Report of 105th Annual General Conference

Again this year, members of the Church of God gathered to celebrate the accomplishments of the past and to make decisions for the future. The theme was "Fix Your Eyes on Jesus" based on Hebrews 12:1, 2. It was highlighted by evening speakers Alan Cain, Talon Paul, and Seth Ross.

The main item of business was consideration of a recommendation by the board to relocate the Church of God General Conference and Atlanta Bible College to the west-central Ohio region. After extensive discussion during business sessions on successive days, the delegates approved the recommendation 77 to 10 – an 89% approval. The board was given authority to identify and execute the necessary real estate transactions to accomplish the move.

Mark Cain and Marcia Railton were elected to four-year terms on the Board of Directors, replacing J. J. Fletcher and Jon Welch who were presented plaques of appreciation for their years of service by Executive Director Seth Ross. The board was installed by the Ministerial Association moderator Michael Hoffman. Prayer was offered for each board member. Following the board election, the new board met to organize itself for the coming year. Joe Myers is chairperson; Mark Cain is vice chair; Alan Cain is secretary; and Shane Martin is treasurer. Robert Alcumbrack, Talon Paul, and Marcia Railton are the other directors.

The delegates approved a revised budget for 2025-2026 of \$1,241,399 with contributions needed of \$545,000; and a budget for 2026-2027 of \$1,274,250 with contributions needed of \$550,000. Other income is generated by college tuition and lodging fees, transfers from several restricted funds for scholarships and other needs, sales, and rental income from space in the Avalon building which is not used for conference/college purposes.

Forty-six church and six conference delegates, along with thirty-four pastors and seven board members conducted the business of the conference. Total delegates were two more than last year. About 200 attended all or part of the conference.

The Maple Grove Community church provided generous hospitality by preparing and arranging meals and making

their beautiful facility available for conference use. Many volunteers made the conference an inspiring and productive event.

The Atlanta Bible College Development Foundation met during conference and elected officers for the coming year. Cheryl Ross was chosen as president and J. J. Fletcher is the vice president. The secretary and treasurer of the Board of Directors also serve as secretary and treasurer of the Foundation Board. Alan Cain is secretary and Shane Martin is treasurer. The Foundation currently has assets of \$1,784,187. Interest earnings help to fund the operation of Atlanta Bible College. During the coming year, \$51,500 will be distributed to the college. Over \$1.6 million has been distributed to the college since the Foundation was created.

During the conference, the ABC/OBC Alumni Association met for its annual meeting. David Cheatwood was reelected as vice president of the Association. The president, Nola Jones, presented Distinguished Alumni awards during an evening service to honor deceased Pastor C. E. Lapp and Pastor Alan Cain.

The Ministerial Recognition Board presented plaques to four recently licensed pastors: Mason Ogle, Jeffery Seiders, Stefan Swanson, and John Truitt. Prayer was offered for these new pastors. The Ministerial Association moderator, Michael Hoffman, recognized Rob Laning, Merry Peterson, and Curt Rowden for 25 years of pastoral ministry.

The 2026 106th annual conference will be held at the Cornerstone Bible Church in McDonough, GA August 5-7. It will be preceded by the 21st annual Heritage Conference on August 4 and 5.

Fall Updates

Property Search and Prayer

At our summer conference, the delegates voted in favor of relocating the General Conference offices and Bible college with an 89% (77-10) approval.

Michael Cisler and I traveled to OH in late August to view potential properties. We were joined by three board members — Alan Cain, Marcia Railton, and Mark Cain. The property search is underway.

It is easy to engage in discussions of the pros and cons of various locations, but we eagerly desire that God would lead us to the ideal property that meets our needs and His purposes.

We invited pastors and churches to join us for a day of prayer and fasting over the property search. We desired that the entire Church of God join together in seeking God's guidance on Monday, September 8. There is power when we collectively seek the Lord together.

If you receive this after September 8, you can corporately pray over this in your church services each Sunday going forward. However, we also hope that people will seek God's guidance individually. There is value in ongoing prayer.

We encourage people to pray that . . .

- 1. God would lead us to the ideal property. There are three properties not currently for sale that meet our criteria for an ideal location. Please pray that God would open the right door for at least one of these properties to become available.
- 2. God would give the board and staff wisdom to recognize the right opportunities when they present themselves.
- 3. God's Spirit will rest upon us all, and God will establish the work of our hands both today and in our future, so we are pleasing to Him.

As our relocation progresses, we anticipate that there will be more "days of prayer" for various phases along the way. Each day of prayer will have a specific focus.

