Scott Ross offered prayer.
- 3. The minutes of the Saturday afternoon session were read. No corrections were noted.
- 4. Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference President David Krogh delivered the President's message. President Krogh reminded the delegates that one day the work of the Church of God will be passed on from us to others. Further, he shared his conviction that as long as we are continuing to build a solid foundation, those who come after us will do a good job of carrying forward the work of the College and Conference. That foundation continues to be built around commitment to four things: strengthening existing churches, starting new churches, educating for both lay and professional ministry, and representing the Church of God to the world at large.
- 5. Michelle Turner, Chairperson of the Credentials Committee, reported that the current delegate count is 6 members of the Board of Directors, 63 church and conference delegates, and 31 pastors, for a total of 100 delegates.

- 6. Paul Duncan was elected to a four-year term on the Board of Directors.
- 7. Pastor Tom New was elected to a four-year term on the Youth Advisory Committee.
- 8. John Raymond moved and Jeff Fletcher seconded adoption of Recommendation 4, to expand the current ABC program of study to include a distance learning program that will provide education for lay ministers and local church leadership. President Krogh presented general information regarding a distance learning program. The motion passed.
- 9. Jeff Fletcher moved and David Riley seconded adoption of Recommendation 5, to study and identify ways to improve the Atlanta Bible College program with the intention of achieving excellence and meeting accreditation standards within the next five years. President Krogh presented information about an organization through which the College would hope to receive accreditation. He also fielded numerous questions. The motion passed.
- 10. Wanda Gerullis moved and Dale Brown seconded adoption of Recommendation 6, to strengthen the programs and increase the resources allocated for youth work in the Church of God. Following considerable discussion about the roles and work of the person to be hired, the motion passed.
- 11. J. E. Fauntleroy moved and Howard Shute seconded adoption of Recommendation 7, to further integrate the use of technology in the work of the College and Conference. The delegates viewed a brief video prepared by Pastor Steve Taylor supporting this recommendation. The motion passed.
- 12. Frances Burnett moved and Jeff Fletcher seconded adoption of Recommendation 8, to strengthen the programs and increase the resources allocated for evangelism. The motion passed.
- 13. Robert Coverstone moved and John Raymond seconded adoption of Recommendation 9, to provide publications that can best enable the Church of God to fulfill the Great Commission. The motion passed.
- 14. Charles Webster moved and J. E. Fauntleroy seconded adoption of Recommendation 10, to secure 1,000 active members of the Church Builder's League by the year 2000. The motion passed.
- 15. Pastor Scott Ross asked for someone to address the reasons the Board of Directors chose not to present the concept of developing a seminary program as suggested by the Atlanta Bible College Task Force members. Dr. Donna Deane addressed the question: need for Doctoral

- Degree staff, costs of such staff, costs for churches to hire Masters Degree pastors, and a desire to more fully develop a distance learning program.
- 16. President Krogh presented information about the proposed 1999 2000 fiscal year budget. He also fielded several questions. The budget will be voted on during Monday's business session.
- 17. President Krogh recognized retiring Board of Directors member Billie Kennedy.
- 18. The 1999 General Conference will be held July 12-15 at the Henry VIII Hotel in St. Louis, Missouri.
- 19. Ed Goit moved and Charles Bottolfs seconded to adjourn today's business session. The motion passed.
- 20. Following adjournment, Pastor Seth Ross led a brief prayer session.

Monday, July 6, 1998

- 1. Chairman Joe James called to order the Monday, July 6th delegate business session of the 1998 General Conference at 2:30 p.m.
- 2. Pastor Scott Deane offered prayer.
- 3. The minutes of the Sunday afternoon business session were read. No corrections were noted.
- 4. Chairman James announced that Pastor Greg Demmitt and Wanda Gerullis were each appointed by the Board of Directors to a three-year term on the ABC Development Foundation Board.
- 5. President Krogh reviewed with the delegates various items included in the delegate packets. He also urged attendees to fill out the Conference evaluation forms enclosed in those packets.
- 6. The Restitution Herald editor, Jeff Fletcher, urged delegates and attendees to take advantage of the \$11/year special new or renewal subscription price available during this Conference.
- 7. Pastor Wally Winner made the delegates aware of a Berean Bible Study Booklet that has been reprinted and is available for sale.
- 8. Youth Coordinator, Jim Graham, gave a brief update about the Church of God youth program and the plans for this summer's R.Y.O.T. (Radical Youth Overcoming Today) to be held at the end of this month on the campus of Taylor University in Upland, Indiana.

President's Message to Delegates

David Krogh

I am thankful to each of you for coming to this Conference. As Chairman James mentioned in his message, we believe that you are a chosen people that God has called here to accomplish His purposes (1 Peter 2:9). We believe that the decisions made here will declare God's praises.

The theme of this 1998 Conference is: A People After God's Own Heart — A Call to Spiritual Maturity. We have been focusing upon the life of King David. In Acts 13:22 God said, "I have found David, son of Jesse, a man after my own heart; he will do everything I want him to do." We know that David also did some things that God did not want him to do, but he was committed to obedience.

He serves as a tremendous model to those who would seek to recognize God's sovereignty in their lives. He serves as a model to those who want to know God in an intimate way and be obedient to everything He asks them to do. My greatest desire is to be a man after God's own heart and my second greatest desire is for the entire Church of God to be a people after God's own heart.

Lately I have been thinking much about the unique position that the Church of God occupies in our world today. Among all of the religions of the world, and among all the denominations and church groups, God has given to the Church of God a special role that we have been fulfilling for well over 150 years.

Recently, upon the death of Pastor J. Arlen Marsh, I was reminded of his great-great uncle Joseph Marsh who lived from 1802 to 1863. Though the Church of God was not founded by any one individual but by many truth seekers, Joseph Marsh was influential in promoting many of the truths that we hold today. For those who are interested, his book *The Age to Come*, has been reprinted and is available from the General Conference.

Speaking of history, this year is the 100th anniversary of youth work in the Church of God. In 1898 youth groups were formed in Illinois and Iowa. These early groups led to the organizing of our National Berean Society in 1913. The Bereans were instrumental in bringing our Conference into existence in 1921.

I am deeply grateful for my heritage in the Church of God. My great grandfather, Herman Mehrens, was baptized 130 years ago this year by a Church of God pastor. My great grandfather strongly held to the biblical truths taught by the Church of God. He taught these truths to his family and they were passed on through several generations to me. In fact my great grandfather was so

committed to truth that on his large tombstone his family engraved the words "Asleep in Jesus." He believed in the sleep of the dead until the time when Jesus returns.

Many of you have a long heritage in the Church of God, going back one or more generations.

But, could we see a show of hands of those of you who are the *first* generation in your family to be a member of the Church of God. [A few hands were raised.]

That is both commendable and of concern. It is commendable that the faith has been passed down from generation to generation and I am deeply grateful that each of you has remained faithful to what you have been taught. But it is of concern if we are not bringing others outside our families to a knowledge of the truth.

If the Church of God is to continue to be faithful to our heritage and message, two things must continue to happen:

- 1. We must be certain to pass the message of truth and salvation to our children and grandchildren.
- 2. We must be certain to pass the message to our world.

If the Lord tarries, one day we are going to have to pass our work on to others. Three years ago when we had our 75th annual Conference, there were five individuals who were still living who had been present at that first conference in 1921. Three of them have since died and only Albert and Alice Harper remain. Just like King David, of whom it says in Acts 13:36, "When David had served God's purpose in his own generation, he fell asleep," our forefathers in the faith served their generation and fell asleep. But they also did what it says in Psalm 78:1-7. The faith has been passed from one generation to the next.

I am sure that our early leaders could not have envisioned the work that we have today nor could they be sure that their successors would carry on the work. In fact, though it was a dream of our early leaders to have a General Conference, many of them died before that dream was finally realized in 1921.

Solomon said in Ecclesiastes 2:18 and 19, "I hated all the things I had toiled for under the sun, because I must leave them to the one who comes after me. And who knows whether he will be a wise man or a fool? Yet he will have control over all the work into which I have poured my effort and skill under the sun."

As with Solomon, the time will come when the leadership of the Church of God will pass to others. To whom will we pass it? If we do our work well, we will not need to worry about the future. If we have built a solid foundation, our work will stand and those who come after us will be wise and faithful servants of God.

Part of the foundation that we are laying is the action that you are taking at this Conference on the recommendations from our long-range study. As we are about to step into a new century and a new millennium, it is the desire of the staff and Board of Directors to move ahead. God has chosen to bless us with substantial financial resources. I have a strong conviction that God would not have given these resources to us if He did not feel that we would use them wisely. He did not give them to us to stash in the bank to provide security for our movement. I believe that we need to invest these resources, not hoard them. I believe that the recommendations that have been proposed are an appropriate way to invest these resources to help each of our churches be more fruitful in ministry.

I am thankful for each of our churches that stand as beacons of hope in our world. I am thankful for the dedicated service of our pastors and members who faithfully serve week in and week out. Some are serving in difficult situations and yet their faith does not waiver and they continue the work.

The strength of this organization rests in the hands of hundreds and thousands of people who love the Lord, love truth, and love the lost. Working together, much will be accomplished.