We also invite you to regularly pray for our ongoing ministries, beyond the relocation, as we strive to partner with churches and ministries in spreading biblical truth of the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ.

MVRA

The letters MVRA stand for Ministers' Voluntary Retirement Association. This program was established in

1968 to provide a voluntary nonprofit retirement program for the ministers of the Church of God General Conference (COGGC) and full-time lay employees of the General Conference. Any minister licensed by the COGGC and who serves regularly in the duties of a pastor or denominational leader is eligible to participate. All member



churches of the COGGC are eligible for membership in the association, whether or not they have a pastor. Additionally, state and regional conferences are eligible for membership in the association. Participation is voluntary and must be requested.

The contributions of ministers, churches, and conferences who choose to participate are calculated in these ways: ministers contribute 2% of their ministry income, churches contribute 2% of their operating income, and conferences contribute an amount equal to the average contributions of participating churches. Quarterly, the total contributions of the churches and conferences are shared equally among the accounts of participating pastors. Each pastor's contributions go directly toward their own retirement accounts.

This program has been a tremendous blessing to our pastors. Over the past nearly six decades, 73 pastors have received benefits of approximately \$2,838,000. Today's value of all the investment accounts is over \$2,010,000. Currently, 16 pastors, 5 conferences, and 25 churches participate in the MVRA program. Eleven churches contribute, though they do not have a pastor participating. The primary function of this team is to provide proactive leadership to the Ministers Association toward the realization of its purpose. The purpose of the Ministers Association is to empower pastors through (a) upholding Christ as our model for service, (b) promoting mutual respect, support, and encouragement, and (c) fostering excellence in ministry skills and in doctrinal integrity.

Chairman's Message to the Delegates at the 2025 General Conference Business Session

I am Joe Myers from the Lakeshore Church in Tempe, AZ. I have pastored churches in Denver, CO, New Hope in Little Rock, AR, Pennellwood in Grand Rapids, MI, Lakeshore in Tempe, and Cornerstone in McDonough, GA. I currently serve as an elder and board chair under the leadership of pastor Levi Salyers, who along with his wife Katelyn await the birth of their first child, a son, whose name has yet to be revealed, although I have suggested that the name Levi Joseph has a nice ring to it.

I am a 1973 graduate of Oregon Bible College and a 1972 husband of Dana Eckerd Myers. We have two children, Bethany Ligon, who recently completed a four-year term of serving on the board of directors and our son Sam, who is a claims specialist working the past thirteen years for State Farm. We are blessed with three grandchildren, Whitney age 14, Charlotte age 6, and Easton age 2!

I became a baptized believer in Jesus on my 19th birthday. I was baptized in Lake Waubee at Camp Mack in the summer of 1970 by Pastor Ed Graham. This is my tenth year of having the responsibility of serving on the Church of God Board of Directors, six years as chairman. I love the Church of God General Conference and the truths and church family which comprise this organization.

Two years ago I recognized what I believed to be a "crossroads" moment in the long history of the COG. Specifically, it became apparent to me that the time was approaching as to whether or not our college and conference would remain in McDonough, GA for the foreseeable future or whether or not a relocation away from Georgia to another locale was a consideration. I wanted to be involved in that decision-making process, hence I ran for the board, and many of you were gracious enough to place your trust in me, and I was elected. It has been an honor to serve along side vice chair J. J. Fletcher, treasurer Shane Martin, secretary Jon Welch, your pastor at Kokomo Talon Paul, Bob Alcumbrack and pastor Alan Cain under the direction of our Executive Director Seth Ross. You should know these are all good, godly men whose hearts are in the right place and who seek to follow in the direction God leads them and the Church of God General Conference.

Before I address the subject of relocation, I would like to share with you some of the very important items your board has been working on over the past twelve months. Yes, it is possible to "walk and chew gum" at the same time as you are about to hear.

The Disciple Collective – approximately a year ago the board was approached by pastors Josiah Cain and Levi Salyers with an idea to create an online presence, highlighting not only COG theology, but practical daily guidance in matters which affect all Christians. On Friday, Josiah will be leading a workshop introducing and explaining in great detail the goals behind this project. I believe this project holds the potential of being one of the greatest efforts of influence for the COG perhaps in decades. Your board has thrown its full weight of support behind the project. Such a significant project requires significant financial resources and your board is fully prepared to assist in that way.