If the recommendations before you are passed, there are several positions on our staff that will be filled. We will be looking for people who have a passion for youth ministry, for evangelism, and who believe strongly that technology can help us proclaim the message. We will look for people who have both the passion and the skills necessary to do the work. We will not fill the positions just so they will be filled.

Our Conference and College are committed to standing beside you to serve you to the best of our ability. As long as we have resources and energy, we will continue to serve.

Our vision remains unchanged. It consists of four parts:

1. Our commitment is to serve every one of our churches. Through the institutional study we have a better understanding of the needs of our churches and how we can help meet your needs.

- 2. We continue to recognize the importance of starting new churches. We will not waiver in our support for those who have caught the vision of reaching out into new fields.
- 3. We are committed to education as we equip lay and professional workers for Christian service. With your approval, we will pursue providing education beyond the campus through modern technology and through courses delivered in other parts of the country by our staff.
- 4. We will continue to represent the Church of God to the public at large.

I have recently been challenged by the parable of Jesus in Luke 12:35-48. He challenged us in verses 35-36: "Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning, like men waiting for their master to return." He also challenges us in verse 48 when He says "from everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked."

We of the Church of God have been given much. We have been entrusted with much and therefore God has great expectations of us. It is my conviction that with His help we can live up to those expectations and do everything that God wants us to do. God will not ask us to do things we cannot do.

I would like to make you aware of a special prayer focus that we are going to implement this fall. In light of our long-range study and many challenges we face in ministry as we enter a new century and millennium, the Board of Directors would like to have a special emphasis upon prayer. The motto of our prayer emphasis will be "Praying the Church into the Twenty-First Century." We are going to seek partners in prayer from among our membership. Please be watching your mailboxes in the fall and I trust that all of you as key leaders in our churches and Conference will choose to be prayer partners as we together seek God's direction and blessing upon our work.

Now is the time for renewal as we build upon the foundation of the past and look forward with an attitude of optimism and keen anticipation for the soon return of Jesus to this earth. Let us be ready for service and make sure that we keep our lamps burning, like people waiting for their Master to return.

Financial Update

Delegates at the summer General Conference adopted a budget for the coming year which will require contributions of \$32,700 per month. This is approximately \$200 per month more than was needed in the previous fiscal year. In addition to contributions from churches and conferences that are members of the General Conference, giving is needed from individuals and families to meet the budget. The faithful support of churches and individuals in the past is greatly appreciated.

- 9. Dale Brown, Missouri Conference President, spoke briefly regarding the 1999 General Conference, strongly urging the delegates to make plans to travel to St. Louis to attend the Conference and to do some family sightseeing as well.
- 10. Pastor Seth Ross moved and Kirk Ross seconded that a task force be appointed to conduct, and to give the delegates a progress report about, a formal review of the Atlanta Bible College/Church of God General Conference organizational structure to optimize the effective implementation of our strategic initiatives.
- 11. Bill Lawrence moved and Charles Webster seconded to table the motion. The motion to table failed 34 to 38.

Preservation of Adult Truth Seekers' Quarterlies

Bob See of the Eden Valley Church in Minnesota has started the process of scanning all of the Adult Quarterlies produced by the Church of God General Conference, since January 2, 1927. When the project is completed, all of the texts and comments on the texts that have been published during the 71 years of publication will be available on computer disk, or each of the books of the Bible with their comments can be printed out for study and review. In essence, this will be a Church of God commentary produced by hundreds of Church of God scholars over the years.

Thus far, 2,500 New Testament and 1,008 Old Testament verses and comments have been scanned.

We will keep you posted on the progress of this project.

To facilitate the scanning project, we would like old copies of the Adult Quarterly donated to the General Conference. The issues that belong to the General Conference have been bound and it is more difficult to scan those than quarterlies that are loose. It is also best if the quarterlies have not been marked. Preserving Restitution Heralds

The Restitution Herald has been published continuously since 1911. Offerings were received at the summer General Conference to assist with this project. Along with other gifts that have been received we now have a little over \$3,000 towards this project which will cost over \$10,000.



The Church of God needs to focus upon evangelism and outreach if we are to be obedient to the Great Commission. At the same time, we recognize that the heritage of the past is the seed that will bring forth the harvest in the future. It is important for us to understand who we are as a distinct people and to benefit from the Bible study and writings of our forefathers in the faith. We feel it would be a tragedy to lose some of the material upon which our movement was founded.

College Classes Resume

The first semester of the 1998–99 school year began on August 24. Students and staff gathered August 20–22 for orientation and a retreat at the Timber Ridge Conference Center on the west side of Atlanta. Twenty-five students are enrolled this semester. Courses offered this semester include: Old Testament Survey; New Testament Survey; Introduction to Church Growth, Evangelism and Disciplemaking; the Pentateuch; Synoptic Gospels; Personal Finance; and Introduction to Christian Education. Students are also involved in weekly discipleship groups. Pastor Ray Hall of the Garden Park Church in Kentwood, Michigan will be campus chaplain in October.