Organizations Outside the Direct Umbrella of the COG it has become apparent to the board that we have a wonderful opportunity to make ourselves known to other organizations not directly under the COG umbrella. Organizations such as the Unitarian Christian Alliance, known as the UCA. It is an organization dedicated to proclaiming the truth that God is one, and one means one. I quote from their website: "The mission of the UCA and its growing membership is twofold: to promote unitarian theology, and to connect like-minded believers across the globe." Perhaps you have heard the names of Mark Cain, Sean Finnegan, Dale Tuggy, Dustin Smith, Will Barlow, Bill and Stephanie Schlegel, Anne Fischhaber, Dan Gill, Kegan Chandler. To mention a few - they all are contributors to the UCA podcast.

While not adhering totally to all our doctrine positions, your board believes that making ourselves known, not only to this organization, but others like Spirit and Truth, which involves Jerry Wierwille and Gary Burnham, Living Hope International led by Sean Finnegan, and Allegiance to the Kingdom led by John Truitt has merit. All of these four men are COG licensed ministers. These connections will enhance opportunities to encourage others to consider attending the one and only Bible college in the country which proudly proclaims and teaches a one, and only one, God theology.

The board in recent months, thanks to the encouragement of new member Robert Alcumbrack has begun investigating how we might crate similar one-issue programs, such as conditional immortality, Kingdom of God, sleep of the dead, etc. Stay tuned for more on this.

Lord's Harvest International (LHI) is a part of every board agenda. Dr. Joe Martin and his dear wife Rebekah, along with sister Annette Osborn, board member Jon Welch and many other mission-loving individuals continue to pour their lives into international missions. Because of COVID, personal health issues, and government unrest, it has been difficult to travel to our sister churches in recent months and years. One

of the biggest challenges has been accountability concerning funds distributed. But LHI continues to work in responsibly bringing the good news to these foreign lands.

On the home front, your board, in cooperation with Bobby Partain and Pastor Talon Paul are seeking to expand our influence in the United States through the North American Missions Ministry. We are working to increase the number of churches under the COGGC umbrella and support those already member churches.

With the help of Madison Cain and Katelyn Salyers we are working to expand and enhance our publishing department. Including, but not limiting ourselves to, the General Conference website and other publications. Speaking of other publications, last year the board voted to financially assist and publish a new systematic theology book. Author Dustin Smith has nearly finished his project and with the assistance of editors Scott Deane and Jeff Fletcher, we anticipate a late fall release of this new book!

Our dear friends Steve and Young An, along with their son, Sam and a dedicated staff, continue to minister and prepare students in the Korean populations. It is worth noting, had a move from Oregon, IL to Morrow, GA not taken place, it is safe to assume these beloved people would have never crossed our path. Personally, I consider the ABCKE to be one of the great success stories of our journey from IL to GA. Which leads me to wonder what unknown blessing lies ahead should our delegates approve a motion to relocation to Ohio.

Let me finish by addressing the major motion which is before our delegates this week. I do not believe it is hyperbole to state that issues such as this do not, nor should not, occur each year. What we are asking our delegates to consider over the next two years will be generational in its impact. So, as pastor Alan Cain stated so eloquently last night, we discuss and decide only after much prayer, discussion, and with all humility.

Your Board of Directors, along with our Executive Director, unanimously recommend we relocate the conference office and Bible college from the current McDonough, GA location to central Ohio. There will be plenty of time given to answer your questions and concerns in our meeting today and tomorrow. So, I will not attempt to do so in this already lengthy address. But, be assured any questions and concerns you may have, your current board of directors in the recent past have also wrestled with. This in no manner has been a quick, or hasty decision. This unanimous recommendation is the result of literally years of discussion, prayer, and consultation with many of you seated here today. Two committees were formed

for the purpose of discussing how the model of the college should look like and where best that model should be located in order to succeed. While the college model committee reached agreement quite quickly, the location committee after numerous meetings, could not reach a consensus. And that's okay. It only served to show us the importance of doing our homework in order to come to what the board believes as the best assessment.

Our recommendation basically centers around three main points: 1) a campus, 2) proximity (to be located near as many churches as possible), 3) centrality (near the center of the Church of God).

Campus – first let me address the return of a college campus. OBC campus, Morrow campus. When Dana and I moved to Georgia in 2007 to assume the pastorate of the Cornerstone Bible Church, I lived in the dorm for the first 3½ months. There can be little doubt that having a centralized college campus enhances the college experience and creates bonds which last a lifetime. Our current location does not allow for the campus experience such as I describe to take place.

Proximity – currently ABC students have the experience to learn and grow under the influence of the Cornerstone Bible Church. Many students have had wonderful experiences in the Cornerstone setting. However, it is the board's belief that a more ideal option would be for students to experience ministry in multiple congregations. Being within an hour of multiple pastors provides greater opportunity for mentorship.

Centrality – I remember my days as a student at OBC and the chorale under the leadership of Dale Ramsey. Prior to this we had gospel teams and currently we have Go Serve teams that visit our churches. Obviously, conference staff and students can visit churches anywhere, but traveling from the Atlanta area makes most trips at least a day away or requires a flight. Being close to more churches allows for more visits.

In summary, the proposed relocation will allow us: 1) an enriched on-campus student experience; 2) to develop closer relationships with more churches; 3) to offer a wide variety of student ministry engagements.

Conclusion: If Dr. Alva Huffer were here today, I can hear him say, "We live in very exciting times and the best days of the Church of God are ahead." Yes! And I believe such a statement is not only true, but possible.

Thank you for allowing me the privilege and honor to serve on this board for ten years. It is a highlight of my life. I am honored. As we move forward these next couple days, may we do so in love and unity, seeking first the kingdom of God and his righteousness.



JJ Fletcher moved to accept the recommendation made by the BOD as printed in the Progress Journal: "The Board of Directors presents to the delegates of the Church of God General Conference, subject to a 2/3 delegate approval of the delegates, the relocation of the Church of God General Conference and the Atlanta Bible College to the west-central Ohio region. The delegates give authority to the Board of Directors to identify and execute the necessary real estate transactions."

Jerry Wierwille seconded. The floor was open for discussion.

- Steve Mattison had a question as to which staff would relocate if the relocation took place.
- Willie Little had a question concerning the possibility of land purchase in the Kokomo, IN area.
- Bob See made comment on the Kokomo, IN area.
- Alan Shaw asked the question concerning the possibility of a lag where we might not have a Bible college between selling and purchasing properties.
- Nancy Vadnais raised question concerning acquiring existing buildings in which to relocate facilities.
- Daniel Smead asked what percentage of HS students would be attending ABC. He also asked how the potential relocation will impact the Korean Extension (ABCKE)?
- Jake Ballard sought clarification that if we relocate Ohio will award a diploma only and not a Bachelor's Degree.
- Bobby Lee Partain asked how many students would move if we relocate? Are we relocating more for the college or the GC?
- Bob See commented on his experience at the Bible College.
- Larry Newman wanted clarification is there a need for a campus at all because of the online age in which we live.
- Anne Fischhaber asked if there were conditions on the \$500,000 that was offered? She also asked questions about the current assets of the COGGC. Has a feasibility study been done about the area of which we desire to relocate?

- Nola Jones shared that we are in a building that is totally paid for. What happens if someone purchases the property in GA and we have to pay rent?
- Eva Jo Fisher asked what title the current college would hold in Ohio? Would it still be college, learning institute, etc?
- Hoyt Alexander shared various concerns he has concerning the possible relocation. He also shared concerns about focusing on churches that are struggling. We might consider an independent consulting firm to help us determine as to where we might relocate would work.
- Mark Cain shared thoughts on the advantages of relocation and staffing and re-staffing.
- Nik Ransom shared his thoughts that as a new student to ABC, distance made him hesitant in attending the current location. Other young people he knows have the same hesitation.
- Brian Garrett asked what it would be like for the people who are staying and for the people who are relocating, if the relocation takes place. Also he asked about revitalization of churches.
- Executive Director Seth Ross addressed the delegates and shared his thoughts about ABC, COGGC, and the ministries within the COGGC in relation to the possible relocation.

All of these things, and more, are helping us align with higher education common practices, better equip our students for a lifetime of leadership and ministry, and better connect our college and students with the churches in our General Conference.

Meet Camden Bormes who is a junior at Atlanta Bible College this fall from the North Kent Bible Church in Rockford, Michigan. Camden preached and served in other ways at Family Camp this summer. He also preached and served on staff at FUEL this summer. He has served at reFUEL South. Chris-



tian Workers Seminar, and on the fall ministry trip in 2024. While on that trip, he preached multiple times and sang on the worship team. When asked about his time at ABC, Camden responded, "My time at ABC has been extremely beneficial in many ways. I have been able to deepen my understanding of God and learn how to minister to His people through my classes. I have also been able to make relationships with classmates that will last a lifetime as we do ministry together in the future. ABC has also given me the opportunity to experience many different forms of handson ministry that have helped me tremendously as I move towards pastoral ministry."