Doctrinal Distinctives Curriculum

For the quarter beginning in December, the Sunday School Curriculum for the Church of God General Conference will focus exclusively on the distinctive Bible truths taught by our association of churches. A new prekindergarten teacher's guide and student's book have been added to the curriculum. The Christian Education Department under the direction of Gayle Guthrie has oversight of this special curriculum. Some of the material has been re-written from its original publication.

Focus on the Kingdom Radio Program

Stations in South Bend, IN and the Washington DC area are now broadcasting a 15 minute radio program Monday through Friday. Anthony Buzzard is the speaker. The staff of the College/Conference receive calls from listeners requesting information. The program is also broadcast on shortwave to most nations in the world. Recently a number of responses have been received from Africa.

Atlanta Bible College Accreditation

Delegates at the Summer General Conference adopted a recommendation authorizing the Board and staff to improve the College program with the intention of achieving excellence in meeting accreditation standards. Following General Conference, an initial application form was submitted to the Accrediting Commission International. Atlanta Bible College has received a certificate granting Candidate Status to the College. A survey team will be visiting the campus on November 10.

The Accrediting Commission International was organized in 1979. Currently, 130 schools in 10 countries on 5 continents with 21,000 students are accredited by this Commission.

The ACI fosters ethical practices, encourages experimental and innovative programs, insists on consumer protection for students, encourages clearly identified needs, and fosters responsiveness to public interests.

Financial Update

The fiscal year of the College and Conference ended on June 30. At the end of the fiscal year it was necessary to borrow \$10,000 to cover expenses. The new fiscal year which began on July 1 will require contributions of approximately \$369,000 or \$30,787 per month. Special thanks to all members, churches, and conferences that support the work of the College and Conference.

What Is It?

 - 4. Groups relocating to a more desirable site.
 - 5. Groups purchasing land for a new building.
- 6. Groups which have outgrown their present facilities and are enlarging, buying, rebuilding, or exchanging.

Church Builder Appeal Results

Since the inception of the program in 1957, 80 appeals have been issued. Nearly 3/4 of a million dollars has been contributed and invested in churches over the past forty years.

Currently there are approximately 476 active, participating members in the Church Builder's League. They contribute an average of \$13,000 to each appeal.

Our Goal for the Future

Delegates at the 1998 Summer General Conference approved a recommendation to secure 1,000 active members of the Church Builder's League by the year 2000.

russia mission trip

The Team consisted of Joe and Rebekah Martin of Atlanta Bible College along with Travis Hamilton of Indiana and Zachary Ross of Georgia. We applied for visas only thirty days in advance as required and received them the Saturday before Youth Congress. We left for Russia Sunday afternoon, August 2, on Lufthansa, stopped in Frankfurt, Germany the next morning and arrived eventually in St. Petersburg at 2:30 p.m. With an eight hour time difference, we had traveled for about 14 hours with layovers.

Tracy hired two cars to take us to Roshino a small community about sixty miles north of St. Petersburg and only about sixty miles from the Finland border. She has a modest cottage across from a government built apartment complex. Our main task was to encourage Tracy and help in any way possible. Primarily, we put a roof on her home but we did many other things as well. She has a nice garden and she and Rebekah even did some canning. That area of Russia is on about the same latitude as Anchorage, Alaska. The sun set at about 11:30 p.m. and rose about 4:30. Lots of time to work and tour!

Another important aspect of the trip was to meet some of Tracy's contacts and encourage them. We spent time with Sergey and Luce, a couple from St. Petersburg; Nina, who lives just around the block from Tracy; and Stepan, a friend and carpenter who worked with us on the roof. We also met some children in the area. On Sunday morning, August 9, we had a devotional service in Tracy's home with each person sharing a favorite passage of scripture and telling how it is meaningful to them.

Also, we did some touring. Without a car, we usually caught the bus that took us to the train station that took us to some interesting destinations. One day we visited the Bay of Finland and saw a beautiful rainbow and sunset. A couple days were spent in St. Petersburg at the Hermitage (the Czar's winter palace) and the Summer Palace, which is about twenty minutes north of St. Petersburg by boat. The last evening we attended a Russian folk dance presentation. Travis and Zachary were chosen from the crowd of two hundred to get up and dance with the costumed ladies!

The Lord blessed us with safety also. Lightning hit near the house one day and I got a "buzz" from it. Tracy

The person filling this position will be groomed to help plant a fifth church in the greater Rockford Metropolitan area, hopefully in the fall of 1999. 