Atlanta Bible College Korean Extension Report



The 2025 spring semester, which included twenty-nine students, concluded without issue on May 8. One student, Sunkyu Park, graduated. He and Jung Hwa Choi, who graduated

in May 2024, were unconditionally accepted into the Master of Arts in Divinity degree program, which requires 72 to 96 credit hours to complete, at Reformed University in Lawrenceville, GA. Their campus is about 10 miles north of us and is accredited by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA). I believe the university recognizes the quality of our education through Eunkyung Seo, who graduated from our school in December 2022 and has been enrolled since August 2023. To help them maintain the faith they acquired through our classes, we've invited them to the Korean Church of God pastor's continuing education classes and other gatherings, and they've been diligently attending so far. We envision that those graduates will be the future instructors of the Korean Extension after completing the degree.

Throughout the summer break, our staff has been working diligently on recruiting, with strong support from Korean pastors and alumni in both the U.S. and South Korea. Due to our efforts, we have three new South Korean students registered for the fall semester, and we also have two additional prospective students who are still in the process of obtaining their entry visas at the U.S. Embassy in South Korea. We continually provide them with the experiences of students who have successfully obtained entry visas.

My wife, Young, and I (Steve) converted to the Abrahamic faith in 1999. Since then, we have been visiting seminaries and local churches in South Korea, including those pas-



tored by Korean Extension graduates, to share our beliefs. In 2003 and 2004, we were joined by Kent and Cheryl Ross, Joe Martin, Anthony Buzzard, and Brian Atra. The MZ Generation (Millennials and Gen Z, born between 1981)

and the present) now make up most of the church members in South Korea. With the support of Lord's Harvesting International (LHI), Sam and Sarah An (right), who are close to this generation and can empathize with them well, plan to join next year's mission trip to begin inheriting our role.



As the scripture says, "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God made it grow" (1 Corinthians 3:6). With assistance from Kent and Cheryl Ross, Joe Martin, Anthony Buzzard, and Brian Atra, my wife and I planted the seed of the Abrahamic Faith in South Korea. Now, Sam and Sarah An will water it, and God will make it grow, so that an abundance of fruit will soon follow.



Report of 20th Annual Heritage Conference

Immediately preceding the annual General Conference, members and friends gathered to learn more about the heritage of the Church of God. Among the


highlights of this conference were presentations by:



Mark Drabenstott - he shared the history and background of a group of churches that also carry the name Church of God of the Abrahamic Faith that trace their history back to Benjamin Wilson and to some of our early leaders.

This group separated from our group of churches in the early 1900s, but continue to share a love for the same truths that have guided our churches. They have some connections and fellowship with Christadelphians whose early leaders also collaborated with our early leaders. Mark's message focused on our common roots. He also addressed the challenges that all Christians face today standing for truth and righteousness. He shared the words of Jesus in Luke 18:8 – "when the son of man comes, will he find faith on the earth?" As the leader of the Williamsburg Christadelphian Foundation, he shared their vision of: helping renew a transforming faith in the community of believers, inspiring and equipping youth for a life of faith, and showing how faith transforms life for good. He reminded us that together we have honored the name Abrahamic Faith for more than 150 years. The challenge we face is not those years, but the ones that remain until Jesus comes.

Janet Snyder - she is the greatgranddaughter of the founders of the Kokomo Church. She proimportant information vided about O. J. Parker and D. G. Harvey and their ministry in

John is a great-great-grandson of these same founders. He provided additional insight into those who started the church nearly 100 years ago.

Kent Bolin - a member of the History Committee, shared additional regional history by speaking about the history of the Indiana Conference. He also spoke about the life and ministry of D. E. VanVactor, a leader from Indiana who served on the Committee of Ten that was in-



strumental in the formation of the General Conference in 1921.

Jan Stilson — a founder of the History Committee, presented a tribute to four members of the committee who died in recent years: Kent Ross, Arlen Rankin, Greg Demmitt, and John Smead.





Bobby Lee Partain - he provided on update on the scanning of materials for the G. E. Marsh Memorial Archives as well as talking about the importance of learning about the legacy of the Church of God and the importance of the legacy that we will leave for the next generation.

Marilee LaMattina — in September, the Virginia Conference will celebrate its 100th anniversary. Marilee presented a history that she prepared which highlighted the impact of this conference on the work of the Church of God.

The conference concluded with a field trip to visit the previous location of the Kokomo church on Jay St. Many attenders have memories of attending services and conferences in this facility which was sold in the late 1990s. The group also traveled to Country Chapel in Michigantown, IN where members of the congregation shared photos and historical information about the church and served refreshments.

Next year's conference will be held in McDonough, GA August 4 and 5.


